MIDDLE CHANNEL, MORETON BAY.

VESSELS entering the Port by the Middle Channel must cross the East Banks with the Lighthouse on Cape Moreton, open to the southward of the Yellow Patch Lighthouse, a distance equal to one-third of the height of the Cape, and keep them in that position until nearing the Venus Bank Spit, when the line of lights must be crossed, and the spit rounded with the Cape Moreton Lighthouse open a similar distance to the northward. By following these directions a vessel will not have less than 16 feet at low-water.

ADDITIONAL RULE FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE ALFRED GRAVING DOCK AND PATENT SLIP.

THE following Rule, with reference to vessels requiring the use of the Dock or Patent Slip for a period of not less than Thirty days, which has been approved by the Governor in Council, is published for general information.

RULE.

SHOULD the Alfred Graving Dock or Patent Slip be engaged for the purpose of docking or slipping any vessel requiring extensive repairs for periods of not less than Thirty (30) working days, the Commissioner of Trade and Customs will decide whether any, or what, concession is to be allowed in the payment of the dock or slip dues. Vessels using the dock or slip, under this rule, shall be kept in such a condition as to be able to leave the dock or slip (if required for another vessel) within a period of Five days after notice has been given to leave, otherwise full rates or dues will be charged for every day the vessel remains in dock or on the slip after the date of notice has expired.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and might also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and might divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* might define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and might distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions should thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town, by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor might from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, the name of any such shire or borough, and might also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby alter the names of the Rivers Tarwin hereinafter referred to, and do proclaim that the names by which such Rivers shall

be distinguished and recognized shall be as follow, that is to say:—

1. The name of the River "Tarwin," which runs into the Koo-Wee-Rup Swamp, is hereby altered to that of "Tarago."
2. The name of the River "Tarwin," which runs into Corner Inlet, is hereby altered to that of "Bowgari."

"LANFRANKI'S TANK."

Regulations fixing the amount to be paid by persons using or carrying away water from that portion of the Reserve for Watering Purposes, in the parish of Darkbonee, known as "Lanfranki's Tank;" and for the care, management, and protection of the said portion of such reserve.

WHEREAS by a Regulation of the Board of Land and Works, made on the twenty-third day of September 1879, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud was duly appointed a Committee of Management of that portion of the land temporarily reserved by Order of the seventh day of February 1876 as a site for Watering Purposes, in the parish of Darkbonee, hereinafter styled "Lanfranki's Tank": Now therefore the said Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, having framed the following Regulations for the care, management, and protection of the said portion of such reserve, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*:—

Regulations.

1. Every person using or carrying away water from "Lanfranki's Tank" shall pay therefor to any person duly appointed by the Committee of Management in that behalf, and duly authorized to demand the same, the fees hereinafter specified:—

- I. For one hogshead of water taken away in any one day, Sixpence.
- II. For every hogshead of water after the first hogshead taken away in any one day, One shilling.
- III. For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Threepence.

2. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the said portion of such reserve, any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals, without the written authority of the Committee of Management, or their officer duly appointed.

3. No person shall climb or jump over, or break or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the said portion of such reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps and troughs attached thereto.

Every person offending against these regulations, or refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF MOUNT WARRENHEIP TIMBER RESERVE, MOUNT BUNINYONG PUBLIC PARK, AND LAL LAL PUBLIC PARK.

WE, John Whiteman Gray, Patrick Hogan, Henry Josephs, Peter Hedrick, and Davis Calwell, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the above-mentioned Timber Reserve and Public Parks, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*:—

Regulations.

1. The reserves shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on days set apart for public sports.
2. No person shall enter or remain in any of the reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage, in any way, the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserves.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserves, nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones therein.
5. No person shall light any fires in the reserves, nor erect any dwellings therein, nor any booth or other structure for the pur-

pose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first having been obtained.

6. No persons, except laborers or workmen employed in the reserves, shall enter any plots which may be enclosed or set apart within the reserves for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

7. No person shall put in the reserves any cattle, goats, or pigs, nor bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the written permission of the committee of management, and any person allowing cattle, goats, or pigs to trespass within the reserves shall be liable to be prosecuted under the provisions of *The Land Act 1869*.

8. All goats, pigs, and poultry, and all dogs, except as hereinbefore provided, found trespassing within the reserves may be destroyed.

9. No person shall enter the reserves on any day set apart for public recreation or sports, nor be permitted to bring any horses, carriages, or other vehicles therein, except on production of a ticket, issued by the committee of management, duly authorizing the admission of such person or persons, or of any horses, carriages, or other vehicles; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any buildings, erections, enclosures, plantations, or cultivated plots within the reserves.

10. All persons paying for admission to any of the reserves, or bringing therein any horses, carriages, or other vehicles, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which they shall upon demand produce, and, if required to do so, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand the surrender or production thereof.

11. Any person committing in any of the reserves, or in any of the buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall, together with any horses, carriages, or other vehicles in his or her possession or care, be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding that such person may have purchased and be in possession of a ticket of admission:—

1st. Being drunk or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language.

2nd. Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.

3rd. Trespassing upon any enclosures, plantations, or cultivated plots, or upon any portion of the grounds set apart for sports, or interfering with or interrupting any person engaged by the authority of the committee in carrying out any sports or amusements.

4th. Being found in any portion of the reserves, or in any building, erection, or enclosure for the time being thereon, and not producing on demand or surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand the production or surrender thereof a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the place wherein he or she may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the committee of management or any person deputed by them that he or she has paid the proper charge for admission to such place, and that the ticket of admission supplied to such person has been lost.

12. The maximum scale of charges for admission to any of the reserves, and to any buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon, on any days set apart for public sports, shall be as follows:—

1st. For admission of each person, such sum as may be determined by the committee of management not exceeding ... 1 0

2nd. For admission of each person to any stand, building, erection, or enclosure, such sum as may be determined by the committee of management not exceeding ... 1 0

3rd. For admission of each saddle-horse (exclusive of rider) such sum as the committee of management may determine not exceeding ... 0 6

4th. For admission of any carriage, cart, or other vehicle (exclusive of passengers) drawn by one horse or other animal, such sum as the committee of management may determine not exceeding ... 1 0

5th. For admission of any cart, carriage, or other vehicle (exclusive of passengers) drawn by two or more horses or other animals, such sum as the committee of management may determine not exceeding ... 3 0

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any public sports may be required to deposit any sum, not exceeding Ten pounds, which the committee of management may determine, by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure; and the committee of management may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such buildings, erections, stand, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserves or the buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against such regulations and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some

justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF RAYWOOD PUBLIC CEMETERY.

1st. All charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground or vault is opened.

2nd. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary the day previous, before 4 o'clock p.m.

3rd. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

4th. The usual hours for the performance of funerals will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., from September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. the remaining months of the year, except on Sunday, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from 2 to 5 o'clock throughout the year.

5th. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties requiring brick graves or vault will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees or their surveyor, or in case of interment to be made in any private grave or vault the consent of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6th. By the Act 27 Vict. No. 201, any person making a vault or erecting or placing monument or tombstone in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees and upon the payment of proper charges, is entitled to have maintained and kept up a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and their representatives for ever.

7th. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones, to be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the owner.

8th. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be cemented and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

9th. A drawing of every stone, tomb, fence, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet, proposed to be erected to be submitted to the trustees, who are empowered by the Act to withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and who are required to determine and fix the position of any monument having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner; and in the erection of tablets copper clamps must be used.

10th. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the charges.

11th. No person engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees shall be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

12th. The ground will be open to the public daily from sunrise to sunset.

13th. A plan of the cemetery will be kept at the office of the secretary for inspection.

14th. Any person who wantonly or wilfully shall destroy or do or cause to be done any damage to any grave, vault, monument, tombstone, or fence, or damage or remove any shrub, tree,

or plant, shall on conviction, before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, or be otherwise dealt with as the Act provides.

15th. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

16th. The dimensions of ordinary graves will be as follows, viz., 6 feet deep, 7 feet long, 2 feet 2 inches wide at the shoulders with other parts proportionate; in the event of any larger size being required due notice must be given, in default thereof the undertaker will have to enlarge the same at his own expense.
