The births of 798 children, viz., 411 boys and 387 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of April. In the month of March 746 births were registered, or 52 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in April numbered 398, viz., 191 of males and 207 of females: the births thus exceeded the deaths by 400. The deaths were fewer than those in March by 111, and were below the average of April during the previous ten years by 34. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of those ten years by 85.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 79.1° on the 19th, and the lowest was 45.1° on the 11th. The mean temperature of the month (59.6°) was more than a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (27.1°) took place on the 11th, viz., from a maximum of 72.2° to a minimum of 45.1°. The least range (5.0°) was on the 23rd, viz., from a maximum of 60.6° to a minimum of 55.6°. The mean daily range was 14.7°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.019 inches) was about one-tenth of an inch above the average.

Males contributed 48 per cent., and females 52 per cent. to the total mortality during the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 46 per cent., as against 43 per cent. in April 1879; 38 per cent. in April 1878; 40 per cent. in April 1877 and April 1876; 47 per cent. in April 1875; 32 per cent. in April 1874; 42 per cent. in April 1873; 50 per cent. in April 1872; 49 per cent. in April 1871; 50 per cent. in April 1870; and 47 per cent. in April 1869.

Nine of the deaths recorded during the month were of persons who had attained the age of 75 or upwards. These were those of a gentleman, aged 75, and a female, aged 82, of paralysis; a female, aged 77, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 80, of heart

disease; a sailor, aged 81, of brain disease; a widow, aged 78, a laborer, aged 83, and a solicitor and a female, each aged 85, of old age.

The deaths from external causes numbered 20, of which 16 were ascribed to accident and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A laborer, aged 30, died of inflammation of the brain, the result of an injury received while blasting; a tailor, aged 36, died of abscess of the brain, caused by falling from a rock; a storeman, aged 54, died of the effects of a compound fracture of the arm, occasioned by falling; a male child, aged 1 year, and a female infant, aged 11 months, died of scalds. The following were accidentally drowned:—A school-boy, aged 9, in the Saltwater River; a bootmaker, aged 22, by the upsetting of a boat; and a laborer, aged 45, in the Yarra; and the following were found drowned:—A male infant, aged 1 month, in the Yarra; a married woman, aged 41, in the Sandridge Lagoon; a man of occupation unknown, aged 50, and a laborer, aged 60, in Hobson's Bay. A male and a female infant were suffocated at birth; two male infants, aged 17 days and 2 months respectively, were suffocated in bed. Of the suicidal deaths, a shoemaker, aged 23; a butcher, aged 32; and 2 laborers, aged 38 and 71 respectively, hanged themselves whilst laboring under temporary insanity.

Ninety-four deaths, or 24 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—44 in the Melbourne Hospital, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Children's Hospital, 10 in the Alfred Hospital, 7 in the Lying-in Hospital, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Pentridge Stockade, 1 in the St. Vincent de Paul's Orphanage, and 3 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 161, of which 82, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 79, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 109 were under one year of age, 32 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 237. Of these, 109, or 46 per cent., were males, and 128, or 54 per cent., were females; 12 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 10 were between fifteen and twenty, 21 were between twenty and twenty-five, 14 were between twenty-five and thirty, 26 were between thirty and thirty-five, 19 were between thirty-five and forty, 22 were between forty and forty-five, 19 were between forty-five and fifty, 25 were between fifty and fifty-five, 17 were between fifty-five and sixty, 13 were between sixty and sixty-five, 9 were between sixty-five and seventy, 15 were between seventy and seventy-five, 3 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 6 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month, a decrease took place during April in deaths from all classes of diseases. Those from zymotic diseases fell from 130 to 87; constitutional diseases, from 103 to 93; local diseases, from 157 to 145; and developmental diseases, from 102 to 53. Under the zymotic head, the decrease is owing to deaths from typhoid fever falling from 90 to 20, and those from diarrhoea, falling from 59 to 29. In local diseases the decrease is accounted for by the diminution of deaths from heart affections, which fell from 30 to 17. The large decrease in deaths from developmental diseases is attributable to those from old age falling from 12 to 5; and those from atrophy and debility falling from 61 to 28. Three deaths were caused by the consequences of childbirth, or one death of a mother to every 266 births registered.

No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Yarrawonga has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order subdivide the Shire of Yarrawonga into three several subdivisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA.

THE EAST RIDING.—Commencing at the north-west angle of the parish of Yarrawonga; thence south by the west boundaries of the parishes of Yarrawonga, Pelluebla, and Karraunet to the south boundary of the shire; thence by the boundary of the shire easterly, northerly, and westerly to the commencing point.

THE CENTRAL RIDING.—Commencing at the north-west angle of the parish of Cobram; thence south by the west boundary and east by the south boundary of that parish to the west boundary of the parish of Boosey; thence south by the west boundaries of the parishes of Boosey, Youarang, and Wagga-randall to the south boundary of the shire; thence east by that boundary to the south-east angle of the parish of St. James; thence north by the east boundaries of the parishes of St. James,

Tharranbegg, and Burramine to the north boundary of the shire; thence by the north boundary of the shire west to the commencing point.

THE WEST RIDING.—Commencing at the north-west angle of the shire; thence south by the west and east by the south boundary of the shire to the south-east angle of the parish of Yabba Yabba; thence north by the east boundaries of the parishes of Yabba Yabba, Youanmite, and Katamatite to the south-east angle of the parish of Cobram; thence west by the south and north by the west boundary of the parish of Cobram to the northern boundary of the shire; thence west by the northern boundary of the shire to the commencing point.

No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Lowan has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order subdivide the Shire of Lowan into three several subdivisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

WEST RIDING.—Commencing at the south-west angle of the shire on the western boundary of the colony; thence south-east by the shire boundary to a point in a line with the eastern boundary of the parish of Mortat; thence north by said line to the south-east angle of the parish of Mortat; thence north by the eastern boundary of the parish of Mortat; thence north by a line north to the south-east angle of the parish of Lawloit; thence north by the east boundary of the parish of Lawloit to the intersection of the south boundary of the parish of Tarranginnie; thence east, by south boundary of parish of Tarranginnie to south-east angle of G. Fleming's selection, parish of Tarranginnie; thence north by the centre of the one-chain road to intersection of road at the south of Joseph Baker's selection, parish of Tarranginnie; thence west by centre of said road to intersection of road near south-west angle of Baker's selection; thence north by centre of said road to intersection of the three-chain road at the one hundred and tenth section reserve, known as "Boyes' Well"; thence north-west by centre of said three-chain road to south-west angle of Allan McDougall's selection, parish of Yanacayanac; thence east by the north boundary of the parish of Tarranginnie to south-east angle of D. McArthur's selection, parish of Yanacayanac; thence north by the west boundary of the parish of Yanacayanac to the north-west angle of said parish; thence in a line true north to the northern boundary of the shire; thence west by the shire boundary to the western boundary of the colony; thence south by the shire boundary to the commencing point.

CENTRE RIDING.—Commencing at the south-east angle of the West riding; thence easterly by the shire boundary to the River Wimmera, north by the course of the River Wimmera to its termination at Pine Plains; thence true north by a line to the shire boundary; thence west by the shire boundary to the north-east angle of the West riding; thence south by the east boundary of the West riding to the commencing point.

EAST RIDING.—Commencing at a point on the south boundary of the shire at the intersection of the River Wimmera; thence east and north by the shire boundary to the north-east angle of the shire boundary; thence west by the northern boundary of the shire to the north-east angle of the Centre riding; thence true south and southerly by the east boundary of the Centre riding to the commencing point.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road, shall be taken to be the boundary line.

And the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby further Order that Councillors be elected accordingly.

And the Honorable Thomas Bent, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SHIRES OF ST. ARNAUD AND DUNMUNKLE.

PROPOSED TRANSFER OF AREA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to the Governor, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of St. Arnaud which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of St. Arnaud and attached to the Shire of Dunmunkle.

Area described in the petition :—“ Bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of the Yarriambiack Creek by the northward boundary of the Kewell run; thence eastward along the northward boundaries of Kewell, Kirkwood, Avon Plains, and Rich Avon West runs to the east boundary of the parish of Dunmunkle; thence northward along the east boundaries of the parishes of Dunmunkle and Aregra to its intersection by the three-chain road from Warracknabeal to Donald; thence west and north-westerly by the said three-chain road from Warracknabeal to Donald to the east boundary of the parish of Bangerang; thence northward along the east boundary of the said parish of Bangerang to its intersection by the three-chain road from Warracknabeal to Morton Plains; thence south-westward and westward by the said three-chain road from Warracknabeal to Morton Plains to the road running along the south boundary of the Warracknabeal pre-emptive right; thence west by the said road running along the south boundary of the Warracknabeal pre-emptive right to the Yarriambiack Creek, and thence down the Yarriambiack Creek to the starting point.”

The petitioners state that the area described is too remote from the seat of government of the shire of which it forms a portion to allow of adequate attention being paid to their requirements; that they are deprived of local representation in the council of the said shire in consequence of said area being situate at the extreme north-west portion of the western riding, of which it forms but a small portion; that they have not an equitable share of expenditure of moneys in proportion to the revenue derived; and that their interests, commercially and geographically, are identical with and inseparable from the said Shire of Dunmunkle; and that they desire that the said area should be severed from the said Shire of St. Arnaud and annexed to the said Shire of Dunmunkle; and they pray as follows :—

“ That the Governor in Council will be pleased to grant the prayer of the petition to the extent set forth,” &c.

- If the board of survey shall decide that the coal is of inferior quality, the delay in delivering the quality specified in condition No. 1 will subject the contractor to a mulct assessed according to the actual loss sustained by such delay, and it will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.
- Steam vessels are to be supplied with coal on demand. No more delay will be allowed than is sufficient to give the necessary

orders and get the hulk or vessel alongside. Bad weather to be the only excuse. When there is not a necessity for an immediate supply, a day's notice will be given.

12. As soon as the orders shall have been completed, the contractor will be required to furnish his accounts in the prescribed form, with the order attached thereto, to the department supplied.

13.
