REGULATIONS FOR THE TRANSMISSION OF GOODS TO THE SYDNEY INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION OF 1879 AND THEIR RETURN TO VICTORIA DUTY TREE.

THE following Regulations, which have been approved by the Governor in Council, in accordance with clause 11 of the Act No. 593, are published for general information.

REGULATIONS.

Goons forwarded to Sydney for exhibition in the International Exhibition of 1879 may be transmitted thither and re-intro-duced into Victoria duty free on the following conditions,

They must be shipped by the Victorian Commissioners for the said Exhibition, being duly entered out by them, with full particulars of contents of packages, values. &c.

Any goods so entered out, upon being shipped from Sydney for Victoria within 40 days after the closing of the said Exhibition, will be admitted duty free upon a certificate by the Secretary to the said Commissioners that such goods have been exhibited at such Exhibition and are identical with such goods exported.

DRAWBACK REGULATIONS.

TT is hereby notified for general information that His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to direct that hats (except straw) shall be added to the list of articles specified in Schedule I. to the Drawback Regulations of 4th December 1878, which came into force on the first January 1879; and that the rate at which drawback of duty paid on the importation of such hats may be paid on the exportation thereof shall be 13½ per cent.

He must possess one of the following qualifications:—Having matriculated at the Melbourne or other recognised University, passing in Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic; or, having passed the Civil Service Examination, including the subjects above named; or, he shall produce such a certificate to his competency in those three subjects as shall satisfy the Board of Examiners for Authorised Surveyors. He shall also, with such certificate, send in a specimen of his plan drawing.

Competitive Examination.

COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting, and plan drawing, when the four competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Board of Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

TERM OF SERVICE.

Term of Service.

The pupil's service in the department will be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing; 'he will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting from field-book and plan drawing. He will next be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

He shall afterwards attend for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

REMUNERATION.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £52; 2nd year, £52; 3rd year, £60; 4th year, £84.

CONDITIONAL SERVICE.

Conditional Service.

At the examination for authorised surveyors next ensuing after the completion of his attendance at the Observatory, or sooner if required, he shall present himself for examination. Should he successfully pass such examination he shall, if required, serve the department as a surveyor for one, year from the date of such examination, at a salary of £200 per annum; should he fail to pass he shall, if required, serve the department as a draughtsman and computer for one year from the date of such examination, at a salary of £150 per annum. If he shall pass at the next ensuing examination for authorised surveyors, he shall, if required, serve the department as a surveyor for the unexpired portion of the year (dating from the first examination), at a salary at the rate of £200 per annum.

The births of 792 children, viz., 407 boys and 385 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of June; in the month of May, 796 births were registered, or 4 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in June numbered 876, viz., 227 of males and 149 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 416. The deaths were less than those in May by 80, but exceeded the average of June during the previous ten years by 38. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been below the average of those ten years by 7.

. The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 59.8° on the 7th, and the lowest was 31.9° on the 23rd. The mean temperature of the month (47.0°) was nearly 3 degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (23.5°) took place on the 7th, viz., from a maximum of 59.8° to a minimum of 36.3°. The least range (53°) was on the 19th, viz., from a maximum of 32°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.054 inches) was a little above the average.

Sixty per cent. of the deaths registered during the month were of males, and 40 per cent. were of females. Twenty-seven per cent. were of children under 5 years of age as against 20 per cent. in June 1878; 38 per cent. in June 1877; 30 per cent. in June 1876; 32 per cent. in June 1875 and June 1874; 35 per cent. in June 1873; 42 per cent. in June 1872; 37 per cent. in June 1871 and June 1870; and 40 per cent. in June 1869

Seventeen persons are stated to have died at the age of 75 years or upwards. Of these, a costermonger, aged 75, and a laborer, aged 77, died of brain disease; a shopkeeper, aged 75, of pneumonia; a marine surveyor, aged 76, of congestion of the lungs; a sailor, aged 76, of hepatitis; a female, aged 77, of bronchitis; a laborer, aged 78, of paralysis; a merchant, aged 79, of apoplexy; a civil engineer, aged 80, a blues; a solicitor, aged 75, a laborer, aged 77, a clerk, aged 80, a barrister, aged 85, and four females aged respectively 83, 85, 86, and 89, of old age.

Only, 10 deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month of June, which is a number much below the average. Of these, 8 are set down as accidental, and 2 as suicidal. The following are the particulars:—A seaman, aged 30, died of fracture of the spine, caused by falling into the hold of a steamer; a widow, aged 48, of the effects of a fall from a cart; a plate-layer, aged 55, was accidentally killed by coming in contact with a railway engine; a clerk, aged 55, died of the effects of an overdose of opium taken medicinally to relieve pain; a lumper, aged 53, a night-watchman, aged 54, and a plasterer, aged 64, were drowned—the first in Hobson's Bay, and the second in the River Yarra; a male child, aged 4 months, was suffocated in bed. The suicidal deaths were those of a tallow-chandler, aged 49, who poisoned himself with strychnine; and of a horse-dealer, aged 36, who hanged himself whilst of unsound mind said to have been brought on by excessive drinking.

One hundred and one deaths, or 27 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—45 in the Melbourne Hospital, 10 in the Immigrants' Home, 3 in the Children's liospital, 7 in the Alfred Hospital, 6 in the Lying-in Hospital, 13 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Homeopathic Hospital.

[•] In cases where the minus sign (-) is prefixed to any number it implies that the deaths exceeded the births by that number.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 103, of which 70, or 68 per cent., were of males; and 33, or 32 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 53 were under one year of age, 15 were between one and two, 5 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 273. Of these, 157, or 58 per cent., were males, and 116, or 42 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 10 were between fifteen and twenty, 14 were between twenty and twenty-five, 15 were between twenty-five and fifty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty-five, 26 were between forty-five, 26 were between forty-five, 13 were between fifty and fifty-five, 19 were between fifty-five and sixty, 29 were between sixty and sixty-five, 13 were between sixty-five and sixty-five and sixty-five and fifty-five, 10 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 7 were upwards of eighty.

It is gratifying to note a further decrease in deaths from zymotic diseases from 106 in May to 65 in June, but it should be borne in mind that such deaths are nearly always least numerous in the winter season; in June 1878 the proportion to the total deaths was 17½ per cent, which is somewhat higher than in the mointh under review. Typhoid fever—the most fatul of these diseases during the last two months—caused 20 deaths in June as against 30 in May; the deaths from croup decreased from 14 in May to 9 in June; and those from diarrhoas from 25 to 2. The mortality from constitutional diseases was slightly less than and that from local diseases about the same as in the previous month; under the latter head an increase of 20, as compared with the previous month, appeared in diseases of the organs of circulation, but this was counterbalanced by a decrease of 12 in lung diseases, and 7 distributed under other causes. Fourteen deaths were ascribed to atrophy and debility in June as against 32 in May.


