POWER TO COMPEL CESSPOOLS IN THE BOROUGH OF SALE TO BE FILLED UP.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign, called *The Public Health amendment Act 1876*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the said Act to any part of Victoria, and from and after three months from the coming into operation of the said section in any part of Victoria if the owner of land whereon there should be a cesspool for the reception of nightsoil, which cesspool in the opinion of the local board should be in such a condition or position as to be calculated to generate disease or be a public nuisance, should be required by notice from the local board to fill up the same within a time to be expressed in such notice not being more than one month from the date thereof, such owner should be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day from the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice that such cesspool should not be filled up as thereby required: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the above-recited Act to the Borough of Sale.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and in the forty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

PROPOSED REVOCATION OF THE TEMPORARY RESERVATION OF LANDS.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Land Act 1869* (33 Vict. No. 360, § 6 and 9): Notice is hereby given that it is the intention of the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to revoke the temporary reservation of the land hereinafter referred to, viz.:-

The following Notices were gazetted 1<sup>o</sup> on 1 April 1881, pursuant to Orders of 28 March 1881.

**FUNERALS IN THE MELBOURNE DISTRICT.**

TENDERS will be received until Ten o'clock a.m. on Monday the 16th May from persons willing to undertake Funerals, as required in the several Departments of the Government, from 1st July 1881 to 30th June 1882, in the Melbourne district, which includes a radius of three miles from the Melbourne General Cemetery.

Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.
