GRANT FOR THE PURCHASE OF BOOKS FOR FREE PUBLIC LIBRARIES, 1880-81.

THE Committees for the Management of Free Public Libraries claiming to participate in the Grant of £3,000 for the purchase of books, are hereby requested to send in their applications on or before the 26th of March instant.

The conditions attached to the vote are:—

1. That grants be made in proportion to the sum, in the aggregate not less than £5, collected by private subscriptions or local rates during 1880.
2. That no grant exceeding £200 be paid to any one library.
3. That no more than one-sixth of the entire sum be divided amongst institutions within ten miles of Melbourne.

Institutions not already supplied with forms of application can obtain them on application by letter addressed to this office.

N.B.—The Grant is limited to Free Libraries.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

The Public Works Statute 1865, section 128.—"It shall be lawful for any officer or agent of the board or company, and all persons called by him to his assistance, to seize and detain any person who shall have committed any offence against the provisions of this part of this Act or of the bye-laws made under the authority of this Act, and whose name and residence shall be unknown to such officer or agent, and give him in charge to a police constable who shall convey him with all convenient despatch before some justice without any warrant or other authority than this Act; and such justice shall proceed with all convenient despatch to the hearing and determining of the complaint against such offender."

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby authorize and appoint the person named in the schedule hereto annexed as its agent and officer for the purpose of carrying into effect (so far as applicable to each respective case) the 128th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and also at any time hereafter to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the provisions of Part III. of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, or of any bye-law made or to be made under the authority of such Act; and to summon such person before any justice or justices for such offence, or to charge him or her with such offence.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Board of Land and Works.

WHEREAS by the Electoral Act 1865 it was amongst other things enacted that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission should have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of ratepaying electors, the Governor in Council might take all such measures as might be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or might declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and every such Order in Council should state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and should be forthwith published in the Government Gazette: And whereas the Secretary of Wannoo Shire accidentally omitted to furnish the Electoral Registrar for the Harrow South division of the Western Province with a list containing the names of the Ratepaying Electors set forth in Schedule A within the time fixed by Act No. 334 for that purpose: And whereas the Secretary of the Shire of Euroa similarly omitted to furnish the Electoral Registrar for the Avenel division of the Electoral District of Moira with a list containing the names specified in Schedule B within the time fixed by Act No. 548: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power in him vested by the 68th section of the Act No. 279, doth by this present Order direct that the Rolls of Ratepaying Electors for the Harrow South division of the Western Province, and for the Avenel division of the Electoral District of Moira, be rectified by including therein the names of the Ratepaying Electors as set forth in Schedules A and B hereto respectively, notwithstanding such accidental omissions as aforesaid; and the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby declare valid the said divisional Rolls of Ratepaying Electors so rectified.

THE SHIRES OF GISBORNE AND ROMSEY.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-first day of March 1881.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Order, amongst other things, altering, for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was also enacted that any error in any Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act might be rectified by the Governor in Council by any subsequent Order: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the seventh day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, a portion of the territory was severed from the Mountain Riding of the Shire of Gisborne and attached as an additional Riding to the Shire of Romsey and therein denominated the Riddell's Creek Riding, and the boundaries of the said shires and of Mountain Riding of the Shire of Gisborne and of the Riddell's Creek Riding of the Shire of Romsey were respectively set forth in the said Order: And whereas the said boundaries were incorrectly described therein, and it is expedient to rectify and re-define the same: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the hereinbefore-mentioned Order in Council of the seventh day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said shires and of the said ridings thereof, in manner following, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF GISBORNE.

Commencing at the south-west angle of Matson's pre-emptive right, in the parish of Bullengarook; thence north to the north-west angle of same; thence west to the south-west angle of allotment 20^a, same parish; thence northerly by Goodman's Creek, being the western boundary of the said parish, and a line to a point on the northern boundary of the county of Bourke due south of the west boundary of the township of Woodend; thence north-easterly by the county boundary aforesaid to the north-west angle of allotment 57, parish of Kerrie; thence south by the west boundary of allotments 57 and 58, and south-easterly by part of the south boundary of the last-named allotment to the centre of the Barringo Creek; thence southerly by that creek to a point west of the north-west angle of allotment 51; thence east by a line and the north boundary of allotments 51 and 50 to the centre of a road east of the north-east angle of the last-named allotment; thence southerly by the centre of that road, forming the east boundary of allotments 50, 53, and 41 to the south-east angle of the last-named allotment; thence west by the north boundary of allotment 36 and south by the west boundary of that allotment to the south-west angle of same; thence east by the centre of a one-chain road to the north-west angle of allotment 6^a; thence south-easterly by the south-west boundary of said allotment to the Macedon River; thence, crossing that river, south-westerly and south by the centre of a road forming the western boundary of allotments 5, 6, and 7 of section 35, parish of Gisborne, to the northern boundary of the Mount Alexander and Murray River Railway; thence easterly and north-easterly by that railway to a point in the centre of a one-and-a-half chain road leading from Riddell's Creek to Sunbury; thence south and south-easterly by that road to a point in the centre of the western branch of the Saltwater River; thence westerly by that river forming the north boundary of the parish of Buttlerjork to the eastern boundary of the parish of Gisborne; thence by that boundary south-easterly and south to the centre of the Mount Alexander road; thence by centre of said road south-easterly to a point due west of the northern boundary of the township of the Gap; thence by a direct line west to the Djerriwarrah Creek; thence by a line westerly to the south-east angle of Matson's pre-emptive section; and thence west by the south boundary of that section to the commencing point.

THE MOUNTAIN RIDING.

Commencing at the intersection of the Mount Alexander road with the boundary of the county of Bourke; thence south-easterly by that road to a line east from a point one chain south from the south-west angle of section 34, parish of Gisborne; thence east by that line for a distance of eighty chains; thence south to the Gisborne Creek or western branch of the Saltwater River; thence easterly by that creek and part of the northern boundary of the parish of Buttlerjork to a point in the centre of a one-and-a-half chain road leading from Sunbury to Riddell's Creek; thence by the centre of said road north-westerly and north to the northern boundary of the Mount Alexander and Murray River Railway; thence by that railway south-westerly and westerly to the centre of a road forming the western boundary of allotments 7, 6, and 5 of section 35, parish of Gisborne; thence north and north-easterly by that road to the Macedon River; thence crossing that river to the south-west angle of block 6^a, parish of Kerrie; thence by the south-western boundary of that allotment to the north-west angle of same; thence west by a one-chain road to the south-west angle of allotment 36, same parish; thence by the west and north boundaries of said allotment to the south-east angle of allotment 41; thence northerly by the one-chain

road forming the east boundary of allotments 41, 53, and 50 to the north-east angle of the allotment last named; thence west by the north boundary of allotments 50 and 51 and a line to the centre of the Barringo Creek; thence northerly by that creek to the south boundary of allotment 58; thence westerly by that boundary and north by the west boundary of said allotment and allotment 57 to the northern boundary of the county of Bourke; and thence south-westerly by the said county boundary to the commencing point.

Wherever the line so described runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

Wherever the line so described runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

SAILING DIRECTIONS.

For Vessels of Heavy Draught entering Port Phillip Heads.

Present entrance.—The present entrance to Port Phillip having shoal patches of 27, 23, and 29 feet of water, which are considered dangerous to vessels of heavy draught now entering the port, it has been deemed advisable to define another fairway.

Beacons.—Two beacons (the outer RED and the inner WHITE) have therefore been erected in Lonsdale Bight (1 mile $\frac{1}{2}$ cables from Point Lonsdale and 1 mile 6 cables from Queenscliffe low light), and these kept in line will lead about midway between the *Lightning* and *Corsair* Rocks, on a bearing N.N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. (magnetic), with not less than 42 feet of water at low-water springs.

Caution.—Vessels approaching the entrance from the WESTWARD, before bringing the beacons in Lonsdale Bight in line, should keep the lighthouse well open to the left of the flagstaff on Point Lonsdale, to ensure clearing the *Lightning* Rocks.

Vessels approaching the entrance from the EASTWARD will know, when the beacons in Lonsdale Bight are in line, that they are to the eastward of the *Lightning* Rocks.

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE FRIENDLY
SOCIETIES ACT 1877."

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Friendly Societies Act 1877*, and of every other power and authority enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Clause 58 of the regulations made by the Governor in Council, and published on the 30th day of April 1878, in the second supplement to the *Victoria Government Gazette* of Friday, 26th April 1878, and, in lieu thereof, doth hereby make the regulation following, that is to say:—

REGULATION UNDER "THE FRIENDLY SOCIETIES ACT."

58. When a society or branch desires that its assets and liabilities shall be valued and reported on by an actuary to be named by the Government Statist, the return of benefits, contributions, funds, effects, debts, and credits, which the society or branch is required to make in the form prescribed by the Government Statist, shall be accompanied with a fee, which, if the actuary named is the actuary attached to the department of the Government Statist, shall be paid forthwith into the Treasury to the credit of the general revenue, or if any other actuary is named, shall be for the use of such actuary on the following scale, viz. :—

When the benefits to be valued do not exceed three (3) classes of sick allowance together with sums payable on the deaths of members and of their wives:—

For valuing societies consisting of—	£ s. d.
Not more than 25 members ...	0 12 6
More than 25 members, for the first 25 members ...	0 12 6

With a further sum of 1½d. in respect of each additional member.

When the benefits to be valued exceed those mentioned, the fee shall be fixed by the Government Statist with the approval of the Chief Secretary.

In computing the amount of fees to be paid for valuation, each branch of a society shall be considered as a separate body.

45. Tributaries of the Mitchell: Wonnangatta River—Wongungarra River—Crooked River—Dargo River—and Wentworth River.—The several beds of the Wonnangatta River, Wongungarra River, Crooked River, Dargo River, and Wentworth River, throughout their entire course, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said several rivers throughout their entire course.

47. 48A. Timbarra River.—The bed of the Timbarra River from its source to its junction with the Tambo River, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said river throughout its entire course.

51. Snowy River.—The bed of the Snowy River, from the point where it is intersected by the boundary-line between New South Wales and Victoria, to its mouth on the Ninety-mile Beach, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links measured from either bank, confining the river at its summer level between the said boundary-line and the mouth of the river.

51A. Tributaries of the Snowy River: Buchan River—Murrindall River—Toonginbooka River—and Jingallala River.—The several beds of the Buchan River, of the Murrindall River, of the Toonginbooka River, of the Jingallala River, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the same throughout their several entire courses.

52. 53. Cann River—Lake Furnell—and Tamboon Inlet.—The bed of the Cann River, the bed of Lake Furnell, the bed of Tamboon Inlet, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said river from its source to the point where it enters Lake Furnell; thence all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from the contour line of the winter level of the water of the said lake, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the channel communicating between the said lake and Tamboon Inlet, and within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from high-water mark at spring tides around the shores of the said inlet to the mouth of the same in Bass' Strait.

Genoa River and Mallagoota Inlet.—The bed of the Genoa River from the point where it is intersected by the boundary-line between New South Wales and Victoria to the point where it enters Mallagoota Inlet, the bed of Mallagoota Inlet, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said river from the said boundary-line to the extreme point reached by the tidal water; thence all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from high-water mark at spring tides on either bank of the said river, around the shores of the said outlet and its several arms, and around all islands within the circuit of the said inlet to its mouth on Bass' Strait.

56. Tributaries of the Murray River: Thongla Creek—Corryong Creek—Cudgewea Creek—and Wabba Creek.—The bed of the Thongla Creek, the bed of the Corryong Creek, the bed of the Cudgewea Creek, the bed of the Wabba Creek, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said several creeks throughout their entire course.

56A. Burrowye Creek and Cooyalong Creek.—The bed of the Burrowye Creek, in both its branches, the bed of the Cooyalong Creek, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said several creeks throughout their entire course.

57. Mitta Mitta River.—The bed of the Mitta Mitta River from the junction of the Victoria River, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the river at its summer level, from the junction of the Victoria River to the River Murray.

57A. *Tributaries of the Mitta Mitta River: Livingstone Creek—Victoria River—Cobangra Creek—Bundarra River—and Big River.*—The bed of the Livingstone Creek, the bed of the Victoria River, the bed of the Cobangra Creek, the bed of the Bundarra River, the bed of the Big River, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said several creeks and rivers throughout their entire course.

57B. *Benambra Creek—Murphy Creek—Gibbo Creek—Snowy Creek—and Tallangatta Creek.*—The bed of the Benambra Creek, the bed of Murphy's Creek, the bed of Gibbo Creek, the bed of Snowy Creek, the bed of Tallangatta Creek, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said several creeks throughout their entire course; and where there is no defined channel to any of those creeks, a strip of land two hundred links in width following the general direction of the lowest level between the points where the defined channel is lost and is again re-formed.

57C. *Maggora Creek—Tallandoon Creek and Lockhart's Creek.*—The bed of Maggora Creek, the bed of Tallandoon Creek, the bed of Lockhart's Creek, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said several creeks throughout their entire course.

59A. *Tributaries of the Ovens River: Buckland River—Morse's Creek—Buffalo River—Myrtle Creek—Hodgson's Creek and Reedy Creek.*—The bed of the Buckland River, the bed of Morse's Creek, the bed of the Buffalo River, the bed of Myrtle Creek, the bed of Hodgson's Creek, the bed of Reedy Creek, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said rivers and said creeks respectively throughout their entire course, and where there is no defined channel to any of these rivers or creeks, a strip of land two hundred links in width, following the general direction of the lowest level between the points in the several streams where the defined channel is lost and is again re-formed.

59B. *King River—Fifteen-mile Creek—Hurdle Creek—Running Creek and Meadow Creek.*—The bed of the King River, the bed of the Fifteen-mile Creek, the bed of Hurdle Creek, the bed of Running Creek, the bed of Meadow Creek, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of 150 links in the case of the King River, and of 100 links in the case of the several creeks, from either bank of the said river and the said creeks respectively throughout their entire course, and where there is no defined channel to such river or any of such creeks a strip of land 300 links in width following the general direction of the lowest level between the points in the several streams where the defined channel is lost and is again re-formed.

62B. *Merton Creek—Home Creek—Gobur Creek—Hughes Creek—Castle Creek—Seven Creek—Violet Ponds Creek.*—The bed of Merton Creek, the bed of Home Creek, the bed of Gobur Creek, the bed of Hughes Creek, the bed of Castle Creek, the bed of the Seven Creeks, the bed of Violet Ponds Creek, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of 100 links from either

bank of the said several streams, at their summer level, throughout their entire course, and where there is no defined channel to such creeks, a strip of land 200 links in width, following the general direction of the lowest level between the points in the several streams where the defined channel is lost and is again re-formed.

62D. *Acheron River—Stevenson River—Muddy Creek—King Parrot Creek—Dabyminga Creek—Sunday Creek—Mollison's Creek—and Deegay Ponds Creek.*—The bed of the Acheron River, the bed of the Stevenson River, the bed of Muddy Creek, the bed of King Parrot Creek, the bed of Dabyminga Creek, the bed of Sunday Creek, the bed of Mollison's Creek, the bed of the Deegay Ponds Creek, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said several rivers and said creeks throughout their entire course; and where there is no defined channel to such rivers and creeks, a strip of land, the property of the State, two hundred links in width, following the general direction of the lowest level between the points in the several streams where the defined channel is lost and is again re-formed; and at the several falls on the Acheron and Stevenson rivers, all land, the property of the State, within a circle of five chains radius, measured from the centre of such falls severally.

65F. *Bullarook Creek—Cresswick Creek—Mount Greenock Creek—Daisy Hill Creek—and Tullaroop Creek.*—The bed of the Bullarook Creek, the bed of Cresswick Creek, the bed of Mount Greenock Creek, the bed of Daisy Hill Creek, the bed of Tullaroop Creek, throughout their entire courses, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the same, and where there is no defined channel to any of such creeks, a strip of land, the property of the State, two hundred links in width, following the general direction of the lowest level between the points where the defined channel ceases and is again re-formed.

65G. *Caratulup Creek—Doctor's Creek—Burn Bank Creek—Timor Creek—Jones' Creek and Burnt Creek—and Bet Bet Creek.*—The bed of Caratulup Creek, the bed of Doctor's Creek, the bed of Burn Bank Creek, the bed of Timor Creek, the bed of Jones' and Burnt Creek, the bed of Bet Bet Creek throughout their several entire courses where not already alienated, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said Caratulup Creek, Doctor's Creek, Burn Bank Creek, Timor Creek, Jones' and Burnt Creek, and within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the said Bet Bet Creek, and where there is no defined channel to any of such creeks, a strip of land, the property of the State, two hundred links in width, following the general direction of the lowest level between the points where the defined channel ceases and is again re-formed.

66A. *Tributaries of the Avoca River: Mountain Creek—Strathfillan Creek—Carapooee Creek—St. Arnaud Creek—and Fenton's Creek.*—The bed of Mountain Creek, the bed of Strathfillan Creek, the bed of Carapooee Creek, the bed of St. Arnaud Creek, the bed of Fenton's Creek throughout their several entire courses, so far as the same are not alienated, the bed of all dams constructed across the same on land, the property of the State, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said several creeks, and from the contour line of the water in the said dams when wasting therefrom, and where there is no defined channel to any of such creeks, a strip of land, the property of the State, two hundred links in width, following the general direction of the lowest level between the points at which the defined channel ceases and is again re-formed.

BYE-LAW No. 4.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Tullaroop, made under section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 4, for regulating the distribution of water, the waterworks, and drains.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Tullaroop order as follows:—

1. Whosoever shall bathe in any stream, reservoir, conduit, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the council, or shall wash, cleanse, throw, or cause to enter therein any animal, alive or dead, or any rubbish, filth, stuff, or thing of any kind whatsoever, or shall cause or permit or suffer to run or be brought therein the water of any sink, sewer, drain, engine, or boiler, or other filthy, unwholesome, or improper water, or shall do anything whatsoever whereby any water or waterworks belonging to the council, or under their management or control, shall be fouled, obstructed, or damaged, shall for every such offence forfeit, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for each day while such offence is continued after written notice in that behalf.

2. Whosoever, being supplied with water by the council from any waterworks of or belonging to or under the control or management of the council, or having access to any such waterworks for the taking of water therefrom, shall wilfully or negligently suffer any water to run to waste from any pipe or conduit from or by which he shall be so supplied, or to which he shall have such access, shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. Whosoever shall, without the consent in writing of the council, construct or place any dam or embankment in or across any river, creek, or natural watercourse shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Five pounds for every day after such conviction during which such dam or embankment, or any part thereof, shall continue.

4. In any case in which the council has the exclusive right of collecting, for the supply of a reservoir or waterworks belonging to the council, or under their management or control, the storm-water having fallen on any gathering-ground, whosoever shall, by any means whatsoever, divert any such water from the course of its natural flow, so that the same shall tend to flow elsewhere than to such reservoir or waterworks, or some watercourse leading thereto, or shall flow to the same respectively in a foul state, shall forfeit, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every day after such conviction during which such water so tends to flow or flows as the case may be.

It shall be lawful for the council, from time to time, to make regulations for prohibiting or regulating the shooting of water-fowl, and the taking of fish, upon, or in, or within one quarter of a mile of any stream, reservoir, or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the council, and every person who shall offend contrary to any such regulation shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Whosoever shall obstruct or damage any culvert, sewer, or drain belonging to or under the control of the council shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and shall pay to the council, by way of compensation for any such damage, such further sum, not exceeding Ten pounds, as the convicting Justice shall order.
