THE ECHUCA AND WARANGA WATERWORKS TRUST.—LOAN.

At an Executive Council held at Government House, Melbourne, the eleventh day of October 1882.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Governor.

Mr. Young | Mr. Burrowes.

WHEREAS by *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application, or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that, if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: and every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should state—

(a.) The amount of money which the Governor in Council would grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same, and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and also the rate of interest which would be charged for such loan, such rate being at least One-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted.

(b.) Should proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks within which such trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District:

(c.) Should state what are the principal works proposed to be constructed: and

(d.) Should contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the now in part recited Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case the Governor in Council should think fit.

And it was further enacted by the said Act that each Waterworks Trust should consist of commissioners to be elected from time to time by the council of each of the municipal districts which will, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, be directly benefited by the proposed waterworks, and which should be specified in the Order in Council approving the construction of such waterworks or in any subsequent Order, and of one other commissioner who should be appointed by the Governor in Council, and the number of commissioners to be elected by each council, not exceeding two, should be determined by the Governor in Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application of the Municipal Councils of Echuca and Waranga for a Loan of One hundred and sixteen thousand pounds sterling, to carry out certain waterworks for the supply of a Waterworks District under the said Act, embracing portions of the Shires of Echuca and Waranga as shown on the general plan and description accompanying the said application deposited in the Department of Mines and Water Supply, Melbourne, and doth hereby order as follows:—

(1.) The construction of the said waterworks:

(2.) The Waterworks Trust for such Waterworks District hereby constituted shall consist of two members from each of the councils of the municipal districts interested and one other commissioner:

(3.) That the amount of the loan hereby granted shall be One hundred and sixteen thousand pounds sterling, for the purpose of carrying out the proposed works and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.

(4.) That the area of the Waterworks District within which such Trust shall have authority shall consist of lands included within the boundaries hereunder described, being portions of the Shires of Echuca and Waranga (each of which said shires or municipal districts will be directly benefited by the proposed waterworks), viz.:—

REGULATION UNDER SECTION 110 OF "THE LAND ACT 1869."—SURVEY FEES.

WHEREAS by the *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind the Regulation made by Order of the eighteenth day of March 1882, fixing the fees payable for surveys, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, viz. :—

SURVEY FEES.

1. The amount of the survey fee payable by a selector shall, for the period from the 1st day of January 1882 to the 1st day of January 1885, be in accordance with the amount fixed by the Graduated Scale and Schedule, copies of which are hereunto annexed, and shall be payable on the order of the Land Officer for the time being of the district in which the land applied for is situated; and the amount of the fee shall be the same to the selector whether the selection be wholly or partly composed of lands previously surveyed or unsurveyed land, except as regards (a) lands specially surveyed and subdivided into lots deemed suitable for selection by the Department of Lands, before being declared available; (b) selections composed of detached portions; and (c) selections in the counties of Croajingolong, Karkaroc, Weeah, and Millewa outside the limits of any defined contract survey district. For these exceptional cases the fees shall be as follow :—

(a) When lands specially surveyed for selection by the Department, before being declared open for selection, are taken up in greater or less areas than was intended when subdivided, or so as to necessitate further expense in surveys, the selector shall, in addition to the cost of the original subdivisional survey, also pay the cost of any modification required by him.

(b) When the right of selection is exercised in any detached portions, a separate survey fee, according to scale, will be required for each portion.

(c) Lands situated outside the limits of the contract surveyors' districts, as now defined, will be subject to a special fee for survey, and the amount of such fee shall in each case be determined by the Surveyor-General.

2. All monies collected on the orders of the Land Officers towards the expense of selection surveys shall be deposited by the selector at the Treasury, and credited to an account called the "Survey Fees Account."

3. Accounts passed against deposits placed to the credit of the "Survey Fees Account" shall be signed by the Land Officer ordering the collection of the money, or his successor in office, and shall be countersigned by the Inspecting District Surveyor.

4. In any case where the whole of the fee collected shall not have been expended on the survey of a selection the Land Officer shall report the fact to the Assistant Surveyor-General immediately on certifying the surveyor's account, and such balance as may remain shall be carried to revenue or otherwise disposed of as the Secretary for Lands may direct.

SCHEDULE TO THE GRADUATED SCALE.

In cases of selections in connection with which only a part of the boundaries or a portion of the areas require to be specially surveyed, the contract surveyor shall be paid in proportion to the work required to be done as follows :—

For Subdividing a Surveyed Allotment.

- When the total length of the lines required to be marked does not exceed 60 chains, the fee shall be the minimum fee (fee for 20 acres) according to the contract scale for the locality.
- When the length does not exceed 80 chains, the fee shall be the same, or $\frac{1}{3}$ of the maximum fee (for 320 acres), according to said scale, when the latter exceeds the former amount.
- When the length exceeds 80 chains, the fee shall be half the maximum.
- When the allotment is subdivided by a road the above fees shall be increased by 25 per cent.

Other Partial Surveys.

 REGULATIONS.

THE Council of the Shire of Benalla, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Benalla Recreation Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869.*

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the authority in writing of the committee.
 6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee first obtained.
 7. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the Reserve for Water Supply purposes, in the municipal district of Browns and Scarsdale, town of Smythesdale, known as the "Eldorado Dam Reserve."

WHEREAS by a regulation of the Board of Land and Works, made on the twenty-sixth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and eighty, the Council of the Borough of Browns

and Scarsdale was duly appointed a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of the 24th day of August 1880, as a site for Water Supply purposes, in the municipal district of Browns and Scarsdale, town of Smythesdale, hereinafter styled "Eldorado Dam Reserve": Now therefore the said Council of the Borough of Browns and Scarsdale, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said reserve, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869.*

REGULATIONS.

- 1st. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within "Eldorado Dam Reserve" any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals, without the written authority of the committee of management or their officer duly appointed.
 - 2nd. No person shall allow any foul or deleterious matter injurious to health to run into, or to be placed within, the said reserve; nor shall any person bathe or wash in or otherwise pollute the water therein.
 - 3rd. No person shall injure or otherwise damage or destroy the embankment of the said reserve, or use the water therein for mining purposes, unless permission in writing from the committee of management be first obtained.
 - 4th. Subject to the foregoing regulations, the water in the said reserve shall be for the free use of the public for domestic purposes and for watering stock.
- Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
