The births of 789 children, viz., 419 boys and 370 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of September. In the month of August, 928 births were registered, or 139 more than in the month under review. The births were 36 above the average of the previous eight years, but 41 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in September numbered 374, viz., 190 of males and 184 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 415. The deaths were fewer than those in August by 103, but exceeded the average of September during the previous ten years by 14. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been below the average of those ten years by 32.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.77, and of deaths registered 1.31.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 78.9° on the 23rd, and the lowest was 34.1° on the 15th. The mean temperature of the month (54.2°) was nearly one and a half degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (32.4°) took place on the 29th, viz., from a maximum of 74.4° to a minimum of 42.0°. The least range (6.0°) occurred on the 12th and 22nd, viz., from a maximum of 56.8° to a minimum of 50.8°, and 59.0° to 53.0° respectively. The mean daily range was 16.7°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.857 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Of the deaths registered during the month under notice, 51 per cent. were of males, and 49 per cent. of females. Thirty-three per cent. were of children under 5 years of age as against 28 per cent. in September 1881; 36 per cent. in September 1880; 31 per cent. in September 1879; 30 per cent. in September 1878; 38 per cent. in September 1877; 28 per cent. in September 1876; 35 per cent. in September 1875; 25 per cent. in September 1874; 36 per cent. in September 1873; and 31 per cent. in September 1872.

The deaths of old people in the month were above the average, as many as 26 persons having died at the age of 75 years or upwards, viz.:—A solicitor, aged 75, who died of diarrhoea; a laborer, aged 75, of extravasation of blood upon the brain caused by a fall; a bricklayer, aged 76, of gangrene; a joiner, aged 76, of apoplexy; a female, aged 76, of paralysis; a poundkeeper, aged 76, of congestion of the lungs; a botanist, aged 76, of cystitis; a laborer, aged 77, of cancer; a female, aged 77, of cancer; a laborer, aged 82, of erysipelas; a female, aged 80, of pneumonia; a tailor, aged 78, and a stonemason, aged 83, of heart disease; a laborer, aged 83, of erysipelas; a female, aged 80, and a laborer, aged 84, of bronchitis; a weaver, aged 85, of nephritis; a blacksmith, aged 75, a lamp-lighter, aged 76, 2 females, each aged 78, a female, aged 79, a wheelwright, aged 82, a female, aged 83, a gardener, aged 84, and a female, aged 84, of old age.

Twenty-one of the deaths recorded during the month were from external causes, of which 17 were ascribed to accident and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A laborer, aged 22, and a tailoress, aged 25, died of injuries received from railway trains; a drayman, aged 39, was killed by a dray passing over him; a carter, aged 42, died of fracture of the spine, caused by being thrown from a cart; a laborer, aged 36, of compound fracture of the leg, cause not stated; a female, aged 53,

of fracture of the leg, a laborer, aged 59, of hemorrhage of the brain, and a laborer, aged 75, of extravasation of blood upon the brain, all the result of falls. A retired government officer, aged 56, died of rupture of the kidneys and bladder, through being run over by a tray; a boy, aged 10, of peritonitis, through being accidentally stabbed in the groin; two females, aged 6 and 21 respectively, of burns, the latter through falling into a fire. Two male infants, aged 1 month and 10 months respectively, a seaman, aged 28, and a laborer, aged 63, were found drowned; a female, aged 33, was suffocated in bed whilst intoxicated. The suicidal deaths were those of a druggist, aged 40, and a female, aged 46, who cut their throats; and those of a commercial traveller, aged 25, and a female, aged 30, who drowned themselves.

Eighty-one deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—40 in the Melbourne Hospital, 11 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 1 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Blind Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 123, of which 61, or 50 per cent., were of males, and 62, or 50 per cent., were of females. Of those who died 82 were under one year of age, 24 were between one and two, 9 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 251. Of these 129, or 51 per cent., were males, and 122, or 49 per cent., were females: 9 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 6 were between fifteen and twenty, 23 were between twenty and twenty-five, 20 were between twenty-five and thirty, 15 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 18 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 17 were between fifty and fifty-five, 14 were between fifty-five and sixty, 27 were between sixty and sixty-five, 16 were between sixty-five and seventy, 9 were between seventy and seventy-five, 16 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 10 were upwards of eighty.

The mortality from all classes of diseases was very low during the month. Under the head of constitutional diseases deaths fell from 102 in August to 73, and under the head of local diseases they fell from 255 to 178. In the former case the decrease was chiefly in deaths from dropsy, which fell from 6 to 1; in those from cancer, which fell from 16 to 11; and in those from phthisis, which fell from 65 to 49. In the latter, the decrease was chiefly in deaths from affections of the nerves, which fell from 70 to 51; in those from lung and chest complaints, which fell from 97 to 67; and in those from bowel and stomach diseases, which fell from 48 to 22.

AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST.

(1.) *Spencer Gulf—Corney Point Light—Arc of Reflected Light.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 20 (1) of 4th February 1882, on the intended exhibition, on 1st March 1882, of a fixed white light on Corney Point, east side of Spencer Gulf, which should be visible seaward between the bearings of N. 45° E. and S. 65° W.—

The Government of South Australia has given further notice, dated 29th May 1882, that an arc of reflected light from Corney Point lighthouse is visible inshore of Webb Rock, and unless the night be clear and the land in sight, might (in the absence of bearings) be mistaken for the true light.

Vessels approaching from the southward should not bring Corney Point lighthouse to bear to the northward of N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. until past Webb Rock.

The reflected light may, in clear weather, be seen from a distance of about 10 miles inside the bearing of N.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ N. This inner passage should never be attempted at night by a sailing vessel, unless with a fair wind and thorough knowledge of the coast.

(2.) *Intended Revolving Light on Cape Banks.*

Also, with reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 43 (3), of 7th March 1882, on the intended exhibition of a light from a lighthouse to be erected on the point near Cape Banks, adjacent to Carpenter Rocks, and known as Carpenter Rocks Point—

Further notice has been given that on or about 1st January 1883 the light will be exhibited.

The light will be a revolving light of the second order, showing one red and two white lights at intervals of twenty seconds each, the whole revolution occupying sixty seconds.

The light will be elevated 92 feet above the sea; the white light should be visible in clear weather from a distance of about 10 miles, the red light from about 8 miles.

THE following information relating to Turtle Dove Shoal, Pelsart Bank, and Clio Breakers, west coast of Australia, is the result of a recent examination by Staff Commander J. E. Coghlan, H.M. surveying vessel *Meda*, 1882.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation 4° 20' W. in 1882.]

Turtle Dove Shoal, the position of which was formerly doubtful, is a shoal of about 2 miles in extent, with depths varying from 5 to 12 fathoms, coral and sand bottom (plainly visible at the latter depth); and was found about 2 miles eastward of the reported position of breakers said to have been seen by several coasting vessels.

The shoal lies about 3½ miles within the 100 fathom edge of the coast bank of soundings, and the shoalest spot found, of 5 fathoms, is situated in latitude 29° 21' 30" S., longitude 114° 11' 30" E., and S.S.E. distant 25 miles from Wreck Point, the south extreme of Pelsart Island; and S.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ S., distant 40 miles from Moore Point lighthouse, Champion Bay.

There are depths of 47 and 49 fathoms, 37 fathoms, and 39 fathoms, at the distance of half a mile westward, southward, and eastward of the shoal respectively. Heavy breakers were seen

from the *Meda* near the shoalest portion of the bank; but on the following day when crossing the 5-fathoms patch in the vessel, high rollers, but no breakers were observed. Shoaler depths therefore than 5 fathoms may exist on Turtle Dove Shoal.

Pelsart Bank has depths varying from 18 to 30 fathoms, with a bottom of coarse sand, mixed with broken coral and shells; it is 5 miles long in a N.N.W. and S.S.E. direction, and 2 miles wide.

The shoalest spot found, of 18 fathoms, is situated in latitude 29° 27' S., longitude 114° 14' E., and S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., distant 6 miles from Turtle Dove Shoal. There are depths of 40 and 60 fathoms, 36 fathoms, and 35 fathoms, close westward, southward, and eastward of the bank respectively; and from 37 to 39 fathoms, coarse sand mixed with broken coral, between it and Turtle Dove Shoal.

From the high swell experienced when crossing the bank in the *Meda*, it is probable that shoaler depths than 18 fathoms exist on Pelsart Bank.

Clio Breakers.—Breakers were reported to have been seen (1872) at about 5 miles N.N.E. of the above position of Turtle Dove Shoal.

The search for this reported danger was relinquished on account of bad weather.

Clio Breakers and Turtle Dove Shoal may be identical, but from indications obtained, it is not improbable that other banks exist between Turtle Dove Shoal and Houtman Rocks.

Caution.—These shoals lie directly in the track of vessels between Fremantle and Champion Bay; caution is therefore necessary when navigating in their vicinity.

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was further enacted that the Governor might from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and might from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes, and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and it was also directed that notice of any pro-

posed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the undermentioned Commons, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—
