LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.

I HEREBY notify that I have received a Return to the Writ issued by me on the fifth day of February last, for the election of a Member to serve in the Legislative Assembly of Victoria for the Electoral District of West Bourke, and that by the Return endorsed on such Writ it appears that

ALFRED DEAKIN

was duly elected Member for the said Electoral District, and that annexed to the said Writ is a statement, a copy of which is hereunder set forth.

"I annex to my return to the writ for the election of a member to serve in the Legislative Assembly for the electoral district of West Bourke the following statement of facts:—

Upon the receipt of the writ I initialled a number of ballot-papers equal to the number of electors throughout the entire electoral district, and my substitute appointed under section 81 distributed the ballot-papers so initialled to the deputy returning officers of the several polling-places in such proportions as had been accustomed, such proportions having been regulated by the apparent proportion of electors of the division residing in the neighbourhood of the particular polling-place, and from the numbers who had polled at such polling-places at the previous election.

At Newham the poll was opened at the proper hour and the polling continued without any difficulty until 3.30 p.m., when it was found that the ballot-papers were exhausted and several electors claimed to vote.

The Deputy Returning-officer, having no means of supplying additional ballot-papers, adjourned the completion of the poll to the 22nd inst., and gave verbal notice at the polling-place that the poll was adjourned to that day. He also sent a telegram to the Returning-officer in the following terms:—

"Telegram for — Buchan, Esq., Substitute Returning-officer, Queen street.

"Ballot-papers exhausted. Voters still coming to poll. Adjourned to 22nd inst. Waiting instructions what to do with ballot-box, papers, &c. Reply by wire.

Deputy Returning-officer, Newham booth,
West Bourke election."

Upon receipt of this telegram I addressed the following letter to the Acting Chief Secretary:—

"37 Queen street, Melbourne,
Feb. 19, 1879.

"Sir,—In accordance with the 55th clause of instructions to returning officers, I have the honour, in connexion with the polling for the West Bourke election on the 18th inst., to No. 26.—FEBRUARY 28, 1879.—1.

report that at Newham, one of the polling-places of the Lancefield division for the district of West Bourke, the Deputy Returning-officer, by some omission, was not supplied with sufficient ballot-papers, and that, consequently, some electors were unable to vote thereat. The deputy returning officer adjourned the polling until the 22nd inst.

"I beg to suggest, that in order to cure any defect, the Governor in Council may under the 131st section of the Electoral Act, 'where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission shall have happened, the Governor in Council may take such measures as may be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission,' appoint Saturday the 22nd inst., between the hours of 8 o'clock in the forenoon and 5 o'clock in the afternoon, as a time for finishing taking the poll at Newham, and publish the same in the *Government Gazette* of Friday.

And received the following reply from the Under-Secretary:—

"Chief Secretary's Office,
Melbourne, Feb. 20, 1879.

"Sir,—I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of yesterday's date, suggesting action by the Governor in Council in respect to the poll taken at Newham on Tuesday, the 18th inst.

"The Acting Chief Secretary is of opinion that any such action now would be premature; moreover he sees grave objections to the course suggested.

"The responsibility at the present stage rests entirely with the Returning-officer, who ought to follow strictly the requirements of the statute.

"In the opinion of the Acting Chief Secretary it is your duty to make your return in due course to the honourable the Speaker, disregarding the action of your deputy.

The votes at all the polling-places, save Newham, having been counted at the close of the poll at the several places on the 18th, it was ascertained that Mr. Deakin had a majority on such votes over the other candidate, Mr. Harper, and Mr. Deakin handed the following letter to the Returning-officer:—

"29 Temple-court, 20 2, 1879.

"Sir,—My attention has been called to a statement that Mr. Deputy Returning-officer John Savage, acting at the Newham booth for the Lancefield Division of the West Bourke Electoral District, at the election on Tuesday, the 18th inst., took upon himself to exceed his legal functions, and without any riot or other legal cause, to adjourn the polling to Saturday, the 22nd inst. I wish to point out to you the illegality of this proceeding, and to protest in the strongest terms against such adjournment as being totally *ultra vires*. Being a candidate at such election, I now call upon you to declare the poll as taken upon the 18th inst., the day fixed by the writ dated the 5th inst., and will hold you personally responsible if you proceed

to countenance this illegal act of your deputy, Mr. Savage; and I would further caution you against your counting in your return to the Speaker any votes tendered on the day to which Mr. Savage has illegally adjourned the Newham poll, as such votes are necessarily void and useless.

My substitute, Mr. Buchan, then, by my authority, wrote to the Deputy Returning-officer the following letter:—

"87 Queen street, Melbourne,
Feb. 20, 1879.

"Sir,—I have the honour, by direction of the Returning-officer for West Bourke, with reference to the present election, to inform you that no further polling can take place at Newham, and therefore you will be good enough, with the least possible delay, to have the ballot-box containing the votes taken at your polling-place on the 18th inst. opened within the building used as such polling-place, in the presence of your poll-clerk, and, if possible, the scrutineers. It will be necessary to name a convenient time (say not later than Ten o'clock on Saturday), and acquaint the scrutineers of the same.

"When the result has been ascertained, please make the usual return, and forward on to the Returning-officer, together with the other papers, precisely the same as if the polling had gone on without any interruption whatever on Tuesday last.

"Be good enough to make known as publicly as possible that by direction of the Returning-officer there will be no more votes taken.

On Saturday, the 22nd, at 3.30 p.m., I was served with the following notice:—

"I, the undersigned Robert Harper, of Melbourne, in the colony of Victoria, merchant, being a candidate for election as a member of the Legislative Assembly for the electoral district of West Bourke, hereby give you notice that the polling for the said election has not been completed, and that unless a further day be appointed for taking the poll at Newham in connexion with such election, prior to the return day named in the writ for such election, you are required to endorse the fact of the polling not having been completed upon such writ.

I then addressed the following letter to the Acting Chief Secretary:—

"87 Queen street, Melbourne,
Feb. 22, 1879.

"Sir,—Since the receipt of the Under-Secretary's letter of the 20th inst., in respect to the poll taken at Newham on the 18th inst., I have this afternoon been served by the agent of Mr. Harper, one of the candidates at the West Bourke election, with a notice of which the following is a copy:—

"I, the undersigned Robert Harper, of Melbourne, in the colony of Victoria, merchant, being a candidate for election as a member of the Legislative Assembly for the electoral district of West Bourke, hereby give you notice that the polling for the said election has not been completed, and that unless a further day be appointed for taking the poll at Newham, in connexion with such election, prior to the return day named in the writ for such election, you are required to endorse the fact of the polling not having been completed upon such writ.

"Dated this day of February 1879.
(Signed) "ROBERT HARPER.
"To Charles Shuter, Esq., the Returning-officer for the said electoral district."

"I have thought it right to acquaint you with this, in order that, if the Governor in Council be so advised, he may appoint a further day for taking the poll at Newham, before the return of the writ on the 26th inst., with a view, under the provisions of section 131 of the Electoral Act, to remedy the omission to supply the Deputy Returning-officer at Newham with a sufficient number of ballot-papers. I should mention, also, that I have received a letter from Mr. Deakin, the other candidate, a copy of which I attach.

To which I received the following reply:—

"Chief Secretary's Office,
February 23, 1879.

"Sir,—I am in receipt of your letter, dated yesterday, with copies of the protests of the candidates for West Bourke. For your guidance I append my opinion on the questions that have arisen in reference to the proceedings connected with the polling at Newham. In the first place, there can be no doubt that in sending only 75 ballot-papers to Newham, you have not complied with the provisions of the 95th section of 'the Electoral Act 1865.' Before the day of polling the returning officer shall deliver to each deputy, and himself retain, such numbers respectively of the ballot-papers, so signed or initialed as shall be sufficient for the use of the electors, who shall be entitled to vote at each booth, at which such returning officer and deputy respectively are to take the poll."

"The number of electors so entitled to vote at Newham for the Lancefield division was 529, and the Returning-officer should have sent that number of ballot-papers respectively to each polling-place in that division, as the electors might all elect to vote at one only of these polling-places.

"I am aware a practice has been followed to be guided by previous voting as to the number of papers sent, but such practice is not in accordance with the clear direction of the Act.

"In the second place, the Deputy Returning-officer at Newham, in practically closing the poll, in or about three o'clock on Tuesday, the 18th, by a so-called adjournment of that day's poll to the 22nd, acted clearly beyond his powers, and committed two illegal acts.

"The first in contravention of the 8th section of the Electoral Act Amendment Act 1876, which enacts that 'Every polling shall commence on the day appointed for the same at eight of the clock in the forenoon, and shall, unless lawfully adjourned, finally close at five o'clock in the afternoon of the same day' repeating the words of the 100th section of the principal act, and simply altering the hours.

"This 'lawful adjournment' refers plainly to the 126th and 127th sections of the Electoral Act 1865, and it can only so refer, as it is clearly laid down that at Common Law a returning officer has no power of adjournment except in cases of riot, and that a poll once closed cannot be re-opened. In these two sections his powers are limited as to adjournments to these following cases:—Firstly. When the proceedings are interrupted or obstructed at any place by any riot or open violence, the poll may be adjourned to the following day, and *de die in diem* until such interruption or obstruction shall cease. Secondly. When no polling shall have been opened. As neither of these exceptions exist here, the closing of the poll by a so-called adjournment and the act of adjournment itself were both illegal acts, in contravention of the statute. Further, the adjournment to Saturday, the 22nd was in itself in contravention of the seventh section of the Electoral Act Amendment Act, which provides that the day of polling shall be not less than four nor more than seven clear days after the day of nomination, which in this case was the 13th or 14th. This section makes no exception of adjournments, and appears to be in restriction of the principal act. Your letter of the 20th refers me to section 131 of the Electoral Act 1865; but in my opinion the adjournment at Newham is so clearly an illegal act that it would be beyond the power of the Governor in Council to validate it; such validation would be practically repealing by Order in Council the Electoral Acts. As to your omission to send ballot-papers, and as to the completion of the poll partially taken at Newham by counting it so far as it was taken, the Governor in Council has power (if it is thought fit to exercise it) to validate those proceedings. As to Mr. Harper's protest calling upon you to endorse the writ with the statement that the polling has not been completed, your duty in this case is, in my opinion, not to make any such endorsement. The 129th section of the Electoral Act 1865 refers by marginal note to limits of adjournment. In the body of the text it speaks of 'such' adjournment, referring to the lawful adjournments for riots and non-opening of polls, made under the provisions of the 126th and 127th sections, and, as a matter of law, the 131st section does not apply to this adjournment which is in contravention of the statute. The words also in the text, 'if the polling shall not have been completed before the day named' in the writ for an election, refer entirely to polling at any such lawful adjournment, and not to a case such as this, where it is unlawful.

On the 22nd my deputy at Newham counted the votes recorded up to 3.30 p.m. on the 18th, and found that 13 votes were recorded for Mr. Deakin and 60 for Mr. Harper, and returned the voting-papers and return of the result on the 18th in a return in the usual form, excepting that the date of the return is on the 22nd.

The following protests were served on him:—

"I hereby protest against the ballot-box containing the votes deposited therein on the 18th February being opened, and the votes counted until the polling is concluded, by the

admission of votes which may be tendered to you to day in accordance with notice of adjournment of polling published in the *Lancefield Examiner* on 20th inst.

"We electors who have been refused ballot-papers join in the above."

"I, Louis Wiseman, jun., of Newham, farmer, hereby protest against opening the ballot-box containing the votes in election for a member for West Bourke, held on 18th February 1879, on the following grounds:—That on Tuesday, 18th February inst., the day appointed for such polling, I applied for a ballot-paper in order to vote at such election, being a voter legally qualified, but was refused by Mr. John Savage, Deputy Returning-officer. This I did at half-past 3, being one hour and a half before the closing of such poll, and I hereby certify that I have been deprived of any opportunity of exercising my franchise in said election."

RENTAL OF PRIVATE TELEGRAPH WIRES, INSTRUMENTS, ETC.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the following reduced rates being charged for rental of Private Telegraph Wires, Instruments, &c., from the 1st February 1879:—

Rent of wire for any distance not exceeding one mile, £5 per annum.

Rent of instruments and keeping in repair, each, £5 per annum.

The minimum charge for rent of wire to be in all cases for one mile, beyond that distance by quarter miles, any less distance to be counted as a quarter mile.

The rent in all cases to be paid yearly, in advance, and the term of agreement to be for a period of not less than three years.

No reduction to be allowed in the present charge for rental in cases where the yearly payment in advance is due or has already been made for the current year.

The births of 635 children, viz., 316 boys and 319 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of January. In the month of December 647 births were registered, or 12 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in January numbered 492, viz., 260 of males and 232 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 143. The deaths were less than those in December by 23, and were lower than the average of January during the previous ten years by 19. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to be less than the average of those ten years by 85.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 106.0° on the 29th, and the lowest was 46.9° on the 1st. The mean temperature of the month (66.0°) was a little below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (49.3°) took place on the 4th, viz., from a maximum of 99.6° to a minimum of 50.3°. The least range (6.7°) was on the 22nd, viz., from a maximum of 61.6° to a minimum of 54.9°. The mean daily range was 21.47°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.867 inches) was above the average.

Males contributed 53 per cent. and females 47 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Forty-four per cent. were of children under the age of 5 years, as against 47 per cent. in January 1878; 49 per cent. in January 1877; 52 per cent. in January 1876; 66 per cent. in January 1875; 57.5 per cent. in January 1874; 49 per cent. in January 1873; 56 per cent. in January 1872; 57 per cent. in January 1871; and 58 per cent. in January 1870 and 1869.

Eleven persons were set down as being of the age of 75 years or upwards at the time of their decease during the month under review:—Of these, a verger, aged 75, died of pneumonia; a gentleman, and a female, each aged 76, died of diphtheria and old age respectively; a patient of the Lunatic Asylum, aged 78, died of disease of the brain; a joiner, aged 79, died of disease of the heart; a gentleman, aged 79, died of bronchitis; a sailmaker, aged 79, and a female, aged 85, died of congestion of the lungs; a carter, aged 80, a widow, aged 86, and a farm laborer, aged 92, died of old age.

Thirty-one deaths from external causes were recorded during the month; of which twenty-seven were ascribed to accident, two to homicide, and two to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A seaman, aged 41, died of fracture of the skull, and a carter, aged 79, of fracture of the thigh, both caused by falls; a female, aged 53, died of injuries to the head, consequent on a fall down stairs; a fireman, aged 29, died of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall from an engine; a railway porter, aged 33, succumbed to injuries to the feet, a railway train having passed over him; a laborer, aged 42, died of tetanus, his hand having been crushed by a railway wagon; two females, aged 46 and 61 respectively, were killed by a water channel during a heavy downfall of rain; a saddler, aged 73, died of fracture of the skull, and an accountant, aged 87, of fracture of the femur; two boys, aged 4 and 5 respectively, and a female infant, aged 9 months, were burnt to death, the house they were living in having caught fire; three females, aged 11, 21, and 60 respectively died of burns, the second, a ballet-girl, in consequence of her clothes catching fire at the Academy of Music, and the third whilst drinking; a boy aged 7, died of sunstroke; a laborer, aged 34, was poisoned through taking aconite liniment by mistake; three boys, aged 12, 13, and 18 respectively, and a confectioner, aged 31, were drowned whilst bathing, two of the former in the River Yarra, and the other two in Hobson's Bay; a female, aged 50, was found drowned in a water-hole; a female infant was accidentally suffocated at birth; a butcher, aged 47, was suffocated by inhalation of chloroform during an operation; and a male infant, aged 4 hours, died of

umbilical hæmorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of laborer, aged 59, who died of injuries received during a fight, and a female infant who was suffocated at birth. Of the suicidal deaths, a bush-carpenter, aged 50, and a groom, aged 55, poisoned themselves with arsenic and opium respectively, the former during a drinking bout and the latter whilst of unsound mind.

One hundred and six deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.—57 in the Melbourne Hospital; 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 9 in the Lying-in Hospital, 3 in the Benevolent Asylum, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Industrial Schools, and 2 in the Homœopathic Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 215, of which 111, or 52 per cent., were of males; and 104, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 164 were under one year of age, 32 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 277. Of these, 149, or 54 per cent., were males, and 128, or 46 per cent., were females; 6 were between five and ten, 16 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 15 were between twenty and twenty-five, 17 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five, 19 were between thirty-five and forty, 17 were between forty and forty-five, 28 were between forty-five and fifty, 32 were between fifty and fifty-five, 28 were between fifty-five and sixty, 21 were between sixty and sixty-five, 13 were between sixty-five and seventy, 12 were between seventy and seventy-five, 9 were between seventy-five and eighty, 5 were upwards of eighty, and 1 was unspecified.

The total mortality from the first three classes of diseases was about the same as in the previous month; deaths from developmental diseases decreased from 94 in December to 63 in January; and those from external causes increased from 28 to 31. In the first class the mortality from diarrhoea still continues high, 68 deaths being recorded in December, and 66 in January; typhoid fever, the next prominent miasmatic disease during the month under review, caused 19 deaths in January as against 16 in December and 11 in November; this disease caused 307 deaths during the past year, or 1·22 deaths to every 1000 of the population. Childbirth caused 4 deaths during the month, or 1 death of a mother to 159 births.
