SHIRE OF WIMMERA.—SPECIAL AUDIT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-second day of November 1880.

WHEREAS certain ratepayers of the Shire of Wimmera petitioned for a Special Audit of the accounts of that shire, and the Governor in Council did, by Order made on the twenty-first day of June, One thousand eight hundred and eighty, appoint William Downing and Humphrey Joseph Bloomfield to make such audit: And whereas the said auditors so appointed have certified that certain moneys—viz., Eight hundred and fifty-eight pounds eighteen shillings and four pence—forming portion of the municipal fund of the said shire, has been wilfully misapplied to purposes not authorized by law, the particulars of which are set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed: Now therefore the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of section 207 of *The Local Government Act 1874*, doth hereby confirm the subjoined certificates, save and except an item of Two pounds twelve shillings set forth in certificate marked "C" in the said schedule, which is hereby disallowed; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth direct that the sum of One hundred and forty-four pounds fifteen shillings be paid out of the municipal fund to the said William Downing, and the sum of One hundred and forty-four pounds seven shillings and nine pence to the said Humphrey Joseph Bloomfield, as costs and expenses of and connected with such audit; and that the sum of Thirty pounds deposited as security by the said petitioners for costs and expenses of such audit be returned to the persons depositing the same.
