SIR,—Nagase Yoshimoto and Akabane Sadamori, officers of the Ministry of the Interior, having now returned to this country, have reported that whilst they were visiting New South Wales and Victoria on a mission to purchase breeding sheep for the bureau for the encouragement of agriculture the two Governments granted them railway passes, and that they experienced hospitable treatment at the hands of the chiefs of Government departments and bureaux, for which my Government is profoundly grateful.

I shall be much obliged if your Excellency will take an opportunity of communicating this to the chief authorities in both places.

REGULATION OF THE VICTORIA STEAM NAVIGATION BOARD.

THE following Regulation of the Victoria Steam Navigation Board, which has been approved by the Governor in Council under the 116th section of "The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865," is published for general information; to take effect on and after the date of the publication hereof.

REGULATION.

Every steam vessel navigating any river or narrow channel within any port shall keep, as far as practicable, to that side of the fairway or mid-channel thereof which lies on the star-board side of such vessel, and shall, at least for a distance of five hundred yards before approaching, and whilst rounding, any bend in the said rivers or narrow channels, sound the steam whistle at least once every half minute, so as to give sufficient warning to any approaching vessel, and thereby lessen the risk of collision.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified : Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind Schedules III. and IX. of the Regulations of the twenty-seventh day of December 1878, and doth hereby substitute the following Schedules in lieu thereof, that is to say :—

Any person may at any time, with the written permission of the Board of Land and Works, enter for the purpose of mining and mine for gold, silver, tin, copper, iron, or the ores thereof, or for auriferous earth or stone, or for coal or lignite, upon the land in respect of which this license is issued, or such part thereof as the Board may by such writing allow, making such compensation to the licensee for the improvements (if any) effected thereon, and for the license and other fees paid in respect thereof, as may be agreed upon between him and such licensee, or in the event of a disagreement as may be determined by the arbitration of three indifferent persons or any two of them, one arbitrator to be appointed by the licensee, one by the Board of Land and Works, and one by the person to whom the permission to mine has been granted, the form of submission to arbitration to be determined by the Governor in Council in case of any differences: and if the licensee obstruct any such holder of a miner's right so entering or mining as aforesaid the Governor may revoke his license.
8. MAJORCA PUBLIC GARDEN.

REGULATIONS.

THE Council of the Borough of Majorca, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Majorca Public Garden, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.—

REGULATIONS.

1. The garden shall be open to the public from sunrise till sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the garden who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, fences, gates, embankments, or erections in the garden, nor shall fires be lighted therein, nor the grass or herbage injured.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut the fences, trees, or seats, or throw stones within the garden.
5. No person shall bathe or wade in the reservoir, or put therein any offensive matter; no person shall fish in the reservoir without written permission of the committee.
6. No person shall carry firearms through the garden, or shoot, snare, or destroy any wild fowl in the garden or reservoir.
7. Children under the age of ten years, not being under the control of some competent person, may be removed from the garden.
8. All dogs, goats, pigs, geese, or poultry found within the garden shall be liable to be destroyed, and the owners shall make compensation for damage done (if any), to be recovered before any justice.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence. Any person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

ST. ARNAUD RECREATION RESERVE.

REGULATIONS.

WE, William E. Wheeler, James Jackson Wolfenden, Charles Michael Rowan, Solomon Cox, and Henry Henden, senior, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land at St. Arnaud reserved for recreation purposes, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve is divided into the following divisions, viz.:—1st, the Playing Ground; 2nd, the Grand Stand; and 3rd, remainder of Reserve.
2. The third (3rd) division shall be open to the public between sunrise and sunset except on days when important matches shall be played, and on days on which sports shall be held in said reserve, such days not to exceed six in each year.
3. All persons paying for admission to the second and third divisions, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which they shall on demand produce, and (if required) surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand the production or surrender of the same.
4. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage the same, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
6. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, or light fires therein without the authority of the committee of management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
8. Persons who may have obtained the consent, in writing, of the committee of management to the erection within the reserve of any structure, &c., for special purposes, shall be bound by any order made by the committee of management in such matter.
9. It shall be competent for the committee of management to allow any part of the reserve to be depastured by quiet stock, the proceeds of such agistment to be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.
10. Any person committing in the reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof:—
 - (1.) Assaulting any other person.
 - (2.) Being drunk.
 - (3.) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket match or sports, or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.
 - (4.) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
 - (5.) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
 - (6.) Behaving improperly or riotously.
 - (7.) Not surrendering (if required) to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand production of same a ticket duly authorizing admission to that part where such person shall be found.
11. The following fees shall be charged and taken for admission to the second and third divisions on such days as the committee of management shall appoint, and which shall not exceed six (6) in each year:—

For admission of each person to the second division such sum as the committee may determine, not exceeding Five shillings (5s.).

For admission of each person to the third division such sum as the committee may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and may be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

3. Any person wishing to make an interment must cause the grave to be dug at his or her expense.

Any person making a vault, placing a gravestone, fence, or monument, in the cemetery, by and with the consent of the trustees, under these rules, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep such vault, monument, gravestone, or fence according to the tenure of such permission; and no permission will be given unless the ground is purchased.
5. All vaults, monuments, gravestones, or fences to be kept in repair and proper condition, by and at the expense of the owner, or it will be removed.
6. Any vault, monument, gravestone, fence, or epitaph objected to will not be permitted to be erected, or if erected notwithstanding will be removed at the expense of the person erecting the same.
7. Charges will be remitted in the case of poor persons being buried, and on the certificate of a justice of the peace, under section 9, Act 310, that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the charges.
8. Any person wishing to make an interment in any private grave or vault must obtain and submit to the trustees the consent in writing of the owner thereof, before the ground, grave, or vault is opened.
9. All graves for adults must be at least six feet deep, and those for children under twelve years five feet deep.
10. All funerals to take place between the hours of Ten a.m. and Five p.m.
11. The trustees reserve to themselves the right from time to time to rescind, alter, or add to these rules and regulations

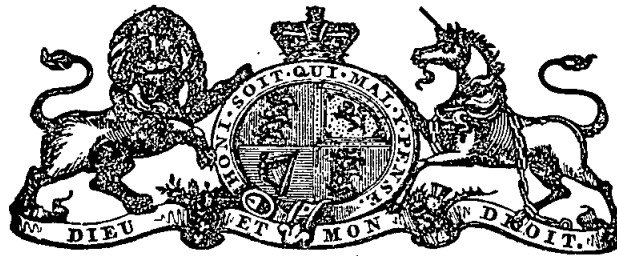

FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

P R O C L A M A T I O N

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," now stand prorogued until Tuesday the fourteenth day of January instant, and it is expedient to prorogue the same further: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Tuesday the fourteenth day of January instant until Saturday the twenty-second day of February next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this tenth day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and in the forty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.
