## ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

An Act to provide for the erection of State School Buildings, for completing the Houses of Parliament and Law Courts, for extending the Geelong, Coliban, and Yan Yean Waterworks, for opening the Gippsland Lakes Entrance, and for improving the Warranbool, Belfast, and Portland Harbors.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and in the forty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## REGULÆ GENERALES.

## RULES FOR THE ADMISSION OF ATTORNEYS.

WHEREAS it is expedient to repeal the rules of the nineteenth day of September A.D. 1882, and to make provision for the admission of certain clerks to practise as Attorneys, Solicitors, and Proctors in the said Court, it is ordered as follows:—

CLERKS.—Any person who shall give proof, by affidavit or otherwise, to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners of the Supreme Court for Attorneys of his having been, prior to the fifteenth day of October 1863, and continuously for a period of ten years at the least after that date a *bonâ fide* clerk to a practising attorney, or practising attorneys, of the said Court, engaged in the transaction and performance (under the direction and superintendence of such attorney or attorneys) of such matters of business as are usually transacted and performed by attorneys, solicitors, and proctors, and who continuously for a further period of five years at the least has been, and is at the date hereof, a managing clerk to a practising attorney or attorneys, and who shall, within one year from the date hereof, file with the Secretary for the Board of Examiners for Attorneys a certificate in the form in the First Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, shall be at liberty, within three years from the date hereof, to enter into articles of clerkship to a practising attorney for a period of three years; and upon his duly serving under such articles of clerkship, and producing a certificate of his having passed two examinations in law in the University of Melbourne—the first of such examinations to be in the Law of Obligations as prescribed for the third examination for the degree of Bachelor of Laws of the said University, and the second of such examinations to be in the Law of Property as prescribed for the third examination for such degree—and upon passing an examination before the Board of Examiners in at least five of the following subjects:—

- (1.) Real Property and Conveyancing;
- (2.) Common and Statute Law;
- (3.) Equity and Divorce and Matrimonial and Ecclesiastical Law;
- (4.) Insolvency and Admiralty;
- (5.) Criminal Law;
- (6.) Practice of the Supreme Court in its various branches;
- (7.) Practice of the Courts of Inferior Jurisdiction;
- (8.) Constitutional Law and Constitutional History—

shall be qualified to be admitted as an attorney, solicitor, and proctor of the said court: Provided that no person shall be entitled to enter into such articles of clerkship, unless he shall, within six months after the publication in the *Government Gazette* of this rule, lodge with the said Secretary a certificate in the form contained in the Second Schedule hereto, signed by three practising attorneys who have been admitted in Victoria ten years at least: Provided also that before any person shall give such proof to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners for Attorneys he shall give to the said Secretary fourteen days' notice at the least of his intention to give such proof; and the rules of the Supreme Court relating to the admission of attorneys, solicitors, and proctors shall, so far as they are applicable and not inconsistent with this rule, apply to all persons taking the benefit of this rule.

## VICTORIAN RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the following conditions to be observed in the expenditure of the grant to the Victorian Rifle Association during the year 1882-83:—

1. Any member of the Local Forces of Victoria who shall, in the opinion of the commandant, have presented himself to shoot on any rifle range in Victoria, with a Government Martini-Henry rifle or carbine, the sights of which have been altered or tampered with, or to fire in any match or competition with a Government rifle, any portion of which has been altered contrary to regulations, shall be disqualified from taking any prize or from competing in any match under the direction of the Victorian Rifle Association for a period of twelve (12) months.

2. In matches restricted to members of the Local Forces of Victoria, and in all matches depending upon the aggregate scores made in two or more of these matches, prizes shall be awarded only to those who were "effective," as per regulations, for their respective branches of the service at the last preceding classification, and who from that period up to the time of firing had attended an average number of parades and drills sufficient, if continued, to render them effective on the 1st July following.

3. In the case of members of the Local Forces joining for the first time after the 31st March an average monthly performance of duty from the time of their joining to the date of the matches sufficient, if continued, to render them "effective" on the 1st July next following, shall render them eligible to be prizetakers.

4. Former members of the Local Forces who had resigned and whose names have not been on the roll of any corps during the twelve months ended the 30th June preceding the matches shall, on rejoining, be deemed new members joining for the first time.

5. In cases of sickness members of the Local Forces having applied for and obtained leave of absence shall, on presenting a medical certificate, be eligible as prizetakers, provided they were unable to render themselves "effective" during the remainder of the year, reckoning the time both before and after their illness.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in the above regulations, where members of the Local Forces who were "effective" on the 1st July 1882 have since attended a sufficient average number of drills per month to have been "effective" had the required number of men been in attendance to form a parade, the conditions of effectiveness shall be deemed to have been complied with.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict., No. 506, § 19, 21, 38, and 39), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, exercising the powers set forth in subdivision 2 of Part I. of the said Act. And it was also enacted that every Order constituting any new municipality should constitute the same as either a borough or a shire, and should—1. Assign a name to such borough or shire. 2. Describe the boundaries thereof. 3. Determine of how many members the council should consist. 4. Determine

whether the municipal district constituted should be subdivided or not; and, in case it should be subdivided, name and describe the subdivisions. And every such Order should take effect according to the tenor of the same; and every such Order constituting any new municipality, having for its municipal district portion of a previously existing municipal district, should operate to sever such portion from such previously existing municipal district. And every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Act are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of the Shire of Wimmera, and by not less than one hundred and fifty inhabitants, householders within the area described in the said petition, praying that the said area might be severed from the South Riding of the Shire of Wimmera, and constituted a new municipality (notices of which said petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act): Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the South Riding of the Shire of Wimmera the portion of the shire described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be constituted a new municipality under the designation of the Borough of Horsham; the boundaries of which said Shire and the South Riding thereof as reduced, and of the new Borough of Horsham, are as follow, that is to say—

**THE SHIRE OF WIMMERA REDUCED.**—The area included within the boundaries above described as the Borough of Horsham to be excepted from the area included within the boundaries of the Shire of Wimmera, as described in *Government Gazette* of 22nd November 1877.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise autho-

rized, shall cut, dig, or remove trees, which at a height of two feet from the ground are of a less diameter than twelve inches, from the timber reserve in the parishes of Franklin and Wombat, the boundaries of which are described in the *Government Gazette* of twentieth day of October One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and in the forty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

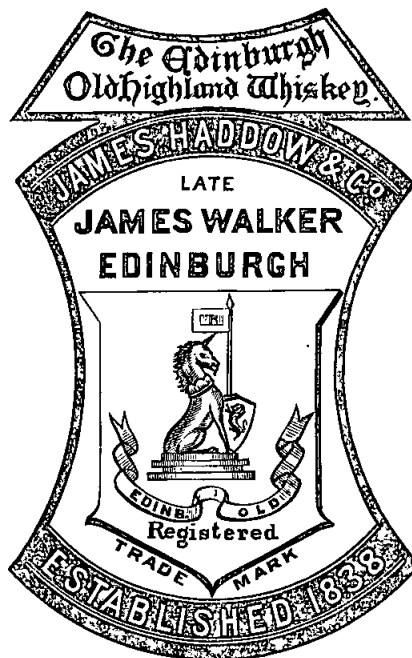
