BANK HOLIDAYS AT DIVERS PLACES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of *The Bank Holidays Act 1873*, I, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint

FRIDAY THE 13TH OF FEBRUARY INSTANT

a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Chiltern;

MONDAY THE 16TH OF FEBRUARY INSTANT

to be observed as a Bank Half-holiday at Ballarat and Sebastopol, from the hour of Twelve noon;

THURSDAY AND FRIDAY THE 19TH AND 20TH OF FEBRUARY INSTANT

to be observed as Bank Half-holidays at St. Arnaud and district, from the hour of Twelve noon.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty, and in the forty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.

POLLING-PLACES FOR ELECTORAL DISTRICTS.

At an Executive Council held at Kyeton, the twelfth day of February 1880.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Governor in Council.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the 73rd section of *The Electoral Act 1865*, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order revoke the appointment of Mirboo as a Polling-place for the Traralgon division of the Electoral District of South Gippsland, and of Mandurang for the Mandurang division of the Electoral District of Mandurang; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth make the following appointments, viz. :-

For the Electoral District of Benambra.

GUNDOWRING to be a Polling-place for the Yackandandah division;

SASSAFRAS CREEK to be a Polling-place for the Omeo division.

For the Electoral District of South Gippsland.

MIRBOO (Brennan's) to be a Polling-place for the Buln Buln division.

For the Electoral District of Ovens.

DRY CREEK to be a Polling-place for the Indigo division.

For the Electoral District of Wimmera.

COROMBY to be a Polling-place for the Longerenong division.
