QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE DISEASES IN STOCK ACT 1872."

WHEREAS, upon the statutory declaration of an Inspector of Stock, made pursuant to Regulation 52 under *The Diseases in Stock Act 1872*, the lands hereinafter described have become Quarantine Districts until the determination and declaration of the Governor in Council relative thereto: It is hereby notified that the Governor in Council has declared the said lands hereinafter described Quarantine Districts, in pursuance of Regulation 52 under the Act aforesaid, viz. :—

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS.

1. Paddock containing forty acres three roods fourteen perches, in the occupation of William Padgett: Commencing at the north-east corner of George Jones' 19th section holding (41592); thence N. 81° 34' W. twenty-three chains eight links; thence N. 8° 26' E. twenty chains eighty-two links; thence S. 81° 34' E. fifteen chains sixteen links; thence S. 16° 37' E. twelve chains thirty-six links; thence S. 7° 8' E. ten chains to point of commencement.

2. Paddock containing seventy-nine acres one rood eight perches, in the occupation of William Padgett: Commencing at the west corner of Daniel Cain's 19th section holding (37467); thence N. 7° 8' W. twenty-one chains forty-two links; thence

N. 16° 37' W. nine chains eighty links; thence N. 76° 16' E. fourteen chains sixty-five links; thence N. 87° 8' E. nine chains ninety-eight links; thence S. 12° 29' E. thirty-two chains seventeen links; thence S. 82° 52' W. twenty-five chains ninety links to the point of commencement. The above bearings are to the true meridian.

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of *The Bank Holidays Act 1873, I*, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint

THURSDAY THE 18TH DAY OF DECEMBER INSTANT  
a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Geelong;

FRIDAY THE 19TH AND SATURDAY THE 27TH DAYS OF  
DECEMBER INSTANT

special days to be observed as Bank Holidays at Stawell;

MONDAY THE 29TH DAY OF DECEMBER INSTANT

a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Bairnsdale.
