SHIRES OF SHEPPARTON AND EUROA.

TRANSFER OF AREA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 39th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:

The petitioners are one hundred and thirty-four in number, and purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Euroa which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Euroa and attached to the Shire of Shepparton.

Area described in the petition:—

"Commencing at the north-eastern corner of the parish of Caniambo in the county of Moira; thence south to the south-eastern corner of that parish; thence west to the north-eastern corner of the parish of Karramomows; thence south to the south-eastern corner of the last-named parish; thence westerly by the southern boundary of the same parish to its south-western corner; thence north to the south-eastern corner of the parish of Arcadia; thence westerly along the southern boundary of the last-named parish, and bounded by the Goulburn Shire to the Goulburn River, down the said river being in a northerly direction to its junction with the Broken River; thence easterly up the last-named river to the point of commencement."

Petitioners state that they are convinced that it will be greatly to their advantage to become connected with the recently established Shire of Shepparton, inasmuch as they have no interests in common with the people of Euroa or the district connected therewith, their business and other relations being hitherto with Shepparton, which is so much nearer and more accessible to them; and, in consequence of the construction of the railway to Shepparton, your petitioners' interests have become, if possible, more identified than previously with the said township, although even before and independently of such railway construction your petitioners have from geographical and commercial considerations been necessarily connected with the district and people now comprised in the Shire of Shepparton, while almost alien to the people and district comprised in the Shire of Euroa.

That your petitioners have been awaiting the proclamation of the said Shire of Shepparton, with the intention of petitioning for the severance and annexation now prayed for, and they have taken the earliest opportunity of presenting their petition in that behalf.

"Your petitioners therefore pray that Your Excellency in Council may be pleased to exercise the powers conferred on you by sub-section 5 of section 19 of *The Local Government Act 1874*, by severing the above area from the Shire of Euroa and attaching the same to the Shire of Shepparton."

POWER TO COMPEL CESSPOOLS IN THE BOROUGH OF HAMILTON TO BE FILLED UP.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign, called *The Public Health amendment Act 1876*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the said Act to any part of Victoria, and from and after three months from the coming into operation of the said section in any part of Victoria if the owner of land whereon there should be a cesspool for the reception of nightsoil, which cesspool in the opinion of the local board should be in such a condition or position as to be calculated to generate disease or be a public nuisance, should be required by notice from the local board to fill up the same within a time to be expressed in such notice not being more than one month from the date thereof, such owner should be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day from the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice that such cesspool should not be filled up as thereby required: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the above-recited Act to the Borough of Hamilton.

THE Board of Examiners which has been appointed in connection with the Department of Lands and Survey to enquire into the qualifications of surveyors who desire to obtain certificates enabling them to effect surveys for the Government of Victoria, hereby notifies that the next examination will be held in the office of the Department of Lands and Survey, commencing on Tuesday, 13th July 1880.

A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, or the examination prescribed for candidates for admission into the Civil Service of Victoria (including in either case the subjects of Arithmetic, Euclid, and Algebra), or such other examination as shall in the opinion of the Board be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some authorized surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field:

Separate tenders will be received for each schedule, but they must include the whole of the articles therein mentioned, and a separate price must be stated for each article. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c.

Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labor may be required in the packing of stores.

The prices must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and total amount of tender stated.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt in favor of the Deputy Postmaster-General, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by bank notes, or a bank draft in favor of the Deputy Postmaster-General, for the amount of the deposit required (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security will be calculated at Ten per cent. upon contracts not exceeding £1000, and at Five per cent. over that sum; but the amount will in no case exceed the deposit above stated.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Postmaster-General will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles, and such quantities of those articles, as the Postmaster-General may order from time to time; neither will the Postmaster-General be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will he be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the

Postmaster-General require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality be equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery as a rule is to be of the full quantity ordered.

4. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

5. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Controller of Stores, General Post Office.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in condition 5, or the head of the department, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

8. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer named in condition 5. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as in condition 6.

10. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 6.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Postmaster-General may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 6, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Postmaster-General, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest, or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized.

13. It will be competent either for the contractor on his own behalf, or for the Postmaster-General, to terminate the contract by giving notice in writing of three full calendar months to the opposite party; it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

15. 5.
