CHINA SEA.—SINGAPORE.—ALTERATIONS IN FORT CANNING LIGHT.

THE Government of the Straits Settlement has given notice that the following alterations have been made in the position and visibility of the light exhibited from Fort Canning, Singapore:—

The light (fixed white) is shown from a new flagstaff situated 20 yards southward of the old staff. It is visible through an arc of nearly 68°, between the bearings N.N.W. ¼ W. and W. ¼ S., or from one mile eastward of Peak Island to one mile southward of Johore Shoal.

The light is elevated 256 feet above the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of twenty miles.

The bearings are magnetic and from seaward. Variation 1½° easterly in 1880.

DREDGING OPERATIONS, LYTTELTON HARBOR.

THE following notice respecting dredging operations, Lyttelton Harbor, which has been received from the Lyttelton Harbor Board, is published for general information.

Caution.—Dredging Operations, Harbor of Lyttelton.

DURING the dredging operations now in hand in the fairway at the entrance of the inner harbor, between the two moles, the masters of all vessels are cautioned to take the entrance to the eastward of the dredge and her buoys.

The dredge's south-west bower-anchor will be laid down about 600 feet outside the moles, and will be buoyed with a large red buoy. The dredge's side moorings will be similarly buoyed.

Masters of all vessels are hereby cautioned against going near or over the dredge moorings, and all steamers are required to slow their engines to less than half-speed for at least 100 yards before arriving abreast of the dredge, in accordance with the New Zealand Harbor Regulations (No. 102).

This notification to take effect from and after the 20th May 1880, and to remain in force until revised or altered.

Masters of all vessels are cautioned against entering between the moles at night.

Vessels must not anchor with the inner harbor lighthouse, on the eastern breakwater, bearing anything to the northward of north-west.

Clause 30 of the New Zealand Harbor Regulations will be strictly enforced.

The mortality of Melbourne and suburbs, together with the mean temperature in the shade, and the mean atmospheric pressure, during the month of May for the ten years 1870-79, were as follow; the births are also given for as many years as the information is available:—

The births of 746 children, viz., 391 boys and 355 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of May. In the month of April 798 births were registered, or 52 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in May numbered 391, viz., 202 of males and 189 of females: the births thus exceeded the deaths by 355. The deaths were less than those in April by 7, and below the average of May during the previous ten years by 10. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of those ten years by 37.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 63.3° on the 1st, and the lowest was 40.3° on the 27th. The mean temperature of the month (53.8°) was more than a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (20.1°) took place on the 5th, viz., from a maximum of 66.1° to a minimum of 46.0°. The least range (3.3°) was on the 12th, viz., from a maximum of 55.1° to a minimum of 51.8°. The mean daily range was 11.2°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.887 inches) was nearly a tenth of a degree below the average.

Fifty-two per cent. of the deaths registered during the month were of males, and 48 per cent. were of females. Thirty-one per cent. were of children who had not attained the age of 5 years, as against 39 per cent. in May 1879; 26 per cent. in May 1873; 34 per cent. in May 1877; 38 per cent. in May 1876; 37 per cent. in May 1875; 39 per cent. in May 1874; 40 per cent. in May 1873; 46 per cent. in May 1872; 39 per cent. in May 1871; and 38 per cent. in May 1870.

Fifteen of the persons who died during the month were stated to have been of the age of 75 years or upwards at the time of their decease, viz.:—A female, aged 75, died of bronchitis; a wheelwright, aged 77, of phthisis; a seaman, aged 77, of pulmonary apoplexy; a laborer, aged 77, of renal disease and dropsy; a coachbuilder, aged 80, of dysentery; a female, aged 80, of pneumonia; a widow, aged 81, of apoplexy; a female, aged 82, of bronchitis; a female, aged 84, of diarrhoea; a dairyman, aged 85, of apoplexy; a female domestic servant, aged 86, of enteritis; a tailor, aged 88, of bronchitis; a governess, aged 88, of anasarca and heart disease; and two females, each aged 77, of old age.

Seventeen of the deaths were ascribed to external causes. Of these, 11 are set down to accident and 6 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A stage-carpenter and a driver, each aged 29, a fitter, aged 34, and a seaman, aged 42, died of fracture of the skull occasioned by falling; a female child, aged 2, was fatally scalded through falling into a tub of hot water; another female child, also aged 2, was poisoned by sulphuric acid; a male child, aged 1, was drowned in a water-tank; a cook, aged 17, and a needlewoman, aged 45, were found drowned, the former at Sandridge and the latter at Brighton Beach; a male and a female infant, aged 3 weeks and 1 month respectively, were suffocated in bed. Of the suicidal deaths, a gentleman, aged 45, stabbed himself to the heart; a pensioner, aged 53, and a carpenter, aged 62, poisoned themselves with strychnine; a groom, aged 32, and a waiter, aged 51, drowned themselves; and a coachbuilder, aged 40, hanged himself.

One hundred deaths, or 26 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—45 in the Melbourne Hospital, 10 in the Immigrants' Home, 5 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 13 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 2 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 120, of which 60, or 50 per cent., were of males, and 60, or 50 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 83 were under one year of age, 20 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 2 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 271. Of these, 142, or 52 per cent., were males, and 129, or 48 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 16 were between twenty and twenty-five, 18 were between twenty-five and thirty, 17 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 18 were between forty and forty-five, 29 were between forty-five and fifty, 31 were between fifty and fifty-five, 23 were between fifty-five and sixty, 19 were between sixty and sixty-five, 14 were between sixty-five and seventy, 19 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 9 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases numbered 70 in the month under review as against 87 in the previous one. The reduction is due to deaths from diarrhoea having fallen from 29 to 8, and deaths from scarlatina, which numbered 2 in April, having entirely disappeared. On the other hand, deaths from croup increased from 4 to 8, deaths from whooping-cough from 7 to 12, and deaths from typhoid fever from 20 to 21. Deaths from local diseases were more numerous in May than in April, the number being 154 against 145, and the increase being chiefly in deaths from affections of the nerves and heart. Under the head of tubercular diseases, phthisis caused 68 deaths in May as against 58 in April, 59 in March, and 50 in February.

KAMAROOKA GOLD-FIELD COMMON.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1879, the managers of the above-named common having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common.

REGULATIONS.

1. All persons entitled to depasture stock must make application to the managers or herdsman, and pay the fees hereinafter mentioned.

2. Special licenses may be granted to butchers or to slaughtermen to depasture, on such parts only of the common as the managers may direct, cattle, sheep, and swine intended for slaughter, on payment of the fees and subject to the rules of the common.

3. All unbranded cattle, horses, sheep, swine, or goats found on the common will be liable to be impounded.

4. Diseased cattle will not be allowed to depasture on the common, nor to be driven over, across, or upon the same.

5. All cattle depastured on the common shall be mustered, at any time, for inspection by the managers (or such person as they may appoint) within forty-eight (48) hours after notice of such muster shall have been given to the owner or owners thereof.

6. No bulls or entire horses shall be allowed on the common without the special consent, in writing, of the managers.

7. All special licenses will be granted subject to the rules of the common, and may be revoked at any time, by the managers, on any infringement thereof by the holders.

8. Travelling stock after remaining twenty-four (24) hours on the common shall be deemed to be trespassing, and shall be liable to be impounded; or, if allowed to remain thereon, the owners shall pay (in advance) Threepence (3d.) for horses and cattle, and One and a half-penny (1½d.) per sheep per head per day to the managers or herdsman.

9. The brand of the Kamarooka Gold-field Common shall be placed on all stock depastured thereon, either in pitch, tar, or by some other reasonable method, but not by burning.

10. The number of cattle, &c., that may be depastured on the common by one person shall not exceed—

Horses, mares, &c.	...	4 head.
Bullocks and cows	...	20 head.
Goats	...	6 head.
Swine	...	2 head.

11. The fees, payable half-yearly in advance, shall be as under—

For every head of cattle	... Four (4) shillings per annum.
For every horse	... Six (6) shillings per annum.
For every sheep	... One shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per annum.
For every goat	... One shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per annum.
For every head of swine	... Four (4) shillings per annum.

12. These rules shall commence and come into force Six (6) days after publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty, not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

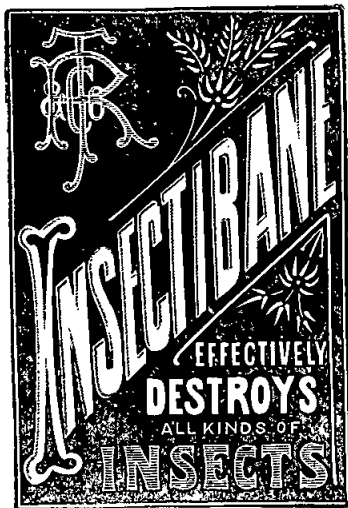
