REGULATIONS TO PROVIDE FOR THE DEPASTURING
OF CATTLE IN STATE FORESTS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-eighth
day of January 1879.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869*, power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules and regulations for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations to provide for the depasturing of cattle in State forests, that is to say:—

- Persons resident within five miles of any State forest may, subject to the conditions hereinafter specified, respectively depasture in such forest any number not exceeding in the whole twelve head of large cattle, or the equivalent thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle shall be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle.
- The depasturing of State forests shall be subject to the supervision and control of the Crown lands bailiff for the district within which the same are situated, and the bailiff shall be responsible for the registration of the cattle thereon, and for the prevention of trespass.
- The fee for depasturing cattle in any State forest shall be paid half-yearly in advance, and shall be, for fenced reserves, at the rate of Six shillings per annum for every head of large cattle, and Two shillings per annum for every head of small cattle; and for unfenced reserves, at the rate of Four shillings per annum for every head of large cattle, and One shilling and fourpence per annum for every head of small cattle.
- Every person desirous of depasturing cattle in any State forest shall pay into the receipt and pay office nearest to such forest the full amount of the fees prescribed by these regulations, and shall obtain a receipt for such payment in the form marked A.
- A place shall be set apart in each forest or district, as the necessities of the case may require, for branding all cattle prior to the same being depastured in any forest, and all persons shall bring their cattle to such place to be branded by the Crown lands bailiff or his assistant on the day next appointed for branding cattle. The days for branding shall be the fourteenth day after the day first appointed by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district, and every fourteenth day subsequent to such date.
- All cattle depasturing in any State forest shall be deemed to be trespassers, unless the same have been duly branded by the Crown lands bailiff or his assistant.
- The brand of every State forest shall be kept in the office of the district Crown lands bailiff, and, except when the same is in use, may be inspected by the public at all reasonable hours, or a description thereof may be obtained on application in writing to the Crown lands bailiff.
- The brand of every State forest shall be liable to alteration at any time, on approval of the Minister. Notice of every such alteration shall be published in a newspaper circulating in the district, and every such notice shall specify a time when the owners of all cattle depasturing under license in such State forest shall bring the same for the purpose of being branded with such altered brand. Every person disobeying such notice shall be deemed to be a person not licensed or otherwise authorized to depasture cattle within the meaning of the 98th section of *The Land Act 1869*, and may be dealt with accordingly.
- For the purposes of these regulations, the term "large cattle" shall mean and include any horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, or foal, any bull, ox, steer, cow, heifer, or calf, and any ass or mule; and the term "small cattle" shall mean and include any ram, ewe, wether, or lamb.
- When the Crown lands bailiff for any district shall consider that a forest is stocked to its full carrying capabilities, he shall notify the Receiver and Paymaster accordingly, who thereupon shall discontinue to issue licenses for such forest until otherwise advised by the district Crown lands bailiff.

DIMBOOLA TOWN COMMON REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of Chap. XIII of the Regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the managers of the Dimboola Town Common submit to the Board of Land and Works, for approval, the following regulations for the management of the said common:—

- Persons entitled may depasture on the common four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof, in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle.
- The assessment on stock depasturing on the Dimboola Town Common shall be respectively as follows:—
Large cattle, over six months old, Six shillings per head per annum.
Horses, over six months old, Eight shillings per head per annum.
Goats, over six months old, Four shillings per head per annum.
Sheep, over six months old, Four shillings per head per annum.
- Special licenses to depasture sheep intended for slaughter will be issued to any butcher approved of by the managers. The number not to exceed fifty sheep at one time. Fees to be One pound seventeen shillings and sixpence per quarter.
- All fees to be paid quarterly in advance; the quarters to commence on the 1st day of January, 1st day of April, 1st day of July, and 1st day of October in each year.
- Bulls, rams, and entire horses will not be permitted to run on the common without the written consent of the managers.
- The herdsman will be required to muster the stock as often as the managers shall think necessary, in some convenient place to be appointed by the managers, to be branded with the common brand; and public notice thereof shall be given by placard posted by the herdsman not less than three days previously. All stock shall be branded by the herdsman. Horses shall be exempted from being branded.
- No stock of any kind shall be turned on the common without due notice being previously given to the herdsman, with description of brands, otherwise they will be liable to be impounded.
- The fees to be paid on travelling stock remaining on the common over six hours shall be as follows:—
Large cattle, One shilling per head for every additional twelve hours.
Horses, One shilling per head per night.
Small cattle, Twopence per head per night.
- All stock on which fees are due, and have not been paid when demanded by the herdsman, will be impounded.
- The herdsman shall have authority to impound all straying or unauthorized stock found on the common, the registers of which he will be required to keep, so that all damages and fees arising therefrom may be properly accounted for.
- The owners of any cattle or sheep diseased, or supposed to be diseased, shall remove such cattle or sheep from the common within twenty-four hours after notice in writing requiring them so to do has been given to them by the herdsman or by one of the managers; and in the event of the owners refusing or neglecting so to do they shall be considered trespassers and be proceeded against accordingly.
- Should the managers have any reasonable suspicion that the stock applied for to be depastured on the common is not the *bona fide* property of the applicant, the managers may, if they think proper, before granting a license, require the person or persons so applying to make a statement in writing specifying that the stock applied for to be licensed are his property and not that of any other person.
- The managers will not be responsible for any neglect or any irregularities of the herdsman.
- The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of any cattle or horses from the common.
- Persons taking stock, not being duly registered in the books of the common, to water, shall keep such stock on the public roads leading to the water. If found straying off such roads, such shall be liable to be impounded.
- The herdsman shall pay to the treasurer (chairman) all moneys received for fees or otherwise within ten days after receiving same.
- No pigs shall be allowed on the common, and if found trespassing thereon shall be impounded.
- Each herdsman shall provide security to the amount of Twenty pounds for the honest and faithful discharge of his duties.

19. Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

The foregoing Regulations were adopted at a meeting of managers of the Dimboola Town Common, held at Dimboola on Wednesday, 23rd September 1878.
