## REGULATIONS FOR THE TRANSMISSION OF GOODS TO THE SYDNEY INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION OF 1879 AND THEIR RETURN TO VICTORIA DUTY FREE.

THE following Regulations, which have been approved by the Governor in Council, in accordance with clause 11 of the Act No. 593, are published for general information.

### REGULATIONS.

Goods forwarded to Sydney for exhibition in the International Exhibition of 1879 may be transmitted thither and re-introduced into Victoria duty free on the following conditions, viz. —

They must be shipped by the Victorian Commissioners for the said Exhibition, being duly entered out by them, with full particulars of contents of packages, values, &c.

Any goods so entered out, upon being shipped from Sydney for Victoria within 40 days after the closing of the said Exhibition, will be admitted duty free upon a certificate by the Secretary to the said Commissioners that such goods have been exhibited at such Exhibition and are identical with such goods exported.

### DRAWBACK REGULATIONS.

IT is hereby notified for general information that His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to direct that hats (except straw) shall be added to the list of articles specified in Schedule I. to the Drawback Regulations of 4th December 1878, which came into force on the first January 1879; and that the rate at which drawback of duty paid on the importation of such hats may be paid on the exportation thereof shall be 13½ per cent.

## PROCLAMATION OF A DISTRICT WHERE, PUBLICANS' LICENSES MAY BE SPECIALLY GRANTED REVOKED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation; And whereas it is expedient to revoke the proclamation hereinafter mentioned so far as it relates to Horsham: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the proclamation bearing date the eleventh day of March 1878, so far as it relates to the constitution of Horsham a district where publicans' licenses might be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act.

An applicant must be not more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age; he will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution and not affected with any physical infirmity which could interfere with the proper exercise of his profession.

He must possess one of the following qualifications:— Having matriculated at the Melbourne or other recognised University, passing in Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic; or, having passed the Civil Service Examination, including the subjects above named; or, he shall produce such a certificate to his competency in those three subjects as shall satisfy the Board of Examiners for Authorised Surveyors. He shall also, with such certificate, send in a specimen of his plan drawing.

COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting, and plan drawing, when the four competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Board of Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

TERM OF SERVICE.

The pupil's service in the department will be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing; he will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting from field-book and plan drawing. He will next be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

He shall afterwards attend for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

REMUNERATION.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £52; 2nd year, £52; 3rd year, £60; 4th year, £84.

CONDITIONAL SERVICE.

At the examination for authorised surveyors next ensuing after the completion of his attendance at the Observatory, or sooner if required, he shall present himself for examination. Should he successfully pass such examination he shall, if required, serve the department as a surveyor for one year from the date of such examination, at a salary of £200 per annum; should he fail to pass he shall, if required, serve the department as a draughtsman and computer for one year from the date of such examination, at a salary of £150 per annum. If he shall pass at the next ensuing examination for authorised surveyors, he shall, if required, serve the department as a surveyor for the unexpired portion of the year (dating from the first examination), at a salary at the rate of £200 per annum.

SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Civil Service of Victoria dated 31st of December 1866, or any subsequent substituted or additional regulations.

BONDS REQUIRED.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds of £150 each that he will duly and faithfully carry out his part of these conditions.

#### SHIRE OF ROSEDALE AND PROPOSED NEW SHIRE OF TRARALGON.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, §46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners are one hundred and thirty-six in number and purport to be inhabitant householders having rateable property within the area described, being the Traralgon Riding of the Shire of Rosedale, which area they desire to be severed and be constituted a new shire, to be called the "Shire of Traralgon," the boundaries whereof are thus described:—

"Commencing at a point in the centre of the Latrobe River, at the junction of Flynn's Creek with said river; thence westerly by the course of said river to the junction of the Morwell River with the said Latrobe River; thence south by the said Morwell River to a point due west of the source of Merrimen's Creek; thence east to a point due south of the source of Flynn's Creek; thence northerly by that creek to the commencing point."

The petitioners state that, owing to their isolated position and the distance from the centre of operations of the said shire, they cannot be fairly represented in the Shire Council, and as they possess nothing in common with the said Shire of Rosedale, they desire to form a separate shire.

That the assessable value of the property available for the purpose of rating in the proposed new shire exceeds the amount sufficient upon which to levy a rate amounting in the aggregate to the sum of Seven hundred pounds, on the basis of a rate of One shilling in the pound on the annual value, and they pray as follows:—

"And your petitioners pray that Your Excellency the Governor in Council will be pleased to grant the prayer of this petition, to the extent set forth, or to such extent as Your Excellency may seem fit, and to apportion all rights and liabilities on such severance as the justice of the case may require."

The births of 792 children, viz., 407 boys and 385 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of June; in the month of May, 796 births were registered, or 4 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in June numbered 376, viz., 227 of males and 149 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 416. The deaths were less than those in May by 80, but exceeded the average of June during the previous ten years by 33. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been below the average of those ten years by 7.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 59.8° on the 7th, and the lowest was 31.9° on the 23rd. The mean temperature of the month (47.0°) was nearly 3 degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (23.5°) took place on the 7th, viz., from a maximum of 59.8° to a minimum of 36.3°. The least range (5.3°) was on the 19th, viz., from a maximum of 52.2° to a minimum of 46.9°. The mean daily range was 10.4°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.054 inches) was a little above the average.

Sixty per cent. of the deaths registered during the month were of males, and 40 per cent. were of females. Twenty-seven per cent. were of children under 5 years of age as against 20 per cent. in June 1878; 33 per cent. in June 1877; 30 per cent. in June 1876; 32 per cent. in June 1875 and June 1874; 33 per cent. in June 1873; 42 per cent. in June 1872; 37 per cent. in June 1871 and June 1870; and 40 per cent. in June 1869.

Seventeen persons are stated to have died at the age of 75 years or upwards. Of these, a costermonger, aged 75, and a laborer, aged 77, died of brain disease; a shopkeeper, aged 75, of pneumonia; a marine surveyor, aged 76, of congestion of the lungs; a sailor, aged 76, of hepatitis; a female, aged 77, of bronchitis; a laborer, aged 78, of paralysis; a merchant, aged 79, of apoplexy; a civil engineer, aged 80, of ileus; a solicitor, aged 75, a laborer, aged 77, a clerk, aged 80, a barrister, aged 85, and four females aged respectively 83, 85, 86, and 89, of old age.

Only 10 deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month of June, which is a number much below the average. Of these, 3 are set down as accidental, and 2 as suicidal. The following are the particulars:—A seaman, aged 30, died of fracture of the spine, caused by falling into the hold of a steamer; a widow, aged 48, of the effects of a fall from a cart; a plate-layer, aged 55, was accidentally killed by coming in contact with a railway engine; a clerk, aged 55, died of the effects of an overdose of opium taken medicinally to relieve pain; a lumper, aged 53, a night-watchman, aged 54, and a plasterer, aged 64, were drowned—the first in Hobson's Bay, and the second in the River Yarra; a male child, aged 4 months, was suffocated in bed. The suicidal deaths were those of a tallow-chandler, aged 49, who poisoned himself with strychnine; and of a horse-dealer, aged 36, who hanged himself whilst of unsound mind said to have been brought on by excessive drinking.

One hundred and one deaths, or 27 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.—45 in the Melbourne Hospital, 10 in the Immigrants' Home, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Alfred Hospital, 6 in the Lying-in Hospital, 13 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Homœopathic Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 103, of which 70, or 68 per cent., were of males; and 33, or 32 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 53 were under one year of age, 16 were between one and two, 5 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 273. Of these, 157, or 58 per cent., were males, and 116, or 42 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 10 were between fifteen and twenty, 14 were between twenty and twenty-five, 15 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five, 16 were between thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 32 were between fifty and fifty-five, 19 were between fifty-five and sixty, 29 were between sixty and sixty-five, 13 were between sixty-five and seventy, 13 were between seventy and seventy-five, 10 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 7 were upwards of eighty.

It is gratifying to note a further decrease in deaths from zymotic diseases from 106 in May to 65 in June, but it should be borne in mind that such deaths are nearly always least numerous in the winter season; in June 1878 the proportion to the total deaths was 17½ per cent., which is somewhat higher than in the month under review. Typhoid fever—the most fatal of these diseases during the last two months—caused 20 deaths in June as against 30 in May; the deaths from croup decreased from 14 in May to 9 in June; and those from diarrhoea from 25 to 2. The mortality from constitutional diseases was slightly less than that from local diseases about the same as in the previous month; under the latter head an increase of 20, as compared with the previous month, appeared in diseases of the organs of circulation, but this was counterbalanced by a decrease of 12 in lung diseases, and 7 distributed under other causes. Fourteen deaths were ascribed to atrophy and debility in June as against 32 in May.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The wood is to be sound, and split out of large forest timber into billets 2 feet in length. For the Benalla and Maryborough Loco. Sheds it must be about 3 inches square, suitable for lighting engine fires; and for the other places it must be about 4 inches square, suitable for making steam.

2. Delivery of the firewood must commence on acceptance of tender, and proceed at the rate of at least 50 tons per week.

6. The Accountant, or such inspecting officer as he may appoint, shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the specification, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supply as to the quality or kind of timber, the same is to be decided by the Locomotive Superintendent, whose decision shall be final.

8. Irregularity in quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding Twenty-five pounds for each case, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. For each and every week's delay in the delivery beyond the time specified in this contract the Government shall be entitled to deduct, as and for liquidated damages, the sum of Five pounds sterling.

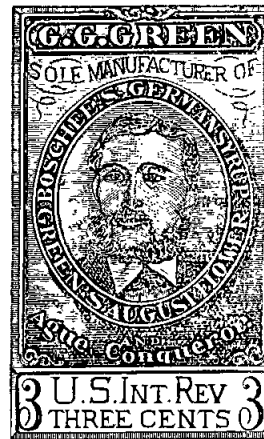
