By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normandy, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; a Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c. &c.

WOMBAT STATE FOREST EXTENSION.—The reserve made for the preservation and growth of Timber under the designation of the Wombat State Forest, and described in Proclamations bearing date respectively 3rd February 1879 and 21st February 1881, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown Lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz. :—Seven hundred acres, more or less, county of Talbot, parish of Wombat: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 3 of section 3 A; thence west by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 12 A of section 4 A; thence south by that allotment and allotment 12 B, and west by the latter allotment to the south-west angle thereof; thence south by the existing reserve ninety-two chains twenty-eight links; thence easterly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment B2 of section Y; and thence north, east, north, east, and north by the existing reserve to the point of commencement.—(W.179^(3 and 9)) (81.A.7463.)

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 it was amongst other things enacted that where any street or road in any municipal district exceeds one chain in width such street or road might, for any length thereof, be reduced in width to any width not less than one chain, and that the council of the municipality and the Board of Land and Works, and every owner of any land having a frontage to such street or road in any place where the same is so reduced in width, or in any place not more than three chains from any such place, might agree in writing, under the common seals of the municipality and the Board of Land and Works, and under the hand and seal of every such owner, upon a scheme for the reduction in width of such street or road for the length mentioned in such scheme, and for the disposal of the surplus land taken from such street or road, and as to the purchase-money to be paid by any such owners who might be allowed to purchase any of the surplus land, and as to the compensation, if any, not exceeding in the whole the amount of the purchase-money to be paid in respect of any land injuriously affected by such scheme, and the Governor in Council might by Order published in the Government Gazette confirm such scheme, and thereupon any land mentioned in such scheme in that behalf should cease to be a street or road, and all rights-of-way over the same should cease and determine; and it should be lawful for the Governor, on payment of the purchase-money for any surplus land to the Treasurer of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, to grant such land in accordance with the provisions of any such scheme in the manner prescribed by the said Act, and by warrant under his hand to direct payment of any such compensation out of the consolidated revenue, which is by the said Act appropriated for that purpose accordingly: And whereas a scheme has this day been submitted to the Governor in Council for reducing the width of a portion of a street or road known as the Melbourne road in the Borough of Williamstown, in the Colony of Victoria, as hereinafter set forth: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the 367th section of the said in part recited Act, doth by this present Order confirm the said scheme for reducing the width of Melbourne road aforesaid, between the south-eastern side of Pasco street and the north-western side of Parker street, to a width of eighty-four feet by taking from the north-eastern side thereof fifteen feet, as delineated on the plan annexed to said scheme, and deposited at the office of Crown Lands and Survey, Melbourne, and in accordance with such scheme, under the seals of the Borough of Williamstown and the Board of Land and Works, and under the hands and seals of the several and respective persons named therein, and dated the thirtieth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the undermentioned Commons.

SHIRE OF TALBOT.—GLENDARUEL, ASCOT, AND TOURELLA FARMERS' COMMON; CRAIGIE AND EGLINTON FARMERS' COMMON; AMHERST FARMERS' COMMON; AND LILLICUR, AND YALONG FARMERS' COMMON.

In pursuance of the regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on the first day of April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Talbot, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the above-named commons, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such commons.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers may respectively depasture on any of the above-named commons, within five (5) miles from their places of residence, four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on any such common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses and mules, and the words "small cattle," shall mean sheep and goats.

3. The scale of fees, payable half-yearly in advance, for depasturing stock on any of the above-named commons, shall be as follows:—

For every horse	Gs. per annum
" " head of large cattle	4s. " "
" " " small cattle	1s. " "
Young cattle under six (6) months old } the progeny of stock legally depas- } turing on the commons	Free

4. No bull or entire horse shall be allowed to depasture on any of the above-named commons without the permission, in writing, of the managers.

5. Persons desiring to depasture stock on any of the above-named commons shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman, at the appointed branding yards, on the days set apart for reception of stock, and shall at the same time hand to the herdsman a duplicate of the written statements of the number and brands of the stock so delivered, and the managers shall on receiving the fees payable on such stock give a receipt in the prescribed form. The herdsman shall then proceed to brand the stock with the common brand in pitch and tar, and the owners or persons in charge of such stock shall render every assistance to the herdsman during the branding.

6. The managers or herdsman will not be responsible for the loss of any stock depasturing on the above-named commons.

7. The managers of the above-named commons may, if they think fit, set apart, for the depasturing of sheep only, portions of the above-named commons.

8. No person shall, without the permission in writing of the herdsman, willfully disturb or remove from any of the above-named commons stock legally depasturing thereon.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.
