STREET REDUCED IN WIDTH.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* it was amongst other things enacted that where any street or road in any municipal district exceeds one chain in width such street or road might, for any length thereof, be reduced in width to any width not less than one chain, and that the council of the municipality and the Board of Land and Works, and every owner of any land having a frontage to such street or road in any place where the same is so reduced in width, or in any place not more than three chains from any such place, might agree in writing, under the common seals of the municipality and the Board of Land and Works, and under the hand and seal of every such owner, upon a scheme for the reduction in width of such street or road for the length mentioned in such scheme, and for the disposal of the surplus land taken from such street or road, and as to the purchase-money to be paid by any such owners who might be allowed to purchase any of the surplus land, and as to the compensation, if any, not exceeding in the whole the amount of the purchase-money to be paid in respect of any land injuriously affected by such scheme, and the Governor in Council might by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such scheme, and thereupon any land mentioned in such scheme in

that behalf should cease to be a street or road, and all rights-of-way over the same should cease and determine; and it should be lawful for the Governor, on payment of the purchase-money for any surplus land to the Treasurer of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, to grant such land in accordance with the provisions of any such scheme in the manner prescribed by the said Act, and by warrant under his hand to direct payment of any such compensation out of the consolidated revenue, which is by the said Act appropriated for that purpose accordingly: And whereas a scheme has this day been submitted to the Governor in Council for reducing the width of a certain street or road called or known as Main street, passing through the village of Sandford, in the county of Normanby, in the shire of Glenelg, in the colony of Victoria: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the 367th section of the said in part recited Act, doth by this present Order confirm the said scheme for the reduction of the width of Main street, in the village of Sandford, in the county of Normanby, in the shire of Glenelg, in the colony of Victoria aforesaid, from three chains to one chain fifty links, as shown on a plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne, and in accordance with the said scheme under the hand and seal of the respective owners of land having a frontage to the said street, and agreed to by the Council of the shire of Glenelg aforesaid, and dated the nineteenth day of August One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON CONSTITUTED AND SHIRES OF ECHUCA AND BENALLA RE-DEFINED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of May 1879.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Act, the sum of Five hundred pounds, a shire; and it was also enacted that the Governor in Council might make Orders, altering, for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts, being shires, without any notice; and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, signed by not less than fifty inhabitants of the part of Victoria described in such petition (being a portion of the Shire of Echuca) each of whom possesses rateable property therein, praying that such part should be constituted a municipality by the name of the Shire of Shepparton: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Act and no counter-petition in opposition thereto has been presented: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make Orders constituting and describing a shire to be named the Shire of Shepparton, and defining the boundaries of the Shire of Echuca and the Shire of Benalla in manner following, that is to say:—

SHEPPARTON SHIRE DEFINED.

Commencing at the north-east angle of the parish of Strathmerton; thence south by the east boundary of the parish of Strathmerton, Katunga, Drumanure, and Congupna, to the south-east angle of the last-named parish; thence west to the south-east angle of M. Conway's 249-acre block; thence southward and south by a one-chain road to the Broken River; thence north-westerly down the Broken River to its junction with the Goulburn River; thence northerly down the Goulburn River to a point where it intersects the southern boundary of the main road from Echuca to Benalla; thence westerly by the southern boundary of the said road 28-09 links to the intersection of the eastern boundary of Redgum Flat reserve; thence by a line bearing $23^{\circ} 52'$ six hundred and ninety links to the centre of the Goulburn River; thence down the Goulburn River to the intersection of the west boundary of the parish of Kaarimba; thence north by the said west boundary to the south-east angle of the parish of Barwo; thence west to the south-west angle of the parish of Barwo; thence by the west boundaries of the parishes of Barwo and Yielima north to the Murray River; thence easterly by the Murray River to the commencing point.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a creek or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such creek or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

The Council of the said Shire of Shepparton shall consist of six members, and such municipal district is not yet to be subdivided.

ECHUCA SHIRE REDUCED.

Commencing on the Campaspe River at its junction with a road north of allotment 20 in the parish of Diggara; thence north-westerly by the centre of that road to the centre of the Murray River and Melbourne Railway; thence north-easterly to the junction of the Melbourne and Murray River Railway with a road in the parish of Diggara north of allotment 89; thence by that road westerly to the western boundary of the parish of Warragamba, at the north-west angle of allotment 68 in the said parish; thence south by the western boundary of allotment 68 to its south-west angle; thence by the south-western boundaries of portions 59 and 58, parish of Kamarooka, to the north-west angle of portion 58; thence south-westerly and west by the roads joining the northern boundary of portions 61, 33, 24, 21, and 20, in the last-named parish, to a point bearing magnetic north from a point in the road forming the eastern boundary of portions 125, 124, and 123 in the parish of Kamarooka, distant one hundred and seventy chains from the south-east angle of portion 125, parish of Kamarooka; thence by a line bearing magnetic north to Mount Hope Creek, and by that creek to its junction with the margin of Kow's Swamp, and by the eastern margin of Kow Swamp to its junction with a creek which bears from the said junction with Mount Hope Creek about twenty-nine degrees; thence easterly by the creek last reached to its junction with a creek running by Nanilla and Rowan's seventeen-mile hut; thence north-westerly by the last creek to join a creek leading easterly to the Murray River, called on old maps Yaluk Creek (the distances between the last four points of junction would be, if in straight lines, about 3, 5, and 3 miles respectively); thence by the River Murray north-easterly to the north-west angle of the parish of Yielima; thence by the west boundary of the parishes of Yielima and Barwo to the south-west

angle of the last-named parish; thence by its south boundary east to the north-west angle of the parish of Kaarimba; thence by the west boundary of the last-named parish south to the Goulburn River; thence up that river to a point due east of a road of which the centre is due north of the north-east angle of allotment 57 in the parish of Taripta; thence by a direct line due west to that road; thence south by the eastern boundaries of allotments 57, 68, and 79 to the centre of a road forming the south boundary of the parishes of Taripta and Tongala; thence by that road westerly to its intersection with a road forming the eastern boundary of the parishes of Koyuga and Timmering; thence by the centre of that road southerly to the centre of a road between allotments 40, 36, 35, 41, 33 on the north, and allotments 82, 80, 79, 76 on the south; thence by that road westerly to a road west of allotments 67 and 95 in the parish of Nancella; thence south by the centre of that road to the centre of a road south of allotment 106 in the same parish; thence west by the centre of that road south of allotment 106 to the south-east angle of Rochester Village Reserve, and by the south boundary of that reserve and the Campaspe River to the point of commencement, excluding the Borough of Echuca.

Echuca Shire—Moirs Riding re-defined.

Commencing at the confluence of the Rivers Murray and Goulburn; thence in a north-easterly direction by the River Murray to the north-west angle of the parish of Yielima; thence by the west boundary of the parishes of Yielima and Barwo to the south-west angle of the last-named parish; thence by its south boundary east to the north-west angle of the parish of Kaarimba; thence by the west boundary of the parish of Kaarimba south to the Goulburn River; thence in a north-westerly direction down the Goulburn River to the point of commencement.

SHIRE OF BENALLA.

Commencing at the junction of the Goulburn and Broken Rivers; thence up the Broken River to opposite a road forming the east boundary of portions 31, 53, 58, 71, and 72, parish of Shepparton; thence north by that road to the south boundary of the parish of Concepnna; thence east by the south boundary of the parishes of Concepnna, Katandra, Yabba Yabba, Waggarandall, St. James, and Karabumet to the south-west angle of the parish of Boweya; thence north by the west boundary of the parish of Boweya to the north boundary line of sections 26, 25, 24, 23, 22, 21, 20, and 19 in the parish of Boweya; thence east by that line to the west boundary of the parish of Killawarra; thence north by the west boundary and east by the north boundary of the parish of Killawarra to the Owens River; thence by the Owens River and Fifteen-mile Creek to the north boundary of allotment 6, section F, on that creek, and by that last boundary and the west boundaries of allotments 6, 5, 4, 3, and 2, and west and south boundaries of 1, all of the said section F, and by the said creek to a point true east from the summit of Futter's Range where crossed by the Sydney Road; thence to that crossing and by that range to the summit nearest the source of the Fifteen-mile Creek; thence direct to the eastern source of King River as far as its western branch; thence by that western branch to its source; thence by the range dividing King and Holland Rivers from Broken River to the source of Back Creek; thence by Back Creek to Broken River; thence by Broken River to Sandy Creek, and by Sandy Creek to its source; thence by the range dividing Sandy Creek from Tallangook Creek continued to, and by the south-west boundaries of Wangambehan and Killeen runs, and by Prangip Creek and Goulburn River to the starting point.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

And the Honorable James Brown Patterson, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506, § 19, 38, and 49), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to annex an outlying district forming with the municipal district of some municipality one continuous area to such municipal district; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the sections of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition under the municipal seal of the Shire of Avoca, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and

in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order annex to the Shire of Avoca the outlying district described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so annexed shall be attached to and form part of the South Riding of the said shire; and with the advice aforesaid doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Avoca as hereby added to, and also of the said South Riding and of the North Riding of the said shire, in manner following, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF AVOCA, AS INCREASED.

Commencing at the intersection of the road from Horsham to Navarre with the west boundary of the parish of Navarre; thence southward along road to allotment 20, section 9, parish of Crowlands; southward along the east boundaries of allotments 41, 46, 66, and 67 of section 9, and 16, 17, 19, 6, and 5 of section 7; south-eastward by the east boundaries of allotments P and O, section 3, and L G and L of section 2, and a direct line south to the south-west angle of the township of Crowlands; thence easterly by a direct line to the north-west angle of Hodgkinson's pre-emptive right; thence along the north boundary of said right to the centre of Bet Bet Creek; thence northerly by the Bet Bet Creek to its intersection with the north boundary of the Bung Bong township reserve; thence by that boundary west to the west boundary of the Bung Bong parish; thence north by the west boundary to the north-west angle of the parish of Bung Bong; thence by a direct line north-easterly to the north-east angle of allotment 14, section C, parish of Rathscar; thence north, by the west boundary of the parish of Wareek to the road from Natte Yallock to Maryborough; thence north-westerly by that road to a one-chain road forming the east boundary of C. Rowland's 19th section; thence north and north-westerly by that road to the Avoca and Dunolly road; thence north-easterly by that road to the northern boundary of the parish of Rathscar; thence northward, westward, and south by the northern and western boundaries of the parish of Rathscar to the north-east angle of W. G. McCulloch's purchased land; thence west by the north boundary of W. G. McCulloch's purchased land to the east boundary of T. Henderson's 19th section; thence south by the east boundary, west by the south boundary, and north by the west boundary of T. Henderson's 19th section to the north-west angle of said selection; thence further north by a direct line to a road forming the south boundary of A. J. Yates' and J. E. Taylor's 19th sections; thence by that road west to the Avoca River, and by that river northerly to the south-east angle of Natte Yallock pre-emptive right; thence by a direct line westerly to the commencing point.

Wherever the line so described [as aforesaid] runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

SOUTH RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of the shire of Lexton where it is intersected by the main dividing range of the Pyrenees; thence northerly by the said dividing range to a point due west of the north-east angle of the borough of Avoca; thence by a line due east to the western boundary of the parish of Bung Bong; thence south by the western boundary of the parish of Bung Bong to the north boundary of the Bung Bong township; thence east by the north boundary of Bung Bong township to Bet Bet Creek; thence southerly by Bet Bet Creek to the north boundary of Hodgkinson's pre-emptive right; thence west to the north-west angle of said pre-emptive right; thence by the northern boundary of the shire of Lexton westerly to the commencing point.

NORTH RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the main dividing range west of the north-east angle of the borough of Avoca; thence by the main dividing range northerly to the south boundary of the shire of St. Arnaud; thence easterly by the said south boundary to the south-east angle of that shire at Natte Yallock; thence by a direct line to a road forming the south boundary of J. E. Taylor and A. J. Yates' 19th sections; thence east by that road to a road bounding section 1, parish of Natte Yallock, on the east; thence south by that road to the south-west angle of T. Henderson's 19th section; thence east by the south boundary and north by the east boundary of the last-named selection to the north-west angle of W. G. McCulloch's purchased land; thence east by the north boundary of said purchased land to the west boundary of the parish of Rathscar; thence northerly, easterly, and southerly by the boundaries of the parish of Rathscar to the Avoca and Dunolly road; thence south-westerly by that road to a one-chain road forming the south-west boundary of — Venell's land; thence by that road south-easterly and south to the south-east angle of C. Rowland's 19th section on the Natte Yallock and Maryborough main road; thence by the said main road easterly to the north-east angle of portion 12, parish of Rathscar; thence south to the north-east angle of allotment 14, section C, parish of Rathscar; thence by a direct line south-westerly to the north-west angle of the parish of Bung Bong; thence south by the west boundary of the parish of Bung Bong to a point due east of the north-east angle of the borough of Avoca; thence west to the said north-east angle; thence by a direct line west to the commencing point.

And the Honorable James Brown Patterson, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
