The births of 708 children, viz., 370 boys and 338 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of November. In the month of October 711 births were registered, or only 3 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in November numbered 445, viz., 249 of males and 196 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 263. The deaths exceeded those in October by 62, and exceeded the average of November during the previous ten years by 67. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been in excess of the average of those ten years by 23.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 92.1° on the 18th, and the lowest was 40.2° on the 6th. The mean temperature of the month (58.9°) was half a degree below the average. The greatest range

of the thermometer in any one day (40°0') took place on the 28th, viz., from a maximum of 83°0' to a minimum of 43°0'. The least range (8°0') was on the 3rd, viz., from a maximum of 58°0' to a minimum of 50°0'. The mean daily range was 20°3'. The mean atmospheric pressure (29·852 inches) was above the average.

Fifty-six per cent. of the deaths registered during the month were of males and 44 per cent. were of females. Forty-one per cent. were of children under the age of 5 years as against 39 per cent. in November 1879; 35 per cent. in November 1878; 42 per cent. in November 1877 and 1876; 46 per cent. in November 1875; 47 per cent. in November 1874; 42 per cent. in November 1873; 48 per cent. in November 1872; 42 per cent. in November 1871; and 48 per cent. in November 1870.

Eighteen deaths of persons who had exceeded the age of 75 years were registered during the month, viz.:—That of a female, aged 75, of general anasarca; a male, of occupation unstated, aged 75, of phthisis pulmonalis; a gentleman, also aged 75, of renal disease; another, aged 77, of cancer of the tongue; a shoemaker, aged 77, of morbus cordis; a nurse, aged 78, of rheumatism and congestion of the lungs; a laborer, aged 80, of bronchitis and congestion of the lungs; a gentlewoman, aged 82, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 82, of serous apoplexy; another, aged 85, of dysentery; a gentleman, aged 89, of pneumonia; a female, aged 98, of cancer of the breast and fracture of the thigh; and a laborer, aged 76, a linendraper, aged 78, a female, aged 79, a tailor and a weaver, each aged 80, and a female, aged 87, of old age.

Of the deaths recorded during the month under notice, 16 are attributable to external causes, and of these 12 were accidental, 3 suicidal, and 1 was due to execution. The following are the particulars:—A carpenter, aged 30, died of injuries to the head, caused by being thrown from a cart; a slaughterman, aged 20, was killed by the wheels of a lorry passing over him; a seaman, aged 16, was killed by a fall from the rigging of a ship; a laborer, aged 33, died of accidental injuries to the head; a platelayer, aged 53, died of fracture of the skull; a trade assignee, aged 52, died of an injury to the arm, the result of a fall in a bath; a clerk, aged 27, was accidentally drowned; and a ship's steward, aged 23, was found drowned in Hobson's Bay; a female infant, aged 7 weeks, was suffocated in a perambulator; 2 newly-born male infants died of accidental injuries at birth; and a female infant, aged 2 days, died of umbilical hemorrhage. Of those who committed suicide—one shot himself; a hawker, aged 46, cut his throat; and a tailor, aged 61, hanged himself; all were stated to have been of unsound mind, induced in the last case by excessive drinking. The death by execution was that of the notorious bushranger, Edward Kelly, who was hanged in the Melbourne Gaol.

Eighty-nine deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—48 in the Melbourne Hospital, 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 4 in the Alfred Hospital, 7 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 182, of which 103, or 57 per cent., were of males, and 79, or 43 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 131 were under one year of age, 30 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 263. Of these, 146, or 56 per cent., were males, and 117, or 44 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 17 were between twenty and twenty-five, 20 were between twenty-five and thirty, 14 were between thirty and thirty-five, 26 were between thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty and forty-five, 16 were between forty-five and fifty, 31 were between fifty and fifty-five, 12 were between fifty-five and sixty, 23 were between sixty and sixty-five, 15 were between sixty-five and seventy, 12 were between seventy and seventy-five, 9 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 9 were upwards of eighty.

Under the head of zymotic diseases, measles caused only 6 deaths in the month under review, as against 26 in October; but deaths from dysentery and diarrhoea, on the other hand, increased from 11 in October to 40 in November. Since the outbreak of the epidemic in May, 170 deaths have occurred from measles—123 of which were recorded in August and September. Whether it be due to greater precautions being taken to prevent the spread of the disease, or to the time of year on the present occasion being more favorable for recovery it is satisfactory to notice that these numbers are considerably less than those relating to the previous epidemic of 1874-5, when over 700 deaths from measles were recorded in 6 months—the highest mortality being 271 in January 1875. Under the head of constitutional diseases cancer caused 16 deaths as against 10 in October; phthisis, 52 as against 60, and hydrocephalus the unusually high number of 15 as against 7. Under the head of local diseases, as compared with the previous month, an increase of 12 took place in deaths from diseases of the nervous system, and of 15 in those of the digestive system, but a decrease of 10 occurred in those from diseases of the respiratory system. Atrophy and debility was ascribed as the cause of 38 deaths—nearly all of young children—in November, as compared with 23 in October. Five deaths were set down to the consequences of childbirth, making a total of 16 deaths therefrom during the last 3 months.

WHEREAS by the Act numbered DII. the Courts of General Sessions of the Peace are to be held on such days as the Governor in Council shall from time to time appoint: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint that the Court of General Sessions of the Peace appointed by Order in Council of the sixth day of December 1880 to be held at Walhalla on the twenty-fourth day of May next ensuing shall be held at Walhalla on the twenty-third day of May next ensuing instead of on the aforesaid date; and with the advice aforesaid doth hereby revoke the appointment of the twenty-sixth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, for holding a Court of General Sessions at Daylesford appointed by the said Order of the sixth day of December 1880.

And the Honorable William Mountford Kinsey Vale, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## PORT AND HARBOR REGULATIONS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Passengers Harbors and Navigation Statute 1865 it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, by proclamation published in the Government Gazette, from time to time frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of ports in Victoria, and for the regulation of shipping in the same; and also for the due protection and preservation, and the good government and management of all public wharfs; and might appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and from time to time in like manner might alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby frame the following clauses 3, 5, and 6 as amended or substituted Port and Harbor Regulations to come into operation on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, in lieu of clauses 3, 5, and 6 of the regulations dated the twenty-sixth day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six and published in the Government Gazette of the fourth day of February of the same year which are hereby repealed.

## AMENDED REGULATION.

Clause 3. No person, except the Pilot and Health and Immigration Officers, and boatmen employed to convey them, shall, with any vessel or boat whatever, go alongside of, nor shall any person except the Pilot or the Officer of Health, board any ship from other than an Australasian port, when entering or within any port in Victoria, before she has been cleared by the Health Officer, nor in the case of ships carrying passengers shall any person on board leave such vessel before she has been so cleared by the Immigration Officer.

## SUBSTITUTED REGULATIONS.

Clause 5. The master or person in charge of any ship entering any port in Victoria is required to furnish the Health Officer, Pilot, or Immigration Officer with a written report of his voyage, cargo, and passengers, and such information relating to the same as may be required.

The Pilot, on boarding any vessel arriving at Port Phillip Heads from other than Australasian ports, shall deliver to the master or person in charge of such vessel a form of the Health Questions prescribed under Section 92 of The Amending Public Health Statute 1867, No. 264, relating to the health of the crew and passengers of such vessel; and shall carefully examine the written replies given to such questions by the master or person in charge of such vessel.

If it shall appear to the Pilot from the answers to such questions that such vessel arrived from, or touched at, any port which shall have been declared by the Governor in Council to be infected, under Section 86 of the Act No. 264, or that there is on board at the time, or has occurred on board during the voyage, any case of small-pox or any other form of eruptive skin disease, fever, plague, cholera, or any other dangerous, infectious, or contagious disease, the Pilot shall cause such vessel to be at once anchored as convenient as may be to the Sanatory Station Jetty, for inspection by the Health Officer.

In all other cases the Master, Pilot, or person in charge shall cause such vessel to be taken direct to the Port of Melbourne or

the Port of Geelong, as the case may be, for inspection by the Health Officer there.

Mail steamers carrying mails for the Western District which require to be landed at Queenscliffe will be inspected by the Health Officer before such mails are landed.

Clause 6. If and as soon as the Pilot finds, from the answers to the health questions, that it is necessary that the vessel be taken to the Sanatory Station for inspection, he is to hoist a signal, which signal shall be a yellow flag at the fore, and the Signal-master at Queenscliffe is thereupon to telegraph to the Health Officer at the Sanatory Station that a vessel requires health inspection.

Any vessel arriving at the Heads in the night-time, and requiring health inspection, shall be anchored in the Quarantine anchorage, Point Nepean, for inspection on the following morning.

As soon as the Health Officer places a ship in quarantine, the master or person in charge of such vessel shall forthwith cause a yellow flag to be hoisted at the mainmast head; and if a vessel shall be placed in quarantine by the Health Officer of the Port of Melbourne or the Port of Geelong, the master or person in charge of such vessel shall cause such vessel to be at once taken to the Quarantine anchorage at Point Nepean.

Vessels calling at Australasian ports on their way to Victoria, vessels from Australasian ports declared by the Governor in Council to be infected with dangerous disease, and vessels from Australasian ports having infectious or contagious disease on board at the time of arrival shall not be considered or deemed as coming from Australasian ports within the meaning of these rules, or of any former rules now in force made by the Governor in Council relating to Ports and Harbors in Victoria.

(net weight), including delivery at the stations and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied, the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender, it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Telegrams will not be entertained.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses be required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. 4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own accounts in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

7. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

8. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.

9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required; or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

11. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1881; and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
