VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.—AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE RATE.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make, the following Bye-law for fixing the charges on agricultural produce to be carried by the railways vested in the Board, that is to say:—

The rates for agricultural produce, as fixed by the Goods Tariff dated 18th October 1878, are hereby cancelled, and the following are now substituted, viz.:—All articles in the agricultural produce class, as enumerated in the above-mentioned Goods Tariff, to be charged Three-halfpence per ton per mile between all stations within a radius of Melbourne of which Colac, Ballarat, Moolort, (*via* Castlemaine), Sandhurst, Euroa, and Traralgon, are the extremities; and between all stations outside of that radius One penny per ton per mile to be charged. One shilling per ton terminal to be added in all cases, and all the other conditions of carriage as specified in the above-mentioned tariff to remain still in force.

CLOSE SEASON FOR ENGLISH TROUT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act 1873* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might substitute other weights for the weights set opposite the names of every or any of the species of fish mentioned in the Second Schedule thereto, or for the weights substituted for any of such weights in any previous proclamation; and might prescribe for every or any of the species of fish in the Second Schedule mentioned a size less than which it should be unlawful to take, sell, or expose for sale, or possess fish of such species; and might for any species of fish prescribe a close season or close seasons in every year: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby prescribe the period from the first day of May to the thirty-first day of August in each year, both days inclusively, to be a close season for the fish known as "English Trout."

MELBOURNE INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION 1880.

THE subjoined Rules and Regulations are published in pursuance of sec. 4 of *The Victorian Exhibitions Act 1878*.

Rules and Regulations made by the Commissioners of the Melbourne International Exhibition 1880.

WHEREAS it is enacted by *The Victorian Exhibitions Act 1878* that a public Exhibition of works of industry and art shall be held in Melbourne in the year 1880: And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that the Governor in Council may from time to time appoint or remove such persons as he may think fit to be Exhibition Commissioners, one of whom he shall appoint to be President; and that on such appointment such Commissioners shall, for the purposes of the said Act, be a body politic and corporate by the name of the "Exhibition Commissioners": And whereas it is further provided that the said Commissioners, or a majority of them, at any general meeting assembled, shall have power from time to time to make, repeal, alter, and re-enact such Rules and Regulations as they may think fit for the purpose of providing for, among other things, the conduct of their proceedings, the due management of the affairs of the Exhibition in its several departments, and the manner in which all moneys received by the Commissioners shall be applied: And whereas His Excellency the Most Honorable the Marquis of Normanby, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria and its dependencies, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, did, under his hand and the Seal of the Colony, on the 20th day of March 1879, appoint certain persons to be Commissioners for the said Exhibition of 1880, and did also appoint one of them to be the President: Now, therefore, a majority of the said Commissioners have, at a general meeting assembled, made the following Rules and Regulations:—

1. *Meeting*.—The Commissioners shall meet once in every month, at a place and hour to be fixed in the notice of the meeting.

2. *Quorum*.—Seven members shall form a quorum. If that number be not present within half an hour after the time appointed for the meeting, the members present may adjourn to a particular day, and receive notices of motion for the next or any other day of meeting.

3. *Chairman to have a casting vote*.—At all meetings the President, or in his absence one of the Vice-Presidents, shall take the chair, and may vote; and, in case of equality of votes, shall have a casting vote. In the absence of the President and Vice-Presidents, the meeting shall elect their chairman, who may vote, and in like cases shall also have a casting vote.

4. *Notice to be given of meeting*.—The President, or one of the Vice-Presidents, shall have power to call a meeting at twenty-four hours' notice; and, on the receipt of the requisition of ten members, shall call a meeting on not less than twenty-four hours' notice.

5. *Minutes*.—All proceedings of the Commission shall be entered in a journal, and the first business at each meeting shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting, which shall, if necessary, be corrected, and when confirmed, be signed by the chairman.

6. *Notices*.—Notice of the business to be considered at each meeting shall accompany the invitation to attend, and may be delivered or transmitted by post within a reasonable time before the meeting.

7. *Receipts to be paid into bank*.—All receipts, income, and moneys, from whatever source received by or on account of the Commission, shall be paid forthwith into the Australian and European Bank Limited, or such bank or banks as the Commissioners may from time to time select, and shall be applied towards the building and management, in connection with the erection, maintenance, and holding of the Exhibition in 1880 and 1881.

8. *Finance Committee*.—The Finance Committee shall supervise the receipts and expenditure. No moneys shall be paid out of the bank unless the accounts for the expenditure shall have been passed at a meeting of the Finance Committee, and then only by cheque signed by the President, or one of the Vice-Presidents and two members of that Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary. No expenditure shall be sanctioned unless ordered by the Commissioners or by some committee under the authority of the Commissioners: Provided that the Commissioners may from time to time vote such sums as they think fit to Committees of the Commission for particular expenditure. But all such sums shall be expended only through the Finance Committee.

9. *Executive Committee*.—The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, the Vice-Presidents, and eleven ordinary members. The Executive Committee shall have full authority to execute all the functions of and exercise all the powers conferred upon the Commissioners; but such Committee shall report their proceedings from time to time to the Commissioners.

10. *Quorum of Committees*.—The President shall be a member of all Committees. Three members shall form a quorum of each Committee; and the rules which regulate the proceedings of the meetings of the Commission shall apply to meetings of Committees.

11. *Security by employés*.—All officers and employés of the Commissioners shall find security when entrusted with the moneys of the Commission.

12. *Rules may be amended*.—These Rules may be altered or amended or added to from time to time, by resolution of a majority of the Commissioners at a meeting to be held after due notice shall have been given.

13. *Notice to be given of any alteration*.—No resolution shall be considered at any meeting of the Commissioners, of which notice has not been previously given and circulated among the Commissioners.

Rules and Regulations for the Carlton Gardens.

WHEREAS it is enacted by *The Victorian Exhibitions Act 1878* that a public Exhibition of works of industry and art shall be held in Melbourne in the year 1880: And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that the Governor in Council may from time to time appoint or remove such persons as he may think fit to be Exhibition Commissioners, one of whom he shall appoint to be President; and that on such appointment such Commissioners shall, for the purposes of the said Act, be a body politic and corporate by the name of the "Exhibition Commissioners": And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that the land described in the First Schedule thereto, known as Carlton Gardens, shall be used for the said Exhibition of 1880, and that the Commissioners appointed to act in respect of such Exhibition shall have the exclusive possession and control of the said land until the 30th day of September 1881: And whereas it is further provided that the said Commissioners, or a majority of them, at any general meeting assembled, shall have power from time to time to make, repeal, alter, and re-enact such Rules and Regulations as they may think fit for the purpose of providing for, among other things, the temporary admission or exclusion of the public, or any individual, to and from the Exhibition, or buildings, or grounds, or any part thereof, and the behaviour to be observed therein: and it is therein declared that every person who shall be guilty of a breach or contravention of any such Rules or Regulations shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds: And whereas His Excellency the Most Honorable the Marquis of Normanby, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria and its dependencies, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, did, under his hand and the Seal of the Colony, on the 20th day of March 1879, appoint certain persons to be Commissioners for the said Exhibition of 1880, and did also appoint one of them to be the President: Now, therefore, a majority of the said Commissioners have, at a general meeting assembled, made the following Rules and Regulations:—

1. Except as hereinafter provided, during the erection of the buildings and the cultivation and preparation of the gardens, the public is hereby excluded until the 1st day of October 1880 from the grounds specified in the First Schedule to the Act No. 619.

2. Any person may freely pass through the gardens at any time, but no person shall enter any enclosure occupied by the contractors for the erection of any of the buildings or ornamental grounds required for the Exhibition unless authorized by the Commissioners or the Contractors.

3. No person visiting or walking through the grounds shall walk elsewhere than on the footpaths.

4. No person shall remove or damage any of the seats, lamps, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, lakes, fountains, aquaria, fish, or birds, or any other material or property in the above-named grounds; and no person shall throw stones or other missiles, or smoke, or light fires therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or litter, or refuse of any kind.

5. No person shall enter the grounds otherwise than by the public gates, or climb or jump over the seats or fences in and around the said grounds, or lie on the seats, or stick bills on the fences or on the gates, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same, or write, or print, or stick bills thereon.

6. No person shall bring into the grounds any horse or vehicle, or any dog unless such dog be held by a chain or cord.

7. No child under seven years of age shall be allowed in the grounds unless in charge of an adult friend or nurse.

8. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the said gardens or grounds any act of indecency, is hereby declared to be excluded from the said grounds, and may be forthwith removed therefrom by any Commissioner, or by any one authorized by a Commissioner, or any one in the employ of the Commissioners, or by any constable; and any such person shall also be liable to prosecution for a breach of these Regulations.

9. No persons except artisans, laborers, or workmen employed in the grounds shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the said grounds, and then only such plots as they may be employed in.

10. Any person who gains admittance to the grounds otherwise than as herein provided, or, being in, does not observe

these Rules and Regulations, shall be and be deemed to be excluded from the grounds, and liable to be prosecuted as for a contravention of the Rules and Regulations as the said Act directs.

11. Every Commissioner upon presenting his Commissioner's medal shall be deemed to be authorized by the Commissioners to enter and visit any part of the grounds or buildings, at any time.

No. 506, § 19, 38, and 49), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the sections of the Act above cited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Shire of Rutherglen therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Shire of Rutherglen the portion of the shire described in such petition and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the Shire of North Ovens; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Rutherglen as hereby diminished, and of the said Shire of North Ovens now added to, in manner following, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF RUTHERGLEN.—Commencing at the point of junction of the Ovens River with the Murray River; thence easterly by the River Murray to a point due north of the eastern boundary of the parish of Gooramada; thence south by the eastern boundary of the said parish to its south-east angle; thence west to the eastern boundary of the Wahgunyah Gold Field Common; thence by a direct line south to a point about (17) seventeen miles north of the junction of the western boundary of the Beechworth Shire with the Ovens River; thence by a line bearing west to the east boundary of allotments 28, 23, 22, 16, 15, 9 and 7, in the parish of Boorhaman; thence by the said east boundary north to the north-east angle of allotment 7, parish of Boorhaman; thence west by the north boundaries of allotments 7, 8, 5, 4, 3 and 1 of the same parish to the Ovens River; thence northerly by the Ovens River to the commencing point, excluding the Borough of Rutherglen.

No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Order, amongst other things, altering, for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of continuous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was also enacted that any error in any Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act might be rectified by the Governor in Council by any subsequent Order; And whereas it has been deemed expedient that a portion of the boundary-line between the Shires of Bet Bet and Avoca should be altered: And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of November last, the boundaries of the said shire of Bet Bet, so far as they were continuous with the said shire of Avoca, were incorrectly described, and it is expedient to adjust and re-define the said boundaries: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke so much of the hereinbefore-mentioned Order in Council of the twenty-fifth day of November 1878 as relates to the shire of Bet Bet, and doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said shire of Bet Bet and of the said shire of Avoca in manner following, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF BET BET.—Commencing at the centre of the Avoca River opposite the south-east angle of the Natte Yallock pre-emptive section; thence northerly by the Avoca River to the intersection of the north boundary of the Dunolly mining division; thence by that boundary N. 76° 30' E. to the trigonometrical station on Mount Moligul; thence north-easterly to the north-west angle of C. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the Government Gazette, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Heidelberg has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order subdivide the Shire of Heidelberg into three several subdivisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE CORINELLA CEMETERY.

- Interments.*
1. Application for interment must be made to the treasurer eight working hours before the time fixed for the interment.
 2. A form, in accordance with schedule A, must be signed by the applicant, and the fees paid at the time of making the application.
 3. The hours for interments are from Nine a.m. to Four p.m.
 4. The time named for the funeral must be that when the procession is at the cemetery.
 5. An extra fee will be charged for interments not in accordance with Rules 1 and 3.
- Digging Graves, &c.*
6. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, and no grave shall be less than six feet deep.
 7. Land for private graves or vaults may be purchased, when a certificate in form of schedule B will be given to the purchaser.
 8. Brick graves or vaults must be constructed under the direction of the trustees.
 9. The consent in writing of the owner of any private grave or vault must be produced at the time of applying for interment therein.
 10. Every coffin in a bricked grave or vault must be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of slate, stone, or iron.

Tombstones, Monuments, &c.

11. All applications to erect any railing, monument, or tombstone, accompanied with a plan or drawing of the same, must be made to the trustees, to whom a copy of any inscription proposed to be placed thereon must be submitted for their approval.
12. If such plan, drawing, or inscription be approved by the trustees, and all fees be paid, a certificate of permission in the form of schedule C will be given.
13. All monuments, tombstones, railings, graves, and vaults must be kept in proper condition and repair, to the satisfaction of the trustees, by and at the expense of the owners.

Burial of Poor Persons.

14. The fees for the burial of poor persons will be remitted on satisfactory evidence being given to the trustees that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the said fees.
15. No person in the employ of the trustees will be allowed to receive any gratuity.

Penalties for Damages.

16. The trustees will rigidly enforce the law against all persons damaging any of the property of the cemetery.
17. No dogs will on any pretence be allowed in the cemetery.

Forms.

18. A printed receipt in the form of schedule D will be given for all payments made to the trustees.

3. Orders will be supplied in turn, to be regulated by the post date upon the envelope enclosing the same; and when two or more orders shall bear the same date, then alphabetically.

4. When an order cannot be supplied in full, a refund shall be made to the person whose name appears in the deposit-receipt; but such refund shall be made only on the certificate of the Superintendent of the State Nursery, and shall be only for the amount named in his certificate.

5. The Superintendent of the State Nursery will pack, address, and deliver the trees at the Macedon railway station, unless any purchaser should elect personally to superintend the same, or should appoint another to do so in his behalf; but in such case no deduction in the prices will be made as an allowance for cost of packing.

6. All charges levied upon the trees subsequent to their delivery at the railway station, Macedon, shall be borne by the consignee.

7. This department will deliver the trees in good order at the Macedon railway station, but it will not undertake any liability in respect of the loss, miscarriage, detention, non-delivery, damage, or decay of the same subsequent to their delivery thereat.

The births of 572 children, viz., 289 boys and 283 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of April; they were 277 less than in the previous month, and 89 less than the average of April during the previous 4 years, irrespective of the increase of population.

The deaths registered in April numbered 483, viz., 288 of males and 195 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 89. The deaths were less than those in March by 96, but exceeded the average of April during the previous ten years by 65. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been only 11 greater than the average of those ten years.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 88.0° on the 5th, and the lowest was 41.0° on the 20th. The mean temperature of the month (59.9°) was nearly one degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (37.9°) took place on the 20th, viz., from a maximum of 79.0° to a minimum of 41.1°. The least range (7.2°) was on the 11th, viz., from a maximum of 61.3° to a minimum of 54.1°. The mean daily range was 20.30°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.092 inches) was nearly a tenth of an inch above the average.

Males and females contributed 60 and 40 per cent. respectively to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 43 per cent. to the total number of deaths as against 38 per cent. in April 1878; 40 per cent. in April 1877 and April 1876; 47 per cent. in April 1875; 32½ per cent. in April 1874; 42 per cent. in April 1873; 50 per cent. in April 1872; 49 per cent. in April 1871; 50 per cent. in April 1870; and 47 per cent. in April 1869.

Seventeen of the deaths recorded during the month were those of persons who had attained the age of 75 years and upwards, viz.:—Those of a female aged 75, who died of paralysis; a gardener and a laborer each aged 75, of old age; a female aged 76, of inflammation of the stomach; 2 females—a housewife and a servant—each aged 77, of paralysis and jaundice respectively; a contractor aged 78, and a female aged 80, of mortification and apoplexy respectively; a female aged 78, and a gentleman aged 80, of brain disease; a laborer and cabinetmaker, each aged 80, of old age; a horse-dealer aged 82, an engineer aged 84, and 2 females aged 83 and 85 respectively, of old age; and a commander in the Royal Navy, aged 85, of diarrhoea.

Fifteen deaths from external causes were registered during the month of April; of these twelve were set down as accidental, one as homicidal, and two to suicidal. The following are the particulars:—A child, aged 1, died of dislocation of the neck; a boy, aged 11, died of fracture of the leg; an old soldier, aged 56, and a pensioner, aged 65, were killed—the former through falling down a stairs in the Blind Asylum, and the latter through an accidental fall; a youth, aged 15, died of injuries to the head, occasioned by the bursting of a gun; a female child, aged 2, was burned to death, and a female, aged 42, died of scalds; a boy, aged 10, was accidentally drowned in a quarry-hole; a male, of occupation and age unknown, and a female, aged 47, were found drowned—the former in the River Yarra; and two female infants died of suffocation at birth (no evidence to show how caused). The homicidal death was that of a female infant, who was suffocated at birth. Of the suicides, a gold miner, aged 36, threw himself from a tree, and a market gardener, aged 55, hanged himself.

Eighty-three deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—45 in the Melbourne Hospital, 10 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 10 in the Alfred Hospital, 5 in the Lying-in Hospital, 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, and 1 in the Industrial Schools.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 217, of which 134, or 62 per cent., were of males; and 83, or 38 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 154 were under one year of age, 34 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 266. Of these, 154, or 57 per cent., were males, and 112, or 43 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 17 were between twenty-five and thirty, 23 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 18 were between forty and forty-five, 30 were between forty-five and fifty, 27 were between fifty and fifty-five, 16 were between fifty-five and sixty, 16 were between sixty and sixty-five, 16 were between sixty-five and seventy, 11 were between seventy and seventy-five, 8 were between seventy-five and eighty, 9 were upwards of eighty, and of 1 the age was unknown.

The decrease of 96 in the total number of deaths in April as compared with March, referred to in a former paragraph, was distributed under the five classes of disease, but chiefly under zymotic diseases. Under the latter class typhoid fever, which caused 28 deaths in April as against 34 in March, and diarrhoea, which caused 69 as against 38, were the most fatal diseases; as many as 15 deaths in April and 18 in March were ascribed to want of breast milk. As regards zymotic diseases, it will be observed by the last table that they caused nearly 26 per cent. of the total mortality; in the three previous months they caused 29, 32, and 27 per cent. respectively, and during the year 1878 the proportion was nearly 27 per cent. It seems discreditable that, in the absence of any particular epidemic, so fine a city as Melbourne should have so high a proportion from zymotic diseases—even greater than London, where, according to the returns of 1876, the proportion is scarcely 21 per cent. Phthisis caused 60 deaths in the month under review as against 62 in March and 43 in February. Deaths from diseases of the digestive organs decreased from 60 in March to 49 in April.
