Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 7 years, except as regards country-breds. It is to be distinctly understood that in regard to classes I. and III., remounts three years old and mares in foal will not be purchased.

After the expiration of three (3) years from the 21st June 1879, greys will not be purchased for horse or field artillery.

The average price for a remount has been fixed at Rupees five hundred and fifty (Rs. 550). Every horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given, provided that the average of the purchases does not exceed that limit.

NOTICES TO MARINERS.

By H.M.S. *Emerald*.

SOLOMON ISLANDS.

Savo Island—Admiralty Chart No. 214. Referred to position of Ferguson Island, Marau Sound. (No. 880.) Savo is placed 2' to the southward and 7' to the westward of its actual position.

Florida Group. Barranago Harbor.—No. 214, and rough plan by late J. St. C. Bower. This anchorage is only fit for small craft, and as the tides run very strong and there is no shelter from westerly winds (N.W. monsoon), and can be very little in the S.E. trade, it cannot be called a desirable one under any circumstances.

Florida Group. Rock awash.—S. 73° E. 1½ of a mile from south point of Barranago Island. No. 214, and rough plan by late J. St. C. Bower. Always visible, and breaks even in fine weather.

Florida Group. Nogu Island.—9° 11' 30" S., 160° 15' 00" E. (approximate). No. 214. Nogu Island¹ is about 70 feet high, about one mile long in an E. and W. direction, and half a mile wide, surrounded by reefs which extend 2 or 3 cables on its south side, but for fully a mile on its west side.

Florida Group. Village of Raita.—No. 214. The village of Raita is about 2½ miles east of Nogu Island. The coast in this vicinity may be approached within half a mile. There is a flat-topped rock about that distance N.W. of village, which is "steep-to."

Florida Group. Passage round north of ditto.—No. 214. The "reported good passage," as shown in chart No. 214, was used. It is much narrower, and there is a rock awash about mid-channel. The *Emerald* passed north of this rock, midway between it and the two small islands south of Buena Vista. The tide rips are very strong, showing right across the channel.

Florida Group. East side of 7-fm. patch.—East Pt., S. 39° E.; East Island, S. 65° E., No. 214. A vessel keeping a mile outside a line from Tree Island to East Island will be in deep water. After passing East Island the small islets which front the shore to the westward of the Asses Ears may all be approached within from one to five cables.

Marau Sound. 6½-fm. patch.—N.E. extreme of Beagle Island, N. 3½ W.; south point of Kamachu Island, S. 76½ W. No. 880. The ship anchored in 17 fms., and used to swing over this patch, which was the least water found, with the northerly stream. The position was verified by angles.

Coolambangra Island. Blackett Strait.—No. 214. Apparently free from any danger. The small islet at eastern entrance had better be left on the north hand.

Coolambangra Island. Ariel Cove.—8° 0' 0" S., 156° 57' 0" E. (approximately). No. 214. Ariel Cove (as recognised by *Sandfly's* sketch) is on the west coast and not on the south as marked in chart, nor could any similar cove be seen on the south side of the island.

Choiseul Island.—No. 214. Made the south coast of Choiseul Island in 157° E. (chart No. 214), and steered to the north-westward from four to five miles off shore for about three miles, when shoal water was observed ahead. There is a chain of coral patches (some awash) with deep water between from three to six miles off shore. Fifteen of these patches were counted in all to abreast Bambatani. An extensive reef was seen about ten miles off shore. There is apparently a clear passage two or three miles off shore as far as Bambatani, only one shoal spot seen in this passage, which can be passed on either hand. *Emerald* passed between it and the shore. Bambatani consists of three villages, close together in one bay, viz.:

Choiseul Island. Bambatani.—7° 7' 0" S., 156° 40' 0" E. (approximate). No. 214. The king's name (of Bambatani district) is Sickasecka, who speaks a little English and is "friendly." Good anchorage was found at the west end of the bay in 12 fms. (cr. s.).

Choiseul Island.—No. 214. Between Bambatani and Choiseul Bay the reefs extend about 10 miles off shore with no deep water passage inside. The S.W. portion of Choiseul Island does not exist, Cape Alexander being only about 12 miles from the passage used by *Emerald* between the islets forming Choiseul Bay. The sketch of Choiseul Bay (No. 209) is very incorrect, though still of use as a guide. The south entrance is narrowed to about a cable by the reefs on either hand. Good anchorage was found in 12 fathoms (cr. s.).

Choiseul Bay.—No. 214. The whole of the bay to the northward of the centre islet is thickly studded with shoals. There is a (and I believe the only one) deep water channel between the 3rd and 4th islets. The centre islet should be passed on its west side. There is a "spur-shaped" reef extending S.W. from this islet, but apparently has plenty of water on it at a cable distance. From Cape Alexander to the eastward the chart appears to be correct.

Village of Kangopassu.—6° 40' S., 156° 33' E. (approximate). No. 214. Kangopassu, the place where the *Zephyr* massacre took place, is situated between two small islands, and by Chart No. 214 is in 156° 33' E. The chief's name is Koka. Our boats reported apparently good anchorage in the lagoon formed by outer reefs.

Bougaville Island. Nouma-Nouma, 5° 54' S., 155° 9' E. (approximate).—No. 214. The reefs appear to extend about 6 miles from the east coast. Mount Balbi kept on a S.W. by W. ¼ W. bearing leads in clear of reefs, and a ship bound to Nouma-Nouma can then coast along to the southward until abreast the village. Anchorage was obtained in centre of small bay off the north end of the huts. The beach here is very steep and has no fringe reef.

Alho Island.—No. 214. Is situated about 6 miles west of Shortland Island (Soondah). King's name is Goni, said by the traders to be friendly.

LOUISIADÉ ARCHIPELAGO.

Two Islets S.W. of East Island.—Nos. 2123 and 2764. Consider these to be placed too far to the southward, the eastern one by 5 miles and the west by 2 miles.

Shoal, 7 fms.—10° 36' 50" S., 151° 35' 30" E., from Chart. Bearings—Hastings Island, N. 33½ E. Dawson Island, N. 43° W. Hummock Island, S. 82° W. Nos. 2123 and 2764. The depth of 7 fms. was struck in what appeared to be the bight of an extensive reef, one portion extending from this position in a N.N.W. direction about 4 miles, and the other in an easterly direction for probably a much greater distance. The tide rips prevented the limits of the reef being clearly defined, but just to the westward of the 7 fms. it appeared to be nearly awash.

Teste Island. Anchorage off South side.—Teste Island: North-East Island, N.N.W., West Island, N. 82° W. Nos. 2123 and 2764. Anchored on the S.W. edge of a large flat with from 8 to 9 fathoms on it; 14 fms. was obtained in the chains at the same time with coral mud bottom. The tides from the anchorage run in a N.N.E. and S.S.W. direction about 4 knots (springs). The reefs off the island extend further to the eastward than shown on Chart (No. 2123) and East Island about one-third of a mile east of its position (relatively with Teste Island). Coming from the southward, East Island, bearing N.N.W. ¼ W., appears under the highest peak at east end of Teste, and leads to the anchorage. A missionary teacher resides here who speaks a little English.

Mewstone Island.—Anchor bearings: Mewstone, N. 58° E.; N. 69° W. No. 2124. Good anchorage on south side of island in 15 fms. (cr. s.) about a mile from the shore. The reefs in the bay extend for more than half that distance from the latter.

Shoal.—11° 8' S., 152° 33' 30" E. (from Chart 2124). No. 2124. About half a mile in extent, and from its appearance probably has 3 to 4 fms. on it.

The births of 639 children, viz., 311 boys and 328 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of February. In the month of January 716 births were registered, or 77 more than in the month under review. The births were above the average of January during the previous six years by 2. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than that average by 37.

The deaths registered in January numbered 427, viz., 227 of males and 200 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 212. The deaths were less than in January by 17, and below the average of January, during the previous ten years, by 25. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been below the average of those ten years by 74.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 99.2° on the 21st, and the lowest was 48.4° on the 15th. The mean temperature of the month (64.9°) was nearly 1½ degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (47.1°) took place on the 21st, viz., from a maximum of 99.2° to a minimum of 52.1°. The least range (6.0°) was on the 3rd, viz., from a maximum of 64.0° to a minimum of 58.0°. The mean daily range was 21.3°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.939 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Males contributed 53 per cent. and females 47 per cent. to the total mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 45 per cent., as against 52 per cent. in February 1880; 45 per cent. in February 1879; 52 per cent. in February 1878; 51 per cent. in February 1877; 53 per cent. in February 1876; 63 per cent. in February 1875; 54 per cent. in February 1874; 53 per cent. in February 1873; 56 per cent. in February 1872; and 65 per cent. in February 1871.

Fourteen deaths of persons who had attained the age of 75 years or over were recorded during the month, viz.:—A gardener, aged 75, who died of paralysis; a coachsmith, aged 75, of heart disease; a gardener, aged 75, of cystitis; a male patient in the Kew Lunatic Asylum, aged 76, of brain disease; a blacksmith, aged 76, of phthisis; a female, aged 77, of paralysis; a gentleman, aged 78, and a doctor of divinity, aged 79, of heart disease; a female, aged 80, of suffocation, by a bone sticking in her throat; a female, aged 87, of bronchitis; a female, aged 92, of apoplexy; a laborer and a female, each aged 85, and a female, aged 90, of old age.

Twenty-three deaths were set down to external causes during the month—of which 20 were ascribed to accident, 2 to homicide, and 1 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A girl, aged 5, was crushed to death by a water-trough falling on her; a laborer, aged 45, died of injuries to the arm, caused by a crushing-machine; a milkman, aged 65, was killed through being thrown from a cart; a school-girl, aged 15, by a train, whilst attempting to cross the railway line; an engine-cleaner, aged 23, by an engine passing over him; a laborer, aged 50, by a truck-wheel passing over him; a printer, aged 24, died of injury to the spine, the result of a fall; a sergeant of police, aged 47, of fracture of the skull, occasioned by a fall down stairs; a male, of occupation unstated, aged 46, of injury to the foot, cause not given; a laborer, aged 50, of fracture of the skull, there being no

evidence to show how he received it; a male child, aged 1, was scalded to death in a tub of hot water; a plasterer, aged 55, died of burns, caused by smoking in bed; a stoker, aged 39, was killed by lightning; a female, aged 1; was drowned in a bath; a bootmaker, aged 14, through falling into the water whilst in an epileptic fit; a marble-mason, aged 22, and a male, of occupation unstated, aged 24, were found drowned, the latter in the River Yarra; 2 males, of occupation unknown, each aged 45, were also drowned; a female, aged 80, was choked, a bone becoming impacted in her throat. The homicidal deaths were those of 2 female infants, who were suffocated at birth. The suicidal death was that of a carpenter, aged 67, who hanged himself whilst of unsound mind.

Eighty-four deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole took place in public institutions, viz. :—51 in the Melbourne Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Alfred Hospital, 7 in the Lying-in Hospital, 3 in the Benevolent Asylum, 1 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Homœopathic Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 192, of which 106, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 86, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 142 were under one year of age, 35 were between one and two, 11 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 2 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 235. Of these, 121 or 51 per cent., were males, and 114, or 49 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 17 were between twenty and twenty-five, 14 were between twenty-five and thirty, 12 were between thirty and thirty-five, 16 were between thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty and forty-five, 25 were between forty-five and fifty, 17 were between fifty and fifty-five, 18 were between fifty-five and sixty, 18 were between sixty and sixty-five, 16 were between sixty-five and seventy, 11 were between seventy and seventy-five, 8 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 6 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month, under the head of zymotic diseases, deaths from typhoid fever rose from 13 to 16, and those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 56 to 64. Measles, which had not proved fatal in January, again made its appearance in February and caused 2 deaths, making a total of 176 deaths since the outbreak of the epidemic in May last. Five deaths, in February, were set down to the effects of childbirth, or 1 death of a mother to every 128 children born alive.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE CLUNES UNITED MUNICIPAL AND GOLDFIELD COMMON.

In pursuance of the regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1873, the Managers of the Clunes United Municipal and Goldfield Common, having drafted the following regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. Each person entitled to depasture stock on the Clunes United Municipal and Goldfield Common shall pay fees at the rate of Three shillings per head per annum for small cattle, Four

shillings per head per annum for large cattle other than horses, and Six shillings per head per annum for horses.

3. All persons desiring to depasture stock on the common must deliver them into the charge of the herdsman, together with a written statement of the number, description, and brands of the stock so delivered. The herdsman will give a receipt for the stock delivered to him, and for the fees paid for same, and enter a copy of the description in the herd book, and shall afterwards proceed to brand the stock at the yards appointed for that purpose with the common brand, viz., CC on the near ribs, in pitch or paint. The owners in all cases to render every assistance during the branding.

4. All stock legally depasturing on the common shall be branded by their respective owners with some distinctive brand, which shall at all times be kept legible.

5. The managers may from time to time call upon the owners of stock, by advertisement in any newspaper circulating in the district, to muster their stock at the appointed yards to have the same re-branded; and if such notice be disregarded, the owners shall take all risk arising from illegibility of the common brand.

6. Stock under six months old, the progeny of cattle registered on the common, may be depastured free of charge.

7. No bulls over the age of nine months, and no entire horses or wrightins, shall be depastured on the common without the sanction of the managers in writing.

8. Whenever the managers have reason to believe that any animal on the common is infected with a contagious disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same within twenty-four hours after receiving notice in writing to do so from the managers or herdsman, and in case of neglect or refusal to remove the same, it may be destroyed.

9. No dead beast shall remain upon the common, and if a carcass be not removed after twenty-four hours' notice has been

given to the owner, the managers may order such carcass to be removed and buried at the expense of the owner thereof.

10. Substitution licenses will be granted in respect of stock placed on the common in lieu of stock permanently removed therefrom, but only in cases in which the owner shall give notice in writing to the herdsman of such removal.

11. The managers may at any time require persons putting stock on the common to certify as to the true ownership of such stock.

12. The managers will not be responsible for the safe custody of stock depasturing on the common, or for loss or damage sustained through the neglect or mistake of the herdsman.

13. All moneys received by the herdsman shall be forthwith entered by him in a book to be kept by him for that purpose, and paid by him to managers once a month, or as soon as the same shall amount to five pounds.

14. The herdsman shall give notice to the owners of stock impounded in any pounds where the common brand is registered within twenty-four hours after receiving notice of such impounding; but the cost of releasing cattle shall in all cases be paid by the owners thereof.

15. All complaints against the herdsman must be made in writing, and should the managers after investigation consider that sufficient evidence has been adduced to substantiate a charge of gross neglect, carelessness, or breach of duty, they reserve power to dismiss him summarily.

16. The herdsman shall produce all books and accounts in connection with the common once a month or oftener, if required, at the office of the managers to be examined.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds for each offence.

The foregoing regulations were drafted by the managers of the Clunes United Municipal and Goldfield Common, at Clunes, this 30th day of December 1880, and are now submitted for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council.

BOROUGH OF ECHUCA.—WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

BYE-LAW No. 4.

1. **WHEREAS** the Borough of Echuca has, by order of His Excellency the Governor in Council, bearing date the 21st day of January 1881, been duly declared a "Water Supply District" under the provisions and within the meaning of the Acts of Parliament of Victoria numbered 448, 500, and 656, which order did appoint the Borough Council of Echuca the "Local governing body" for said Water Supply District; Now the Council of the Borough of Echuca, as such local governing body, pursuant to and in the exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such council, doth order as follows:—

Water Rates and Charges.

2. That the following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Council:—

3. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds or less, the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.

4. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, in addition to the One pound named in the last clause, a rate of Four pounds per centum per annum for every pound from £21 to £100 inclusive, and the rate of Three pounds per centum per annum on every pound from £101 and upwards.

5. On every cordial or aerated-water factory, or other such like factories, a rate or charge of Ten pounds per annum.

6. On every steam-engine, a rate or charge of Twenty shillings per annum.

7. On every livery stable, a rate or charge of Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.

8. On every hotel, a rate or charge of Five pounds per centum per annum on the valuation up to £150; and for every pound from £151 upwards, a rate or charge of Three pounds per centum per annum.

9. On every horse trough, a rate or charge of Twenty shillings per annum.

10. On houses, lands, hotels, tenements, &c., &c., using a hose, in addition to the foregoing rates and charges named for each respectively, a rate or charge of Twenty shillings per annum.

Cases where water is not used.

11. On every house, tenement, hotel, factory, &c., &c., not supplied with water, a rate or charge of Two pounds ten shillings per centum per annum on the valuation of same.

12. On each allotment or piece of land rated separately from any tenement, a rate or charge of Two pounds ten shillings per centum per annum on the annual value of same, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings and sixpence per annum.

Meters.

13. The rate or charge for water supplied by meter shall be Three shillings per thousand gallons (1000).

14. The charge for water supplied from the Council stand-pipes shall be Three shillings per thousand gallons.

General Conditions.

15. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, where water is supplied by measure, shall be:—(1.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at Three shillings per 1000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure; and (2.) If for other than domestic purposes, not exceeding 25,000 gallons per quarter. "Syphon-pumps" will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

16. Any person receiving water from the council, who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

17. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the council, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every offence.

18. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the council, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the council, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the council, he shall obtain from the council a license in that behalf, to execute such work; any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every offence.

19. Before any license shall be granted by the council, the person applying for same shall satisfy the council that he is a competent plumber.

20. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall wilfully offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the council, without giving 24 hours' notice to the council of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the council without the permission in writing of the council being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

21. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the council without giving 24 hours' notice of the day and hour when

such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the council, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the council, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipe of the council of a strength and material not sanctioned by the council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council. Iron piping of the following dimensions, namely:—

22. Three-quarter inch diameter or bore, black or galvanized, of approved quality, will only be allowed for external and internal services. Ordinary connections with sub-mains must be made with proper ferrules, to which a length of not less than three feet of pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only to each tenement, &c., will be permitted; and, for houses rated at Twenty pounds per annum and under, the bore of such service-pipe must not exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch.

23. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the council into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the council that such service-pipe requires repairing, the council may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe, or otherwise as to the said council may seem fit, until the necessary repairs have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

24. Any person supplied with water by the council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

25. No meter shall be allowed to be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons, and except by special permission of the council.

26. If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the council shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the council may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe.

27. Overflow pipes to private baths, or any other vessel, will not be permitted.

28. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first fixing a self-acting valve, for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

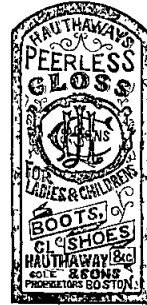
