The births of 746 children, viz., 369 boys and 377 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of October. In the month of September 828 births were registered, or 82 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in October numbered 374, viz., 207 of males and 167 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 372. The deaths exceeded those in September by 15, and were also greater than the average of October during the previous ten years by 51. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been greater than the average of those ten years by 13.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 80.5° on the 16th, and the lowest was 38.6° on the 9th and 14th. The mean temperature of the month (56.6°) was half a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (32.2°) took place on the 15th, viz., from a maximum of 77.2° to a minimum of 45.0°. The least range (4.6°) was on the 7th, viz., from a maximum of 54.6° to a minimum of 50.0°. The mean daily range was 17.7°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.875 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Of the deaths registered during the month 55 per cent. were of males, and 45 per cent. of females. Thirty-seven per cent. were of children under the age of 5 years, as against 27 per cent. in October 1878; 39 per cent. in October 1877; 29 per cent. in October 1876; 39 per cent. in October 1875; 35 per cent. in October 1874; 37 per cent. in October 1873; 37 per cent. in October 1872; 41 per cent. in October 1871; 32 per cent. in October 1870; and 40 per cent. in October 1869.

The deaths of 21 persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a gentleman, aged 75, of rheumatism; a tailor, aged 75, of disease of the heart; a female, aged 75, of bronchitis; a seamstress, aged 75, of enteritis; two females, aged 75 and 76 respectively, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 76, of apoplexy; a female aged 76, of asthma; a female, aged 77, of phthisis; a female, aged 78, of hydatids of the liver; a bricklayer, aged 80, of hepatitis; a master-mariner, aged 81, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 81, of abdominal tumor; a female domestic servant, aged 81, and one female—83, of pneumonia; and three males—a laborer, aged 77, a watchmaker, aged 80, and an estate agent, aged 85—and three females—two aged 79, and one 80, of old age.

Seventeen deaths from external causes were registered in October, of which 12 are set down to accident or negligence, and 5 to suicide. The particulars are as follow:—A female child, aged 12 months, died of the effects of a fall from the arms of a nurse; a boy, aged 7, died of fracture of the skull, and a carter, aged 38, of peritonitis—in both cases the result of a kick from a horse; a boy, aged

15, was accidentally killed by being crushed between a punt and a jetty; an engineer, aged 54, was crushed to death by the lever of a steam-tug; a boy, aged 15, died of an accidental gun-shot wound; a female, aged 29, died of lead poisoning—how received into the system not known; a female child, aged 12 months, and a boy, aged 12, were accidentally drowned—the former by falling into a tank; a pensioner, aged 40, was found drowned in the River Yarra; two male infants, aged 2 days and 2 months respectively, were suffocated in bed. Of the persons who committed suicide a civil servant, aged 48, cut his throat; a bootmaker, aged 65; stabbed himself in the belly; a male of occupation unstated, aged 52, drowned himself in the River Yarra; a baker, aged 44, hanged himself; a seaman, aged 24, placed himself on a railway line. All these are supposed to have been of unsound mind.

Ninety-three deaths, or 25 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—38 in the Melbourne Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Alfred Hospital, 11 in the Lying-in Hospital, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 10 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 9 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, and 1 in the Homoeopathic Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 137, of which 73, or 53 per cent., were of males, and 64, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 95 were under one year of age, 21 were between one and two, 14 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 237. Of these, 134, or 57 per cent., were males, and 103, or 43 per cent., were females; 12 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 19 were between twenty and twenty-five, 12 were between twenty-five and thirty, 16 were between thirty and thirty-five, 16 were between thirty-five and forty, 16 were between forty and forty-five, 21 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 20 were between fifty-five and sixty, 18 were between sixty and sixty-five, 17 were between sixty-five and seventy, 6 were between seventy and seventy-five, 13 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 8 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from whooping-cough increased from 9 in September to 28 in the month under review, the latter being a number which had been previously reached on only four occasions during the last ten years, viz., twice in 1871 and twice in 1877. Rheumatism also caused an unusually high number of deaths in October, viz., 10; the yearly average from that complaint during the eleven years ended with 1878 was only 23, but already during the current year as many as 40 deaths from it have been recorded. Phthisis caused 40 deaths in October as against 61 in September and 36 in August; and diseases of the respiratory system caused 55 deaths in October as against 42 and 47 in the previous two months. Eight deaths were set down to the consequences of childbirth, making the total of such deaths since the beginning of the year 51, or 1 death of a mother to every 145 births registered.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the most distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its dependencies &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Licensing Act 1876 (No. 566, sec. 14) it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time upon the application in writing of the council of any municipality to proclaim any part of the municipal district of such municipality, to be defined by such council, not being a borough having a population of Five hundred persons liable to be rated, as shown by the rate-book, a special area; and it was further enacted that the fee which should be paid for a publican's license in respect of premises situated within a special area should be Ten pounds only; and the Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any proclamation made under the authority of the above recited section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a special area under the provisions of the fourteenth section of the Act above recited the locality hereinafter mentioned, within which the fee to be paid for a publican's license shall be Ten pounds only, that is to say:—
