EXTRADITION TREATY WITH LUXEMBURG.

CIRCULAR.

Downing street, 15th March 1881.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your government, a copy of a letter from the Foreign Office, enclosing an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the 2nd of March, for giving effect to the Treaty between this country and Luxemburg, signed on the 24th of November last, for the mutual surrender of Fugitive Criminals.

SIR,—I am directed by Earl Granville to acquaint you, for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that an Order in Council was passed on the 2nd instant for carrying into effect the Treaty for the mutual surrender of fugitive criminals, signed between Great Britain and Luxemburg on the 24th of November last.

The Order in Council was published in the *London Gazette* of the 4th instant, of which I am to enclose copies; and I am to add that the Treaty will come into operation in this country on the 15th instant, in conformity with the stipulation contained in Article XV.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts of 1870 and 1873 it was amongst other things enacted, that where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the twenty-fourth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and eighty, between Her Majesty and the King of the Netherlands, Grand Duke of Luxemburg, for the Mutual Extradition of Fugitive Criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and his Majesty the King of the Netherlands, Grand Duke of Luxemburg, having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice and to the prevention of crime within the territories of Her Britannic Majesty and the Grand Duchy of Luxemburg, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should, under certain circumstances, be reciprocally delivered up, their said Majesties have named as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a Treaty for this purpose, that is to say:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Honorable William Stuart, a Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Her Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to His Majesty the King of the Netherlands, as Grand Duke of Luxemburg;

And His Majesty the King of the Netherlands, Grand Duke of Luxemburg, Baron Felix Blochausen, Grand Cross of the Order of the Crown of Oak, Chevalier of the Second Class of the Order of the Golden Lion of the House of Nassau, &c., &c., his Minister of State, President of the Government of the Grand Duchy of Luxemburg:

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland engages to deliver up, under the circumstances and on the conditions stipulated in the present Treaty, all persons, and His Majesty the King of the Netherlands, Grand Duke of Luxemburg, so far as concerns the Grand Duchy of Luxemburg, engages to deliver up under the like circumstances and conditions all persons, excepting subjects of the Grand Duchy, who, having been charged with, or convicted by the Tribunals of one of the two High Contracting Parties of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article II, committed in the territory of the one party, shall be found within the territory of the other.

ARTICLE II.

The crimes for which the extradition is to be granted are the following:—

1. Murder (including assassination, parricide, infanticide, poisoning, or attempt to murder).
2. Manslaughter.
3. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.
4. Rape.

SA Majesté la Reine du Royaume-Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, et Sa Majesté le Roi des Pays-Bas, Grand-Duc de Luxemburg, ayant jugé opportun, afin de mieux assurer l'administration de la justice et la répression des crimes sur les territoires de Sa Majesté Britannique et dans le Grand-Duché de Luxemburg, de se livrer réciproquement, dans certaines circonstances, les individus accusés ou condamnés du chef des crimes ci-après énumérés, et qui seraient en fuite, ont nommé pour leurs Plénipotentiaires chargés de conclure un Traité à cet effet, savoir:

Sa Majesté la Reine du Royaume-Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, l'Honorable William Stuart, Compagnon du Très-Honorable Ordre du Bain, son Envoyé Extraordinaire et Ministre Plénipotentiaire près Sa Majesté le Roi des Pays-Bas en sa qualité de Grand-Duc de Luxemburg; et

Sa Majesté le Roi des Pays-Bas, Grand-Duc de Luxemburg, M. le Baron Félix de Blochausen, Grand-Croix de l'Ordre de la Couronne de Chêne, Chevalier de Deuxième Classe de l'Ordre du Lion d'Or de la Maison de Nassau, &c., &c., son Ministre d'Etat, Président du Gouvernement du Grand-Duché de Luxemburg;

Lesquels, après s'être communiqué leurs pleins pouvoirs respectifs, trouvés en bonne et due forme, sont convenus des Articles suivants:—

ARTICLE I.

Sa Majesté la Reine du Royaume-Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande s'engage à livrer, dans les circonstances et sous les conditions prévues par le présent Traité, tous les individus, et Sa Majesté le Roi des Pays-Bas, Grand-Duc de Luxemburg, pour ce qui concerne le Grand-Duché de Luxemburg, s'engage à livrer, dans les mêmes circonstances, et sous les mêmes conditions, tous les individus, à l'exception des sujets du Grand-Duché, lesquels, ayant été accusés ou condamnés par les Tribunaux d'une des Hautes Parties Contractantes, du chef des crimes ou délits énumérés dans l'Article II, commis sur le territoire de l'une des Parties, seront trouvés sur le territoire de l'autre.

ARTICLE II.

Les crimes pour lesquels l'extradition devra être accordée sont les suivants:—

1. Meurtre (y compris l'assassinat, le parricide, l'infanticide, l'empoisonnement, ou tentative de meurtre).
2. Homicide sans préméditation ou guet-apens.
3. Administration de substances ou emploi d'instruments dans l'intention de provoquer l'avortement.
4. Viol.

5. Aggravated or indecent assault. Carnal knowledge of a girl under the age of ten years; carnal knowledge of a girl above the age of ten years and under the age of twelve years; indecent assault upon any female, or any attempt to have carnal knowledge of a girl under twelve years of age.

6. Kidnapping and false imprisonment, child stealing, abandoning, exposing, or unlawfully detaining children.
7. Abduction of minors.
8. Bigamy.
9. Wounding, or inflicting grievous bodily harm.

10. Assaulting a magistrate or peace or public officer.
11. Threats by letter or otherwise with intent to extort money or other things of value.
12. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
13. Arson.
14. Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, larceny or embezzlement.
15. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member or public officer of any company, made criminal by any law for the time being in force.

16. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property knowing the same to have been unlawfully obtained.

17. (a.) Counterfeiting or altering money, or bring into circulation counterfeited or altered money.

(b.) Forgery, or counterfeiting or altering or uttering what is forged, counterfeited, or altered;

(c.) Knowingly making without lawful authority any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of coin of the realm.

18. Crimes against bankruptcy law.
19. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger persons in a railway train.

20. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.

The extradition is also to take place for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, as an accessory before or after the fact, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both contracting parties.

ARTICLE III.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed on the part of the Government of the United Kingdom, or the person claimed on the part of the Government of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg, has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial, in the Grand Duchy or in the United Kingdom, respectively, for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed on the part of the Government of the United Kingdom, or if the person claimed on the part of the Government of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg should be under examination for any other crime in the Grand Duchy or in the United Kingdom respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial, and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

ARTICLE IV.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime, or the institution of the penal prosecution, or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applied to.

ARTICLE V.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he prove that the requisition for his surrender has in fact been made with a view to try or to punish him for an offence of a political character.

ARTICLE VI.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in prison, or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made, for any other crime or on account of any other matters than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored or has had the opportunity of returning to the country from whence he surrendered.

The period of one month shall be considered as the limit of the period during which the prisoner may, with the view of securing the benefits of this article, return to the country from whence he was surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE VII.

The requisition for extradition must always be made by the way of diplomacy, and to wit, in the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg by the British Minister in Luxembourg, and in the United Kingdom to the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs by the Foreign Minister in Great Britain, who, for the purposes of this treaty, is recognized by Her Majesty as a diplomatic representative of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg.

The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A requisition for extradition cannot be founded on sentences passed in contumacian.

6. Enlèvement et emprisonnement illégal de personnes, vol, abandonnement, exposition ou détention illégale d'enfants.

7. Enlèvement de mineurs.

8. Bigamie.

9. Actes de violences ou sévices ayant causés des blessures graves.

10. Violences contre un magistrat ou officier public.

11. Menaces écrites ou autres faites en vue d'extorquer de l'argent ou des valeurs.

12. Faux témoignage, ou subornation de témoins.

13. Incendie volontaire.

14. Vol avec effraction, escalade, ou violence; toute soustraction frauduleuse.

15. Fraude par un administrateur, banquier, agent, procureur, tuteur, ou curateur, directeur, membre, ou fonctionnaire d'une société quelconque, pour autant que le fait est puni par les lois en vigueur.

16. Escroquerie d'argent, de valeurs ou de marchandises sous de faux prétextes; recel d'argent, de valeurs, ou d'autres propriétés, avec connaissance de leur provenance illégitime.

17. (a.) Contrefaçon ou altération de monnaie, ou mise en circulation de la monnaie contrefaite ou altérée;

(b.) Faux, contrefaçon ou altération, ou mise en circulation de ce qui est falsifié, contrefait, ou altéré.

(c.) Fabrication avec connaissance de cause, en dehors de l'autorisation légale, d'un instrument, outil, ou engin destiné à la contrefaçon de la monnaie du pays.

18. Crimes contre les lois sur les banqueroutes.
19. Tout acte commis avec intention de mettre en danger la vie de personnes se trouvant dans un train de chemin de fer.

20. Atteinte à la propriété, avec mauvaise intention, pour autant que le fait est punissable par les lois.

L'extradition aura également lieu pour complicité à un des crimes ci-dessus mentionnés, que la complicité se soit produite avant ou après la perpétration, pourvu que la complicité soit punissable par les lois des deux parties contractantes.

ARTICLE III.

L'extradition ne sera pas accordée si l'individu poursuivi par le Gouvernement du Royaume-Uni ou par le Gouvernement du Grand-Duché de Luxembourg, a déjà été dans le Grand-Duché ou dans le Royaume-Uni l'objet d'une instruction ou d'une ordonnance de non-lieu pour le crime pour lequel l'extradition est demandée, ou s'il est encore en état de prévention, ou qu'il ait déjà été puni pour ce fait.

Si l'individu poursuivi par le Gouvernement du Royaume-Uni ou par le Gouvernement du Grand-Duché de Luxembourg est en état de prévention dans le Grand-Duché ou dans le Royaume-Uni pour un autre crime, son extradition sera différée jusqu'à la conclusion du procès et l'exécution complète de la peine lui infligée.

ARTICLE IV.

L'extradition n'aura pas lieu si postérieurement à la perpétration du crime, aux poursuites ou à la condamnation, la prescription de l'action ou de la peine est acquise d'après les lois du pays où le prévenu s'est réfugié.

ARTICLE V.

Aucun criminel fugitif ne sera extradé, si le délit pour lequel l'extradition est demandée est considéré comme un délit politique, ou si l'individu prouve que la demande d'extradition a été faite en réalité dans le but de la poursuivre ou de le punir pour un délit d'un caractère politique.

ARTICLE VI.

L'individu qui aura été livré ne pourra, dans le pays auquel l'extradition a été accordée, être tenu en état d'arrestation ou poursuivi pour aucune infraction ou fait autre que ceux ayant motivé l'extradition, jusqu'à ce qu'il ait été rendu ou qu'il ait eu l'occasion de retourner au pays qui l'a extradé.

Le délai d'un mois sera considéré comme la limite du temps pendant lequel le prisonnier, afin de s'assurer les bienfaits de cet Article, peut retourner au pays dont il a été extradé.

Cette stipulation n'est pas applicable aux crimes commis après l'extradition.

ARTICLE VII.

L'extradition sera toujours demandée par la voie diplomatique, savoir: dans le Grand-Duché de Luxembourg, par l'Envoyé Britannique, et dans le Royaume-Uni au Secrétaire d'Etat pour les Affaires Étrangères, par le Ministre Étranger dans la Grande-Bretagne, lequel sera, à cette fin, reconnu par Sa Majesté la Reine comme le Représentant Diplomatique du Grand-Duché de Luxembourg.

La demande d'extradition d'un prévenu devra être accompagnée d'un mandat d'arrêt décerné par l'autorité compétente du pays requérant, et des preuves qui, d'après les lois de l'endroit où le prévenu a été trouvé justifieraient son arrestation, si l'acte punissable y avait été commis.

Si la demande d'extradition concerne une personne déjà condamnée, on doit produire l'arrêt de condamnation qui a été rendu par le tribunal compétent de l'Etat requérant.

La demande d'extradition ne peut se baser sur des arrêts qui ont été rendus par contumace.

ARTICLE VIII.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

The prisoner is then to be brought before a competent magistrate, who is to examine him and to conduct the preliminary investigation of the case according to the laws of the country in which he is found.

ARTICLE IX.

The extradition shall not take place before the expiration of fifteen days from the date of the fugitive criminal's committal to prison to await his surrender, and then only if the evidence produced in due time be found sufficient according to the laws of the State applied to.

ARTICLE X.

A fugitive criminal may, however, be apprehended under a warrant issued by any police magistrate, justice of the peace or other competent authority in either country, on such information or complaint and such evidence, or after such proceedings as would, in the opinion of the person issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant, if the crime had been committed or the prisoner convicted, in that part of the dominions of the two contracting parties in which he exercises jurisdiction: Provided however that, in the United Kingdom, the accused shall, in such cases be sent as speedily as possible before a police magistrate in London. He shall be discharged, as well in the United Kingdom as in the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg, if, within fourteen days, a requisition shall not have been made for his surrender by the diplomatic agent of his country.

ARTICLE XI.

If, in any criminal matter, pending in any court or tribunal of one of the two countries, it is thought desirable to take the evidence of any witness in the other, such evidence may be taken by the judicial authorities in accordance with the laws in force on this subject in the country where the witness may be.

ARTICLE XII.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension, shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery thereof, be given up when the extradition takes place; and the said delivery shall extend not merely to the stolen articles, but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

ARTICLE XIII.

The high contracting parties renounce any claim for the reimbursement of the expenses incurred by them in the arrest and maintenance of the person to be surrendered, and his conveyance till placed on board ship, as well as for the reimbursement of the expenses incurred in taking the evidence of any witness in consequence of Article XI. and in giving up and returning seized articles. They reciprocally agree to bear such expenses themselves.

ARTICLE XIV.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of such colonies or foreign possessions shall be made to the Governor or to the supreme authority of such colony or possession through the Luxembourg consul, or, in case there should be no Luxembourg consul, through the consular agent of another State charged for the occasion with Luxembourg interests in the colony or possession in question, and recognized by such Governor or supreme authority as such.

The Governor or supreme authority above mentioned shall decide with regard to such requisitions as nearly as possible in accordance with the provisions of the present Treaty. He will, however, be at liberty either to consent to the extradition or report the case to his Government.

Her Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of such individuals as shall have committed in the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg any of the crimes hereinafter mentioned, who may take refuge within such colonies and foreign possessions, on the basis, as nearly as may be, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal from any colony or foreign possession of Her Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding Articles of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE XV.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the high contracting parties. It may be terminated by either of the high contracting parties, but shall remain in force for six months after notice has been given for its termination.

The Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Brussels as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Done at Luxembourg, the twenty-fourth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty.

ARTICLE VIII.

Si la demande d'extradition est en accord avec les stipulations précédentes, les autorités compétentes de l'Etat auquel la demande d'extradition a été faite, procéderont à l'arrestation du fugitif.

Le prisonnier sera ensuite amené devant un magistrat compétent, qui devra l'examiner et conduire les investigations préliminaires d'après les lois du pays où il est trouvé.

ARTICLE IX.

L'extradition n'aura pas lieu avant l'expiration de quinze jours, à dater de l'arrestation du criminel fugitif attendant son extradition, et elle n'aura lieu que sur la production en temps utile de pièces trouvées suffisantes d'après les lois de l'Etat requis.

ARTICLE X.

Un malfaiteur fugitif peut néanmoins être arrêté dans les deux pays en vertu d'un mandat d'arrêt décerné par un magistrat ou fonctionnaire de police, par un juge de paix ou telle autre autorité compétente, sur une dénonciation ou plainte, et sur les preuves, ou d'après une procédure établissant que, dans l'opinion du fonctionnaire qui décerne le mandat d'arrêt, cette mesure serait justifiée, si le crime avait été commis ou si le prisonnier avait été condamné dans la partie des territoires des deux parties contractantes où le fonctionnaire exerce la juridiction. Il est stipulé toutefois que, dans le Royaume-Uni, le prévenu devra, en pareil cas, être aussi promptement que possible conduit devant un magistrat de police à Londres. Il devra être mis en liberté dans le Royaume-Uni et dans le Grand-Duché de Luxembourg si, dans l'espace de quatorze jours, une demande d'extradition n'est pas faite par l'agent diplomatique de son pays.

ARTICLE XI.

Si, dans une matière criminelle pendante devant une cour ou un tribunal de l'un des deux pays, il est jugé désirable d'entendre dans l'autre les dépositions d'un témoin, pareilles dépositions peuvent être reçues par les autorités judiciaires d'après les lois en vigueur sur la matière dans le pays où le témoin se trouve.

ARTICLE XII.

Les objets saisis en la possession de l'individu au moment de son arrestation seront, si l'autorité compétente de l'Etat requis en a ordonné la remise, livrés lorsque l'extradition aura lieu, et cette remise ne comprendra pas seulement les objets enlevés, mais encore tout ce qui peut servir de pièce à conviction.

ARTICLE XIII.

Les hautes parties contractantes renoncent à toute réclamation pour le remboursement des frais qui leur ont été occasionnés par l'arrestation, l'entretien, et le transport de l'individu jusqu'au bord d'un navire, ainsi que de ceux occasionnés par la déposition d'un témoin, en conséquence de l'Article XI., et par la remise et la restitution des objets saisis. Elles consentent à supporter réciproquement les dits frais.

ARTICLE XIV.

Les stipulations du présent Traité seront applicables aux colonies et possessions étrangères de Sa Majesté Britannique.

La demande d'extradition d'un criminel qui s'est réfugié dans une de ces colonies ou possessions étrangères, sera faite au Gouverneur ou à l'autorité suprême de cette colonie ou possession par le Consul Luxembourgeois, ou, à défaut d'un consul Luxembourgeois, par l'agent consulaire d'un autre Etat chargé pour l'occasion des intérêts Luxembourgeois dans la colonie ou possession en question, et reconnu comme tel par le Gouverneur ou l'autorité suprême.

Le Gouverneur, ou l'autorité suprême, mentionné ci-dessus, décidera à l'égard de telles demandes, en se conformant autant que possible aux dispositions du présent Traité. Il sera néanmoins libre d'accorder l'extradition ou de soumettre le cas à son Gouvernement.

Sa Majesté Britannique se réserve cependant le droit de faire, en se conformant autant que possible aux stipulations du présent Traité, des arrangements spéciaux dans les colonies ou possessions étrangères pour l'extradition d'individus qui ont commis dans le Grand-Duché de Luxembourg un des crimes prévus dans le Traité, et qui auraient trouvé un refuge dans ces colonies ou possessions étrangères.

Les demandes concernant l'extradition de criminels qui se sont échappés d'une des colonies ou possessions étrangères de Sa Majesté Britannique seront traitées suivant les dispositions des Articles précédents du présent Traité.

ARTICLE XV.

Le présent Traité entrera en vigueur dix jours après sa publication dans les formes prescrites par la législation des hautes parties contractantes. Le Traité peut être dénoncé par chacune des parties contractantes; il demeurera toutefois en vigueur encore six mois après qu'il aura été dénoncé.

Le Traité sera ratifié, et les ratifications en seront échangées à Bruxelles, le plus tôt que faire se peut.

En foi de quoi, les plenipotentiaires respectifs ont signé le présent Traité, et y ont apposé le cachet de leurs armes.

Fait à Luxembourg le vingt-quatre Novembre, de l'an mil huit cent quatre-vingt.

HYDROGRAPHIC NOTICE.—[No. 1.]

The last number for the year 1880 was No. 46.

NEW ZEALAND PILOT.—Notice No. 8.

THE following information, relating to portions of the coast of New Zealand, has been principally derived from notices issued by the New Zealand Government, 1880.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation in 1881. Port Nicholson, 15° easterly. Awarua or Bluff Harbor, 17° easterly.]

NORTH ISLAND.—EAST COAST.

AUCKLAND HARBOR.¹—*Buoys*.—The following buoys have been laid down in Auckland Harbor:—
An iron buoy, painted red, in 3½ fathoms water, at three-quarters of a cable N. 49° E. from the north-east extreme of the Railway pier.

An iron buoy, painted red, in 4 fathoms, at three-quarters of a cable N. 42° W. from the north-west extreme of the Railway pier.

There is a depth of from 3½ to 4 fathoms water between these buoys.

CAVALLI ISLAND.^{2,4}—A sunken rock has been reported to lie about one mile E.N.E. from Cavalli Island.

BAY OF PLENTY.—*Motiti Island*.^{3,4}—A shoal forming a narrow ridge with from 2 to 4 fathoms on it, deepening to 10 fathoms rather suddenly to the southward and eastward, and more gradually to the westward, extends from the south extreme of Motiti Island for about a mile in a S.W. by S. direction.

Plate Island.—A rocky patch (Tokeroa shoal), about three-quarters of a mile long in a N.E. and S.W. direction by half a mile broad, lies south-westward of Plate Island. The least water found on this shoal was 3 fathoms, with the south extreme of Plate Island bearing N.E., distant 1½ miles.

COOK STRAIT.

PORT NICHOLSON.—*Lambton Harbor*.^{2,6}—On the north-west side of Lambton Harbor a railway pier has been constructed, extending in a S.S.E. direction; from the south extreme of this pier the north extreme of the outer part of Queen's wharf bears S. 16° W., distant 1½ cables.

There is a depth of 4½ fathoms close southward of the pier head.

LIGHT.—From the outer extremity of this pier is exhibited a fixed white light.

Buoys.—The following six iron warping buoys, painted red, have been laid down in Lambton Harbor:—

A buoy in 18 feet water at 1½ cables S. 60° E. from the observation spot on Pipitea point.

A buoy in 22 feet water at 2½ cables S. 25° E. from the observation spot on Pipitea point.

Four buoys lie off Queen's wharf; of these, two are situated on the following bearings and distances from the north extreme of the outer part of that wharf:—N. 45° E. distant 1½ cables, and N. 68° E. distant 2½ cables. The other two are situated on the following bearings and distances from the south extreme of the outer part of Queen's wharf:—S. 35° E. distant one cable, and S. 54° E. distant 1½ cables.

APPROACH TO PORT NICHOLSON.⁷—*Lyall Bay*.—A sunken rock (on which the *Sophia R. Luhrs* struck) is said to lie about 1½ cables E. by S. from the extreme of the reef which extends from the west entrance point of Lyall Bay. This rock has about 17 feet on it at low-water springs.

MIDDLE ISLAND.—EAST COAST.

PORT LYTTLETON.²—On the south-west side of Little Port Cooper, the position of the landing place of the submarine telegraph cable is marked by a vertical white mark, which is conspicuous from seaward for a distance of three or four miles.

Buoy.—An iron buoy, painted red, lies in 15 feet water, at nearly a cable east of the east extreme of Shag reef. The rock at the west extreme of Shag reef is about 8 feet high.

MIDDLE ISLAND.—SOUTH COAST.

AWARUA OR BLUFF HARBOR.^{10,11}—Two dolphins have been placed on the Middle spit, which lies north of the wharf on west side of entrance to Bluff Harbor. One is situated on the extreme east end of the spit in 12 feet water, and is surmounted by a cross, painted red and white in horizontal bands. The other is on the middle of the spit, in 4 feet water, and surmounted by a Y-shaped beacon, painted red and white in diagonal bands. These dolphins, when kept in line bearing about N.W. by W. ½ W., lead through the deepest part of the channel, between Te Waewae point and Burial point, in not less than 24 feet water.

Sandy knoll, lying about three cables E.N.E. of Starling point, and over which there was formerly a depth of 2 fathoms, is now reported to have over it a depth of 3½ fathoms.

The knoll situated nearly 4 cables S.E. ½ E. of Te Waewae point, and over which there was formerly a depth of 3 fathoms, has shoaled and extended about 1½ cables to the southward; there is only a depth of from 1½ to 2 fathoms over it. A chequered black and white buoy has been placed on the north-west extreme of this shoal, and a red buoy on its south-east extremity; both of these buoys are in 3 fathoms water. When entering by the west channel these buoys must be left on the starboard hand, and when entering by the north channel on the port hand.

MORETON BAY.—BRISBANE RIVER ENTRANCE.

(1.) *Additional Lights in Francis Channel.*

THE Queensland Government has given notice that, on 16th November 1880, three *white* lights would be exhibited in Francis or West Channel, Brisbane River entrance, from the following positions, viz.:

1. From the corner beacon at the south-east end of the outer cutting.
2. From the double beacon in the bend.
3. From the corner beacon seaward of the light vessel.

VITI LEVU.

(2.) *Leading Lights at Suva Harbor.*

Information has been received from Lieutenant Moore, commanding H.M. surveying vessel *Alacritty*, dated 6th December 1880, that two leading lights are now exhibited on the northern shore of Suva (Tomba-ko-suva) Harbor, south-east coast of Viti Levu:—

The low light is a fixed *red* light, visible in clear weather from a distance of 5 miles; it is situated on the beach about 2½ cables eastward of the east end of Nukumarorsko islet.

Position: Lat. 18° 6' 50" S., long. 178° 24' 40" E.

The high light is a fixed *white* light, elevated 320 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of from 8 to 12 miles; it bears from the low light north, distant 1900 yards.

These lights in line bearing north lead through the channel into Suva Harbor.

KANDAVU ISLAND.

(3.) *N'galoa Harbor—Leading Lights Discontinued, Beacons Removed.*

Also, that the leading lights for the main channel into N'galoa Harbor, Kandavu Island, have been discontinued, and the beacons from which they were shown have been removed.

The bearings are magnetic. Variation 9½° easterly in 1881.

(1.) SPENCER GULF—PROPOSED LIGHT ON CORNY POINT.

The Government of South Australia has given notice that, on or about 10th January 1882, it is proposed to exhibit a light from a lighthouse to be erected on Corny Point, east side of Spencer Gulf:—

The light will be a *fixed* white light of the third order.
Position approximate, lat. 34° 54' 0" S., long. 137° 0' 30" E.
Further information concerning this light will be published in due course.

Navarre Goldfield Common.
Stawell and Pleasant Creek Goldfield Common.
Landsborough, Glasgow Lead, Glendhu, and Malakoff Goldfield Common.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the first of April 1879, the Ararat Mining Board, having drafted the following regulations for management of the above-named commons, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such commons:—

Regulations.

- In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules. The words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.
- Holders of miners' rights (actually engaged in mining), business licenses, or carriers' licenses, residing on or near to the boundaries of any of the above-named commons may respectively depasture stock thereon.
- The following shall be the scale of fees for depasturing stock on the commons:—
For each head of large cattle, Three shillings (3s.) per annum.
For each head of small cattle, One shilling (1s.) per annum.
- Every holder of a miner's right or business license shall be entitled to depasture any number of cattle not exceeding twelve (12).
- The managers may issue special licenses to dairymen to depasture any number of large cattle not exceeding forty (40) for dairying purposes, on payment of the fees specified in clause 3.
- The managers may issue to butchers and slaughtermen special licenses to depasture, for slaughtering purposes only, any number of sheep, not being less than twenty (20) nor more than two hundred and fifty (250), at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per head per annum, and for any number of large cattle not exceeding thirty (30) on payment of the fees specified in clause three (3).
- During the months of August and February in each year, or as soon thereafter as possible, all owners of stock on the commons shall be required to muster such stock in their own yards or in some other convenient place to be determined by the managers within forty-eight (48) hours after receiving notice in writing, and to assist in branding them with the common brand, horses and sheep only exempt from being branded.
- Previous to the depasturing of stock, the owners thereof shall register the same with brands and descriptions in the herd-book, and such registration shall be renewed half-yearly, and shall be made previous to the branding of such stock.
- Holders of licenses may substitute cattle for others removed from the commons during the currency of their license by giving notice in writing to the herdsman, containing the brands and number of cattle so substituted. A record of such notice to be kept by the herdsman.
- All fees must be paid half-yearly in advance, licenses to date from the first day of August and the first day of February in each year.
- All stock depastured on any of the commons, if not registered, branded, and duly paid for, may be impounded by the managers.
- The progeny of cattle; horses, or goats depastured on any of the commons shall be exempt from fees if under six months old.
- No swine or entire animal shall be depastured on any of the commons without permission of the managers.
- Sheep specially licensed shall only be depastured on such parts of the commons as the managers shall set apart for that purpose, and if depastured beyond those limits they shall be deemed to be trespassing, and may be impounded.
- No license shall be transferred without the permission of the managers.
- When any animal is infected with disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the commons within twelve hours after receiving notice from the managers or herdsman, and such animal shall not again be put upon the commons without the special permission of the managers.
- After due notice has been given, the managers shall, at the owners' expense, have power to remove all diseased animals, and also, at the owners' expense, to remove, bury, or destroy all dead carcasses found on the commons.
- Travellers intending to drive cattle or sheep across or through any of the commons shall, before entering upon such commons, deliver at the residence of one of the managers or herdsman of the commons a notice of his intention so to drive such cattle or sheep, and shall by such notice state whence he has brought the same and whither he is driving them, and all cattle shall be driven every day a distance of not less than ten miles and all sheep shall be driven every day a distance of not

less than six miles in the direction of the place mentioned in the notice as the place to which it is intended to drive such cattle or sheep respectively. Travellers depasturing any stock on any of the commons shall be allowed to run the same free of charge for twenty-four hours, but shall be liable to pay twopenny per day for each horse or head of horned cattle and one halfpenny for each sheep depastured beyond that time, but the managers shall have the power at any time to prevent travelling flocks or herds remaining beyond the twenty-four hours.

19. No person shall cart away water from any dam on the above-named commons without the permission, in writing, of the managers thereof.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

UNITED SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE BOWMAN'S FOREST FARMERS' COMMON.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council, on 1st April 1879, the Council of the United Shire of Beechworth, having drafted the following regulations for management of the Bowman's Forest Farmers' Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fee for depasturing stock on the common shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of April and the first day of October in each year; and all stock remaining on the common fourteen days after the period for which payment has been made will be liable to be impounded without notice to the owners thereof.

3. The fee to be paid for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follows:—For every head of large or small cattle, Two shillings per annum.

4. No entire horse, bull, or ram shall be allowed to be depastured on the common without the sanction in writing of the managers.

5. The herdsman shall register the permanent brand, as delivered to him in writing by the owners thereof at the time of registration, or brand with the common's brand all stock depasturing on the common, and in respect of which the fee specified shall have been paid, and shall give to the person so paying a printed receipt in the prescribed form.

6. The herdsman may impound any stock trespassing on the common, and all travelling stock remaining thereon more than twenty-four hours will be liable to be impounded.

7. Stock becoming diseased after being placed on the common shall be removed within twenty-four hours after notice by the herdsman to the owners thereof; and in case such stock be not removed within the time specified the same shall be removed or destroyed at the expense of the owners. Stock which may die on the common, if not removed within twelve hours after notice has been given to the owners thereof, shall be removed at the owners' expense.

8. The managers will not be responsible for any stock placed on the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

The births of 734 children, viz., 388 boys and 346 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of April. In the month of March 877 births were registered, or 143 more than in the month under review. The births were above the average of April during the previous six years by 65. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 3.

The deaths registered in April numbered 482, viz., 255 of males and 227 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 252. The deaths were less numerous than those in March by 29, but exceeded the average of April, during the previous ten years, by 49. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been below that average by 17.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 92.0° on the 7th, and the lowest was 40.9° on the 29th. The mean temperature of the month (57.9°) was half a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (33.0°) took place on the 24th, viz., from a maximum of 82.1° to a minimum of 54.1°. The least range (5.6°) was on the 27th, viz., from a maximum of 56.1° to a minimum of 50.5°. The mean daily range was 20.2°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.089 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Males contributed 53 per cent. and females 47 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 36 per cent. to that mortality, as against 40 per cent. in April 1880; 43 per cent. in April 1879; 38 per cent. in April 1878; 40 per cent. in April 1877 and April 1876; 47 per cent. in April 1875; 32½ per cent. in April 1874; 42 per cent. in April 1873; 50 per cent. in April 1872; and 49 per cent. in April 1871.

Fourteen of the deaths recorded during the month were of persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards, viz. — those of a produce dealer, aged 75, who died of intermittent fever; a female, aged 76, of jaundice; a gentleman and a female, each aged 77, of apoplexy; a shoemaker, aged 77, of heart disease; a widow, aged 78, of paralysis; a female, aged 78, of hepatitis; a laborer, aged 80, of cancer; a laundress, aged 81, of congestion of the lungs; a gentleman, aged 87, of bronchitis; a female, aged 75, a gentleman, aged 82, a female, aged 84, and a laborer, aged 99, of old age.

Twenty-five deaths were set down to external causes during the month, of which 20 were ascribed to accident, 2 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male child, aged 2, and an engine-driver, aged 30, died of injury to the head; a female child, aged 2, of inflammation of the brain; and a carpenter, aged 34, of fracture of the skull—all the result of falls; a carter, aged 35, of injury to the leg, caused by a truck passing over it; an engine-driver, aged 35, of injuries resulting from a train passing over him; a male, of occupation unstated, aged 53, of injuries to the head received in a fall; a selector, aged 50, of a fall from a horse; a female, aged 64, of shock to the nervous system, the result of a fall; a female, aged 67, of injuries received in falling from a railway train; a carter, aged 37, of an accidental gun-shot wound in the thigh; a male infant, aged 1, of the effects of caustic alkali taken by accident; a laborer, aged 43, of the administration of chloroform, for the purpose of an operation; a licensed victualler, aged 52, of blood poisoning resulting from the bite of a venomous insect; a candle maker, aged 12, a needle-woman, aged 28, a school teacher, aged 27, and a master mariner, aged 74, of drowning, the first and last in the Yarra; a female infant, aged 1 day, of suffocation in bed; and a cigar maker, aged 48, of suffocation with gas. Of the homicidal deaths, that of a newly-born female infant was effected by suffocation, and that of a newly-born male infant by a blow on the head. Of the persons who committed suicide a female artist, aged 25, and a tutor, aged 35, shot themselves; and a female, aged 64, drowned herself. All of these were set down as laboring under insanity at the time of their committing self destruction.

One hundred and three deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—62 in the Melbourne Hospital, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 10 in the Alfred Hospital, 9 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 2 in the Homœopathic Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 174, of which 93, or 53 per cent., were of males, and 81, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 122 were under one year of age, 35 were between one and two, 9 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 308. Of these, 162, or 53 per cent., were males, and 146, or 47 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 24 were between twenty and twenty-five, 25 were between twenty-five and thirty, 24 were between thirty and thirty-five, 23 were between thirty-five and forty, 24 were between forty and forty-five, 38 were between forty-five and fifty, 32 were between fifty and fifty-five, 27 were between fifty-five and sixty, 20 were between sixty and sixty-five, 17 were between sixty-five and seventy, 11 were between seventy and seventy-five, 8 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 6 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases fell from 137 in March to 90 in the month under notice. The decrease was in deaths from diphtheria, which fell from 4 to 2, in deaths from typhoid fever, which fell from 30 to 15, and in deaths from dysentery and diarrhoea, which fell from 58 to 30. Measles, which had not proved fatal in the previous month, caused 2 deaths in April, making a total of 178 deaths from that complaint since its outbreak in an epidemic form in May last. Six deaths in childbed, or 1 death of a mother to every 122 births registered, took place in the month under review, as against 10 deaths in childbed, or 1 to every 88 births in the previous month.

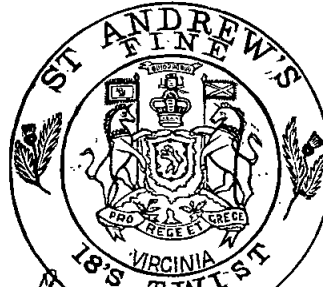
