CALIFORNIAN SALMON.

THE Californian Salmon are now from six (6) to ten (10) inches in length, and may be expected to grow an inch longer every month.

The sides and belly are of a silvery white color, the back has three rows of very dark-green round spots, with numerous small olive-green spots interspersed. They are expected to descend to the sea from January to March.

The attention of the public is directed to the 20th clause of *The Fisheries Act*, viz.:—"If any person knowingly take, or assist in taking, or attempt to take, in any Victorian waters, any fish not indigenous to Victoria, or any fish of the same species as any such non-indigenous fish introduced into such waters, within three (3) years after the introduction thereof, or within such further time as the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* appoint, or if any person shall inadvertently capture any such fish, and shall not forthwith return the same to the water in which they were captured, such person shall, for every offence, be liable to a penalty of Twenty pounds (£20)."

The Californian Salmon were introduced into the above-named rivers and creeks during December 1877 and January 1878, and their capture is therefore prohibited until 1st January 1882.

DEATH OF MR. EDWARD HENTY.

SIR,—I have the honor to report for your information, and as a noteworthy event in the history of Victoria, that there died at Melbourne on the 14th instant, in the 70th year of his age, Mr. Edward Henty, the first settler in that division of the Australian continent which now forms this colony.

2. From an interesting and accurate memoir of Mr. Henty's life which has appeared in one of the local journals, and of which I enclose a copy,—[Enclosure—Extract from *Argus* of 15th August 1878]—it will be seen that Mr. Henty first landed in Portland Bay in November 1834, a few months before the time (August 1835) when the first settlers (Messrs. Batman and Fawcett) established themselves on the site of the present city of Melbourne.

3. Mr. Henty had acquired a large fortune by his energy and enterprise. He has now passed away in the full enjoyment of the respect of his fellow colonists; and his name will always fill an honorable place in the history of Victoria. In the comparatively short space of 44 years, he has lived to see the country in which he was the first white settler advance to its present position, with a population of 870,000; with an annual revenue of four and a half million sterling (equal to the revenue of Portugal, and far exceeding the revenues of ancient European kingdoms like Denmark and Saxony); and with a trade (including imports and exports) exceeding in value thirty-two millions sterling; while the seat of the Colonial Government at Melbourne, though barely forty-three years have elapsed since its first foundation, is already a great city with 250,000 inhabitants, and with public buildings and institutions that would do credit to most European capitals.

DISTRICTS WHERE PUBLICANS' LICENSES MAY BE SPECIALLY GRANTED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district in a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the localities hereinafter mentioned to be districts where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

The Parish of Tongala.
The Parish of Anakie.
The Parish of Colquhoun.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, sec. 14) it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time upon the application in writing of the council of any municipality to proclaim any part of the municipal district of such municipality, to be defined by such council, not being a borough having a population of Five hundred persons liable to be rated, as shown by the rate-book, a special area; and it was further enacted that the fee which should be paid for a publican's license in respect of premises situated within a special area should be Ten pounds only; and the Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any proclamation made under the authority of the above recited section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as special areas under the provisions of the fourteenth section of the Act above recited the localities hereinafter mentioned, within which the fee to be paid for a publican's license shall be Ten pounds only, that is to say:—

The Shire of Pymalong,
The Shire of Oxley,
The Parishes of Bulgaback and Dargo,
The Township of Grant (Crooked River).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: And whereas by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the second day of December in the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, the digging or removing loam from the Crown lands comprised within the boundaries described in such proclamation was prohibited: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said proclamation so far as the same relates to section 24a, in the municipal district of Portland: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said proclamation of the second day of December One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, so far as regards section 24a, in the municipal district of Portland.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* it was amongst other things enacted that where any street or road in any municipal district exceeds one chain in width such street or road might, for any length thereof, be reduced in width to any width not less than one chain, and that the council of the municipality and the Board of Land and Works, and every owner of any land having a frontage to such street or road in any place where the same is so reduced in width, or in any place not more than three chains from any such place, might agree in writing, under the common seals of the municipality and the Board of Land and Works, and under the hand and seal of every such owner, upon a scheme for the reduction in width of such street or road for the length mentioned in such scheme, and for the disposal of the surplus land taken from such street or road, and as to the purchase-money to be paid by any such owners who might be allowed to purchase any of the surplus land, and as to the compensation, if any, not exceeding in the whole the amount of the purchase-money to be paid in respect of any land injuriously affected by such scheme, and the Governor in Council might by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such scheme, and thereupon any land mentioned in such scheme in that behalf should cease to be a street or road, and all rights-of-way over the same should cease and determine; and it should be lawful for the Governor, on payment of the purchase-money for any surplus land to the Treasurer of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, to grant such land in accordance with the provisions of any such scheme in the manner prescribed by the said Act, and by warrant under his hand to

direct payment of any such compensation out of the consolidated revenue, which is by the said Act appropriated for that purpose accordingly: And whereas a scheme has this day been submitted to the Governor in Council for reducing the width of a portion of a certain street or road called or known as Mollison street west, in the Borough of Malmesbury, in the colony of Victoria: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the 367th section of the said in part recited Act, doth by this present Order confirm the said scheme for the reduction of the width of such portion of Mollison street west within the Borough of Malmesbury aforesaid, from three chains to one chain fifty links, as shown on a plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne, and in accordance with a certain agreement attached to said plan, dated the twenty-fourth day of September A.D. RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE MOORMURUNG AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON.

WHEREAS by regulations made by the Governor in Council under *The Land Act 1869* the council of every shire in which any common is situate are appointed managers of such common, and empowered to draft rules and regulations for its management and submit the same to the Board of Land and Works: Now therefore the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale hereby submit the following regulations for the management of the Moormurung Agricultural Area Farmers' Common:—

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

2. Persons entitled to commonage will be permitted to depasture on payment of fees according to the following scale:—

Four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of land cultivated by him.

3. The fees to be paid for depasturing on the common shall be as follows:—

a. For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, per annum, Six shillings.

b. For every cow, heifer, ox, steer, or calf, per annum, Four shillings.

c. For every head of small cattle, per annum, Three shillings.

4. No cattle shall be considered as registered unless the above fees are paid at the time of entering their brand or other distinguishing mark and description by the herdsman, and all fees must be paid half-yearly in advance, the licenses dating from the first day of May and the first day of November in each year.

5. No fees will be charged for the progeny of registered cattle which in the opinion of the managers or herdsman are under six months old. No bulls or entire horses will be allowed to depasture on the common without the special consent, in writing, of the managers.

6. All large and small cattle shall have a distinguishing brand on them, and all horned cattle shall be marked with the common brand.

7. The herdsman will attend the common-yards every Monday, from Nine a.m. to Three p.m., to register and brand all cattle brought to him, and in the performance of this duty the owners are required to assist.

8. It will be the herdsman's duty to see all cattle under his care every alternate day; the managers will not, however, be responsible for any cattle depasturing on the common, but the herdsman is required to give immediate notice to owners when he becomes aware of their cattle having strayed from off the common; neither do the managers hold themselves responsible for any neglect or irregularity on the part of the herdsman.

9. The herdsman will be authorized to impound all cattle, sheep, pigs, and goats trespassing on the common; and the entries of all impoundings shall be kept in a book for that purpose, so that all damages and fees accruing from that source may be accounted for.

10. No person will be allowed to remove any cattle from the common without giving at least twelve hours' notice to the herdsman, and no person will be allowed to disturb or remove any cattle unless the herdsman is present.

11. The managers reserve to themselves the right to cause to be removed from the common any cattle suspected of contagious diseases.

12. Persons desirous of registering cattle shall sign a description of such cattle, describing all brands and other distinguishing marks in the form of schedule 24 appended to the regulations of the 26th May 1873, made by the Governor in Council under *The Land Act 1869*. The herdsman shall give to each person registering a receipt for all money paid on account of depasturing of any cattle, and shall hand over all such money to the shire treasurer within three days of its receipt.

13. At the request of the person registering the herdsman may register and brand elsewhere than at the common branding-yard, in which case an additional fee of One shilling per head for one beast and Sixpence per head for two or more shall be made.

14. The general mustering of cattle shall take place in the first week in May and the first week in November in each year, the three first days in each of these weeks to be for horses, the remainder for neat and small cattle. Cattle thus mustered for registration shall, if not registered and paid for, be impounded on the third of the respective days set apart for such musters.

15. The managers are empowered to set apart a portion of the common for the grazing of sheep.

16. Persons removing cattle will be allowed to substitute others upon payment of a registration fee of One shilling per head.

17. Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

The above rules and regulations were framed the day of December, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE CORACK COMMON WITHIN THE SHIRE OF ST. ARNAUD.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter XIII. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, as managers of the Corack Common, in the parishes of Corack and Witchipool, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following regulations for the management of the said common:—

1. All persons entitled to commonage under the provisions of *The Land Act 1862*, *The Amending Land Act of 1865*, and *The Land Act 1869* shall be allowed to depasture stock on the Corack Common, situated and being within the Shire of St. Arnaud, subject to these regulations, and upon payment in advance of the fees specified in the schedule hereunto annexed.

2. Ratepayers and other persons entitled to commonage, residing within five miles of the said common, may depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. Farmers having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by them may depasture on such common in addition one head of large cattle or three head of small cattle for every ten acres of land so cultivated.

3. Every person depasturing cattle must be the *bona fide* owner of the cattle so depastured.

4. Bulls or entire horses over the age of nine months will not be allowed on the common without the written sanction of the managers; and sheep will be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the said common as may be set apart for that purpose by the managers.

5. The herdsman of the common shall be in attendance at a place to be named on the seven days immediately preceding the first day of each quarter, for the purpose of registering cattle and receiving the fees thereon; and due notice of such attendance, and the time and place thereof, shall be given by the managers.

6. All persons taking cattle to depasture shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman at the time and place appointed as aforesaid, together with a written statement of the number and brands of such cattle; and the herdsman shall on receiving the fees payable on such cattle give a receipt for the same on behalf of the managers; and shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owner or person in charge, brand such cattle in a conspicuous place with the common brand, which

shall be of pitch or tar; and such brand shall be renewed whenever necessary, so as to be plainly legible during the whole period that such cattle are depasturing on the common. On presentation of the above-named receipt the managers shall deliver, or cause to be delivered, to the person named therein a license for the period specified.

7. No cattle duly registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common unless notice of intention to remove be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the cattle so removed.

8. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of any cattle from the common, save as provided in the next section.

9. The herdsman shall, on any cattle straying or being otherwise removed without the owner's consent, notify the owner thereof within ten days; and in default of giving notice within that time, should such cattle be lost, the herdsman shall be held responsible for the loss, to be computed at the rate of Two pounds sterling per head for horses, and Two pounds sterling per head for horned cattle, to be deducted from the remuneration payable to the herdsman.

10. All fees must be paid quarterly in advance to the herdsman of the common; licenses to date from the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in each year.

11. All stock on which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid within ten days after date for renewal of license will be impounded.

12. All carcasses found on the common which the owner or owners may refuse or neglect to remove, after receiving twenty-four hours' notice in writing from the managers or herdsman, the managers or herdsman shall have power to remove or cause to be removed, by burning or otherwise, at the expense of such owner or owners.

13. The herdsman shall report immediately on the indication of any contagious disease in any cattle on the common to the managers, and shall give notice to the owner of such cattle to remove the same. The managers shall at once take precautionary measures to remove such cattle from the common; but they shall not be responsible for any loss the owners of such diseased cattle may sustain.

14. The herdsman shall take the necessary steps for the effectual destruction of thistles growing on the common, the expense of such work to be paid out of the common fund; provided that express authority for such expenditure be first obtained from the managers.

15. Persons taking to water on the Corack Common stock not duly registered in the books of the managers of the common must confine such stock to such roads or tracks (not being less than five chains in width) as may be from time to time prescribed and set out by the managers; and no notice shall be required to be given as regards such stock, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

16. The herdsman shall be responsible for the efficient carrying out of the regulations for the management of the common, and shall conform to any special instructions issued to him by the managers relative to the registration, custody, and delivery to the owners of the cattle thereon, and to the prevention of trespass thereon of animals for which no commonage fees have been paid, or which are not allowed to depasture as herein provided.

17. The herdsman shall pay all moneys received by him in depasturing or trespass fees, within ten days after receiving the same, to the treasurer of the shire, who shall then pay the same into the Bank of Victoria, St. Arnaud, or such other bank as may be from time to time appointed by the managers, to the credit of the managers of the said common.

18. The remuneration to be paid to the herdsman shall be taken out of the common fund, and shall not exceed seventy-five per cent. of all fees received.

19. The herdsman shall, before entering on his duties, provide a guarantee for the due performance thereof to the satisfaction of the managers to the amount of Twenty pounds.

20. Whenever in these regulations any act or thing is required to be done by the managers, it shall be considered to be well and truly done if done by any two or more of them duly appointed, from time to time, to act in their behalf.

21. The managers shall, within one month after the termination of each year, publish in a newspaper circulating in the district a certified account of their receipts and expenditure for the year, in the form prescribed in Schedule xxv. to the Regulations made by the Governor in Council on the 26th May 1873, and forward copy of such account to the Board of Land and Works.

22. Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

SCHEDULE OF FEES.

For each horse, Seven shillings per annum.

For each head of horned cattle, Five shillings per annum.

For each head of small cattle, Two shillings per annum.

For each pig, Six shillings per annum.

Progeny of horned cattle and horses, under six months old, if running with their mothers, free.

WALHALLA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WALHALLA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

(Made under the provisions of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, No. 201.)

1. All the charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground is broken or a vault re-opened.

2. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the fees set forth in the schedule.

3. Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, and that the relatives of the deceased were unable to pay the usual fees.

4. Order for interment to be given either to the sexton or at the office of the trustees at least eight hours previous to interment, when a form of instruction must be filled up and given to the sexton.

5. The sexton shall dig all ordinary graves, unless otherwise specially ordered, on payment of the proper fee. Parties requiring brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees.

6. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7. The usual hours for the performance of funerals shall be from sunrise to sunset until otherwise ordered.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owner.

9. Plan of every monument or headstone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.

10. Any person who shall wantonly and wilfully destroy, or do, or cause to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, in the said cemetery, will be guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof will be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, or at the discretion of the justices to imprisonment for any period not exceeding three months; and every person who shall do or cause to be done any injury to any such monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, shrubbery, tree, or plant, wantonly or otherwise howsoever, shall be liable to pay damages and compensation, which shall be recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction in the colony by the trustees of the said cemetery, or any person injured by such damage.

11. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

12. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined.

13. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration, from time to time, in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

14. No interment shall be less than six feet in depth for adults and children over seven years of age, nor less than four feet in depth for children under seven years of age.

No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Stawell has requested that certain streets in the said Borough of Stawell be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate in the Borough of Stawell, to be respectively public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :—

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Wimmera has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order re-subdivide the Shire of Wimmera into three several subdivisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

THE WEST RIDING.—Commencing at the most northern point of the River Glenelg; thence westerly along the boundary between the Shires of Wimmera and Kowree to its junction with the Shire of Lowan; thence northerly and easterly by the boundary between the Shires of Wimmera and Lowan to the River Wimmera; thence southerly by that river to its junction with the Norton Creek; thence southerly up the said creek to its source; and thence by a direct line to the commencing point.

CENTRAL RIDING.—Commencing at a point on the Wimmera River opposite a one-chain road which bounds allotment 17, parish of Dooen; thence to and by that road north-westerly to a three-chain road; thence by that three-chain road to a one-chain road running west through the parishes of Dooen, Vectis East, and Quantong, and forming the south boundary to Alfred Saunders' and R. Houston's selections, in the parish of Quantong; thence westerly by that road and a direct line to the centre of the River Wimmera, opposite the south-west angle of R. Houston's selection; thence southerly by the River Wimmera to Norton's Creek; thence up Norton's Creek to its source; thence by a direct line to the most northern bend of the Glenelg River; thence south-easterly by the northern boundary of the county of Dundas to the Grampian range; thence northerly by that range to Briggs' Bluff; thence by a direct line north-east to the Wimmera River; thence down the Wimmera River to the commencing point.

NORTH RIDING.—Commencing at a point on the Wimmera River opposite a one-chain road which bounds allotment 17, parish of Dooen; thence to and by that road north-westerly to a three-chain road; thence by that three-chain road to a one-chain road running west through the parishes of Dooen, Vectis East, and Quantong, and forming the south boundary to Alfred Saunders' and R. Houston's selections in the parish of Quantong; thence westerly by that road and a direct line to the centre of the River Wimmera opposite the south-west angle of R. Houston's selection; thence northward by the River Wimmera to the southern boundary of Lowan shire; thence east by the southern boundary of Lowan shire to Yarrambiack Creek; thence southward by Yarrambiack Creek to the River Wimmera; thence by the River Wimmera to the point of commencement.

And His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby further order that councillors be elected accordingly.

All previous subdivisions of the said shire are hereby and from henceforth abolished.

And the Honorable James Brown Patterson, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Order, amongst other things, altering, for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas it has been deemed expedient that a portion of the boundary-line between the

Shires of Benalla and Yarrawonga should be altered: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and adjust the boundaries of the said Shires of Benalla and Yarrawonga, and doth re-define the boundaries thereof respectively in manner following, that is to say:—

BENALLA SHIRE.—Commencing at the junction of the Goulburn and Broken Rivers; thence up the Goulburn River to the boundary of the Tallagaroopna run; thence north-easterly by the boundary of that run to the west boundary of the parish of Katandra; thence south by the west boundary of Katandra parish to the south-west boundary of that parish; thence east by the south boundaries of the parishes of Katandra, Yabba Yabba, Waggarandall, St. James, and Karabumet to the south-west angle of the parish of Boweya; thence north by the west boundary of the parish of Boweya to the north boundary-line of sections 23, 25, 24, 23, 22, 21, 20, and 19 in the parish of Boweya; thence east by that line to the west boundary of the parish of Killawarra; thence north by the west boundary and east by the north boundary of the parish of Killawarra to the Owens River; thence by the Owens River and Fifteen-mile Creek to the north boundary of allotment 6, section F, on that creek, and by that last boundary and the west boundaries of allotments 6, 5, 4, 3, and 2, and west and south boundaries of 1, all of said section F, and by said creek, to a point true east from the summit of Futter's Range where crossed by the Sydney road; thence to that crossing and by that range to the summit nearest to the source of the Fifteen-mile Creek; thence direct to the eastern source of King River as far as its western branch; thence by that western branch to its source; thence by the range dividing King and Holland Rivers from Broken River to the source of Back Creek; thence by Back Creek to Broken River; thence by Broken River to Sandy Creek, and by Sandy Creek to its source; thence by the range dividing Sandy Creek from Tallangalook Creek, continued to and by the south-west boundaries of Wangambeh and Killen runs, and by Prangil Creek and Goulburn River to the starting point.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

THE SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA.—Commencing at the south-east angle of the parish of Peechelba; thence northward by the Owens River to the Murray River; thence northward and westward by the River Murray to the north-west angle of the parish of Yarraweyah, being the point where meridian 145° 36' intersects the south bank of the Murray; thence south along the same meridian, being the west boundary of the parishes of Yarraweyah, Naringaningalook, Dumbulbalane, and Katandra, to the south-west angle of the last-named parish; thence east by the south boundaries of the parishes of Katandra, Yabba Yabba, Waggarandall, St. James, and Karabumet, to the south-west angle of the parish of Boweya; thence north by the west boundary of the parish of Boweya to the north boundary line of sections 26, 25, 24, 23, 22, 21, 20, and 19 in the parish of Boweya; thence east by that line to the west boundary of the parish of Killawarra; thence north by the west boundary and east by the north boundary of the parish of Killawarra to the Owens River at the south-east angle of the parish of Peechelba, being the commencing point.
