The births of 797 children, viz., 400 boys and 397 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of September. In the month of August 871 births were registered, or 124 more than in the month under review. The births were 50 above the average of the previous seven years, but 39 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in September numbered 420, viz., 241 of males and 179 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 377. The deaths were fewer than those in August by 37, but exceeded the average of September, during the previous ten years, by 74. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of the month in those ten years by only 18.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 78.0° on the 16th, and the lowest was 34.9° on the 13th. The mean temperature of the month (53.4°) was more than half a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (37.4°) took place on the 29th, viz., from a maximum of 76.0° to a minimum of 38.6°. The least range (9.9°) was on the 4th, viz., from a maximum of 55.0° to a minimum of 45.1°. The mean daily range was 19.2°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.962 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Males contributed 57 per cent. and females 43 per cent. to the mortality registered during the month. Deaths of children under five years of age were in the proportion of 28 per cent. to that mortality as against 36 per cent. in September 1880; 31 per cent. in September 1879; 30 per cent. in September 1878; 38 per cent. in September 1877; 28 per cent. in September 1876; 35 per cent. in September 1875; 25 per cent. in September 1874; 36 per cent. in September 1873; 31 per cent. in September 1872; and 37 per cent. in September 1871.

The deaths of old people in the month under notice were above the average, as many as 24 persons having died at the age of 75 years or upwards, viz. :-A female, aged 75, of pneumonia; a farmer and two females, each aged 76, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 77, of cardiac dropsy; a female, aged 78, of inflammation of the stomach; an overseer and a female teacher, each aged 79, of congestion of the lungs; a laborer, aged 79, of hepatitis; a blacksmith, aged 79, of cystitis; a hatter, aged 81, of softening of the brain; a wool sorter, aged 80, of heart disease; a female, aged 81, of bronchitis; a bricklayer, aged 82, of paralysis; a female, aged 82, of brain disease; a female aged 82, of paralysis; a widow, aged 77, a female, aged 78, a dressmaker, aged 80, a female, aged 81, a female, aged 82, a hall keeper, aged 82, and two widows, each aged 80, of old age.

Twenty-four deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month under notice, of which 18 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 13, died of laceration of the thigh, caused by a lorry passing over him; a female, aged 26, of erysipelas, resulting from a scalp wound, occasioned by a fall of the head, supervening upon injuries caused by falling whilst drunk; a manager of a jute factory, aged 31, was killed by being caught in machinery; a law clerk, aged 20, a Baptist minister, aged 29, a publisher aged 41, and a civil servant, aged 53, were killed by a railway accident; a laborer, aged 64, died of injury to the spine; a female, aged 62, of burns, her clothes catching fire whilst cooking; a painter, aged 51, of lead poisoning; a seaman, aged 31, two males, of occupations unknown, aged 40, and a housekeeper, aged 50, were found drowned; a female and a male infant, aged 1 month and 3 months respectively, were suffocated in bed. The homicidal deaths were those of a newly-born female infant, who was suffocated, and a female, aged 26, who was killed by an injury to the head. Of those who committed suicide, a female, aged 44, and a draper, aged 62, cut their throats; a laborer, aged 22, and a storekeeper, aged 35, drowned themselves.

One hundred and six deaths, or 25 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—54 in the Melbourne Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 10 in the Alfred Hospital, 6 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, 2 in the Homœopathic Hospital, and 1 in the Infants' Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 117, of which 66, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 51, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 73 were under one year of age, 22 were between one and two, 9 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 303. Of these, 175, or 58 per cent., were males, and 128, or 42 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 6 were between fifteen and twenty, 24 were between twenty and twenty-five, 22 were between twenty-five and thirty, 24 were between thirty and thirty-five, 15 were between thirty-five and forty, 29 were between forty and forty-five, 31 were between forty-five and fifty, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 24 were between fifty-five and sixty, 26 were between sixty and sixty-five, 19 were between sixty-five and seventy, 17 were between seventy and seventy-five, 12 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 12 were upwards of eighty.

Zymotic diseases caused 57 deaths in August, and exactly the same number in September. Under this head, deaths from scarlatina rose from 5 to 8, those from croup from 4 to 6; those from whooping-cough from 8 to 10; those from erysipelas from 2 to 4; and those from diarrhœa from 3 to 4. On the other hand, deaths from diphtheria, which numbered 4 in August, entirely disappeared, and those from typhoid fever fell from 11 to 5. Under constitutional diseases, deaths from phthisis fell from 68 to 55. Deaths in childhood were less numerous in the month under notice than in any month since February. The total number since the beginning of the year together with its proportion to the births of living children registered, was as follows:—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which have been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz. :—

The Petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Borough of Footscray which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Borough of Footscray and attached to the Shire of Wyndham.

Area described in the petition:—

Allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 of section 13, allotments 2A, 1A, and 1B of section 14, allotment 4 and part of allotment 5 of section 8, allotments A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, J and part of allotment I of section 9, with the several roads and streets intersecting same, parish of Cut Paw Paw, county of Bourke.

Petitioners state their interests will be better served by forming part of the shire than by remaining on the outskirts of the borough; that for years the road from Geelong to Melbourne, and within the area, has been made at the cost of the shire, under the authority of an agreement approved by the Governor in Council, and £1,768 has been spent within the territory under said authority; that the ratepayers, acting in accordance with the terms of said agreement, have paid their rates to the shire, and their names have appeared on the municipal roll for that municipality.

They therefore pray, that in order that the Wyndham Council may be enabled to exercise proper and legal control over the area, that the severance asked for may be effected.

BOOMAHNOOMONAH COMMON.—Three thousand six hundred acres, more or less, county of Moira, parish of Boomahnoomoonah, being the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz. :—Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 3 of section F; thence north and west by that allotment, north, west, and south-westerly by the block applied for by R. W. Jones, north by allotment 1, and east and north by allotment 1 of section D to the north-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment: thence east by a road, south by the block applied for by J. Pilkington, east by that block and allotment 9, and south-westerly, south, and east by J. Pearson's block to the south-east angle of the last-mentioned block; and thence south and west by the boundary of the parish to the point of commencement.—(80.Y.2972).

KATAMATITE COMMON.—One thousand two hundred acres, more or less, county of Moira, parish of Katamatite, being the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries of the Katamatite township reserve.—(80.L.5554.)

The Council of the Shire of Stawell, the duly-appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Watering Purposes and Camping Ground in the parish of Kirkella, and of the Reserve for camping and for affording access to water in the said parish, conjointly known as "Campbell's Bridge Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be always open to the public.

 3. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
