## GRANT FOR THE PURCHASE OF BOOKS FOR MECHANICS' INSTITUTES OR PUBLIC LIBRA- RIES, 1879-80.

THE Committees for the Management of Mechanics' Institutes or Public Libraries claiming to participate in the grant of £3000 for the purchase of Books are hereby requested to send in their applications before 1st March 1880.

The conditions attached to the item in the Appropriation Act are as follow:—

I. That grants be made in proportion to the sum, in the aggregate not less than £5, collected by private subscription or local rates during 1879; provided that where the libraries are free the sum of the subscriptions and local rates shall be reckoned as of twice the amount received.

II. That no grant exceeding £200 be paid to any one library.

III. That no more than one-sixth of the entire sum be divided amongst institutions within ten miles of Melbourne.

## CAUTION TO PASSENGERS WITH REGARD TO THE EXEMPTION FROM DUTY OF PERSONAL LUGGAGE AND SECOND-HAND FURNITURE.

ORDER 80/7.

THE attention of passengers entering Victoria is called to the provisions of the Act 43 Vict. No. 646, sec. 5, as regards the exemption from duty of personal luggage and second-hand furniture, as follows:—

"Passengers' baggage, being cabin furniture and personal luggage; and second-hand furniture accompanying any passenger which has been in such passenger's own use, up to Fifty pounds in value, and which is not imported for sale."

It has been decided that this exemption applies merely to goods closely connected with the passenger, on the specific journey, not separated either in time or place. Passengers desirous of availing themselves of the exemption are therefore cautioned as to this circumstance, and that, unless the goods actually accompany the passenger, the Customs Department is unable to recognize any exemption.

WHEREAS by *The Juries Statute 1876* it was amongst other things enacted that every man residing in Victoria having attained the age of twenty-one years, and being a natural born or naturalized subject of the Queen, who being a householder should be rated on an annual value of One hundred pounds sterling in any city, town, or borough, or of Seventy-five pounds sterling in any shire, district, or place not within the limits of a city, town, or borough; or should have in his own name or in trust for him real estate in fee or for life of the value of Two thousand pounds sterling or yielding him the yearly income of One hundred pounds sterling, should, save as in the said Act excepted, be qualified and liable to serve as a Special Juror: Provided that if a sufficient number of Special Jurors could not be obtained for the Jury district of any Assize, Sessions, or County Court Town the Governor in Council might as regards the qualification of Special Jurors in that district reduce either of the said annual values from One hundred pounds and Seventy-five pounds sterling to any sum not less than Seventy-five pounds and Fifty pounds sterling, and might afterwards increase either of the said values to One hundred pounds and Seventy-five pounds sterling respectively: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order reduce the qualification of Special Jurors in the Jury district of the County Court Town of Omeo from Seventy-five pounds to Fifty pounds sterling.
