The conditions attached to the vote are :-

- 1. That grants be made in proportion to the sum, in the aggregate not less than £5, collected by private subscriptions or local rates during 1880.
- 2. That no grant exceeding £200 be paid to any one
- 3. That no more than one-sixth of the entire sum be divided amongst institutions within ten miles of Melbourne. Institutions not already supplied with forms of application can obtain them on application by letter addressed to this office. N.B.—The Grant is limited to Free Libraries.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

The Public Works Statute 1865, section 128.—"It shall be lawful "for any officer or agent of the board or company, and all persons "called by him to his assistance, to seize and detain any person who shall have committed any offence against the provisions of this part of this Act or of the bye-laws made under the authority of this Act, and whose name and residence shall be unknown to such officer or agent, and give him in charge to a police constable who shall convey him with all convenient despatch before some justice without any warrant or other authority than this Act; and such justice shall proceed with "all convenient despatch to the hearing and determining of the complaint against such offender."

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby authorize and appoint the person named in the schedule hereto annexed as its agent and officer for the purpose of carrying into effect (so far as applicable to each respective case) the 128th section of of The Public Works Statute 1865, and also at any time hereafter to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the provisions of Part III. of The Public Works Statute 1865, or of any bye-law made or to be made under the authority of such Act; and to summon such person before any justice or justices for such offence, or to charge him or her with such offence.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Board of Land and Works.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Order, amongst other things, altering, for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was also enacted that any error in any Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act might be rectified by the Governor in Council by any subsequent Order: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the seventh day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, a portion of the territory was severed from the Mountain Riding to the Shire of Gisborne and attached as an additional Riding to the Shire of Romsey and therein denominated the Riddell's Creek Riding, and the boundaries of the said shires and of Mountain Riding of the Shire of Gisborne and of the Riddell's Creek Riding of the Shire of Gisborne and or the Riddell's Creek Riding of the Shire of Romsey were respectively set forth in the said Order: And whereas the said boundaries were incorrectly described therein, and it is expedient to rectify and re-define the same: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the hereinbefore-mentioned Order in Council of the seventh day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said shires and of the said ridings thereof, in manner following, that is to say:—

ORDER OF THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF RICHMOND.

Order of the Council of the Town of Richmond.

SAILING DIRECTIONS.

For Vessels of Heavy Draught entering Port Phillip Heads.

Present entrance.—The present entrance to Port Phillip having shoal patches of 27, 28, and 29 feet of water, which are considered dangerous to vessels of heavy draught now entering the port, it has been deemed advisable to define another fairway.

Beacons.—Two beacons (the outer RED and the inner WHITE) have therefore been erected in Lonsdale Bight (1 mile 12 cables from Point Lonsdale and 1 mile 6 cables from Queenscliffe low light), and these kept in line will lead about midway between the Lightning and Corsair Rocks, on a bearing N.N.W. ‡ W. (magnetic), with not less than 42 feet of water at low-water springs.

Caution.—Vessels approaching the entrance from the WEST-WARD, before bringing the beacons in Lonsdale Bight in line, should keep the lighthouse well open to the left of the flagstaff on Point Lonsdale, to ensure clearing the Lightning Rocks.

Vessels approaching the entrance from the EASTWARD will know, when the beacons in Lonsdale Bight are in line, that they are to the eastward of the Lightning Rocks.

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE FRIENDLY SOCIETIES ACT 1877.'

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by The Friendly Societies det 1877, and of every other power and authority enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Clause 58 of the regulations made by the Governor in Council, and published on the 30th day of April 1878, in the second supplement to the Victoria Government Gazette of Friday, 26th April 1878, and, in lieu thereof, doth hereby make the regulation following, that is to say:

REGULATION UNDER "THE FRIENDLY SOCIETIES ACT."

88. When a society or branch desires that its assets and liabilities shall be valued and reported on by an actuary to be named by the Government Statist, the return of benefits, contributions, funds, effects, debts, and credits, which the society or branch is required to make in the form prescribed by the Government Statist, shall be accompanied with a fee, which, if the actuary named is the actuary attached to the department of the Government Statist, shall be paid forthwith into the Treasury to the credit of the general revenue, or if any other actuary is named, shall be for the use of such actuary on the following scale, viz.:—

When the benefits to be valued do not exceed three (3) classes of sick allowance together with sums payable on the deaths of members and of their wives:—

For valuing societies consisting of— Not more than 25 members More than 25 members, for the first 25 members 0 12 6

0 12 6 With a further sum of 14d. in respect of each additional member. When the benefits to be valued exceed those mentioned, the fee shall be fixed by the Government Statist with the approval of the Chief Secretary.

In computing the amount of fees to be paid for valuation, each branch of a society shall be considered as a separate body.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of Wesleyan Methodists, under the provisions of The Act to provide for the Abolition of State Act to Religion, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the twenty-first day of March 1881, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

Description of land.—One rood and thirty-six perches, county of Bendigo, parish of Sandhurst, municipal district of Eaglehawk, being allotment 10 of section 12, and the adjoining allotment: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 9; bounded thence by roads bearing respectively N. 81º 45' W. two chains five links, and N. 14º 52' E. two chains fifty-two links; thence by a line hearing S. 81º 45' E. one chain seventy-five links; and thence by allotment 9 aforesaid bearing south 8º 15' W. two chains fifty links to the point of commencement.

Names of trustees.—Samuel Hollis, John Williams, John Matthews, George Willan, Theker Featonby, Henry Roberts Williams, John Ellis, William Oates, William Henry Scaddan, Elisha Hocking, and William Murdoch.

Powers of disposition.—Power to sell, lease, mortwage, exchange.

Winams, Som Elis, winam Oates, Winam Renry Scadan, Elisha Hocking, and William Murdoch.

Powers of disposition.—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, exchange, transfer, grant easements, or deal with the whole or any part or parts of the said land, when and as the trustees or the major part of them shall, with the approval of the Annual Conference regulating the affairs of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Victoria, think most advantageous.

The President for the time being of the said Annual Conference shall have power to fill up all vacancies occurring in the trusteeship, to appoint new or additional trustees, and to register these trusts under the provisions of the Successory Trusts Act 1878. The printed minutes of the meetings of the said Annual Conference shall, for the purposes thereof, be received and taken as sufficient evidence of its acts and proceedings, subject to such power as aforesaid, the land, or such part thereof as shall be undisposed of as aforesaid, shallbe held upon the trusts of the Wesleyan model deed, enrolled in the Supreme Court of New South Wales under the Act of Council of that colony, 2 Victoria, No. 7, so far as such trusts can be applied and are not inconsistent herewith.

Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.—To such Wesleyan Methodist building purposes as shall be approved by a majority of the trustees and the aforesaid Annual Conference.

9. Whoseever, being supplied with water by the council.

Whosoever, being supplied with water by the council from any waterworks of or belonging to or under the control or management of the council, or having access to any such waterworks for the taking of water therefrom, shall wilfully or negligently suffer any water to run to waste from any pipe or conduit from or by which he shall be so supplied, or to which he shall have such access, shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

Whoseever shall, without the consent in writing of the council, construct or place any dam or embankment in or across any river, creek, or natural watercourse shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Tive pounds for every day after such conviction during which such dam for embankment, or any part thereof, shall continue.

4. In any case in which the council but the exclusive right of collecting, for the supply of all reservoir or waterworks belonging to the council, or under their minagement or control, the storm-water having faillen on any gathering-ground, whosever shall, by any inform whatsoever, divert any such water from the course of the factural flowers that the same shall tend to flow elsewhere than to such reservoir or waterworks, or some watercourse leading thereto, or shall flow to the same respectively in foul state, shall forfeit, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every day after such conviction during which such water so tends to flow or flows as the case may be.

It shall be lawful for the council, from time to time, to make regulations for prohibiting or regulating the shooting of water-fowl, and the taking of fish, upon, or in, or within one quarter of a mile of any stream, reservoir, or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the council, and every person who shall aftend contrary to any such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Whoseever shall obstruct or damage any culvert, sewer, or drain belonging to or under the control of the council shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and shall pay to the council, by way of compensation for any such damage, such further sum, not exceeding Ten pounds, as the convicting justice shall order.
