PASSPORTS TO ALIENS NATURALIZED IN BRITISH COLONIES.

THE Governor has directed the subjoined Circular Despatch and Enclosure to be published for general information.

Sir,—Her Majesty's Government have had under their consideration the position of aliens naturalized in a colony, when travelling beyond the limits of the colony in which naturalization has been granted, and they have decided that aliens naturalized in British colonies shall, as regards their claim to British protection out of Her Majesty's dominions, be placed, in future, on the same footing as aliens naturalized in this country under the Naturalization Act of 1870.

2. To carry out this object, aliens naturalized in British colonies will be allowed to receive from the Governor of the colony in which they have been naturalized a passport unlimited in point of duration, instead of a passport for one year, as is now authorized. These passports will also be issued by the Foreign Office in London, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

3. If, however, an alien naturalized in a colony, and not possessing such passport, finds himself in need of one when in a foreign country, a British Minister or Consul will be empowered, on such evidence as he may deem sufficient, to grant him a provisional passport, limited in duration, in order to meet the immediate requirements of his case, and to enable him to return to his colony or to the United Kingdom, and so establish his identity beyond question, and obtain a permanent passport.

4. I enclose an amended regulation, which will be substituted in the Colonial Regulations for the present Regulation No. 404, in chapter XIV.; and also an amended form of passport, which will be inserted in the appendix, in place of the form and memorandum now in use.

Form of Passport.

This passport is granted to A.B., naturalized as a British subject in this colony, to enable him to travel in foreign parts.

This passport is granted with the qualification that the bearer shall not, when within the limits of the Foreign State of which he was a subject previously to obtaining his colonial certificate of naturalization, be entitled to British protection, unless he has ceased to be a subject of that State in pursuance of the laws thereof, or in pursuance of a treaty to that effect.

§ II. Passports to Naturalized British Subjects in the Colonies.

404. Governors are authorized to issue passports for foreign travel to persons naturalized in their respective colonies. The form of passport is inserted in the appendix (page 317). These passports must be signed by the Officer administering the Government, and must contain an express declaration that the person receiving the passport has been naturalized as a British subject in the colony.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following Bye-law for regulating the Shipping and Unshipping of all Goods at any pier vested in the Board, that is to say:—

Trucks shall be loaded or unloaded, as the case may be, within eight working hours after the same shall be placed on the pier in a position accessible for such purpose; and the master of any vessel, or the stevedore thereof, not loading or unloading any such truck within such time shall be liable to a demurrage charge of Ten shillings a truck for every day or part of a day that the truck is not loaded or unloaded as aforesaid, or, in the case of trucks to be discharged, the Board may, at the expiry of the eight working hours before mentioned, immediately and without further notice, have the trucks returned to the station whence they were consigned, or any station, store, or shed nearer to the pier than the consigning station, and discharge them, storing their contents; and all charges for such conveyance and storage shall be borne by the owners of the goods.

(b.) Should proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks within which such trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District:

(c.) Should state what are the principal works proposed to be constructed: and

REGULATIONS FOR COMMONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the undermentioned Commons.

ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.
REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE UNDERMENTIONED GOLD-FIELD COMMONS WITHIN THE ARARAT MINING DISTRICT, VIZ.:-

- GREAT-WESTERN GOLDFIELD COMMON,
- ARMSTRONGS GOLDFIELD COMMON,
- CAMPBELLS' DIGGINGS GOLDFIELD COMMON,
- GLENPATRICK GOLDFIELD COMMON,
- NAVARRE GOLDFIELD COMMON,
- STAWELL AND PLEASANT CREEK GOLDFIELD COMMON,
- LANDSBOROUGH, GLASGOW LEAD, GLENDHU, AND MALAKOFF GOLDFIELD COMMON.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1879, the Ararat Mining Board having drafted the following Regulations for management of the above-named Commons, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such commons.

Regulations.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations, the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules. The words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.
2. Holders of miners' rights (actually engaged in mining), business licenses, or carriers' licenses, residing on or near to the boundaries of any of the above-named commons, may respectively depasture stock thereon.
3. The following shall be the scale of fees for depasturing stock on the Armstrongs Goldfield Common, Campbell's Diggings Goldfield Common, Glenpatrick Goldfield Common, and Navarre Goldfield Common:-
For each head of large cattle, Three shillings (3s.) per annum.
For each head of small cattle, One shilling (1s.) per annum.
And the following shall be the scale of fees for depasturing stock on the Great Western Goldfield Common, Stawell and Pleasant Creek Goldfield Common, and Landsborough, Glasgow Lead, Glendhu, and Malakoff Goldfield Common:-
For each head of large cattle, Two shillings (2s.) per annum.
For each head of small cattle, One shilling (1s.) per annum.
4. Every holder of a miner's right or business license shall be entitled to depasture any number of cattle not exceeding twelve (12).
5. The managers may issue special licenses to dairymen to depasture any number of large cattle not exceeding forty (40), for dairying purposes, on payment of the fees specified in clause 3.
6. The managers may issue to butchers and slaughtermen special licenses to depasture, for slaughtering purposes only, any number of sheep being not less than twenty (20) nor more than two hundred and fifty (250), at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per head per annum, and for any number of large cattle not exceeding thirty (30) on payment of the fees specified in clause three (3).
7. During the months of August and February in each year, or as soon thereafter as possible, all owners of stock on the commons shall be required to muster such stock in their own yards or in some other convenient place to be determined by the managers, within forty-eight (48) hours after receiving notice in writing, and to assist in branding them with the common brand, horses and sheep only exempt from being branded.
8. Previous to the depasturing of stock, the owners thereof shall register the same with brands and descriptions in the herd book, and such registration shall be renewed half-yearly, and shall be made previous to the branding of such stock.
9. Holders of licenses may substitute cattle for others removed from the common during the currency of their license, by giving notice, in writing, to the herdsman, containing the brands and number of cattle so substituted. A record of such notice to be kept by the herdsman.
10. All fees must be paid half-yearly, in advance. Licenses to date from the first day of August and the first day of February in each year.
11. All stock depastured on any of the commons, if not registered, branded, and duly paid for, may be impounded by the managers.
12. The progeny of cattle, horses, or goats depastured on any of the commons shall be exempt from fees if under six months old.
13. No swine or entire animal shall be depastured on any of the commons without permission of the managers.
14. Sheep specially licensed shall only be depastured on such parts of the commons as the managers shall set apart for that purpose, and if depastured beyond those limits they shall be deemed to be trespassing and may be impounded.
15. No license shall be transferred without the permission of the managers.
16. When any animal is infected with disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the commons within twelve hours after receiving notice from the managers or herdsman, and such animal shall not again be put upon the common without the special permission of the managers.
17. After due notice has been given, the managers shall, at the owners' expense, have power to remove all diseased animals, and also, at the owners' expense, to remove, bury, or destroy all dead carcasses found on the commons.
18. Travellers intending to drive cattle or sheep across or through any of the commons, shall, before entering upon such commons, deliver at the residence of one of the managers or herdsman of the commons a notice of his intention so to drive

such cattle or sheep, and shall, by such notice, state whence he has brought the same and whither he is driving them. And all cattle shall be driven every day a distance of not less than ten miles, and all sheep shall be driven every day a distance of not less than six miles in the direction of the place mentioned in the notice as the place to which it is intended to drive such cattle or sheep respectively. Travellers depasturing any stock on any of the commons shall be allowed to run the same free of charge for twenty-four hours, while travelling as aforesaid, but shall be liable to pay Twopence per day for each horse or head of horned cattle, and One halfpenny for each sheep depastured beyond that time; but the managers shall have the power at any time to prevent travelling flocks or herds remaining beyond the twenty-four hours.

19. No person shall cart away water from any dam on the above-named commons, without the permission, in writing, of the managers thereof.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.
