NOTICE TO MARINERS.

THE following letter from Captain Rogers, of the barque *Alice Mary*, reporting certain discoveries on his passage from Foochow to Sydney, is published for general information.

DEAR SIR,

I think it my duty to inform you that on my last passage from Foochow to Sydney, in the *Alice Mary*, I passed through Dampier Straits, between New Britain and Rook Island, having on board the Admiralty and Imry's charts; we passed safely through the Straits in the night, close to the New Britain shore, which the natives told me was quite safe; I found it so, for we sailed along about a mile from the shore with a leading wind. At daylight on 7th October 1878 we were close to Cape St. Ann, moderate easterly wind; we stood out and made Passage Bank, with all the low islets surrounding, and made the easternmost one with low bushes on it, visible from the deck about 3 to 5 miles; the bank from the mast-head was quite clear, to be seen from the discolored water of a reddish color, the wind falling light at the time, about 11 a.m., and being to south, tacked ship, at noon wind freshened to a 6-knot breeze, ship heading E.N.E. to east; at 4 p.m. stood close in between Cape St. Ann and Cape Piddar, tacked ship and stood off on a S. by E. course till 6.30 p.m.; the easternmost island on Passage Bank not visible from the mast-head, ship by bearings and both charts from 15 to 20 miles to windward of all danger marked on both charts; had good observations at noon, also at 4 p.m., when we tacked to southward and found it to agree with the bearings and the lay of the land; at 7.30 p.m. whilst standing in, heading N.E. by E. ship struck on a coral patch, I think not more than half a mile in extent. We could not find less than 8 feet on any part of it after sounding round about the ship; we got off after discharging about 100 tons tea and stood south, when we again struck about a half mile to south of where we first struck, ship drawing at that time about 11 feet; whilst on the reef I got the bearings of Tupinier Island, a very high and remarkable peak, which was shut in with or over Cape St. Ann, a low headland, on a bearing of N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. about 7 miles from the coast, by the charts this would give the latitude 5°55' south, longitude 148°35' east. (Alice Mary Reef.)

There is also a small island about half a mile to the W.N.W. of Lotting Island, forming a snug harbor, also a village on the island.

An island also exists $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile to N.W. of Tupinier Island.

We also discovered a dangerous reef on the following bearing, Lottin Island S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. and Cape Gloucester, a remarkable peak on New Britain, at the north entrance of Dampier Straits bearing S.S.E. Merite Island, E. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. latitude by charts, 4°50' south, longitude 148°10'. This is a very dangerous reef; I was apprised of it by the second officer calling me and reporting a whirlwind, which are common in these parts; and reduced sail accordingly, but the noise getting nearer, I kept ship away and went aloft; after waiting a reasonable time for a squall to come, and saw breakers plainly; we kept ship in the vicinity of the breakers till daylight, when we plainly saw rock above water and breakers as we sailed along about 8 miles, the diameter I could not judge, but am sure it extended north and south 8 miles. This I call Whirlwind Reef. I am of opinion that the peculiar formation caused by New Ireland

and New Britain, forming a horseshoe, and the still water about these parts offers a great facility for the formation of coral reefs, and that the navigation is highly dangerous till further surveyed.

BAY OF BENGAL—BRITISH BURMA—BASSEIN RIVER.

Vessels prohibited from anchoring near Submarine Telegraph Cable between Diamond Island and the mainland.

NOTICE is hereby given that a telegraph cable having been laid between the north part of Diamond Island and the mainland to the northward, two posts surmounted with boards, painted white, have been set up—one has been placed where the cable leaves the water, and the other inland of it, in a line with the cable.

To prevent damage to this cable, masters of vessels and others are warned that they are to anchor only with these beacons well open of each other, to the eastward or westward.

If the beacons are not visible, vessels should avoid anchoring when the centre of Diamond Island bears between S. by E. and S. by W.

If bound for Bassein, masters of vessels are also warned to avoid anchoring between the cable-houses (which are painted white, one on each side of the river) in Gnaputau Reach.

Intended exhibition of Revolving Light at Vakalapudi.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the undermentioned Common the Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

THE EVANSFORD AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 10th August 1863, and increased by Orders dated respectively the 30th August 1869 and the 7th May 1878, is hereby further increased by adding thereto the allotments and portions of allotments hereinafter enumerated, viz.:—County of Talbot, parish of Caralulup: allotments 99 A, 100 A, and the unappropriated portions of allotments 96 and 100 B; area of extension, 770 acres, more or less.—(79 C.3865.)

RAYWOOD RACECOURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE AT YALLOOK.

REGULATIONS.

WE, Richard Stewart Harvey, Richard Dixon, John P. Teague, William Sullivan, John F. Willoughby, William McKane, William Gunn, junr., and Henry R. Hyde, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land at Yallook reserved for a racecourse and for recreation purposes, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*:—

REGULATIONS.

No. 1. The reserve is divided into the following divisions, viz.:—1st, grand stand; 2nd, saddling paddock; 3rd, running ground; 4th, residue of the reserve.

No. 2. All persons paying for admission to the 1st and 2nd divisions, or to any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which they shall, on demand, produce and (if required) surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand the production or surrender of the same.

No. 3. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.

No. 4. No person shall climb over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage the same, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

No. 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, or light fires therein, without the permission of the committee of management.

No. 6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent (in writing) of the committee of management first obtained.

No. 7. Any person who may have obtained the consent of the committee of management (in writing) to the erection within the reserve of any structure, &c., for special purposes shall be bound by any order made by the committee of management in regard thereto.

No. 8. It shall be competent for the committee of management to allow any part of the reserve to be depastured by quiet

stock; the proceeds of such agistment to be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

No. 9. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or mayor shall be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof:—

- (1) Assaulting any other person.
- (2) Being drunk.
- (3) Crossing or trespassing on the playing ground during a cricket match or sports, or during practice at cricket, or crossing or trespassing on the running ground during the time any race is being run, or when crossing or trespassing on such cricket ground or racecourse would be injurious to the same as a cricket ground or racecourse.
- (4) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (5) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- (6) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (7) Not surrendering (if required) to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand production of the same a ticket duly authorizing admission to that part where such person shall be found.

No. 10. The following fees shall be charged and taken for admission on such days as the committee shall appoint:—For each person to the first division, such sum as the committee may determine, not exceeding ten shillings (10s.). For admission of each person to the second division such sum as the committee may determine, not exceeding five shillings (5s.). For admission at the gates of a truck or wheelbarrow, 2s. 6d. For each horse not entered for any race, 2s. 6d. For each vehicle drawn by one horse, 2s. 6d. For each vehicle drawn by more than one horse, 2s. 6d. for each horse. And for admission to the reserve for training purposes, £1 each half-year. Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and may be taken before a justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
