ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Six hundred and fifty-three thousand seven hundred and eighty-five pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two and three.

An Act to authorize the Raising of Money for the Redemption or Payment of certain Debentures.

An Act to provide for the creation of Victorian Government Inscribed Stock and for the inscription and transfer thereof in London.

An Act to provide for the Redemption and Payment of certain Debentures by increasing the amount of Victorian Government Stock.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-third day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and in the forty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the boundaries of the subjoined School Districts, which lie contiguous to each other, to be re-adjusted in the manner hereinafter described, that is to say:—

School District, No. 312—(Shire of Echuca, North-East Division).

Commencing at the junction of the River Goulburn with the River Murray; thence south-easterly by the River Goulburn to the north-east angle of the Shire of Waranga; thence by a direct line north-east to the Broken Creek; thence by the Broken Creek to the western boundary of the Yarrawonga division of the Electoral District of Moira; thence by that western boundary to the River Murray, and by the River Murray to the commencing point.

School District No. 317—(Shire of Echuca, South-west Division).

Commencing at a point on the River Campaspe where the north boundary of the county of Bendigo abuts thereon; thence southerly by that river to the northern boundary of the township of Rochester; thence westerly, southerly, and easterly by the boundaries of the said township again to the River Campaspe; thence southerly by that river to the north-east angle of allotment 20, parish of Diggora; thence by the northern boundary of that allotment and a direct line to the western boundary of the Railway Reserve; thence north-easterly by the said boundary of reserve to the north-east angle of allotment 89 of the parish of Diggora; thence west to the north-west angle of allotment 68, parish of Warragambe; thence south by a road to the south angle of allotment 59 B, parish of Kamarooka; thence north-westerly by a road to the north angle of allotment 61 A of the same parish; thence south-westerly and west by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 12 C of the said parish; thence north by a line to the north-east angle of allotment 12 E; thence west by a direct line to the south-east angle of allotment 12 B; thence north by a direct line to Picaniny Creek; thence north-westerly and northerly by that creek and Mount Hope Creek to the northern boundary of the county of Bendigo, and east by that boundary to the commencing point.

WANGANUI HARBOR BOARD DREDGE SIGNALS.

THE Wanganui Harbor Board notifies that, on and after the 6th November 1882 the signals used on board the dredge in the Wanganui River will be as follow:—

In the daytime (inward bound): A red ball denotes—"Leave the dredge on the starboard hand," and a green ball denotes—"Leave the dredge on the port hand when passing."

At night (inward bound): A red under a white light denotes—"Leave the dredge on the starboard hand," and a green under a white light denotes—"Leave the dredge on the port hand when passing."

Masters of vessels are warned to pass the dredge when at work at slow speed.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke all and every Proclamation issued under the authority of the 44th section of the said Act in relation to the places or districts named or specified in the subjoined Schedule, that is to say:—

The total increase of population from these sources was thus, 6,190, viz., 3,352 males and 2,838 females, as shown in the table. This is slightly less than the increase in the corresponding quarter of the previous year, viz., 6,202. It should be stated that whilst it is probable nearly all the deaths and arrivals by sea are noted, there is reason to believe that some births and departures by sea are not recorded; it should moreover be borne in mind that no account is or can be taken of persons who come and go overland.
