RUMMAGE CERTIFICATES AND JERQUE NOTES.

ON and after Monday the 16th August 1880, intercolonial vessels, whose cargo may consist of coals, will not in future require an Outwards Rummage or Jerque Note.

In case of vessels from other than intercolonial ports the Rummage Certificate and Jerque Note shall be sent direct and without delay to the clearing clerk at the Custom House, Melbourne (either by the master or otherwise), immediately the cargo is all discharged, and should any portion of such cargo (in the bulk) be required to be kept on board for stiffening purposes it is to be endorsed on the Jerque Note.
