Note.—The increase during the quarter by excess of births over deaths was 2837, viz., 1295 males and 1542 females. The net increase by excess of arrivals over departures was 456, viz., 477 through excess of arrivals of males, from which must be deducted 21 through excess of departures of females. This is the first time since March 1876 that the departures of females exceeded the arrivals. The total increase of population was thus 3293, viz., 1772 males and 1521 females, as shown in the table. It must be borne in mind that the arrivals and departures referred to are by sea, and that no account is or can be kept of persons who come and go overland.

PHILLIPS'S PATENT, DATED 6TH SEPTEMBER 1865.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has issued the following Commission, in pursuance of the provisions of *The Patents Statute 1865*.

VICTORIA, by the Grace of God of the United  
Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen,  
Defender of the Faith:

To our trusty and well-beloved the Honorable ROBERT MOLESWORTH, and Sir REDMOND BARRY, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, two of our Judges of our Supreme Court of our Colony of Victoria; the Honorable ROBERT LE POER TRENCH, Q.C.; THOMAS SPENCER COPE, Esquire, Judge of the County Court of the City of Melbourne in our said Colony; and MORGAN AUGUSTUS McDONNELL, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, of the city of Melbourne aforesaid:

WHEREAS by *The Patents Statute 1865* it is enacted, among other things, that if any person who has obtained letters patent under the said Act or any other Act relating to letters patent theretofore in force in Victoria, or (in case such person shall have parted with his whole or any part of his interest by assignment) if such person, together with the assignee where part only has been assigned, or if the assignee alone where the whole has been assigned shall, six months before the expiration or other determination of such letters patent, present to the Governor in Council a Petition for the extension of the term in such letters patent mentioned, and shall set forth in such Petition that he or they has or have been unable to obtain a due remuneration for his or their expense and labor in perfecting such invention, and that an exclusive right of using and vending the same for some further period to be named in such Petition, in addition to the said term, is necessary for his or their reimbursement and remuneration, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to refer the consideration of the said Petition to commissioners to be appointed for that purpose in the manner thereinafter mentioned: AND WHEREAS by our letters patent bearing date the sixth day of September One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, under the hand of our trusty and well-beloved Sir Charles Henry Darling, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, at that time Governor and Commander-in-Chief of our said colony of Victoria, and sealed with the seal of the said colony, it was made known that we, of our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, did give and grant unto Charles Phillips, in the colony of Victoria, engineer, his executors, and administrators, and assigns, the special license, full power, sole privilege, and authority that he, the said Charles Phillips, his executors, administrators, and assigns, and every of them by himself and themselves, or his and their deputy or deputies, servants, or agents, or such others as he or they should at any time agree with and no others, during the term thereinafter expressed, should and lawfully might make, use, exercise, and vend "an invention for preventing accumulation of sand, shingle, and other obstructions at the entrances to navigable canals and other waters which open into the sea or estuaries of rivers, and for regulating the flow of drainage and other water into navigable canals, and for a novel construction of sluices, and certain applications of the sluices" within the said colony of Victoria and its dependencies, in such manner as to him his executors, administrators, and assigns, or any of them should seem meet, and that he, the said Charles Phillips, his executors, administrators, and assigns should, and lawfully might have and enjoy the whole profit, benefit, commodity, and advantage from time to time coming, growing, accruing, and arising by reason of the said invention during the said term of years therein mentioned, to have, hold, exercise, and enjoy the said licenses, powers, privileges, and advantages unto and by the said Charles Phillips, his executors, administrators, and assigns for and during, and unto the full end and term of fourteen years then next ensuing, subject, however, to the provisos and conditions in such letters patent contained: AND WHEREAS the said Charles Phillips did, on or about the third day of March One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, present a Petition to our right trusty and entirely beloved cousin and counsellor, His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of our Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; the then Administrator of the Government of the said colony in Council, praying for an extension of the term of such letters patent, which Petition is as follows:—

To His Excellency the Most Honorable the Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of Victoria, in Council:

The humble Petition of Charles Phillips, of Dandenong, in the county of Bourke, and colony of Victoria, engineer, sheweth that your Petitioner did obtain Her Majesty's royal letters patent for "an invention for preventing accumulation of sand, shingle, and other obstructions at the entrances to

navigable canals and other waters which open into the sea or estuaries of rivers, and for regulating the flow of drainage and other water into navigable canals, and for a novel construction of sluices and certain applications of the sluices," bearing date the sixth day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, granting to your Petitioner, his executors, administrators, and assigns, the sole right throughout the said colony and its dependencies for the term of fourteen years from the said date of making, using, and vending the said invention. Wherefore your Petitioner humbly prays that Your Excellency, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, will be pleased to take the premises into your favorable consideration, and will grant an extension of the term for the exclusive right of making, using, and vending the said invention for an additional period of fourteen years. MAAFU ROCK.

In consequence of information received from Henry Maafu, Roko Tui Lau, a rock has been found in lat. 17° 53' 50" S., long. 178° 55' 37" W., which has 18 feet of water over it at low tide. It is about 5 yards in diameter, and very difficult to see in fine weather. It breaks only in gales. The discolored water in its neighborhood indicates 6 and 9 fathoms, and the whole patch is not one cable in diameter. Probably this is the same danger as that shown as 2 fathoms in chart 2691, 7½ miles to the N.W. of the above position.

BORIEKU ROCK.

A coral patch, awash at low water, and about one cable in diameter, has been found in lat. 17° 13' 27" S., long. 179° 0' 7" W., 1½ miles N.N.E. of the small craft harbor at Kanacea.

DANGER MARK.

The east extreme of Kanacea, in line with the centre of Mago Island, bearing S. ½ E., leads over the rock. Bearings given magnetic. Longitudes depend upon Supreme Court, Levuka, being in 178° 51' E. (the meridian lately determined upon by the Hydrographer to the Admiralty.)

AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS OF THE COLONY OF VICTORIA FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st MARCH 1879.

MEMORANDUM.—The Agricultural Statistics in parts of the colony included within Municipal Districts are rendered by the Local Bodies in pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Statute. In other parts of the colony special collectors are employed by the Government. The returns should be sent in by the 31st March at the latest. There are, however, on every occasion, some districts in which the returns are much behind time, and there are others from which the work is forwarded in so imperfect and manifestly incorrect a condition that it becomes necessary to return it for amendment. As the work reaches this Department it is examined and kept written up, and the whole is forwarded for publication immediately on the receipt of the last return. The returns of the Shire of Portland are not quite complete. A few returns relating to large holdings in the Shire of Dundas have not been received; the figures of 1877-8 have therefore been substituted. Some slight alterations may possibly be made in the returns of one or two other districts.

GLENLOGIE COMMON.—REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF  
THE GLENLOGIE COMMON.

IN pursuance of the regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1879, the managers of the Glenlogie Common, having drafted the following regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council.

REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations, the words "large cattle" shall mean bulls, cows, heifers, oxen, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules. The words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats. Words importing the singular number shall mean and include the plural number, and words importing male persons shall include females.

#### SHIRE OF BALLARAT.

BYE-LAW No. VII.

*A Bye-law of the Shire of Ballarat made under the 213th section of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered vii., for the suppression of nuisances.*

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ballarat order as follows:—

1. No person shall leave any live animal in a dying state in or upon any public road or thoroughfare, or in or upon any Crown lands within the boundaries of the Shire of Ballarat.
2. No person shall slaughter or skin any animal in or upon any public road or thoroughfare, or permit the carcass of any

animal to remain in or upon any public road or thoroughfare, or upon any Crown lands, nor in or upon any lands, whether the same be public or private property, within the boundaries of the Shire of Ballarat.

3. The owner of any dead animal within the boundaries of the Shire of Ballarat shall immediately bury the same a sufficient depth beneath the surface of the soil, and shall cover the same with sufficient earth to prevent any effluvia arising therefrom dangerous to the health of the inhabitants.

4. In the event of any dead animal being left exposed in any place within the boundaries of the Shire of Ballarat, whether it be on public or private property, the council of the shire is hereby authorized and directed to instruct their Inspector of Nuisances to have the carcass buried at once, to prevent any effluvia dangerous to the public health arising therefrom.

5. The Council of the Shire of Ballarat, through their inspector, may summon the owner of such dead animal to the Court of Petty Sessions, and shall be entitled to recover all expenses incurred by the said shire council in burying the carcass of such animal, together with all reasonable costs, such costs to be adjudged by the adjudicating justices.

6. In the construction of this Bye-Law the word animal shall mean and include all horses, mares, geldings, fillies, bulls, cows, oxen, heifers, steers, calves, sheep, runs, ewes, goats, and swine.

7. No person shall deposit within the Shire of Ballarat any nightsoil, or other offensive matter, without the written consent of the council of the said shire.

8. Every person guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing Bye-Law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds sterling (£10), nor less than Five shillings.




