WHEREAS by The Juries Statute 1876 (No. 560) it was amongst other things enacted that on any Court of Assize or of General Sessions or any County Court being appointed to be newly held, the Clerk of the Court of Petty Sessions held at or nearest to the Court House of such Assize, Sessions, or County Court town, and the clerks of all courts held elsewhere within the jury district of such Assize, Sessions, or County Court town, and all clerks, constables, sheriffs, and Courts of Petty Sessions should, in manner therein provided, and at and within the times and intervals which the Governor in Council should order, do, with respect to that district, all acts and things therein required to be by any clerk, constable, sheriff, or Court of Petty Sessions ordinarily done with respect to a jury district; and all jurors' books made out under the now reciting section should be brought into use, and the persons whose names were therein set down should be liable to serve immediately after such books should have been so made out; and the said books should be used until new books should have been completed under the provisions there-inbefore contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order the undermentioned times and intervals at and within which the provisions of Part III. of the said Statute are to be carried out with respect to the Jury District of the County Court appointed to be newly held at Kerang, that is to say:-

Section 15. Shire rolls to be sent to Sheriff before 3rd September 1879.

Section 17. Clerk of Petty Sessions to issue warrant to compiler before 8th September 1879.

Section 19. Compiler to prepare lists before 18th September 1879.

Section 20. Compiler to transmit lists to Sheriff before 20th September 1879.

Section 21. Compiler to sign and affix notices before 27th September 1879.

Section 22. Revision Court during the week ending 4th October 1879.

IMPORTATION OF NATIVE CATS FROM AUSTRALIA INTO NEW ZEALAND PROHIBITED.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the thirty-third clause of "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858," it is, among other things, enacted that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation of the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient that the importation of the goods hereinafter specified should be prohibited:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the said power and authority, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and proclaim that the importation into New Zealand of all native cats from Australia, whether known as tiger cats, or by any other name, shall be and the same is hereby prohibited.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this fifth day of August in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

The births of 739 children, viz., 385 boys and 354 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of July; in the month of June, 792 births were registered, or 53 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in July numbered 385, viz., 224 of males and 161 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 354. The deaths exceeded those in June by 9, and also exceeded the average of July during the previous ten years by 25. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of those ten years by 17.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 61'1° on the 30th, and the lowest was 31'0° on the 1st and 4th. The mean temperature of the month (46'2°) was more than 1 degree below the average, and was the minimum recorded for July during the last eleven years. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (24'9°) took place on the 2nd, viz., from a maximum of 56'9° to a minimum of 32'0°. The least range (4'9°) was on the 12th, viz., from a maximum of 50'9° to a minimum of 46'0°. The mean daily range was 15'4°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30'035 inches) was slightly below the average.

Of the deaths registered during the month 58 per cent. were of males, and 42 per cent. were of females. Twenty-nine per cent. were of children under 5 years of age as against 29 per cent. in July 1878; 33 per cent. in July 1877; 30 per cent. in July 1876; 29 per cent. in July 1875; 38 per cent. in July 1874; 36 per cent. in July 1873 and July 1872; 34 per cent. in July 1871; 39 per cent. in July 1870; and 37 per cent. in July 1869.

Twenty deaths of persons who had arrived at the age of 75 years or over were recorded during the month. The following are the particulars:—A laborer, aged 75, died of pneumonia; a widow, aged 75, of dropsy; another widow, at the same age, of bronchitis; a female, aged 75, of paralysis; a gardener, aged 76, of erysipelas; a female, aged 76, of pleurisy; a gardener, aged 78, of pneumonia; a married woman, aged 79, of rheumatic gout; a tent-maker (a patient in the Lunatic Asylum), aged 80, of brain disease; a farmer, aged 83, of bronchitis; a paper-maker, aged 84, of brain disease; a widow, aged 86, of bronchitis; a laborer, aged 75, a carpenter, aged 79, a laborer and two females, each aged 80, a female, aged 83, a laborer, aged 84, and a farmer, aged 87, of old age.

Twenty deaths, during the month of July, were ascribed to external causes. Of these, 18 are set down as accidental, and 2 as suicidal. The particulars of the accidental deaths are as follow:—A laborer, aged 27, died of injuries to the lung, caused by the upsetting of a spring-cart; a laborer, aged 33, died of shock and exhaustion resulting from an operation for fracture of thigh; a married woman, aged 39, was killed by a fall into the hold of a steamer; 2 laborers, each aged 42, died of fracture of the skull resulting from falls; a shipwright, aged 41, died of fracture of the skull caused by stone ballast falling on him; a laborer, aged 40, died of accidental fracture of the skull, how caused not stated; a female child, aged 2 years, died of compression of the brain, caused by "a blow from a horse"; a female infant, aged 4 days, died of an accidental injury to the head at birth; 2 girls, aged 4 and 8 respectively, died of burns, the latter through her clothes catching fire; a female, aged 28, died of the effects of a poisonous dose of morphia and chloral taken by mistake; a seaman, aged 25, and a tailor, aged 50, were found drowned; a seaman, aged 50, and a laborer, aged 74, were accidentally drowned in the River Yarra; a female infant, aged 2 months, and a male infant, aged 4 months, were suffocated in bed. The suicidal deaths were those of a cabman, aged 41, and of a butcher, aged 46, who hanged themselves whilst in a state of temporary insanity.

Eighty-eight deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—37 in the Melbourne Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 5 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 10 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 13 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Industrial School, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, and 1 in the Homœopathic Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 112, of which 65, or 58 per cent., were of males; and 47, or 42 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 85 were under one year of age, 12 were between one and two, 7 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 2 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 273. Of these, 159, or 58 per cent., were males, and 114, or 42 per cent., were females; 18 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 7 were between fifteen and twenty, 11 were between twenty and twenty-five, 14 were between twenty-five and thirty, 14 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 24 were between forty and forty-five, 38 were between forty-five and fifty, 21 were between fifty and fifty-five, 20 were between fifty-five and sixty, 26 were between sixty and sixty-five, 13 were between sixty-five and seventy, 14 were between seventy and seventy-five, 10 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 10 were upwards of eighty, and 1 was unspecified.

The number of deaths from Zymotic diseases was about the same as in the previous month; deaths from typhoid fever—the principal cause under that head—however decreased from 20 in June to 13 in the month under review. A decrease of 21 occurred under the head of Constitutional diseases, due to the exceptionally small number of deaths from phthisis in the month under notice, which was the lowest recorded in any month since February 1873; deaths from this disease rarely fall below 40, and generally average from 50 to 60 per month, but in the month under notice they only numbered 28. The deficiency, however, was fully made up by the increased number of deaths from lung diseases, viz. from 48 in June to 73 in July.

THE LEDCOURT STATE FOREST.—The proclamation bearing date the 18th January 1875 aforesaid, by which a reserve made for the preservation and growth of Timber, situate in the parish of Ledcourt, and comprising an area of Eighteen thousand five hundred and fifty-nine acres two roods five perches of land, was proclaimed, and which was in part revoked by another proclamation bearing date the 5th November 1877, is hereby further altered and revoked so far as it relates to the portion hereinafter described, viz.:- Sixty acres, more or less, county of Borung, parish of Ledcourt, being part of allotment 267: Commencing at a point on the right bank of Mount William Creek where the north boundary of the allotment abuts thereon; bounded thence by a road bearing east fifteen chains; thence by lines bearing respectively south twenty-four chains, and west to Mount William Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek downwards to the point of commencement. REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE BALLARK AND BUNGAL COMMON.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Ballan, having drafted the following regulations for management of the above-named common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles of the above-named common may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. All persons entitled to depasture stock on the above common shall be permitted to do so on payment, quarterly in advance, of the following fees, viz.:—

For every head of neat cattle ... 6s. per annum.
For every horse ... 10s. "
For every sheep or goat ... 8s. "

All stock under twelve months old will be allowed to depasture on the common on payment of half the fees specified.

3. All fees shall be paid to the herdsman, who will give a printed receipt for the same.

4. All stock to be depastured on the common must be delivered to the herdsman, and be entered in his book, and must be branded with the common brand with pitch or tar.

5. No sheep, goats, bulls, or entire horses shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the written consent of the Council of the Shire of Ballan.

6. The herdsman shall muster the cattle at such times as the council shall direct.

7. No person shall remove cattle or horses from the common without first applying to the herdsman.

8. Any diseased stock found upon the common shall be immediately removed; and any owner who shall neglect or refuse to remove such stock after receiving written notice from the herdsman to do so shall be liable for all expenses incurred by the herdsman in removing such stock.

9. The herdsman shall be and is hereby authorized to impound cattle, horses, or other stock or animals found trespassing on the common.

10. Any stock put on the common will be entirely at the risk of the owners, and must be the *bona fide* property of persons entitled to commonage.

Every person offending against any of these regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds for each offence.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE KATAMATITE CEMETERY.

BEFORE any interment shall take place application for permission shall be made to the secretary a reasonable time previously, when an order will be given to the applicant upon payment of the proper charges.

2. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees.

3. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary before sunset of the day previous to the burial.

4. The usual hours for interment will be from ten o'clock a.m. to six o'clock p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from ten o'clock a.m. to four o'clock p.m. during the other months of the year, except on Sundays, when the hours will be from two to five p.m. throughout the year.

5. The procession will be expected to arrive at the cemetery at the hour appointed for the funeral.

6. The trustees will permit vaults or graves to be dug, maintained, and kept as private burial places, and monuments or tombstones may be erected or placed therein in accordance with these rules and regulations.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act Amendment Act 1878* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might provide for the more effectual government, management, protection, and improvement of fish and any waters in which fishing might be carried on: And whereas it is expedient to prohibit netting in the under-mentioned lakes: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby prohibit the use of any kind of nets for taking fish in either Lakes Burrumbett, Learmonth, or Connewarre.
