REVOLVING LIGHT, DENT ISLAND, WHITSUNDAY PASSAGE.

ON and after this date a Revolving Dioptric Light, of the 4th order, will be exhibited from the western side of Dent Island, about 8 cables from its southern extremity. The light stands at an elevation of 120 feet above high-water mark, and attains its greatest brilliancy every thirty seconds.

It is visible from the Anchor Islands, west about, until shut in to the northwards by Cid Island, and can be seen from a distance of 16 miles.

The tower, which is circular, is painted white, and is 33 feet in height.

THE Bluff Harbor Board reports that a small vessel, on which a WHITE LIGHT showing all round is exhibited, has been placed at the narrowest part of Bluff Harbor, on what is called the "Black Buoy Rock," with the following bearings from the vessel:—

Burial Point, S. by E., two cables' length.

Red light on east end of the jetty, W., three cables' length.

Triangle Rocks (sunk), S.S.E., three-quarters of a cable's length.

No. 108.—NOVEMBER 14, 1879.—1.

The vessel is moored with four anchors (quarterly), and swings in her own length. Care should be taken by vessels dropping past not to hook the moorings, which extend 20 fathoms from the vessel.

Vessels drawing over 12 feet should not come to the south of a line between the vessel and the northern face of the jetty at low-water.

There is 13 feet close to the light vessel at low-water spring tides.

PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867" EXTENDED TO THE SHIRES OF BENALLA, EUROA, ROSEDALE, AND TRARALGON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the county of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it was amongst other things enacted that Part II. of the said Act should apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, had been in force, and all or some of the provisions of Part II. aforesaid should also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council should by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council might at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the seventeenth day of November 1870, Part II. of the said Act was extended to the Shire of Benalla, which was subsequently divided into the Shires of Euroa and Benalla: And whereas by another Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the fifth day of June 1871, the said Part II. of the said Act was also extended to the Shire of Rosedale, which was subsequently divided into the Shires of Traralgon and Rosedale: And whereas it is expedient to extend Part II. aforesaid to the Shires of Benalla, Euroa, Traralgon, and Rosedale as now constituted: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the Proclamation aforesaid bearing date the seventeenth day of November 1870 as relates to the Shire of Benalla, and the Proclamation aforesaid bearing date the fifth day of June 1871: and with the advice aforesaid I do by this my Proclamation direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above-recited Act, 31 Vict. No. 310, shall apply to the respective shires hereinafter mentioned, as now constituted, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF BENALLA,
THE SHIRE OF EUROA,
THE SHIRE OF ROSEDALE,
THE SHIRE OF TRARALGON.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE HAWKESDALE TOWN COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 1st of April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Minhamite having drafted the following Regulations for the Management of the above-named Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council.

Regulations.

1. All householders within the township reserve shall be allowed to depasture three head of horned cattle and one horse, or four head of cattle.
2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be payable to the herdsman quarterly in advance, and shall be at the rate of eight shillings per head per annum for horses and six shillings per head for horned cattle. Stock under nine months' old free.
3. All cattle depasturing on the common must be branded with the common brand.

4. No animal affected with any disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common.

5. All unregistered stock depasturing on the common will be impounded.

6. Every care will be taken to ensure the safety of all registered stock depasturing on the common, but neither the managers nor the herdsman will be responsible for them.

7. No person shall remove stock from the common without first giving notice to the herdsman.

8. No entire horses or bulls over six months old shall be allowed on the common without the permission of the managers in writing.

9. Any person disturbing or driving cattle on the common will be liable to prosecution.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the most distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that the Governor might from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any Common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and might from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and nothing therein contained should prevent the sale by auction or the leasing or licensing under the said Act of any land comprised in any Common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby unite the Commons hereinafter

mentioned and do re-proclaim the same under the designation hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

THE COOLEBARGHURK FARMERS' COMMON, described in three several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 12th August 1861, the 10th December 1866, and the 13th October 1869; and the Beremboke Common, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 24th March 1873 and the 13th October 1879, are hereby united and re-proclaimed as a Common under the designation of

THE BEREMBOKE AND COOLEBARGHURK COMMON, subject to the provisions of the hereinbefore in part recited Act. —(79.M.20585.)

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MOUNT WYCHEPROOF CEMETERY.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. By the 19th section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and their representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees; a certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the proper charges.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, upon an order signed by a justice, under the Act of the Parliament of Victoria numbered 310, or on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the charges.

5. Orders for interment to be given at the office of the trustees; such notice to be given between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. the previous day.

6. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, if requested; but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and, in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

8. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

9. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months.

10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

12. A plan of every monument and tombstone, proposed to be erected and placed, shall be exhibited to the said trustees before permission for the erection thereof is given, and the said trustees shall be at liberty to withhold such permission, and prevent the erection of any monument or tombstone, which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming; and shall determine and fix the position of any monument or tombstone which may be proposed to be erected, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having regard to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

13. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty, on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

15. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected, and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

16. By *The Cemeteries Statute 1864* any person who shall wantonly and wilfully destroy, or do, or cause to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, in the said cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof, will be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £20; or, at the discretion of the justices, to imprisonment for any period not exceeding three months; and any person who shall do, or cause to be done, any injury to any such monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, or plant, whether the same shall have been done wilfully or wantonly, or otherwise howsoever, shall be liable to pay damages and compensation, which shall be recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction in the colony, by the trustees of the said cemetery, or any other person injured by such damage.

17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

The increase during the previous quarter was 4,699, and the increase during the third quarter of 1878 was 6,302. 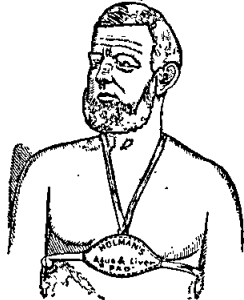
