I, THE Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby declare and proclaim

FRIDAY THE 1ST OF OCTOBER NEXT

to be a Public and General Holiday throughout the colony.

REGULATIONS FOR VATTING, BLENDING, AND BOTTLING SPIRITS IN BOND FOR EXPORTATION.

(Act No. 503, Sec. 2).

IMPORTED SPIRITS may be vatted, blended, and reduced in strength in the warehouse for exportation, provided that all import marks, &c., on the casks into which they may be placed after such operation shall have been removed; or any such spirits, after blending, vating, &c., may be bottled for exportation, subject, in either of the above circumstances, to the following conditions:—

Applications shall be made in writing to the Collector of Customs, specifying casks, &c., the contents of which it is desired to blend, &c., and no labels, brands, capsules, nor seals will be per-

mitted to be used except such as may have been registered in the office of, and approved by, the Commissioner of Customs.

The spirits after having been racked, &c., to the casks, or bottled, will be re-gauged, and the strength thereof retaken. Duty on any loss which may arise during the operation must be paid immediately after the completion thereof in excess of one per centum of the number of gallons computed at proof vatted, &c. Any accidental loss will be dealt with under *The Customs Act 1857*.

No operation will be allowed under these regulations unless conducted under the supervision of an officer of Customs, to be paid for by the owner of the spirits.

The births of 811 children, viz., 415 boys and 396 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of August. In the month of July 726 births were registered, or 85 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in August numbered 413, viz., 210 of males and 203 of females: the births thus exceeded the deaths by 398. The deaths were less than those in July by 52, but exceeded the average of August during the previous ten years by 61. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, the excess over the average during those ten years will be reduced to 20.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 68.9° on the 16th, and the lowest was 36.0° on the 22nd. The mean temperature of the month (52.6°) was nearly three degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (25.0°) took place on the 24th, viz., from a maximum of 65.0° to a minimum of 40.0°. The least range (9.2°) was on the 10th, viz., from a maximum of 54.9° to a minimum of 45.7°. The mean daily range was 15.7°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.879 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Fifty-one per cent. of the deaths were of males and 49 per cent. were of females. Forty-three per cent. were of children who had not attained the age of 5 years as against 36 per cent. in August 1879; 31 per cent. in August 1878; 34 per cent. in August 1877; 32 per cent. in August 1876; 33 per cent. in August 1875; 30 per cent. in August 1874 and in August 1873; 33½ per cent. in August 1872; 45 per cent. in August 1871; and 40 per cent. in August 1870.

The deaths of 22 persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were registered during the month, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 75, a gentleman, aged 78, and a laborer, aged 84, of cancer; a clerk, aged 75, of cystitis; three females, each aged 75, a commercial traveller and a sailmaker, each aged 77, a female, aged 79, a clerk, aged 80, and a groom, aged 82, of bronchitis; a widow, aged 75, of apoplexy; a gatekeeper, aged 76, of heart disease; a female, aged 76, and a farmer, aged 78, of congestion of the lungs; a baker, aged 77, of gout; a patient in the Kew Lunatic Asylum, aged 77, of brain disease; a cook, aged 77, of pneumonia; a female, aged 78, of phthisis; a gardener, aged 80, of rheumatism; and a housewife, aged 83, of old age.

Fifteen deaths from external causes were recorded during the month, of which 13 were ascribed to accident, and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A girl, aged 11, died of fracture of the skull, caused by being run over; a baker, aged 43, died of injuries to the head, received through being thrown from a spring-cart; a clerk, aged 65, died of fracture of the thigh, occasioned by a fall downstairs; a gardener, aged 70, died of an injury to the head, the result of a fall; a boy, aged 3, died of scalds; a seaman, aged 33, a lumper, aged 38, a cooper, aged 54, and a gardener, aged 68, were drowned; 2 male infants, aged 14 days and 5 months respectively, and a female infant, aged 21 days, were suffocated in bed; a male infant, aged 1 day, died of injuries received during birth. Of the suicidal deaths, a gentleman, aged 24, shot himself; a brewer, aged 56, cut his throat; both were set down as laboring under insanity when they committed self-destruction.

Eighty-three deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—39 in the Melbourne Hospital, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Alfred Hospital, 7 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 5 in the Protestant Refuge, 3 in the Blind Asylum, and 1 in the Industrial Home.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 177, of which 86, or 49 per cent., were of males, and 91, or 51 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 84 were under one year of age, 51 were between one and two, 22 were between two and three, 15 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 256. Of these, 124, or 53 per cent., were males, and 112, or 47 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 16 were between fifteen and twenty, 15 were between twenty and twenty-five, 9 were between twenty-five and thirty, 12 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 19 were between forty and forty-five, 15 were between forty-five and fifty, 17 were between fifty and fifty-five, 22 were between fifty-five and sixty, 26 were between sixty and sixty-five, 12 were between sixty-five and seventy, 12 were between seventy and seventy-five, 17 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 5 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases increased from 61 in July to 88 in August. Under this head 63 deaths, or nearly three-fourths, were ascribed to measles, as against 12 in July, 2 in June, and 1 in May, making a total of 78 deaths from the beginning of the epidemic. Deaths from local diseases, however, fell from 240 in July to 194 in August, the diminution being due to deaths from affections of the heart and lungs; 49 deaths were set down to phthisis in the latter month as against 55 in the former. Deaths from old age fell from 16 to 2. Four deaths in the month under review were set down to the consequences of childbirth, or 1 death of a mother to every 203 children born.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following Bye-law for fixing the charges for the carriage of animals upon all railways vested in the Board (the late Melbourne and Hobson's Bay lines excepted), to take effect on after the 1st October 1880, that is to say:—

SHEEP.

Sheep Trucks.

1 to 150 miles	9d. per truck per mile.
(Maximum £4 8s. 6d. per truck, exclusive of terminal.)	
Over 150 miles	7d. per truck per mile.

Goods Trucks.

1 to 150 miles	6d. per truck per mile.

Over 150 miles	5d. per truck per mile.

In the event of the department not being able to supply sheep trucks, it does not undertake to provide goods trucks.

Sheep consigned to Sunbury, also sheep from stations on the Denilquin and Moama Railway consigned to Woodend, to be charged Melbourne rate.

For every sheep or lamb (not exceeding 84 lbs. each) up to 3, carried any distance not exceeding 24 miles, by goods trains only	2 0
And for each mile beyond that distance	0 1

Over 84 lbs. and not exceeding 126 lbs. each, rate and a half; over 126 lbs. double rate; the half sheep truck rate not, however, to be exceeded.

For every sheep or lamb (not exceeding 84 lbs. each,) any distance not exceeding 24 miles, in van of passenger or mixed trains	4 0
And for each mile beyond that distance	0 2

Over 84 lbs. and not exceeding 126 lbs. each, rate and a half; over 126 lbs., double rate.

Sheep or lambs sent in vans of passenger or mixed trains must be in skeleton cases, and weight of skeleton cases to be included in the weight of the animals. All skeleton cases must be of a reasonable size, so as not to occupy too much room in the vans, and the department may refuse any case deemed too bulky, when the sender must supply one of the required dimensions.

Over three and up to ten animals, half sheep truck rate, whether sent in sheep or goods trucks; over ten animals, full sheep or goods truck rate, according to order. In calculating distances between stations either side of Geelong, the full mileage *via* Geelong is taken.

The minimum charge for a sheep truck, or half a sheep truck, is 40s., and for a goods truck, or half a goods truck, 20s., exclusive of a terminal charge of 2s. per truck for sheep trucks, and 1s. per truck for goods trucks, to be added to the above rate in all cases.

The department undertakes no responsibility as to number, but a free pass will be issued at the station from which the sheep are sent to a drover to accompany the sheep. For every order of three trucks up to fourteen, only one single second-class pass will be issued, whether the trucks are forwarded by one train or by several trains. If only one drover is present for a train of twenty-eight trucks, then one pass only will be issued, but a second pass will be given at the station where the train is divided should a second drover present himself. Under no circumstances are passes to be issued to drovers unless they are actually present and travel in the same train with the sheep. These passes are issued for the single journey only. Orders for the conveyance of sheep will only be accepted on the forms provided by the department for the purpose.

CATTLE.

Cattle or pigs (in goods trucks) 1 to 150 miles, 9d. per truck per mile (maximum £4 8s. 6d. per truck, exclusive of terminal).

Cattle or pigs (in goods trucks) over 150 miles, 7d. per truck per mile.

The minimum charge for a cattle truck is 20s., exclusive of a terminal charge of 2s. per truck to be added to the above rate in all cases.

Over 100 lbs. each and not exceeding 150 lbs., rate and a half; over 150 lbs. and not exceeding 200 lbs., double rate.

Any animal over 200 lbs. will not be taken in van of passenger or mixed trains, but must be sent in ordinary truck by goods train, when the charge will be 6d. per mile each, or else full truck rate; minimum 20s., exclusive of terminal. Goats, pigs, or calves sent in vans of passenger or mixed trains must be in skeleton cases, and weight of skeleton cases to be included in the weight of the animals. All such skeleton cases must be of a reasonable size, so as not to occupy too much room in the vans, and the department

may refuse any case which may be deemed too bulky, when the sender must supply one of the required dimensions.

Over three goats or pigs, and up to ten, not exceeding 100 lbs. each, half truck, and over ten, or over 100 lbs. each, full truck rate. Goats and calves at cattle rate. In calculating distances between stations either side of Geelong, the full mileage *via* Geelong is taken.

HORSES.

For each mare, gelding, or filly, or entire under 3 years, carried any distance not exceeding 40 miles	20 0
And for each mile beyond 40 miles	0 6

Horses which have never been shod to be carried at cattle rates by goods trains only.

Not more than eight horses or heavy bullocks to be put in each truck. For each mare with foal at foot, and each cow with calf at foot, rate and half.

The minimum charge for a truck with horses is 20s., exclusive of a terminal charge of 2s. per truck to be added to the above rate in all cases.

By the 121st section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, the liability of the Board is limited as follows, viz.:—For any horse, £50; for any neat cattle, per head, £20; for any sheep, pig, or other small animal, per head, £1. Any person forwarding animals of a higher value than as above mentioned, and declaring their value at the time of booking, will, according to Bye-law XXXIX., be charged Five pounds per centum upon the value so declared above the respective sums so limited as aforesaid, and which percentage shall be paid in addition to the ordinary rate of charge.

No horses, cattle, or other animals are to be brought to the railway stations of the Board of Land and Works, except on the terms that the owner takes upon himself all risk of injury on its premises not arising from gross negligence on the part of the Board or its servants. And the Board is to be held free from all risk and responsibility in respect of any loss or damage arising on the loading or unloading, or from suffocation, or from being trampled on, bruised, or otherwise injured in transit, or from fire, or from any other cause whatsoever not arising from such gross negligence as aforesaid, or where the loss or injury arises wholly or partially from fear or restiveness; and all fastening in either horse-boxes or trucks must be done by the consignor, who will take the whole responsibility.

Horses, cattle, or other animals to be carried must be at the stations one hour before the departure of the train by which they are intended to be forwarded. And the Board does not undertake to forward horses, cattle, or other animals at or by any particular time or train. Not less than twenty-four hours' notice must be given when a horse-box is required, and 50 per cent. of the fare must be deposited when making the requisition. Such deposit to be forfeited if the horse or other animal does not arrive in time to be forwarded by the train appointed.

Rugs, bridles, saddles, or other trappings forwarded with horses or other animals are carried entirely at the risk of the owner, unless previously booked and paid for as parcels; and in any case the Board accepts no responsibility for damage done to these articles. Men travelling in horse-boxes or trucks, in charge of horses or cattle, to pay 2nd class fare.

DOGS.

Dogs will be charged for at the rate of One halfpenny per mile, and must be provided with chains or other sufficient means to secure them, otherwise the Board will not be responsible for their safety. Minimum charge for each dog, Sixpence.

NOTE.—In calculating the above rates, part of a mile will be charged for as a whole mile.

In calculating all of the above rates for truck loads, odd pence are to be added on to make the even Sixpence.

THOONA.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By the 19th section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864* any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and their representatives for ever.

3. Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, upon an order signed by a justice under the Act of the Parliament of Victoria numbered 310, or on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the charges.

5. Orders for interment must be given at the office of the trustees during the day previous to that on which it is intended to take place.

6. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, if requested, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults, or the friends of indigent or other persons, who wish to dig the graves themselves, are required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and, in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent in writing of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

8. No grave will be allowed to be re-opened for a further interment at a shorter interval than twelve years, unless the grave has been originally sunk to a depth sufficient to admit of such interment.

9. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

10. Until otherwise ordered, the hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months.

11. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones will be kept in proper condition and repair by the trustees, at the expense of the owners.

12. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, iron or redgum.

13. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription must be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 18th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the cemetery. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

14. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

15. The cemetery will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

16. The keeper has orders to turn out any person who shall behave indecorously or commit any trespass or injury to the trees, flowers, gravestones or erections, or otherwise infringe the Act of Parliament relating to cemeteries or regulation for protection of this cemetery; and such person shall be proceeded against and prosecuted according to law.

17. No dogs, horses, or cattle will be allowed in the cemetery, nor will smoking, nor the lighting of fires, be allowed therein, without the permission of the trustees.

18. The owners of any and all cattle or other animals which may be discovered or known to have been trespassing on or damaging the cemetery or fences, or any part thereof, or any erection whatsoever within the fence, will be prosecuted according to law.

19. A plan of the cemetery showing the position of the purchased and other graves is kept at the office, and may be inspected; and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

20. By *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, any person who shall wantonly and wilfully destroy, or do, or cause to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the said cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and, being convicted thereof, will be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds; or, at the discretion of the justices, to imprisonment for any period not exceeding three months. And any person who shall do, or cause to be done, any injury to any such monument,

vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, tree, fence, shrubbery or plant, whether the same shall have been done wilfully or wantonly, or otherwise howsoever, shall be liable to pay damages and compensation, which shall be recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction in the colony by the trustees of such cemetery, or any person injured by such damage.

21. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

to wit. } Proclamation by His Excellency The Right Honorable Lord AUGUSTUS WILLIAM FREDERICK SPENCER LOFTUS, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the county of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland: a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE EDUCATION ACT 1872."

THE Governor in Council has rescinded clause 3 (E) of section IX., and clause 5 of section XII. of the Regulations under *The Education Act 1872*, No. 447, from the 30th September 1880, and has made the following Regulations in lieu thereof; to take effect from the 1st October 1880:-

IX.—EXHIBITIONS.

3. (E.) That at the end of the fourth year of his tenure he shall have passed the 1st ordinary examination for a degree, or for the certificate of engineering; and at the end of the fifth year the second ordinary examination for a degree, or for the certificate of engineering.

XII.—TERMS UPON WHICH SCHOOL BUILDINGS MAY BE USED UNDER THE DIRECTION OF BOARDS OF ADVICE.

5. When school-rooms are used for religious instruction on school days, and immediately after the ordinary school hours, no charge will be made. When so used on other than school days, a fee of One shilling will be charged for each room, subject to the condition that the total charge shall not exceed Two shillings and sixpence, whatever the number of rooms used. This fee will be retained by the head teacher towards the expense of cleaning the rooms.

6. No charge will be made for the use of school-rooms for meetings of Boards of Advice or for elections.
