DISTRICTS WHERE PUBLICANS' LICENSES MAY BE SPECIALLY GRANTED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Licensing Act 1876 (No. 566, sec. 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exist, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the districts hereinafter mentioned to be districts where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

1. An area of one mile square at Budjic.
2. A distance of half a mile radius around a point situated on the road from Walhalla to Aberfeldy, midway between those two places.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Licensing Act 1876 (No. 566, section 14) it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time upon the application in writing of the council of any municipality to proclaim any part of the municipal district of such municipality, to be defined by such council, not being a borough having a population of five hundred persons liable to be rated, as shown by the rate-book, a special area. It was also enacted by the said Act that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place not included in any municipal district or licensing district a special area; and it was further enacted that the fee which should be paid for a publican's license in respect of premises situated within a special area should be Ten pounds only; and the Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any proclamation made under the authority of the above recited section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as special areas under the provisions of the fourteenth section of the Act above recited the localities hereinafter mentioned, within which the fee to be paid for a publican's license shall be Ten pounds only, that is to say:—

1. THE KIRKSTALL RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF BELFAST.
2. AN AREA OF THREE ACRES, in the parish of Tragowel, on which stands the Hawkinstone Hotel.
3. AN AREA OF THREE ACRES, in the parish of Boga, in the county of Tatchera.
4. AN AREA INCLUDING ALLOTMENT 4 OF SECTION 3, suburban lands, parish of Kerang, on which stands the Bridge Hotel.
5. AN AREA INCLUDING THE SITE ON WHICH THE JUNCTION HOTEL, at Narung, stands.
6. THE PARISH OF MACORNA.
7. A DISTANCE OF HALF A MILE RADIUS AROUND A POINT SITUATED ON THE ROAD FROM WALHALLA TO ABERFELDY, midway between those two places (not included in any municipal district).

## EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

SIR,—I have the honor, at the request of the Civil Service Commissioners, to transmit to you the enclosed Regulations, &c., for an Examination of Candidates for the Civil Service of India, which is to be held in June 1882.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE OPEN COMPETITION OF JUNE 1882.

N.B.—The Regulations are liable to be altered in future years.

1. On the 1st June 1882, and following days, an examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.<sup>1</sup> Not fewer than candidates will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified, viz. :— for the Presidency of Bengal, [ for the Upper, and for the Lower Provinces (including Assam), and for Burma,] for that of Madras, and for that of Bombay.<sup>2</sup>

2. No person will be deemed qualified who shall not satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners :—

- (i.) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.
- (ii.) That his age will be above seventeen years and under nineteen years on the 1st June 1882. [N.B.—In the case of natives of India this must be certified by the Government of India or of the Presidency or Province in which the candidate may have resided.]
- (iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.
- (iv.) That he is of good moral character.
- (v.) That he has paid such fee as may be prescribed under the provisions of the Order in Council of the 22nd March 1879.<sup>3</sup>

3. Should the evidence upon the above points be *prima facie* satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, the candidate will be admitted to the examination. The Commissioners may, however, in their discretion at any time prior to the grant of the certificate of qualification hereinafter referred to, institute such further inquiries as they may deem necessary; and if the result of such inquiries, in the case of any candidate, should be unsatisfactory to them in any of the above respects, he will be ineligible for admission to the Civil Service of India; and if already selected will be removed from the position of a Probationer.

4. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge :—

Candidates are at liberty to name any or all of these branches of knowledge. No subjects are obligatory.

<sup>1</sup> An order for admission to the examination will be sent to each candidate on the 18th of May.

<sup>2</sup> The numbers will be announced hereafter.

<sup>3</sup> The fee will be £5, payable by means of a special stamp according to instructions which will be communicated to candidates.

<sup>4</sup> A considerable portion of the marks for English History and Literature will be allotted to the works selected by the candidate. See notice respecting the examination in the History of England and English Literature. In awarding marks for this, regard will be had partly to the extent and importance of the periods or books selected, but chiefly to the thoroughness with which they have been studied.

<sup>5</sup> The examination will range from Arithmetic, Algebra, and Elementary Geometry, up to the elements of the differential and integral calculus, including the lower portions of applied Mathematics.

<sup>6</sup> The standard of marking in Sanskrit and Arabic will be determined with reference to a high degree of proficiency, such as may be expected to be reached by a native of good education.

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks; and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. The marks assigned to candidates in each branch will be subject to such deduction as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary, in order to secure that "a candidate be allowed no credit at all for taking up a subject in which he is a mere smatterer."

7. The examination will be conducted on paper and *visà voce*, as may be deemed necessary.

8. The marks obtained by each candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the several candidates who shall have obtained, after the deduction above mentioned, a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining candidates, will be set forth in order of merit, and such candidates shall be deemed to be selected candidates for the Civil Service of India, provided they appear to be in other respects duly qualified. Should any of the selected candidates become disqualified, the Secretary of State for India will determine whether the vacancy thus created shall be filled up or not. In the former case, the candidate next in order of merit, and in other respects duly qualified, shall be deemed to be a selected candidate. A selected candidate declining to accept the appointment which may be offered to him will be disqualified for any subsequent competition.

9. Selected candidates, before proceeding to India, will be on probation for two years, during which time they will be examined periodically, with a view of testing their progress in the following subjects :—

In these examinations, as in the open competition, the merit of the candidates examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each subject denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it at any one examination. The examination will be conducted on paper and *visà voce*, as may be deemed necessary. The last of these examinations will be held at the close of the second year of probation, and will be called the "Final Examination," at which it will be decided whether a selected candidate is qualified for the Civil Service of India. At this examination candidates will be permitted to take up any one of the following branches of Natural Science, viz. :—Botany, Geology, or Zoology, for which 350 marks will be allowed.

10. Any candidate who, at any of the periodical examinations, shall appear to have wilfully neglected his studies, or to be physically incapacitated for pursuing the prescribed course of training, will be liable to have his name removed from the list of selected candidates.

11. The selected candidates who, at the final examination, shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in Regulation 9, and who shall have satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of nationality, age, health, and character, shall be certified by the said Commissioners to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India, provided they shall comply with the regulations in force, at the time, for that service.

12. Persons desirous to be admitted as candidates must apply on forms which may be obtained from "The Secretary, Civil Service Commission, London, S.W." at any time after the 1st December 1881. The forms must be returned so as to be received at the office of the Civil Service Commissioners on or before 1st April 1882. They should be accompanied by evidence on the first four of the points mentioned in Regulation 2, and by a list of the subjects in which the candidate desires to be examined.<sup>9</sup>

The Civil Service Commissioners are authorized by the Secretary of State for India in Council to make the following announcements :—

1. Selected candidates will be permitted to choose, according to the order in which they stand in the list resulting from the open competition, so long as a choice remains, the Presidency (and in Bengal the Division of the Presidency) to which they shall be appointed; but this choice will be subject to a different arrangement, should the Secretary of State, or the Government of India, deem it necessary.<sup>10</sup>

2. The probationers, having passed the necessary examinations, will be required to report their arrival in India within such period after the grant of their certificate of qualification as the Secretary of State may in each case direct.

3. The seniority in the Civil Service of India of the selected candidates shall be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from the final examination.

4. An allowance amounting to £300 will be given to all candidates who pass their probation at one of the Universities or Colleges which have been approved by the Secretary of State, viz., the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, Glasgow, Edinburgh, St. Andrews, and Aberdeen; Trinity College, Dublin; University College, London; and King's College, London; provided such candidates shall have passed the required examinations to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners, and shall have complied with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of selected candidates.

5. All selected candidates will be required, after having passed the first periodical examination, and before receiving the first instalment of their allowance, to attend at the India Office for the purpose of entering into an agreement binding themselves, amongst other things, to refund, in certain cases, the amount of their allowance in the event of their failing to proceed to India. A surety will be required.

6. After passing the final examination, each candidate will be required to attend again at the India Office, with the view of entering into covenants, by which, amongst other things, they will bind themselves to agree to such regulations for the provision of pensions for their families as may be approved by the Secretary of State for India in Council. The stamps payable on these covenants amount to £1.

7. Candidates rejected at the final examination of 1881, will in no case be allowed to present themselves for re-examination.

‡ EVIDENCE OF AGE TO BE REQUIRED FROM CANDIDATES FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

I.—Every candidate born in England or Wales should produce a certificate from the Registrar-General of Births, Marriages, and Deaths, or from one of his provincial officers. This certificate may be obtained at Somerset House, or from the superintendent registrar of the district in which the birth took place.

II.—A candidate who is a native of India must have his age certified by the Government of India, or the presidency or province in which he may have resided.

III.—Every other candidate not producing the certificate mentioned in clause 1, must prove his age by statutory declaration, and should also, if possible, produce a record of birth or baptism from some official register; under which term may be included the parochial registers of baptisms, the non-parochial registers of baptisms and births deposited at Somerset House under Acts of Parliament, the register kept at the India Office of persons born in India, &c., &c. This Regulation applies—

1. To all candidates not born in England or Wales.
2. To candidates who, though born in England or Wales, cannot produce the Registrar-General's certificate.

The Civil Service Commissioners reserve to themselves the right of deciding in each case upon the sufficiency of the evidence produced, but they subjoin the following general rules for the guidance of candidates:—

(a.) The declaration should specify precisely the date and place of birth, and should, if possible, be made by the father or mother of the candidate. If made by any other person, it should state the circumstances which enabled the declarant to speak to the fact. If an entry in a Bible or other family record be referred to, the Bible or other record must be produced at the time of making the declaration, and must be mentioned in the declaration as having been so produced.

(b.) If the candidate was born in England or Wales, the declaration must contain a statement, that after due inquiry no entry has been found in the books of the Registrar-General; or a separate declaration must be made to that effect.

(c.) If no extract from any register is produced, the declaration must contain a statement, that after due enquiry no such record is believed to exist; or a separate declaration must be made to that effect.

(d.) Statutory declarations must be exactly in the form prescribed by the Act of 5 and 6 William IV., c. 62. A printed form, if required, will be supplied on application to the Civil Service Commissioners.

N.B.—Clergymen, as such, are not qualified to take declarations.

## SOUTH-EAST COAST OF NEW GUINEA AND LOUISIADE ARCHIPELAGO.

The following remarks, relating to the south-east coast of New Guinea and to the Louisiade Archipelago, are chiefly by Lieutenant T. de Hoghton, commanding H.M. schooner *Beagle*; Lieutenant J. St. C. Bower, H.M. schooner *Conflict*; and Lieutenant G. E. Richards, H.M. schooner *Renard*.

(All bearings are magnetic. Variation  $6\frac{1}{2}^\circ$  easterly in 1881.)

**GULF OF PAPUA.**<sup>1,2</sup>—*Directions*.—When approaching the Gulf of Papua from the southward, it is recommended to make the land to the westward of Maclatchie Point, where the western villages on this part of the coast are situated.

In clear weather, when within a distance of 25 or 30 miles of the land, the high mountains, named the Gordon Range, will be seen, having three peaks at the western part appearing as islands; these are unmistakable, the two eastern are very rugged, and the centre one bears from Bald Head (Deception Bay) about N.N.W., distant 35 miles. On nearing the land it is easily known if the vessel is east or west of Maclatchie Point, as, to the westward of Flattop and Woody hills there is no high land, and it is low and flat near the coast. East and West Entrance islands could not be recognized from the 4 fathoms edge of soundings. If wishing to close the land, the lead is a sure guide, as the water shoals very gradually to the beach; but it is necessary to pass the mouths of the rivers at a distance of 3 miles.

Between Cliff Point and Jokea village (N.W. hill) a depth of 5 and 6 fathoms was found when close to the shore. Off Coombes River there is a depth of 4 fathoms to within 200 yards of the bar, on which there is 6 feet.

After passing Jokea village it is necessary to keep at a distance of 2 miles from the shore, till nearing Cape Possession, to avoid very shallow water.

**Basilisk Passage.**<sup>3</sup>—Whilst sailing through Basilisk Passage with Paga Point bearing N.  $3^\circ$  E. and south extreme of Fisherman Islands bearing S.  $83^\circ$  W., an extensive shoal with apparently not more than 4 or 5 feet water over it, bore N.E. distant one cable.

**POINT MORESBY.**—The coral reef fringing the eastern side of this port, north of Paga Point, does not extend so far from the coast as has been supposed.

**Pyramid Point.**—A reef extends half a mile S.W. from this point.

**Locol Island.**—The *Beagle* found anchorage in 12 fathoms water, off the west side of this island, abreast of the centre of a sandy beach.

There is much shoal water between Locol Island and Pyramid Point.

**Hood Lagoon.**<sup>4</sup>—From the western entrance point of this lagoon a shoal of mud and shingle, steep-to, having a depth of 9 feet over it at half flood, extends S.W. about 200 yards.

As this shoal greatly narrows the entrance, it is advisable to mark the outer edge by a boat when beating in.

**Coutance Island.**<sup>5</sup>—From the masthead of the *Beagle* a chain of sandbanks and shoals were observed, extending a considerable distance in a N.N.E. direction, from about 2 miles N.N.E. of Coutance Island.

During the S.E. monsoon there is said to be better anchorage in from 2 to 7 fathoms under the lee of a large sandbank, lying about 4 miles eastward of Coutance Island, than off that island.

*Directions*.—When proceeding between Coutance and Grango islands through the inner passage, it is recommended to keep at from 1 to 2 miles within the edge of the Barrier Reef, carefully avoiding two large coral patches awash, situated east from Coutance Island, distant respectively  $1\frac{1}{2}$  and 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  miles.

**Barrier Reef.**—At 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  miles eastward of Coutance Island there is an opening in the Barrier Reef, three-quarters of a mile wide and apparently deep.

**Sandbank Bay.**—From Sandbank Point, the east entrance point of this bay, sandbanks and rocks, about a mile wide, east and west, extend about 2 miles at right angles from the general trend of the coast; at high-water only some portions of these are visible.

There is a good passage in from 5 to 7 fathoms water, close along the outer edge of these dangers, gradually shoaling to 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms on the western side of the bay, where the *Beagle* anchored.

From Sandbank Bay the *Beagle* steered S.W. to the western side of Rodney Entrance, without observing any shoals.

**Barrier Reef.**—There are two openings through the Barrier Reef, situated in long.  $148^\circ 45' E.$  and  $148^\circ 40' E.$  respectively; the eastern of these is about 1 mile wide.

The *Beagle* passed through the western of these openings and found it to be about half a mile wide, with depths of more than 17 fathoms in it. The barrier on the eastern side projects a little to the south-westward; on the western side the reef is narrow, and trends W.N.W.

A reef which uncovers is situated in lat.  $10^\circ 20' S.$ , long.  $148^\circ 42' E.$ ; from this reef numerous shoals were observed extending towards Colombier Point.

**Cloudy Bay.**—When entering this bay from the southward, the *Beagle*, from a position in lat.  $10^\circ 18' S.$ , long.  $148^\circ 34' E.$ , steered N. by E. for 2 miles, when rocks above water were seen in a westerly direction, and from thence to the anchorage the channel was extremely intricate, leading in depths of 10 and 12 fathoms between shoals and sandbanks, which were observed in all directions.

**Anchorage.**—The *Beagle* anchored in 5 fathoms in Cloudy Bay, nearly abreast of Eugenie Island.

**Colombier Point**, the east entrance of Cloudy Bay, is low and sandy, with sandbanks and shoals extending from it for a considerable distance.

A large sandbank, a considerable part of which uncovers at low-water, lies close off the point, and westward of it are two coral patches, which should be rounded at a distance of 300 or 400 yards.

There is a channel close round Colombier Point, 50 yards wide, with a depth of 7 fathoms in it.

**Anchorage.**—Good and sheltered anchorage for small vessels can be obtained N.W. of Colombier Point, but the approach is so obstructed by shoals that a preliminary examination should be made in a boat.

The *Beagle* anchored in 4 $\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms, mud, with the point bearing S.E. by E. distant half a mile.

The Natives of Dedede (a village situated on Colombier Point) are treacherous.

**Tides.**—At Colombier Point (midway between neaps and springs) a rise from 5 to 6 feet was observed, the flood stream set to the westward, the ebb to the eastward.

**Forrest Point.**—This well-defined point is situated about 3 miles eastward of Colombier Point. There is said to be good smooth anchorage in 3 fathoms N.W. of this point during the S.E. monsoon.

A reef lies about half a mile from Forrest Point, and is half a mile long in a W.S.W. and E.N.E. direction. The eastern part of this reef extends eastward of Forrest Point, and affords shelter to the anchorage. A shoal, with but little water over it, lies at a short distance N.W. of this reef, and several coral patches lie S.E. of it, of which one, awash at low-water, lies opposite a small village on the beach, at about one mile east of Forrest Point.

Water can be procured at the anchorage off Forrest Point, but the natives are treacherous.

**Grango Island.**—The passage through the barrier reef immediately west of this island is about one mile wide, and is said to be clear of danger, but when seen from the masthead of the *Beagle* did not appear deep, heavy rollers, which occasionally broke, were setting in nearly across the passage.

Anchorage can be obtained off the north-east side of this island in 17 fathoms, somewhat close to the shore, protected by a reef which projects about half a mile N.E. from the east extreme of the island, and extends round its east and south sides.

At about one mile from Grango Island, in a N.W. and W.N.W. direction, there is much shoal water and depths of from 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  and 4 fathoms were obtained on the edge of the barrier reef.

A heavy break was observed at about 4 miles N.W. by N. from Grango Island, from the masthead of the *Beagle*, and westward of this shoal broken water was observed.

**Table Point.**—The uncovered portion of the barrier reef, lying southward of Table Point, shelters vessels approaching that point from the eastward through the inner passage.

A depth of 21 fathoms was obtained when within one mile of Table Point.

A shoal, over which the *Beagle* found a depth of 4 fathoms (discolored water) lies E. by S. from Table Point, distant about 9 miles.

The best passage for vessels in this vicinity is at 1½ or 2 miles from the shore, in a depth of 11 to 13 fathoms, taking care to avoid a shoal lying half a mile outside and eastward of Table Point.

**Amazon Island.**<sup>6</sup>—The south-east extreme of the sandbank, lying S.S.W. of Amazon Island, is connected by shoals and sandbanks with the reef on which double rocks are situated.

Northward of this, sheltered anchorage will be found during the S.E. monsoon.

**Toulon Island.**—*Shoals.*—Several shoals, with 4 fathoms over them, lie off the eastern side of Toulon Island.

At 4 miles W. by N. ¼ N. from Toulon Island a depth of 7 fathoms was obtained, increasing when steering W. by N. ¼ N. to 13 fathoms, which depth was maintained for a distance of 3 miles.

**Mayri Bay.**—This bay, the entrance to which is about 2 miles wide, extends about 2½ miles east and west, and affords good and sheltered anchorage during the S.E. monsoon in from 10 to 6 fathoms, mud. Off the south entrance point a spit extends nearly half a mile, and the shores are fringed with coral reefs extending for some distance; the head of the bay is shoal.

Between Mayri Bay and Toulon Island, depths of from 10 to 15 fathoms were obtained.

**Millport Harbor.**—This excellent and capacious harbor is of an oval shape, the longer diameter extending east and west for a distance of 2 miles, and the shorter N. by E. and S. by W. for 1½ miles. Two wooded islands and a rock lie off the east entrance point, and one island lies near the west entrance point; clumps of coconut trees and mangroves with white sandy beaches between, extend round the shores of the harbor, which is fringed by a coral reef, extending from 30 to 150 yards from the coast.

At the eastern extreme of the harbor a rocky patch extends about 400 yards from the shore.

The entrance is about half a mile wide, and has in it a depth of 11 fathoms, gradually shoaling to 7 fathoms, which is the general depth all over the harbor, the bottom being of mud.

The country in the vicinity of Millport Harbor is mountainous, sloping to the entrance points, which are low. A remarkable high peak (Mount Goldie) lies N.N.W. of the harbor.

Water can be obtained from a cove at the head of Millport Harbor; close west of this cove a spit and reef extends a short distance from the shore.

**Cette Island.**—A coral reef, which uncovers at low-water, and extends about one mile in an east and west direction, and is half a mile broad, lies about one mile east of Cette Island.

Several shoals lie N.E. of this danger, on one of which the *Beagle* found a depth of 3½ fathoms, with Cette Island bearing about west and the entrance to Port Glasgow N.W. ¼ W.; the water in the vicinity being much discolored, renders it difficult to see these shoals.

**Dufauré Island.**<sup>7</sup>—The south-western part of Dufauré Island is connected with Kopo Kopo Island by a reef, which at low-water uncovers nearly its whole extent.

Good well-sheltered anchorage during the S.E. monsoon will be found westward of this reef in 12 fathoms, stiff mud; but the space is somewhat contracted, as the fringing reef extends half a mile from Dufauré Island. This anchorage is readily accessible.

**Port Duffield.**—The island lying about one-third of a mile off the east entrance point of this port (Webb Island) is composed of white sand and rocks, and has on it a clump of coconut trees.

Between this island and the mainland there is a channel having in it a depth of 11 fathoms, though narrowed by shoals extending from both sides.

A small wooded island lies close to the western entrance point, and is joined to the mainland by a reef, which uncovers at low-water.

**Anchorage.**—Good anchorage in 10 fathoms, mud, will be found northward of the island lying off the western entrance point.

**SOUTH CAPE.**—*Murri Pass.*—When entering the anchorage in this pass (north of Stacey Island) from the eastward, it is advisable to keep near the southern shore, as a reef extends some distance from the mainland.

When seen from the westward, the hill over South Cape, 920 feet high, appears as a double peak.

**Tissot Island.**—A depth of 6 fathoms was found at one mile N.E. of Tissot Island, and the water appeared shoal in the vicinity.

**Leocadie Islands.**<sup>8</sup>—These islands, lying off the west entrance point of Inverary Bay, are two in number, separated by a channel about one cable wide. The smaller island lies about a quarter of a mile south of the larger, the channel between being seen open when approaching from the eastward or westward.

There is a conspicuous tree on the smaller Leocadie Island and a red bluff at the north-east extreme.

Good sheltered anchorage may be obtained between the northern island and the mainland. The entrance to this anchorage is from the eastward, between two reefs, the southern of which (extending from Leocadie Island) does not break, and has a rock awash at half-tide near the extreme; the anchorage is three-quarters of a mile wide, and has in it a depth of 8 fathoms.

The soundings in the vicinity of this anchorage are irregular, varying from 17 to 7 fathoms.

**Heath Reefs.**—The *Beagle* passed over the assigned position of Heath Reefs, but although the weather was clear and there was a heavy swell from the southward, no indication of shoal water was observed.

**CHINA STRAIT.**—*Heath Island.*<sup>9</sup>—There is no passage for vessels between Heath Island and the two islets lying close northward of it.

A dangerous shoal, extending N.W. and S.E. for about 200 yards, with probably less than 6 feet water over it, lies N.E. from the south-east extreme of the eastern of these two islets, distant half a mile.

The *Beagle* passed between Heath Island and this shoal, when a slight ripple was observed upon it.

**Water.**—Good water can be procured from a stream running through the large village in Musters Bay, on the east side of Heath Island.

The mission station, formerly established on Heath Island, has been removed to Dinner Island.

**Blanchard Island.**—Good smooth anchorage in 12 fathoms water, regular soundings, can be obtained, during the S.E. monsoon, off the north-west side of Blanchard Island.

**Hayter Island.**<sup>10</sup>—*Stanley Bay.*—This bay is situated on the south side of Hayter Island, westward of Peninsula Point. The *Beagle* found good anchorage, well sheltered from the S.E. monsoon, in 11 fathoms, mud, with the east extreme of Blanchard Island shut in by Peninsular Point, bearing S. by E. ¼ E. There is a large village on the shores of this bay.

**Dinner Island.**—There is good anchorage with smooth water in from 6 to 9 fathoms, mud, with Dinner Island bearing S.E. distant about 300 yards.

This is a convenient anchorage for sailing vessels when waiting for the tide to proceed through China strait.

**Sand banks.**<sup>11</sup>—Midway between the north extremes of Papes and Didymus islands, a sandbank with stones on it, which uncovers, was observed.

At one mile N.N.E. from Mekinley Island, are two shoal patches of sand. Vessels approaching from the southward and intending to proceed east should not haul to the eastward after passing Mekinley Island until these two last-mentioned patches are made out.

South of Mekinley Island, and separated from it by a passage about 80 yards across, is a low island, about 400 yards in length, covered with mangrove bushes.

#### LOUISIADÉ ARCHIPELAGO.<sup>12</sup>

**TESTE ISLAND.**<sup>13</sup>—*Anchorage* was obtained by H.M.S. *Emerald* on the south-west edge of a bank having 8 to 9 fathoms of water over it, and 14 fathoms coral and mud within half a ship's length. From this anchorage the following bearings were observed.—Right extreme of Teste Island, North; East Island, N.N.W.; West Island, N. 82° W.

A missionary teacher, who speaks a little English, resides at Teste Island.

**Tides.**—At the above-mentioned anchorage the tidal streams ran in a N.N.E. and S.S.W. direction, attaining at springs a velocity of 4 knots an hour.

**Imbert Islet.**—*Reefs.*—A reef awash, of circular shape and about three-quarters of a mile in diameter, lies S. by W. from Imbert Island, distant, 1¼ miles.<sup>14</sup>

A large coral reef, awash at low-water, lies S.W. by W. from Imbert Islet, distant 2 miles. This reef is about 2 miles long in a N.E. and S.W. direction, and is of semicircular shape, being curved on the south-east side. There is a clear passage between this reef and Imbert Islet.<sup>15</sup>

**Stuers Islets.**<sup>16</sup>—The reef surrounding the larger of these islets extends some distance north and south from the islet; the *Beagle* passed through the channel eastward of this reef, and found it to be about a quarter of a mile broad, with deep water on the eastern side, close to the edge of the large detached reef lying S.E. of the Stuers Islets.

Shoal water extends about half a mile N.W. from the northern small islet of the Stuers Group, and the south-eastern islet of the group is nearly joined to the large reef lying southward of it.

**Anchorage.**—The western edge of the detached reef lying S.E. of Stuers Islets is steep-to, but from the southern edges of this reef, and also of that lying S.W. of the group, shoal water extends some distance, and, if the sea is not too heavy, vessels may find temporary anchorage.

**Emerald Reef.**—An extensive reef was discovered by H.M.S. *Emerald* in latitude 10° 36' S., longitude 151° 35' E. A depth of 7 fathoms was struck in what appeared to be the light of this reef, with Hastings Island bearing N. 38° E., Dawson Island N. 43° W., left extreme of Hummock Island S. 82° W. From this position, one portion of the reef extended N.N.W. for about 4 miles, and the other E. for probably a much greater distance. Numerous tide rips prevented the limits of the reef being clearly defined, but just westward of the depth of 7 fathoms it appeared to be nearly awash.

**Bramble Haven.**—*Current.*<sup>16</sup>—The *Beagle*, when hove-to off Bramble Haven in June, was set south 30 miles in 12 hours.

**CONFLICT GROUP.**<sup>17</sup>—The *Conflict* in 1880 passed through the group of islands reported to have been seen from H.M.S. *Cormorant* in 1879 in latitude 10° 46' S., between the meridians of 151° 38' E. and 151° 54' E. (approximate), and (by moonlight) 22 islets were counted from the masthead; the *Conflict* ran for 7

miles along the northern edge of a barrier reef extending east and west, and apparently forming the southern part of the group.

At the eastern part of this group the flood stream was found setting to the eastward, and at the western limit it set to the westward; smooth water was experienced when among these islets.

**Eddystone Island.**—A shoal, about half a mile in extent, and from its appearance having probably 3 to 4 fathoms over it, is situated in latitude  $11^{\circ} 8' S.$ , longitude  $152^{\circ} 33\frac{1}{2}' E.$  This position is about  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles E. by S. from the east extreme of Eddystone Island.

**Mewstone Island.**—**Anchorage.**—There is good anchorage on the south side of Mewstone Island, in 15 fathoms, coral and sand, about a mile from the shore, from which, also, reefs extend for a distance of half a mile. The following are the bearings taken from the position in which the *Emerald* anchored:—East extreme of Mewstone Island, N.  $53^{\circ} E.$ ; south-west extreme of Mewstone Island, N.  $69^{\circ} W.$

**Mudge Island.**—A reef, 7 miles long in an east and west direction, lies eastward of Mudge Island.

From the west extreme of this reef Mudge Island bears W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N., distant 23 miles.

**RENARD GROUP.**—This group consists of 11 small islands, lying north-east of Calvados Chain. The westernmost island, the largest of the group, is about 500 feet in height, and has several conspicuous grass-covered peaks upon it. It is surrounded by a fringe reef. At one mile from the west extreme point of this island no bottom could be obtained with 150 fathoms of line.

The remaining islands of the group are low, densely wooded, and surrounded by fringe reefs. A depth of 16 fathoms, sand, was obtained at half a mile off the north shore of Long Island, one of the easternmost of the group.

**Barrier Reef.**—At about 12 miles south of Renard Group is situated the northern edge of the Barrier Reef of the Calvados Chain, which, with the exception of one small opening, appears to extend to the westward in an unbroken line from this position to Basses Islands.

No bottom could be obtained with 100 fathoms line at 2 miles northward of the edge of the reef, and the water inside the barrier appeared very deep from the masthead.

The space between this barrier and the Renard Group is apparently free from dangers, several casts with 150 fathoms line giving no indications of bottom.

**ST. AIGNAN ISLAND.**<sup>18</sup>—North-west of the Renard Group is situated St. Aignan Island, extending 22 miles in an east and west direction. The north coast is steep-to, but is higher at the western than at the eastern part. At the east extreme are several perpendicular limestone cliffs, and at the west extreme the hills slope from a high range, and are densely wooded to the water's edge. The highest hills are about 3,000 feet in height, the others vary between 2,000 and 1,000 feet in elevation. No reefs were observed off the north side, and the water was deep close alongside the cliffs.

**Anchorage.**—Anchorage in 13 fathoms, sand and coral, fair holding ground, was obtained in a small bight, on the east side of the large bay in the middle of the island. This anchorage is open to winds from west through north to N.E.

**Supplies.**—An abundance of good water was found at St. Aignan Island (October), many streams running down the gullies between the hills.

A few yams and taro were procured from the natives, who were quite friendly, but shy at first. Some pigs and fowls were seen, but the natives did not seem inclined to part with them. The sago palm is extensively cultivated.

**DEBOYNE ISLANDS.**—This group bears S.W. by W. from the west extreme of St. Aignan island distant 6 miles.

The coasts are cliffy and about 100 feet in height, with apparently deep water close to, no reefs being observed off the north and east sides. Reefs extend off the west side of the group to a group of small islands; these have not been examined.

Deboyne islands are generally flat-topped and thickly wooded.

**Deboyne Peak.**—A conspicuous hill, about 1500 feet in height, and partly wooded, rises from the centre of the largest island, and is the only high land on this group.

The space northward of St. Aignan and the Renard group as far as latitude  $10^{\circ}$  south is apparently clear of dangers, the *Renard* having frequently passed over it.

**LASEINIE ISLANDS.**<sup>19</sup>—**Breakers.**—The sea was seen to break to the westward of Laseinie islands, and shoals appeared to extend from the Hardman islands across to Dawson Island.

**Discoloured water.**—Several patches of discoloured water were observed and passed close to, with Hardman islands bearing W.N.W. distant 4 miles. These patches had apparently about 5 fathoms on them.

**BONVOULOIR ISLANDS.**<sup>20</sup>—**East Island.**—This island is about 500 feet in height and densely wooded; the east side is cliffy, the north west and west sides are somewhat lower.

The island is inhabited, the natives trading freely alongside, yams and apples were procured in exchange for hoop iron, tobacco, and pipes.

No bottom could be obtained with 150 fathoms of line at from half a mile to three-quarters of a mile from the north shore. Shoal water of probably 18 or 20 fathoms extends off the eastern extreme.

**Anchorage.**—Anchorage was obtained in 17 fathoms, broken coral and sand, at about a quarter of a mile from the N.W. side of East Island.

**Current.**—The surface current was observed to set to the westward at the rate of two miles an hour, and a strong under current was found to set east.

**Hastings Island.**—This island is about 400 feet high, cliffy and densely wooded. A small bank about three-quarters of a mile in length and a quarter of a mile broad lies off the N.W. extreme.

A group of islands lies north from Hastings Island, distant 3 miles, apparently consisting of three islands connected by a reef.

The channel between this group and Hastings Island appears to be clear of dangers.

**Reef.**—Between Hastings and East islands there is a detached reef on which the sea breaks heavily.

**Blakeney Islet.**—Good anchorage in  $8\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms, white sand, was obtained off the N.W. side of this island, with the centre of the island bearing S.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. distant a quarter of a mile, or just eastward of the sand spit that extends from the N.W. side.

**Discoloured water.**—At 3 miles W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. from Blakeney Islet patches of discoloured water were observed.

#### AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST.

##### (1.) *Alteration in Baranjo Head Light.*

The Government of New South Wales has given notice, dated 30th April 1881, that on 1st August 1881 the two fixed white lights hitherto exhibited from Baranjo Head, south side of entrance to Broken Bay, will be discontinued, and a red light substituted for them.

This light will be a fixed light of the second order, elevated 370 feet above high-water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 15 miles, between the bearings of N.N.W. through west to S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S.

The illuminating apparatus will be dioptric, or by means of lenses.

#### NEW ZEALAND—NORTH ISLAND.—WEST COAST.

##### (2.) *Fixed Light on Cape Egmont.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 103, of 2nd July 1881, on the intended exhibition of a fixed light on Cape Egmont:—

The New Zealand Government has given further notice, dated 14th June 1881, that this light would come into operation on 1st August 1881.

The light is a fixed white light of the second order, elevated 103 feet above the sea, and visible seaward in clear weather from a distance of about 15 miles, between the bearings of N.  $23^{\circ}$  W. and S.  $5^{\circ}$  W.

The light-tower is situated 259 yards within the high-water mark of Cape Egmont, and is 67 feet high, constructed of iron and painted white.

Position approximate, lat.  $39^{\circ} 17' S.$ , long.  $173^{\circ} 46' E.$

#### NORTH ISLAND—EAST COAST.

##### (3.) *Alteration in Lights at Port Napier.*

Also that, on 18th July 1881, a light would be exhibited from the eastern pier at Port Napier, in place of the two fixed green lights and the fixed red and white light formerly exhibited at the entrance to that port, which have been discontinued.

This light is a fixed light of the fifth order, elevated about 27 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of about 7 miles; it shows white when bearing from S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. to S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S.; red from S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. to S.S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. over Pania Rock; white from S.S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. to S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E.; green from S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. to S.S.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. over the anchorage; and white westward of the anchorage.

The light is exhibited from an open wooden structure, painted black, and situated about 190 feet within the outer extremity of the eastern pier.

**NOTE.**—Vessels approaching Port Napier from the southward should have the white sector of this light well open before rounding Ahuriri Bluff, in order to avoid Auckland Rock.

[The bearings are magnetic. Variation (1)  $10\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  easterly, (2) and (3)  $14\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  easterly in 1881.]

## DANGERS IN CARIMATA PASSAGE.

The Dutch surveying vessel *Hydrograaf* sought fruitless for :—  
1st. The danger marked with a small circle on the Dutch Chart, "Westkust Borneo, blad II.," at 7 miles E.N.E. from Poeloe Kanis.

2nd. The reef placed on the same chart at 6 miles N.N.W. from Poeloe Nangka, and

3rd. The reef placed on the same chart 8 miles W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. from Poeloe Nangka.

The *Hydrograaf* discovered further :—

Detached reef composed of coral and stones, S.W. from Poeloe Nangka, and stretching N. and S. about 600 meter, and E. and W. 400 meter.

Smallest depth 2 fathoms, and around this steep reef 15 to 20 fathoms, generally no breakers or alteration of color to be seen.

The middle of this reef lies with the following bearings :—

Goenong Boerong Mandie N. 130° W. 15 miles.

South Peak of Poeloe Nangka, N. 57° E. 8 miles.

Middle of Poeloe Bakau N. 175° W. 6 miles.

Between the islands of the Momprang Group are series of coral reefs and shoals, wherefore the passages between these islands are considered useless for the navigation of great ships.

## NELSON HARBOR.

It is hereby notified that, from recent soundings taken on Nelson bar by Pilot Low, it appears that there is now from 1 to 2 feet less water than is shown on the Admiralty chart, and that at times, during neap tides, the rise and fall is as little as 6 feet. On the eastern edge of the bank or shoal a red buoy has been placed in 7 feet of water, with the lighthouse bearing N. 15° E., red beacon at entrance to harbor S. E. by E. and the Arrow Rock S. E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. This buoy should be kept on the starboard hand going in, and the deepest water will be found on the Boulder Bank side of the channel.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act 1873* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might for any species of Fish prescribe a close season or close seasons in every year : Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the proclamation bearing date the seventh day of June, One thousand eight hundred and eighty, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the eighteenth June, One thousand eight hundred and eighty, and with the advice aforesaid do hereby prescribe the period from the first day of April to the thirtieth day of September in each year to be a close season for all species of Fish, so far as Lake Colac and its tributaries are concerned.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and in the forty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## "FISHERIES ACT AMENDMENT ACT 1878."

The births of 752 children, viz., 383 boys and 369 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of October. In the month of September 797 births were registered, or 45 more than in the month under review. The births were 70 above the average of the previous seven years, but 6 below that average, if allowance be made for increase of population.

The deaths registered in October numbered 397, viz., 222 of males and 175 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 355. The deaths were fewer than those in September by 23, but exceeded the average of October, during the previous ten years by 49. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of those ten years by 5.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 84.9° on the 23th, and the lowest was 35.4° on the 7th. The mean temperature of the month (55.0°) was nearly two degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (35.9°) took place on the 1st, viz., from a maximum of 82.8° to a minimum of 46.9°. The least range (7.5°) was on the 11th, viz., from a maximum of 59.1° to a minimum of 51.6°. The mean daily range was 18.3°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.948 inches) was slightly above the average.

Of the deaths registered during the month 56 per cent. were of males and 44 per cent. were of females. Thirty-three per cent. were of children under the age of 5 years, as against 37 per cent. in October both in 1880 and 1879; 27 per cent. in October 1878; 39 per cent. in October 1877; 29 per cent. in October 1876; 39 per cent. in October 1875; 35 per cent. in October 1874; 37 per cent. in October 1873 and 1872; and 41 per cent. in October 1871.

The deaths of 20 persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month, viz.:—Two females, both aged 75, of rheumatism and cancer respectively; a solicitor, aged 75, of apoplexy; a carpenter, aged 75, of pneumonia; a female, aged 76, of paralysis; a waterman, aged 76, of rheumatic gout; a solicitor, aged 79, of bronchitis; a shepherd, aged 80, of brain disease and pleuro-pneumonia; a female, aged 80, of congestion of the lungs; and another, also aged 80, of injuries received by being knocked down by a horse; a male patient in the Lunatic Asylum, aged 83, of brain disease; a miner, aged 84, of congestion of the lungs; a watchman, aged 77, a laundress, aged 80, three females aged 81, 81, and 83, respectively, an ex-surveyor-general, aged 87, a female aged 88, and a carpenter, aged 90, of old age.

Nineteen of the deaths registered during the month were set down to external causes, viz. :—16 to accident or negligence, 1 to homicide, and 2 to suicide. The particulars of the deaths from accident are as follow :—An apprentice on board ship, aged 20, was killed by a fall on the deck; a contractor, aged 72, died of the effects of a fall from a verandah; a laborer, aged 30, was killed by falling on the point of a crow-bar; an Industrial School boy, aged 11, died of fracture of the skull, and a carpenter, aged 68, of fracture of the pelvis—both resulting from falls; a female, aged 80, died from injuries received through being knocked down by a horse; a laborer, aged 46, was crushed between two railway trucks; a fireman, aged 21, was passed over by a train; a male child, aged 12 months, died of scalds, and another, aged 16 months, of burns; three male children, aged 1, 3, and 6 years respectively, were found drowned; two male infants, both aged 3 months, were suffocated in bed; and a male infant, aged 10 months, was choked by a piece of pine wood. The death set down to homicide was that of a male infant, about 15 days old, which was found in the River Yarra—evidently a case of infanticide. Of those who committed suicide, a constable, aged 25, poisoned himself, and an engineer, aged 29, hanged himself.

Ninety-five deaths, or 24 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz. :—54 in the Melbourne Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Alfred Hospital, 7 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 3 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, and 2 in the Madeline-street Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 131, of which 72, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 59, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 100 were under one year of age, 20 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, and 3 were between three and four.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 266. Of these, 150, or 56 per cent., were males, and 116, or 44 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 13 were between fifteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 20 were between twenty-five and thirty, 17 were between thirty and thirty-five, 19 were between thirty-five and forty, 27 were between forty and forty-five, 18 were between forty-five and fifty, 27 were between fifty and fifty-five, 18 were between fifty-five and sixty, 20 were between sixty and sixty-five, 16 were between sixty-five and seventy, 18 were between seventy and seventy-five, 8 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 12 were upwards of eighty.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Act, the sum of Five hundred pounds, a shire; and it was also enacted that every Order constituting any new municipality should constitute the same as either a borough or a shire, and should—(1.) Assign a name to such borough or shire. (2.) Describe the boundaries thereof. (3.) Determine how many members the council should consist. (4.) Determine whether the municipal district constituted should be subdivided or not, and every such Order constituting any new municipality having for its municipal district portion of a previously existing municipal district should operate to sever such portion from such previously existing municipal district: And it was further enacted by the said Act that every petition for the constitution of a shire must be signed by fifty inhabitants of the part of Victoria sought to be constituted a shire, each of whom possesses rateable property therein; and that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, signed by not less than fifty inhabitants of the part of Victoria described in such petition (being a portion of the Shire of Buln Buln), each of whom possesses rateable property therein, praying that such part should be constituted a municipality by the name of the Shire of Warragul: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Act, and no valid counter petition in opposition thereto has been presented: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make Orders constituting and describing a shire to be named the Shire of Warragul, and re-defining the boundaries of the Shire of Buln Buln and the north-eastern riding thereof, as hereby reduced, in manner following, that is to say :-

SHIRE OF WARRAGUL CONSTITUTED AND DEFINED.

Commencing at the intersection of the Moe River with the northern boundary of the Gippsland Railway reserve; thence south-westerly up the Moe River and Bear Creek to the south-west angle of allotment 100, parish of Warragul; thence east by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 99; thence south by a road to the south-west angle of same allotment; thence west by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 129; thence south, east, and south again by a road forming the west and part of the southern boundary of the last-named allotment to its south-west angle; thence west by same road to the north-west boundary of

allotment 130; thence south by same road, being the western boundary of that allotment, to its south-west angle and its junction with McDonald's track; thence south-westerly by that track to its junction with Lardner's track; thence northerly by that track and the western boundary of the parish of Drouin East to the north-west angle of allotment 26 of that parish; thence to and by the dividing line between allotments 22 and 23 parish of Drouin West to Brandy Creek; thence north-westerly by that creek to the dividing line between allotments 14A and 14B, parish of Drouin East; thence north by that line to the centre of the two-chain road to Neerim; thence northerly by that road to the north-east angle of allotment belonging to J. A. Ellis; thence easterly by a direct line to the northern angle of allotment 116, Drouin East, belonging to W. Little; thence east by a direct line to the west boundary of the Shire of Narracan, being a line bearing true north from the commencing point; and thence south to the commencing point aforesaid.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a creek or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such creek or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

Unless otherwise specifically mentioned the bearings have reference to the magnetic meridian.

And it is hereby determined that the Council of the said Shire of Warragul shall consist of nine members, and that such municipal district shall not be subdivided at present.

SHIRE OF BULN BULN REDUCED.

Commencing at a point on the boundary of the county of Mornington where it is intersected by the northern boundary of the Gippsland Railway reserve; thence southward along the said county boundary, being the east boundary of the shire of Berwick, to a point east of the south-east angle of the parish of Cranbourne, west to a point north of the east angle of section 19, parish of Yallock; thence south to the east angle of section 19, parish of Yallock; thence along the eastern side of allotments 24 and 1, and the southward side of allotments 1, 2, and 3, south and west to and around allotments 20, 28, and 26, all in the same parish, to the south-east angle of Meikle's pro-emptive section; thence west to Western Port Bay; thence by the shore of the bay south-easterly to a point opposite the northern boundary of Hurdy Gurdy pre-emptive section, county of Mornington; thence to and by the said boundary and a line east therefrom to the east boundary of the said county; thence north-easterly by that boundary, being part of the western boundary of the Shire of Narracan, to Macdonald's track; thence northerly by that track to its intersection with Lardner's track; thence northerly by Lardner's track and the western boundary of the parish of Drouin East to the north-west angle of allotment 26 of that parish; thence to and by the dividing line between allotments 22 and 23, parish of Drouin West, to Brandy Creek; thence north-westerly by that creek to the dividing line between allotments 14A and 14B, parish of Drouin East; thence north by that line to the centre of the two-chain road to Neerim; thence northerly by that road to the north-east angle of allotment belonging to J. A. Ellis; thence easterly by a direct line to the northern angle of allotment 116, Drouin East, belonging to W. Little; thence east by a direct line to the west boundary of the Shire of Narracan, being a line bearing true north from the intersection of the north boundary of the Gippsland Railway reserve with the Moe River; thence true north by that boundary to the south boundary of the county of Evelyn; thence west by that boundary and south by the east boundary of the county of Mornington to the commencing point.

BULN BULN SHIRE.—NORTH-EASTERN RIDING REDUCED.

Commencing at a point on the shire boundary in the centre of the two-chain road to Neerim, east of the north-east angle of allotment belonging to J. A. Ellis; thence easterly by a direct line to the northern angle of allotment 116, parish of Drouin East, belonging to W. Little; thence east by a direct line to the west boundary of the Shire of Narracan, being a line bearing true north from the intersection of the north boundary of the Gippsland Railway reserve with the Moe River; thence true north by that line to the south boundary of the county of Evelyn; thence west by that boundary to a point true north of the north-east angle of J. Roger's selection, being allotment 2, parish of Neerim; thence true south to the said angle; and thence southerly by the two-chain road through Neerim to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Charles Young, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**LILLYDALE RESERVE.**

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES AT LILLYDALE.

THE Council of the Shire of Lillydale, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order of 27th April 1868, for Public purposes at Lillydale, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* :—

*Regulations.*

1. The reserve shall be always open to the public.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the fences, hedges, gates, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in, or allow to wander into, the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or poultry.

6. No person shall erect any building, booth, or structure of any kind in the reserve on any pretence whatsoever, without the consent in writing of the committee of management being first obtained.

7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS.**

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Order for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery five hours previous to the interment.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
5. The charge will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced before two of the trustees that the relatives or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges, except the cost of digging grave.
6. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to persons applying.
7. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
8. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition, at the expense of the owner.
9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees, for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

11. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair, may be removed, by order of the trustees, without notice to owner.

12. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the office of the sexton.

13. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of, the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14. It is notified that any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, tombstone, or vault, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanor, and, being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished, as prescribed by the Act in that case made and provided.

15. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

16. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.

17. No grave to be of less depth than 6 feet, except in case of still-born children, 3 feet.

18. The charge for digging grave to include filling up.

19. Family vaults to be limited to 10 feet frontage by a depth of 10 feet. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations.

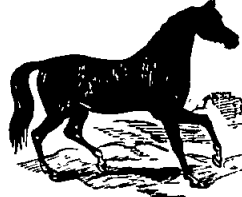

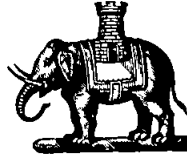
