THE STAMP DUTIES ACT 1879.

43 VICTORIA No. 645, SECTION 25.

IT having been determined to discontinue the use of the die used for the One penny adhesive stamp, under *The Stamp Duties Act 1879*, and provide a new die to be used in lieu thereof, it is hereby notified that, on and after the 5th day of July, One thousand eight hundred and eighty, such new die shall be the only lawful die for denoting the duty chargeable in any case in which the discontinued die would have been used if it had not been so discontinued, and every instrument first executed by any person, or bearing date after the day so stated, and stamped with the discontinued die, shall be deemed to be not duly stamped:

Provided as follows—

(1.) If any instrument stamped as last aforesaid and first executed after the day so stated at any place out of Victoria, is brought to the Comptroller of Stamps within fourteen days after it has been received in Victoria, then upon proof of the facts to the satisfaction of the Minister the stamp thereon shall be cancelled, and the instrument shall be stamped with the same amount of duty by means of the lawful die without the payment of any penalty.

(2.) All persons having in their possession any material stamped with the discontinued die, and which by reason of the providing of such new die has been rendered useless, may at any time within six months after the day mentioned in such notice send the same to the Chief Office, and the Minister may thereupon cause the stamps on such material to be cancelled, and the same material, or, if the Minister thinks fit, any other material, to be stamped with the new die in lieu of and to an equal amount with the stamps so cancelled.

IT is hereby notified for general information that His Excellency the Governor in Council has directed that the declaration to be made by the exporter in respect to goods subject to *ad valorem* duties under paragraph 6 of the Drawback Regulations of 22nd January 1880, shall be as follows:—

ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

THE Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing date the 17th February 1880, intimated to the Governor of Victoria that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise Her power of disallowance in respect of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 43rd year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates of which are hereto subjoined, viz.:-

43 VICTORIA.

No. 635.—"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Eight hundred thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine and eighty." [Assented to 17th July 1879.]

No. 636.—"An Act to authorize the Construction by the State of a Line of Railway from Toolamba to Tatura." [Assented to 18th August 1879.]

No. 637.—"An Act to resume and apply to Railway purposes certain lands in the City of Melbourne." [Assented to 18th August 1879.]

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby authorize and appoint the person named in the schedule hereto annexed (being a servant or employé of the Board) as its agent for the purpose of carrying into effect (so far as applicable to each respective case) the undermentioned provisions of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, that is to say:-

Under the 128th section of the said Statute to seize and detain any person trespassing on any line of State railway, or on any State railway premises, whose name and residence shall be unknown to such agent, and to give such person in charge to a police constable, whose duty it is to bring the offender before a justice, and also to complain to any justice against such offender, and charge him with an offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*.

Also to complain to any justice against any person trespassing on any line of railway or on any railway premises for an offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and to summons such person before a justice and charge him with such offence.

The births of 755 children, viz., 366 boys and 389 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of March. In the month of February 569 births were registered, or 186 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in March numbered 509, viz., 269 of males and 240 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 246. The deaths exceeded those in February by 77, and were more than the average of March during the previous ten years by 30. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of those ten years by 15.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 91.0° on the 16th, and the lowest was 51.4° on the 15th. The mean temperature of the month (65.2°) was nearly two degrees above the average, and was exceeded only once in the last ten years. A similarly high temperature was noticed in the previous month. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (34.7°) took place on the 16th, viz., from a maximum of 91.0° to a minimum of 56.3°. The least range (5.6°) was on the 18th, viz., from a maximum of 67.9° to a minimum of 62.3°. The mean daily range was 17.0°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.889 inches) was nearly a tenth of an inch below the average.

Deaths of males during the month were in the proportion of 53 per cent., those of females in the proportion of 47 per cent. to the total mortality. Deaths of children under 5 years of age averaged 47 per cent., as against the same percentage in March 1879; 49 per cent. in March 1878 and 1877; 50 per cent. in March 1876; 58 per cent. in March 1875; 46 per cent. in March 1874; 49 per cent. in March 1873; 55 per cent. in March 1872; 52 per cent. in March 1871; and 47 per cent. in March 1870.

The number of persons who died at the age of 75 years or upwards was 22, viz.:—A laborer, aged 76, of cancer; a female, aged 76, of gangrene; a miner, aged 76, of cystitis; a civil servant, aged 76, and a widow, aged 78, of bronchitis; a miner, aged 77, of gastritis; a female, aged 77, of hepatitis; a wheelwright, aged 79, of ascites; a male of occupation unstated, aged 80, of brain disease; a fruiterer, aged 82, of apoplexy; a carpenter, aged 78, and a female umbrella mender, aged 88, of rheumatism; a carpenter, aged 75, a gardener, aged 76, a married woman, aged 79, a female, aged 82, a widow, aged 83, a female, aged 89, two laborers, aged 90, a female, aged 93, and a grocer, aged 97, of old age.

Seventeen deaths from external causes were recorded during the month, of which 12 were ascribed to accident, 1 to homicide, and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A fellmonger, aged 17, died of tetanus; a cab-driver, aged 32, of fracture of the skull caused by being thrown from a cart; a coachman, aged 50, of internal injuries the result of a fall; a male child, aged 3, was poisoned by eating bitter almonds; a married woman, aged 33, died of sunstroke; 2 boys, aged 5 and 9, of grooms, aged 23, and a laborer, aged 36, were drowned; a male infant, aged 15 days, was suffocated in bed; a cabman, aged 39, died of suffocation; and a male infant, aged 1½ hours, died of umbilical hemorrhage. The homicidal death was that of a male infant, just born, who was strangled by a piece of tape being tied tightly round the neck. Of the suicidal deaths, a watchmaker, aged 50, shot himself whilst of unsound mind; an accountant, aged 42, cut his throat; a photographer, aged 15, poisoned himself; and a waitress, aged 17, drowned herself.

Eighty-six deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—50 in the Melbourne Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 3 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Lying-in Hospital, 4 in the Benevolent

Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, 1 in the Industrial School, and 1 in the Homœopathic Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 240, of which 125, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 115, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 180 were under one year of age, 44 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 269. Of these, 144, or 54 per cent., were males, and 125, or 46 per cent., were females; 5 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 20 were between fifteen and twenty, 19 were between twenty and twenty-five, 17 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five, 23 were between thirty-five and forty, 11 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 32 were between fifty and fifty-five, 17 were between fifty-five and sixty, 21 were between sixty and sixty-five, 18 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy and seventy-five, 12 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 10 were upwards of eighty.

Under the head of zymotic diseases, a sudden increase from 15, in February, to 30 in the month under review took place in the number of deaths from typhoid fever. Under the same head the high mortality from diarrhoea, noticed in January and February, still continues, the deaths recorded from that disease numbering 54, 61, and 59 respectively in the last three months. Rheumatism also caused as many as 6 deaths in the month under notice. Under the head of constitutional diseases, the deaths from all the principal causes show increased numbers as compared with the previous month.—Those from cancer increased from 8 to 12, tabes mesenterica from 1 to 8, phthisis from 50 to 59, and hydrocephalus from 9 to 13. In the third class a great increase is noticeable in heart diseases, which caused 30 deaths as against only 14 in February. Diseases of the lungs, other than phthisis, principally bronchitis, caused 6 less than in February; but the fatality from diseases of the digestive organs was about the same in both months. Developmental diseases of children increased from 17 in February to 24 in March; and Atrophy and debility from 47 to 61, 52 of the latter number being of infants under one year of age. Five deaths were ascribed to the consequences of childbirth, making a total of 15 since the commencement of the year or 1 death of a mother to every 133 births registered.

PUPIL SURVEYORS AND DRAUGHTSMEN.

APPLICATIONS will be received, addressed to the Secretary of the Board of Examiners, up to Thursday, 10th of June next, from candidates desirous of being appointed as Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen, in connection with this Department.

CONDITIONS.

An applicant must be not more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age; he will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution and not affected with any physical infirmity which could interfere with the proper exercise of his profession.

He must possess one of the following qualifications:—Having matriculated at the Melbourne or other recognized University, passing in Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic; or, having passed the Civil Service Examination, including the subjects above named; or, he shall produce such a certificate as to his competency in those three subjects as shall satisfy the Board of Examiners for Authorized Surveyors. He shall also, with such certificate, send in a specimen of his plan drawing.

COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting, and plan drawing, on Monday, 14th June, when the three competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Board of Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

TERM OF SERVICE.

The pupil's service in the department will be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing; he will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting from field-book and plan drawing. He will next be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

He shall afterwards attend for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

REMUNERATION.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year £52; 2nd year, £52; 3rd year £60; 4th year, £84.

CONDITIONAL SERVICE.

At the examination for authorized surveyors next ensuing after the completion of his attendance at the Observatory, or sooner if required, he shall present himself for examination. Should he successfully pass such examination he shall, if required, serve the department as a surveyor for one year from the date of such examination, at a salary of £200 per annum; should he fail to pass he shall, if required, serve the department as a draughtsman and computer for one year from the date of such examination, at a salary of £150 per annum. If he shall pass at the next ensuing examination for authorized surveyors, he shall, if required, serve the department as a surveyor for the unexpired portion of the year (dating from the first examination), at a salary at the rate £200 per annum.

SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Civil Service of Victoria dated 31st of December 1866, or any subsequent substituted or additional regulations.

BONDS REQUIRED.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds of £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1st. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2nd. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission in the form contained in Schedule A will be granted to the person applying, on payment of the proper charges.

3rd. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any persons on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.

4th. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them.

5th. All monuments, vaults, graves, grave-stones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

6th. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

7th. A plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.

8th. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

9th. Wooden fenceings allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees.

10th. Orders for interment to be given either to the sexton or other person appointed by the trustees; such notice to be given between the hours of Ten a.m. and sunset the previous day.

11th. In case an interment is to be made in any private vault or grave, the consent in writing of the proprietor must be left with the order.

12th. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order, and answers are to be made in accordance with Schedule B.

13th. The processions to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.

14th. The usual hours for interment will be from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. from the 1st September to the 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Three p.m. in the other four months of the year.

15th. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the proper charges.

16th. The person in charge of the cemetery has orders to turn out, or take into custody (as the case may require), any person who shall behave indecorously, or commit any trespass, or injure the trees, flowers, fences, tombs, or otherwise infringe the regulations for the protection of the cemetery, in accordance with the provisions of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*.

17th. The trustees reserve the right to recommend any alterations from time to time in either charges and regulations.

Form of Certificate of Right of Burial in the Katandra Public Cemetery.

On the application of _____ and upon payment of the sum of _____ the trustees of the Katandra Public Cemetery, in terms of and as authorized by the Act of Council 17 Vict. PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the county of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Berwick has requested that the street hereinafter mentioned within the Shire of Berwick be so declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the land acquired or used for the street hereinafter named and described, and situate in the Shire of Berwick, to be a Public Highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :-
