PROPOSED TRANSFER OF AREA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Act
1874 (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a petition,
in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has
been presented to the Administrator of the Government, are
published, viz.:—

The petitioners, seven in number, purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Bairnsdale which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Bairnsdale, and attached to the Shire of Omeo.

Area described in the petition :-

"Commencing at the trigonometrical station at Mount Baldhead; thence by the eastern watershed of the Nicholson River south-easterly to the head of Ramrod Creek; thence by that creek south-easterly to the Tambo River; thence by that river easterly to the mouth of Dead Horse Creek; thence by a straight line easterly to the intersection of the Omeo and Maneroo roads; thence by the Omeo road northerly and north-westerly across the Timbarra River to the range forming the watershed of the Tambo and Timbarra rivers; thence by that range northerly to Mount Bindi; thence by the present conterminous boundaries of the shires of Omeo and Bairnsdale to Mount Baldhead, the commencing point aforesaid."

The petitioners state their interests are more immediately connected with Omeo than with Bairnsdale, and the said area includes a road leading from Omeo to Bairnsdale; that the demands of the revenue of the Shire of Bairnsdale from its settled portions precludes any outlay on said road commensurate with the importance of the traffic; and that the improvement of this road is of importance to petitioners and also the inhabitants of the Shire of Omeo; and the petitioners pray as follows:—"That Your Excellency in Council may be pleased to make the following order, under section 19, subsection 5. of the Local Government Act 1874, severing that portion of the Eastern Riding of the Shire of Bairnsdale from the Shire of Bairnsdale, and annexing it to the Shire of Omeo, and fixing the rights and liabilities of the portion so severed and annexed."

No. 246, sec. 6) it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, divide the colony of Victoria into districts and assign the said colony and districts to the Registrar-General and Deputy Registrars respectively, or to so many of them as he might think fit, and might define the limits of such districts, and from time to time revoke, vary, and alter such division and the limits of such districts. And whereas by an Order made by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and dated the 14th day of February 1876, the Registration District theretofore known as the North Melbourne District was divided, and the portion of the colony of Victoria included within the boundaries of the said district was constituted two districts, as therein defined, and designated respectively the Carlton District and the Hotham District. And whereas it is expedient to divide one of such districts therein distinguished by the designation of the Hotham District. Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions and for the purposes of the said Act, do hereby abolish the said Hotham District, and do divide the limits thereof into two districts by a line running through the centre of Errol street, and do designate the said new districts as

#### MINING OPERATIONS WITHIN THE AREA OF SPRING GULLY RESERVOIR.

THE Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked the Order of the 6th day of March 1877, granting permission to Mr. Knoch Sincock to carry on mining operations within the area of the Public Water Reservoir at Spring Gully, near Castlemaine, and has granted permission to Andreas Hansen Schade and party to carry on mining operations, by virtue of their miners' rights, within the area of the said reservoir, subject to the following conditions:—

1. The working shall be confined within such limits as shall be set out by the Secretary for Mines or such other officer as may be authorized by him in that behalf, and shall be at all times open to inspection by such officer.

2. All puddling in connection with such mining operations shall be done outside the limits of the reservoir and the drainage area of the same.

- 8. All earth excavated in the course of the mining operations hereby authorized which may not be removed for the purpose of being puddled shall be filled into the holes again.

4. The dam and by-wash shall not in any way be injured.

- 4. The dam and by-wash shall not in any way be injured.

  5. Previous to occupying any portion of the said land under the authority of this Order the said Andreas Hansen Schade and party shall deposit in the hands of the Receiver and Paymaster at Castlemaine the sum of Two pounds sterling, as a guarantee that they will observe and fulfil these conditions, such deposit to be retained until the said Andreas Hansen Schade and party shall relinquish the said land and discontinue mining operations; and if the said conditions, restrictions, and regulations shall then have been observed and fulfilled, the said deposit shall be returned to the depositors, but if any of them shall not then have been observed and fulfilled, then the whole or such part of the sum so deposited as aforesaid, as the Governor in Council shall think fit, shall, by an Order of the Governor in Council, be declared forfoited and shall thereupon become public money and be applied accordingly.
