The births of 726 children, viz., 373 boys and 353 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of July. In the month of June 823 births were registered, or 97 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in July numbered 465, viz., 256 of males and 209 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 261. The deaths exceeded those in June by 84, and exceeded the average of July during the previous ten years by 93. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, the excess over the average during those ten years will be reduced to 49.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 63·7° on the 27th, and the lowest was 29·0° on the 18th. The mean temperature of the month (46·9°) was nearly half a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (24·0°) took place on the 11th, viz., from a maximum of 56·0° to a minimum of 32·0°. The least range (6·1°) was on the 8th, viz., from a maximum of 54·9° to a minimum of 48·8°. The mean daily range was 15·9°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30·069 inches) was a little above the average.

Of the mortality during the month 55 per cent. was of males and 45 per cent. of females. Thirty-six per cent. was of children under 5 years of age as against 29 per cent. in July 1879 and July 1878; 33 per cent. in July 1877; 30 per cent. in July 1876; 29 per cent. in July 1875; 33 per cent. in July 1874; 36 per cent. in July 1873 and July 1872; 34 per cent. in July 1871; and 39 per cent. in July 1870.

Thirty deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were registered during July, viz.:—Those of a widow, aged 76, and a female aged 77, who died of dropsy; a hutkeeper, aged 76, of paralysis; two laborers, each aged 76, of congestion of the lungs and nephria; a bootmaker, aged 76, of hernia; a female, aged 76, of jaundice; a butcher, aged 76, and two females each aged 77, of heart disease; a tailor, aged 79, of apoplexy; a female servant, aged 79, a gentleman and a shepherd, each aged 84, of paralysis; a female, aged 80, of bronchitis; a nurse, aged 81, of insanity; a gentleman, aged 88, of dropsy; a female, aged 75, a female aged 76, two females, each aged 77, a female, aged 78, a laborer and a contractor, each aged 79, two females, each aged 85, a housewife, aged 88, a laborer, aged 92, a male, of occupation unstated, aged 93, and a female, aged 94, of old age.

Twenty-three deaths from external causes were recorded during the month, of which 17 were set down as accidental, and 6 as suicidal. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A station-manager, aged 75 was killed by an engine passing over him on the Flinders street tramway; a bricklayer, aged 48, died of injury to the head, and a shipwright, aged 54, of fracture of the skull, both resulting from falls; a female, aged 74, died of fracture of the femur; a bookbinder, aged 64, died from a wound in the heart caused by his falling on the point of an open knife which he had in his breast-pocket; a male infant, aged 1, died of severe scalds received through upsetting a coffee-pot; a male child, aged 5, and a widow, aged 49, died of burns; two seamen, aged 28 and 35, a stoker, aged 34, and a gentleman, aged 71, were drowned, the last in the Yarra; and three male infants, one aged 3 months, and two aged 4 months, and two female infants, aged 9 and 14 days respectively, were suffocated in bed. Of the suicidal deaths a plasterer, aged 54, shot himself; a gentleman, aged 23, and an ex-military officer, aged 49, poisoned themselves, the latter with arsenic; a carpenter, aged 25, a laborer, aged 37, and a tanner, aged 69, hanged themselves whilst of unsound mind.

One hundred and nine deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—58 in the Melbourne Hospital, 10 in the Immigrants' Home, 5 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Alfred Hospital, 6 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 9 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, and 4 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 168, of which 91, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 77, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 124 were under one year of age, 17 were between one and two, 14 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 297. Of these, 165, or 55 per cent., were males, and 132, or 45 per cent., were females; 13 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 8 were between fifteen and twenty, 13 were between twenty and twenty-five, 19 were between twenty-five and thirty, 23 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 24 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 28 were between fifty and fifty-five, 14 were between fifty-five and sixty, 17 were between sixty and sixty-five, 26 were between sixty-five and seventy, 20 were between seventy and seventy-five, 19 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 11 were upwards of eighty.

Increased mortality from all classes of diseases is shown by the returns of the month under review as compared with those of the previous one. Under zymotic diseases, measles caused 12 deaths in July as against 2 in June; and diarrhoea, which is invariably found to be present when measles prevail, caused 10 deaths against 3. Under the head of local diseases, deaths from pneumonia and from diseases of the stomach and bowels, both of which complaints are also usually found to be prevalent concurrently with measles, rose the former from 17 to 29 and the latter from 25 to 32. Under constitutional diseases, deaths from phthisis increased from 46 in June to 55 in the month under review.

INNER ANCHORAGE, FLAT-TOP ISLAND.

Two white beacons are now placed on East Point, which, when kept in line, lead clear of the reef running out to the northward of Flat-top Island. Two similar beacons are also placed on the S.W. end of Flat-top Island, which, when in line, lead clear of, and to the westward of the reef off Flat-top. These beacons will be lit up at night, when necessary.

Directions by Day.—Masters of vessels intending to anchor to the westward of Flat-top, should bring the white beacons on East Point in line bearing W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.; steer with these in line until two other beacons on Flat-top are also brought in line bearing S. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., then haul up and steer S. by W., until the lighthouse on Flat-top bears S.E.; a vessel can then anchor in not less than 18 feet at low-water springs. Coasters or steamers of light draught can proceed a little closer in, where they will get better shelter during south-easterly gales.

By Night.—Bring the two lights on East Point in line, and keep them in that position, until a light on the S.W. end of Flat-top Island opens out, then proceed as by day.

THE subjoined Rules and Regulations have been submitted to the Governor in Council, in accordance with section 9 of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864* (27 Vict. No. 201).

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the grave or vault is opened.
2. Orders for interment must be given to the secretary between the hours of Ten a.m. and Five p.m. the previous day.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and the probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
5. The usual hours for interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from the 1st September to the 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months of the year.
6. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.
7. Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person and his representatives for ever.
8. Application for such permission to be made to the secretary. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in the schedule.
9. As to ground in which the right of constructing any vault or place of burial has not been purchased, the trustees will cause the grave for the burial of the body of a person of the age of 12 years or upwards to be dug to a depth of 5 feet 6 inches, and the grave for the burial of the body of a child under the age of 12 years to be dug to the depth of 4 feet 6 inches; for any additional depth, the trustees will require the payment of Three pence for every cubic foot.
10. As to ground in which the right of constructing any vault or place of burial has been purchased, the trustees will require the vault or place of burial to be dug to the depth of not less than 6 feet; and such digging is to be done, and all mason's or bricklayer's work is to be performed, under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them, by and at the cost of the person possessing the right of constructing such vault or place of burial.
11. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owner.
12. The right to erect monuments, tombstones, gravestones, or tablets on purchased land to be left to the discretion of the trustees, and every monument, tombstone, gravestone, or tablet as to its design, and every inscription, must first be approved of by the trustees.
13. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.
14. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair, must be removed by order of the trustees, without notice to the owner.
15. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected.
16. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
17. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and, being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*.
18. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
19. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid to the person in charge when orders are given, or before the ground is opened.
2. Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge before Five o'clock on the day previous to the interment.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
4. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
5. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees through the person in charge. A certificate permission will be granted on payment of the proper charges.
6. All monuments, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair at the expense of the owner; and wooden fences, if not kept in repair, will be removed by the trustees, with notice to the owner.
7. A drawing of every tombstone, monument, or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission to erect any of these things which shall seem to them unbecoming or inappropriate, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected, appropriate to the ornamenting of the cemetery.
8. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees to be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
9. No graves to be of a less depth than six feet.
10. No vehicles (except that conveying the body), nor horses, allowed in the grounds unless in the case of invalids.
11. It is notified that any person wantonly or wilfully, or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, tombstone, building, erection, paling fence, shrubbery, tree or

plant in the cemetery, or be guilty of a misdemeanor and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Statute in that case made and provided.
