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DECLARATION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND RUSSIA RELATIVE TO THE DISPOSAL OF THE ESTATES OF DECEASED SEAMEN.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for the information of your Government, and for publication in the *Gazette* of the colony, a copy of a Declaration between this country and Russia relative to the disposal of the estates of deceased seamen of the two nations, which was signed at London on the 9th of the present month.

DECLARATION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND RUSSIA RELATIVE TO THE DISPOSAL OF THE ESTATES OF DECEASED SEAMEN OF THE TWO NATIONS.

Signed at London, 9th August 1880.

THE Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Government of His Majesty the Emperor of all the Russias, having judged it expedient to make arrangements for the disposal of the estates of seamen, being subjects of the one State, who shall die on board a ship or on the territory of the other State, have agreed as follows:—

ARTICLE I.

The estate of any Russian or Finnish seaman who shall die, either on board a British ship or at any place within British territory, shall, if not exceeding fifty pounds sterling (£50) in value, be delivered to the Russian Consul-General in London without being subject to any of the formalities usually required by English law on succession to property.

On the other hand, the estate of any British seaman who shall die, either on board a Russian or Finnish ship, or within Russian territory, if not exceeding three hundred and fifty silver roubles (350 roubles) shall be delivered to the nearest British Consul without undergoing any of the forms usually required by Russian or Finnish law on succession to property.

ARTICLE II.

If the deceased, a Russian subject, shall have served in the Royal Navy of Great Britain, any assets which may be payable by the British Admiralty shall be dealt with according to the law of Great Britain.

On the other hand, if the deceased, a British subject, shall have served in the Imperial navy of Russia, any assets which may be payable by the Russian authorities shall be dealt with according to Russian law.

ARTICLE III.

The term "seaman" in this Declaration includes every person (except masters and pilots) employed or engaged in any capacity on board any merchant-ship, or who has been so employed or engaged within six months before his death, and every person, not being a commissioned, warrant, or subordinate officer, or assistant engineer, borne on the books of, or forming part of the complement of, any public ship of war.

The term "estate" includes all "property, wages due, money, and other effects" left by a deceased seaman on board a ship.

The term "Consul" include Consul-General, Consul, Vice-Consul, and every person for the time being discharging the duties of Consul-General, Consul, or Vice-Consul.

ARTICLE IV.

The present Declaration shall be concluded for a term of three years, to date from the day of its signature. At the expiration of this term and of each successive term of three years it shall be continued for a further term of three years, unless one of the High Contracting Parties shall give notice for its termination one year before the expiration of any such term of three years.

In witness whereof the undersigned, duly authorized to that effect, have signed the present Declaration, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Le Gouvernement de Sa Majesté la Reine du Royaume Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, et le Gouvernement de Sa Majesté l'Empereur de Russie, ayant reconnu utile de régler de commun accord l'ordre à suivre pour la remise des successions des marins, sujets de l'un des deux Etats, qui seraient décédés à bord d'un bâtiment appartenant à l'autre Etat ou sur le territoire de ce dernier, sont convenus des arrangements suivants:—

ARTICLE I.

La succession de tout marin Russe ou Finlandais qui serait mort, soit à bord d'un navire Britannique soit sur un point quelconque du territoire du Royaume Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande et de ses Colonies, et ne dépassant pas la somme totale de cinquante livres sterling (£50) sera délivrée au Consul-Général de Russie à Londres sans requérir l'exécution d'aucune des formalités généralement exigées par la loi Anglaise pour la remise des héritages.

De même, la succession de tout marin Anglais, qui serait mort soit à bord d'un navire Russe ou Finlandais, soit sur un point quelconque du territoire Russe et ne dépassant pas la somme totale de trois cent cinquante roubles argent (350 rbls.) sera délivrée au Consul Britannique le plus rapproché, sans requérir l'exécution d'aucune des formalités généralement exigées par les lois Russes ou Finlandaises pour la remise des héritages.

ARTICLE II.

Si le sujet Russe, décédé, avait servi dans la Marine Royale de la Grande Bretagne, il sera procédé conformément aux lois de la Grande Bretagne par rapport à tout ce qui pourrait lui revenir de la part de l'Amirauté Britannique.

De même, si le défunt, sujet Anglais, avait servi dans la marine Impériale Russe, il sera procédé conformément aux lois de l'Empire de Russie par rapport à tout ce qui pourrait lui revenir de la part des autorités Russes.

ARTICLE III.

Le terme "marin," employé dans cette Déclaration, comprend toute personne (à l'exception des capitaines et des pilotes) employée ou engagée dans une fonction quelconque à bord d'un bâtiment marchand ou ayant été employée ou engagée de cette manière dans l'intervalle de six mois avant sa mort, et toute personne, n'étant pas un officier (commissioned officer), un officier subalterne, un officier fiscal (warrant officer), ou ingénieur mécanicien, inscrite sur les registres ou formant partie de l'équipage d'un bâtiment de guerre.

Le terme "succession" comprend toute propriété, salaires dus, argent et autres effets laissés par un marin décédé à bord d'un navire.

Le terme "Consul" comprend tout Consul-Général, Consul, Vice-Consul, et toute personne chargée, au moment donné des fonctions de Consul-Général, Consul, ou Vice-Consul.

ARTICLE IV.

La présente Déclaration est conclue pour trois ans et sera exécutoire à partir du jour de sa signature; à l'expiration de ce terme, elle demeurera en vigueur pendant trois années encore, et ainsi de suite, à moins de notification contraire, faite par l'une des deux Haute Parties Contractantes, un an avant l'expiration de chaque terme.

En foi de quoi les Soussignés, dûment autorisés à cet effet, ont signé la présente Déclaration en y apposant le cachet de leurs armes.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for the information of your Government, copies of a Treaty of Commerce and Navigation, dated the 5th of April 1880, which has been concluded between this country and Roumania, and of which the draft was communicated to you for the concurrence of your Government, in my Predecessor's Circular Despatch of the 5th of June 1878.

If your Minister's should desire, which however I do not anticipate to be likely, that the Colony under your Government should be exempted from the operation of the treaty, I have to request that you will inform me of their wishes as speedily as possible, in order that her Majesty's Government may take the necessary steps to procure the exclusion, under the Protocol which is annexed to the Treaty, of such Colonies as may desire it.

TREATY OF COMMERCE AND NAVIGATION BETWEEN HER MAJESTY
AND THE PRINCE OF ROUMANIA.

Signed at Bucharest { 24th March } 1880.
 { 5th April }

Ratifications exchanged at Bucharest { 30th June } 1880.
 { 12th July }

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and His Royal Highness the Prince of Roumania, being desirous of placing on a satisfactory footing the commercial and maritime relations between the two States, have, with this object, determined to conclude a Treaty of Commerce and Navigation, and have therefore named as their respective Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, William Arthur White, Esquire, a Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Her Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to His Royal Highness the Prince of Roumania;

And His Royal Highness the Prince of Roumania, M. Basile Boeresco, his Minister Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, Grand Cross of his Order of the Star of Roumania, Grand Cross of the Order of the Iron Crown, of the Order of the Crown of Italy, &c.;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

There shall be reciprocally full and entire liberty of commerce and navigation between the subjects of the two High Contracting Parties, who shall be free to establish themselves in each other's territory.

British subjects in Roumania and Roumanian subjects in the territories (including the colonies and foreign possessions) of Her Britannic Majesty shall, in conforming to the laws of the country, be at liberty reciprocally to enter, travel, or reside in any part of the respective territories, to carry on their business; and shall enjoy, in this respect, the same protection of their persons and property as that enjoyed by native subjects, or by the subjects of any third country the most favoured in these respects.

They shall be at liberty to exercise their commerce, and to trade, both by wholesale and by retail, in the whole extent of both territories, without being subjected, as to their persons or property, or with regard to the exercise of their trade or business, to any taxes, whether general or local, or to any imposts or conditions of any kind other or more onerous than those which are or may be imposed upon native subjects or the subjects of any third country the most favoured in these respects.

The rights, privileges, exemptions, and immunities of any kind enjoyed with respect to trade and commerce by the subjects of the High Contracting Parties, or which are or may be hereafter conceded to the subjects of any third Power, shall be extended to the subjects of the other.

British subjects in Roumania and Roumanian subjects in the territories (including the Colonies and foreign Possessions) of Her Britannic Majesty shall enjoy full liberty to acquire, possess, and dispose of, in the whole extent of the respective territories, every description of property which the laws of the country permit or may permit the subjects of any foreign nation to acquire or to hold.

They shall be at liberty to acquire and dispose of such property, whether by sale, donation, marriage, testament, or in any other manner whatever, under the same conditions which are or may be established with respect to the subjects of any other foreign nation, without being subject to any imposts, duties, or charges of any description whatever other or higher than those which are or may be levied on such foreign subjects, or on subjects of the country. They shall likewise be at liberty to export the proceeds of the sale of their property and goods in general, without being subjected, on such exportation, to pay as foreigners, any other or higher duties than those payable under similar circumstances by subjects of the country, or the subjects of any third Power the most favoured in these respects.

They shall be equally exempted from all official, obligatory, judicial, administrative, or municipal functions whatsoever. They shall likewise enjoy most-favoured nation treatment with respect to access to Courts of Law, and in the prosecution and defence of their rights, and in regard to domiciliary visits to their dwellings, manufactories, warehouses, or shops.

British subjects in Roumania and Roumanian subjects in the territories (including the Colonies and foreign Possessions) of Her Britannic Majesty shall be reciprocally exempted from all personal service, whether in the army, navy, or national guard, or militia, from billeting, from all contributions, whether pecuniary or in kind, destined as a compensation for personal service, from all forced loans and military exactions or requisitions.

The liabilities, however, arising out of the possession of real property, and for military loans and requisitions to which all the subjects of the State might be called upon to contribute as proprietors of real property, shall be excepted.

ARTICLE II.

The produce and manufactures of, as well as all goods coming from the territories (including the Colonies and foreign Possessions) of Her Britannic Majesty, which are imported into Roumania, and the produce and manufactures of, as well as all goods coming from Roumania, which are imported into the territories (including the Colonies and foreign Possessions) of Her Britannic Majesty, whether intended for consumption, warehousing, re-exportation, or transit, shall be treated in the same manner as, and, in particular, shall be subjected to no higher or other duties, whether general or municipal or local, than the produce, manufactures, and goods of any third country the most favoured in this respect. No other or higher duties shall be levied in Roumania on the exportation of any goods to the territories (including the Colonies and foreign Possessions) of Her Britannic Majesty, or in the territories (including the Colonies and foreign Possessions) of Her Britannic Majesty, on the exportation of any goods to Roumania than may be levied on the exportation of the like goods to any third country the most favored in this respect.

Neither of the Contracting Parties shall establish a prohibition of importation, exportation, or transit against the other, which shall not, under like circumstances, be applicable to any third country the most favoured in this respect.

In like manner in all that relates to local dues, customs formalities, brokerage, patterns or samples introduced by commercial travellers, and all other matters connected with trade, British subjects in Roumania and Roumanian subjects in the territories (including the Colonies and foreign Possessions) of Her Britannic Majesty, shall enjoy most-favoured-nation treatment.

ARTICLE III.

The Roumanian Government engage to modify and reduce, with respect to the following goods, the duties specified in the Tariff drawn up by the Mixed Commission which met at Vienna in conformity with Article IX. of the Convention of June 22, 1875, between Roumania and Austria-Hungary, that is to say:—

Art. 267. *Paints*, unprepared, common, unenumerated, prepared with oil, ground for painting houses, ships, &c., to which shall be added: and such as are imported in larger recipients than mentioned in Art. 266.

Reduction to	16 lei " "

Art. 345. *Felts*, of all sorts, as well as the following articles of felt: Soles, list-shoes, with or without soles (even of leather), as well as common felt hats for the use of peasants and soldiers.

Art. 376. *Cotton Twist*, single, grey or bleached, called in Roumanian *cretz*, *cretzisor* or *extra-cretz*.

ARTICLE IV.

The duties *ad valorem* provided for in the present Treaty shall be calculated on the value at the place of export, with the addition of the cost of transport, insurance, and commission necessary for the importation into the territories of the other Power as far as the port of discharge or place of entry.

The importer shall annex to his written declaration stating the value and description of the goods imported an invoice indicating the actual price emanating from the maker or seller. If the Custom-house authorities, within twenty-four hours after the declaration is presented, shall be of opinion that the declared value is insufficient, they shall be at liberty to take the goods on paying to the importer the price declared, with an addition of 10 per cent.

This payment shall be made within the fifteen days following the declaration, and any duty which may have been levied upon such goods shall be at the same time repaid.

ARTICLE V.

British subjects in Roumania and Roumanian subjects in the territories (including the Colonies and foreign Possessions) of Her Britannic Majesty shall enjoy the same rights as natives, or as are now granted, or may hereafter be granted, to the subjects of any third country the most favoured in this respect, in everything relating to property in trade marks and trade labels or tickets, as well as in patterns and designs for manufacturers.

It is understood that any person who desires to obtain the aforesaid protection must fulfil the formalities required by the laws of the respective countries.

ARTICLE VI.

Every reduction in the Tariff of Import and Export Duties, as well as every favour or immunity which may be granted hereafter by one of the Contracting Parties to the subjects, commerce, or navigation of a third Power, shall be granted simultaneously and unconditionally to the other.

ARTICLE VII.

British ships and their cargoes shall, in Roumania, and Roumanian vessels and their cargoes shall, in the territories (including the Colonies and foreign Possessions) of Her Britannic Majesty, from whatever place arriving, and whatever may be the place of origin or destination of their cargoes, be treated in every respect as national ships and their cargoes.

The preceding stipulation applies to local treatment, dues, and charges in the ports, basins, docks, roadsteads, harbours, and rivers of the two countries, pilotage, and generally to all matters connected with navigation.

Every favour or exemption in these respects, or any other privilege in matters of navigation which either of the Contracting Parties shall grant to a third Power, shall be extended immediately and unconditionally to the other party.

All vessels which, according to British law are to be deemed British vessels, and all vessels which, according to Roumanian law, are to be deemed Roumanian vessels, shall, for the purposes of this Treaty, be respectively deemed British or Roumanian vessels.

The coasting trade, however, is excepted from the preceding stipulations, and remains subject to the respective laws of the two countries.

ARTICLE VIII.

Each of the Contracting Parties may appoint Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, Pro-Consuls, and Consular Agents to reside respectively in towns and ports in the territories of the other Power. Such Consular officers, however, shall not enter upon their functions until after they shall have been approved and admitted in the usual form by the Government to which they are sent. They shall exercise whatever functions, and enjoy whatever privileges, exemptions, and immunities, are or may hereafter be granted there to Consular officers of the most favoured nation.

ARTICLE IX.

Any ship of war or merchant vessel of either of the Contracting Parties, which may be compelled by stress of weather, or by accident, to take shelter in a port of the other, shall be at liberty to refit therein, to procure all necessary stores, and to put to sea again, without paying any dues other than such as would be payable in a similar case by a national vessel.

In case the master of a merchant-vessel should be under the necessity of disposing of a part of his merchandize in order to defray the expenses he may have incurred, no impediment shall be opposed by the local authorities, the master being, however, bound to conform to the regulations and tariffs of the place to which he may have come.

If any ship of war or merchant vessel of one of the Contracting Parties should be stranded or wrecked upon the coasts of the territories of the other, such ship or vessel, and all parts thereof, and all furniture and appurtenances belonging thereto, and all goods and merchandize saved therefrom, including any which may have been cast into the sea, or the proceeds thereof, if sold, as well as all papers found on board such stranded or wrecked ship or vessel, shall be given up to the owners or their agents when claimed by them from the officers or functionaries, British or Roumanian, who may be, by the laws and orders of the Governments of their respective countries, entrusted with the protection, preservation, and custody of shipwrecked property. If there are no such owners or agents on the spot, then the said ship, and the above-named things and appurtenances, shall be delivered by the above-named officers or functionaries to the British or Roumanian Consul-General, Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent in whose district the stranding or wreck may have taken place, upon being claimed by him within the period fixed by the laws of the country; and such Consular functionaries, owners, or agents shall pay only the expenses incurred in the preservation of the property, together with the salvage or other expenses which would have been payable in the like case of the stranding or wreck of a national vessel.

It is, however, agreed that when the owner of the goods or merchandize, or his agent, not being present on the spot, shall be a native of the country in which the stranding or wreck may take place, and resident therein, the goods or merchandize which may belong to him, or the produce thereof, if sold, shall not remain in the power of the Consular functionaries, but shall be deposited according to the laws of the said country, in order to be handed over to whomsoever they may belong by right.

The goods and merchandize saved from the wreck shall be exempt from all duties of Customs, unless cleared for consumption, in which case they shall pay the same duties that they would have to pay if they had been imported in a national vessel.

In the case of a vessel being driven in by stress of weather, stranded, or wrecked, the respective Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular agents shall, if the owner or master, or other agent of the owner is not present, or is present and requires it, be authorized to interpose in order to afford the necessary assistance to their fellow-countrymen.

The intervention of the local authorities, when the owners, their agents, the captain, or the Consular functionaries are present, shall only take place for the purpose of maintaining order, of furthering the action of those persons, and of ensuring the execution of the rules to be observed for the entry and exit of the goods and merchandize saved, and for the realization of the duties when payable.

In case, however, of the absence, not only of the owner, captain, or other agents, but also of the Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents, and until their arrival, the local authorities shall make it their duty to take the necessary measures for the protection of the individuals, and the preservation of the effects wrecked.

ARTICLE X.

British Consular officers in Roumania, and Roumanian Consular officers in the territories (including the Colonies and Foreign Possessions) of Her Britannic Majesty, shall receive from the local authorities such assistance as can by law, or the provisions of Treaties with any third Power, be given to them for the recovery of deserters from the vessels of their respective countries.

ARTICLE XI.

The ratifications of the present Treaty shall be exchanged at Bucharest as soon as possible. It shall come into force immediately, and shall remain in force for ten years from the date of the exchange of ratifications. And in case neither of the two Contracting Parties shall have notified twelve months before the expiration of the said period of ten years its intention of putting an end to the present Treaty, it shall remain binding until the expiration of one year from the day on which either of the Contracting parties shall have given such notice.

In witness whereof, the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Treaty, and have affixed thereto their seals.
Done in duplicate, at Bucharest, the 24th day of March (o. s.) and the 5th day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

PROTOCOL.

Upon proceeding to the signature of the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation concluded this day between Great Britain and Roumania, the Plenipotentiaries of the two Powers have agreed as follows:—

The South African Colonies, having signified their wish not to be included in the stipulations of the said Treaty, they remain excluded from the operations of the same.

In a similar manner any British Colony or foreign Possession of Her Britannic Majesty shall have the option not to be included in the stipulations of this Treaty, provided notice to that effect is given within a period not later than six months after the ratifications of the Treaty, and the provisions of this Treaty shall not apply to any British Colony or foreign Possession of Her Britannic Majesty which shall have given such notice.

In witness whereof, the undersigned Plenipotentiaries have drawn up the present Protocol in duplicate form, to which, after it had been duly read, they affixed their signatures.

The births of 704 children, viz., 358 boys and 346 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of September. In the month of August 812 births were registered, or 108 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in September numbered 439, viz., 225 of males and 214 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 265. The deaths were more numerous than those in August by 26, and exceeded the average of September during the previous ten years by 115. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, the excess over the average during those ten years will be reduced to 77.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 77.2° on the 8th, and the lowest was 37.4° on the 26th. The mean temperature of the month (53.7°) was more than a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (30.9°) took place on the 5th, viz., from a maximum of 72.9° to a minimum of 42.0°. The least range (3.3°) was on the 6th, viz., from a maximum of 59.3° to a minimum of 56.0°. The mean daily range was 15.2°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.941 inches) was about the average.

Males contributed 51 per cent. and females 49 per cent. to the mortality registered during the month. Deaths of children under 5 years of age amounted to 36 per cent., as against 31 per cent. in September 1879; 30 per cent. in September 1878; 33 per cent. in September 1877; 28 per cent. in September 1876; 35 per cent. in September 1875; 25 per cent. in September 1874; 36 per cent. in September 1873; 31 per cent. in September 1872; 37 per cent. in September 1871; and 32 per cent. in September 1870.

The deaths of old people in the month under notice were above the average, as many as 21 having died at the age of 75 years or upwards, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 75, of obstruction of the bowels; a carpenter, aged 76, of rheumatism; a messenger, aged 76, and a gentleman, aged 77, of dropsy; a female, aged 76, of liver disease; a female servant, aged 77, of congestion of the lungs; a gentleman, aged 77, of kidney disease; a female, aged 79, of paralysis; a female, aged 81, of apoplexy; two females and a waterman, each aged 81, of bronchitis; a female, aged 82, of heart disease; a chairmaker, aged 85, of bronchitis; a female, aged 86, of cholera; a seaman, aged 95, of pneumonia; two females, each aged 80, a widow, aged 82, a copper-smelter, aged 79, and a teacher, aged 85, of old age.

Seventeen deaths were set down to external causes during the month under review, of which 14 were ascribed to accident, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A girl, aged 6, died of injury to the back, and a boy, aged 11, of injury to the abdomen, both the result of falls; a seaman, aged 31, was passed over by a train; a male child, aged 1, died from the effects of immersion in boiling water; two boys, aged 8 and 10 respectively, were drowned in the Yarra whilst bathing; a butcher, aged 23, was drowned in the flood waters at Emerald Hill; a barmaid, aged 30, a female, aged 35, and a painter, aged 58, were found drowned; two male infants, and a female infant, each aged 2 months, were suffocated in bed; a painter, aged 56, was choked with a piece of meat. Of those who committed suicide, a hawker and a perfumer, each aged 43, cut their throats whilst of unsound mind; and a gatekeeper, aged 57, hanged himself.

Eighty-six deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—47 in the Melbourne Hospital, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Benevolent

Asylum, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Industrial School, 3 in the Protestant Refuge, and 1 in the Homœopathic Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 159, of which 86, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 73, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 81 were under one year of age, 45 were between one and two, 16 were between two and three, 10 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 280. Of these, 139, or 50 per cent., were males, and 141, or 50 per cent., were females; 18 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 19 were between twenty and twenty-five, 19 were between twenty-five and thirty, 25 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 20 were between forty and forty-five, 19 were between forty-five and fifty, 35 were between fifty and fifty-five, 20 were between fifty-five and sixty, 18 were between sixty and sixty-five, 13 were between sixty-five and seventy, 10 were between seventy and seventy-five, 9 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 12 were upwards of eighty.

Under the head of zymotic diseases deaths from measles fell from 63 in August to 60. From the period of the first outbreak of this complaint to the end of the month under review, 138 deaths were caused by it in Melbourne and suburbs. Phthisis, which is classed as a constitutional disease, caused 65 deaths in September as against 49 in the previous month. Five deaths in September were set down to the consequences of childbirth, or 1 death of a mother to every 141 children born.

PROCLAMATIONS OF DISTRICTS WHERE PUBLICANS' LICENSES MAY BE SPECIALLY GRANTED REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Licensing Act 1876 (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation dated the second day of July One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, proclaiming the township of Shepparton, in the county of Moira, a district wherein publicans' licenses may be specially granted, and also the Proclamation dated the fourteenth day of June One thousand eight hundred

and eighty, so far as the same constitutes an area of a quarter of a mile radius from the Railway Station at Tatura, a district wherein publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act.

ADDITIONAL RULE UNDER "THE PATENTS STATUTE 1865."

WHEREAS by *The Patents Statute 1865* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, to make such Rules and Regulations as may appear to be necessary and expedient for the purposes of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following additional Rule, that is to say:—

NEW RULE.

In order to secure exact copies by photo-lithography, to prevent the necessity of reproducing by hand, drawings for the photo-lithographer, and to expedite the production of the annual indexes, the drawings, if any, accompanying specifications shall be made upon parchment or tracing cloth, and the following directions must be observed in making copies of drawings:—

The paper copy of drawings deposited in the Patent Office, Registrar-General's Department, Melbourne, must be made on good white smooth-surfaced drawing paper of the same dimensions (where possible) as the parchment drawing.

All the lines of the drawing must be absolutely black, and of the best quality, and should be allowed to dry without the use of blotting paper.

Any shading must be in the lines, clearly and distinctly drawn, and as open as is consistent with the required effect.

Section lines should not be too closely drawn. Black must be used for all purposes upon each drawing.

All letters and figures of reference must be bold and distinctly written.

The border line of the drawing to be one fine line only.

This drawing must not be folded, but must be delivered at the Patent Office either in a perfectly flat state or rolled upon a roller, so as to be free from creases or breaks.

In all cases where the original drawing is colored there must be deposited, in addition to the uncolored drawing, another copy colored.

The Attorney-General may, by order under his hand, upon good cause being shown to him, suspend the operation of this rule in any special case.

This rule to come into operation as regards Victoria, New South Wales, South Australia, Queensland, Western Australia, Tasmania, and New Zealand, on the 1st of January 1881, and as regards all other countries on the 1st of July 1881.

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act Amendment Act 1878* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor-in-Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might provide for the more effectual government, management, protection, and improvement of fish, and any waters in which fishing might be carried on: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of September One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine all persons (excepting aboriginal natives of the colony) were prohibited from fishing in Lake Condah or Lake Tyers, and the use of any trammell, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed, or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in the said lakes, was also prohibited: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the sixth day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty so much of the above-mentioned Proclamation was revoked as refers to Lake Tyers during the months of July, August, and September in any year: And whereas it is expedient that such prohibition should be further restricted: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby revoke so much of the Proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of September One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine as refers to Lake Tyers during the month of June in any year.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act 1873* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might define the limits of, and what waters should be deemed to be, and what should be deemed the mouth or other boundary of any river, creek, stream, bay, estuary, or lake, and might fix a distance from the mouth of any or every river, creek, or stream within which nets and fixed engines were not to be used: And whereas it is expedient to repeal so much of a Proclamation, dated 11th December 1876, as relates to Yarram Creek, excepting during the months of January, October, November, and December in each year: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby repeal so much of the Proclamation as is above mentioned.

PARISH OF LAEN.

RESERVE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Regulations following to be observed and enforced in respect of the Reserve for Water Supply purposes in the parish of Laen, known as "Dickeson's Tank."

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be under the control of the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud as a Committee of Management thereof.

2. Every person using or carrying away water from the reserve shall pay therefor to any person duly appointed by the Committee of Management in that behalf and duly authorized to demand the same, the fees hereinafter specified:—

i. For one hogshead of water taken away in any one day, Sixpence.

ii. For every hogshead of water after the first hogshead taken away in any one day, One shilling.

iii. For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Threepence.

3. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals without the written authority of the Committee of Management or their officer duly appointed.

No person shall climb or jump over, or break, or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps and troughs attached thereto.

Every person offending against these regulations, or refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before any justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
