CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY GRANTED BY THE STEAM NAVIGATION BOARD OF VICTORIA.

THE following Order of Her Majesty in Council, under *The Merchant Shipping (Colonial) Act 1869*, and relating to the issue of Certificates of Competency to Masters, Mates, and Engineers in British Possessions, is published for general information.

AT THE COURT AT WINDSOR, THE 20TH DAY OF JUNE 1882.

Present :

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by *The Merchant Shipping (Colonial) Act 1869*, it is (among other things) enacted, that where the Legislature of any British possession provides for the examination of and grant of certificates of competency to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British ships, and the Board of Trade reports to Her Majesty that they are satisfied that the examinations are so conducted as to be equally efficient as the examinations for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the Acts relating to merchant shipping, and that the certificates are granted on such principles as to show the like qualifications and competency as those granted under the said Acts, and are liable to be forfeited for the like reasons, and in the like manner, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council—

1. To declare that the said certificates shall be of the same force as if they had been granted under the said Acts.
2. To declare that all or any of the provisions of the said Acts which relate to certificates of competency granted under those Acts shall apply to the certificates referred to in the said Order.
3. To impose such conditions and to make such regulations with respect to the said certificates and to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension thereof as to Her Majesty may seem fit, and to impose penalties not exceeding Fifty pounds for the breach of such conditions and regulations.

And that, upon the publication in the *London Gazette* of any such Order in Council as last aforesaid, the provisions therein contained, shall, from a date to be mentioned for the purpose in such Order, take effect as if they had been contained in the Act, and that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to revoke any Order made as aforesaid.

And whereas the Legislatures of the British possessions of—

Canada,	Tasmania,
Malta and its dependencies,	Bengal,
Victoria,	Newfoundland,
New Zealand,	Bombay,
New South Wales,	and
South Australia,	Queensland.

have respectively provided for the examination of and grant of certificates of competency to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British ships, which certificates are hereinafter denominated colonial certificates of competency, and the Board of Trade have reported to Her Majesty that they are satisfied that the said examinations are so conducted as to be equally efficient as the examinations for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the Acts relating to merchant shipping, and that the certificates are granted on such principles as to show the like qualifications and competency as those granted under the said Acts, and are liable to be forfeited for the like reasons and in the like manner.

And whereas Her Majesty by various Orders in Council, and certain Orders in Council amending the same, has been pleased to declare, that, subject to certain conditions and regulations therein contained, the colonial certificates of competency therein referred to granted by—

- (a.) The Minister of Marine and Fisheries in Canada,
- (b.) The Head of the Government of Malta and its dependencies,
- (c.) The Steam Navigation Board of Victoria appointed by the Government of Victoria,
- (d.) The Governor for the time being of New Zealand,
- (e.) The Marine Board of New South Wales,
- (f.) The Marine Board of South Australia,
- (g.) The Governor of Tasmania,
- (h.) The Lieutenant-Governor of Bengal,
- (i.) The Governor of Newfoundland,
- (j.) The Governor of Bombay,
- (k.) The Marine Board of Queensland,

shall be of the same force as if they had been granted under the Acts relating to merchant shipping.

And whereas by the condition or regulation numbered five contained in each of the said recited Orders in Council, it is provided that such colonial certificates of competency shall be granted only to persons who for a period of three years immediately preceding their application for such colonial certificates, or who for several periods amounting together to three years, the earliest of which shall have commenced within five years prior to such application have been domiciled in or have served in a ship or ships registered in the said possessions respectively, and that certificates of competency granted contrary to this regulation shall be regarded as improperly granted.

And whereas it has been represented to Her Majesty in Council that the provisions of the said fifth condition or regulation in the said recited Orders in Council should be rescinded, and that other provisions should be substituted in lieu thereof.

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the said recited Orders in Council should be revoked, and a new Order in Council, modified and amended in manner aforesaid, substituted in lieu thereof.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, doth hereby direct that from and after the first day of October 1882, the following Orders in Council; that is to say,

- (a.) An Order in Council dated the 19th day of August 1871 relating to colonial certificates of competency granted by the Minister of Marine and Fisheries in Canada;
- (b.) An Order in Council dated the 12th day of May 1874 relating to colonial certificates of competency granted by the Head of the Government of the possession of Malta and its dependencies;
- (c.) An Order in Council dated the 12th day of February 1876 relating to colonial certificates of competency granted by the Steam Navigation Board of Victoria appointed by the Governor of the said possession of Victoria;
- (d.) An Order in Council dated the 12th day of February 1876 relating to colonial certificates of competency granted by the Governor for the time being of the possession of New Zealand;
- (e.) An Order in Council dated the 12th day of February 1876 relating to colonial certificates of competency granted by the Marine Board of the possession of New South Wales;
- (f.) An Order in Council dated the 12th day of February 1876 relating to colonial certificates of competency granted by the Marine Board of South Australia;

- (g.) An Order in Council dated the 20th day of November 1880 relating to colonial certificates of competency granted by the Governor of the possession of Tasmania;
- (h.) An Order in Council dated the 27th day of June 1876 relating to colonial certificates of competency granted by the Lieutenant-Governor of the possession of Bengal;
- (i.) An Order in Council dated the 14th day of May 1877 relating to colonial certificates of competency granted by the Governor of the possession of Newfoundland;
- (j.) An Order in Council dated the 11th day of July 1877 relating to colonial certificates of competency granted by the Governor of the possession of Bombay;
- (k.) An Order in Council dated the 26th day of March 1878 relating to colonial certificates of competency granted by the Marine Board of the possession of Queensland;

shall be and the same are hereby revoked: provided, however, that the revocation of the said Orders in Council shall not affect or invalidate any colonial certificate of competency previously granted thereunder.

And Her Majesty is further pleased—

1. To declare that the colonial certificates of competency granted by—

- (l.) The Minister of Marine and Fisheries in the possession of Newfoundland to persons intending to act as masters and mates or board British ships;
- (m.) The Head of the Government of the possession of Malta and its dependencies, the Governor for the time being of the possession of New Zealand, the Governor of the possession of Tasmania, the Marine Board of the possession of Queensland, the Lieutenant-Governor of the possession of Bengal, and the Governor of the possession of Bombay, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British ships;
- (n.) The Steam Navigation Board of Victoria appointed by the Government of the possession of Victoria to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers of British seagoing steamships;
- (o.) The Marine Board of the possession of New South Wales to persons intending to act as masters, first mates, or second mates, or as first class engineers or second class engineers on board British ships;
- (p.) The Marine Board of the possession of South Australia to persons intending to act as masters, first mates, only mates, or second mates, or first class engineers or second class engineers on board British ships;

shall be of the same force as if they had been granted under the said Acts.

2. To declare that all the provisions of the said Acts which relate to certificates of competency for the foreign trade granted under those Acts, except so much of the 139th section of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854* and the 10th section of *The Merchant Shipping Amendment Act 1862*, as requires the delivery by the Board of Trade to any master, mate, or engineer of a copy of any certificate to which he appears to be entitled as therein mentioned, so much of the third paragraph of the 23rd section of the said last-mentioned Act as requires at the conclusion of a case relating to the cancelling or suspending of a certificate, such certificate if cancelled or suspended, to be forwarded to the Board of Trade, and the whole of the provisions of the fourth paragraph of the same section shall apply to such colonial certificates of competency provided, however, that the foregoing exceptions shall not, as regards colonial certificates of competency granted by the Governor for the time being of the British possession of New Zealand interfere with or suspend the operation of an Act of the Legislature of New Zealand entitled *The Merchant Shipping Acts Adoption Act 1869* (32 and 33 Vict., No. 5).

3. To impose and make the conditions and regulations set out in the schedule hereto, numbered 1 to 10 respectively, with respect to the said colonial certificates of competency, and to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension thereof, and to impose for the breach of such conditions and regulations the penalties therein mentioned.

This Order shall take effect in each of the said possessions from and after the first day of October 1882, and shall apply not only to colonial certificates of competency granted under this Order, but also to such as shall have been granted under the Orders hereby revoked and be subsisting at the above date.

SCHEDULE:

CONDITIONS AND REGULATIONS WITH RESPECT TO THE USE, ISSUE, DELIVERY, CANCELLATION, AND SUSPENSION OF COLONIAL CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY.

Interpretation Clause.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these conditions and regulations, the following terms shall have the respective meanings hereinafter assigned to them, that is to say:—

“Colonial Certificate of Competency” shall mean a certificate of competency authorized to be granted by the legislative authority of a British possession to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers of British ships on similar principles and conditions as those granted under the Imperial Acts relating to Merchant Shipping.

“Authority” shall mean the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, Administrator, Head of the Government, Minister, Board, Body or Corporation of or in any British possession for the time being authorized by the Legislature of such possession to grant colonial certificates of competency.

Form of Certificate.

2. A colonial certificate of competency shall be on parchment, and as nearly as possible similar in shape and form to the corresponding certificate of competency for the foreign trade granted by the Board of Trade under the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping.

Name of Possession to be Inserted.

3. A colonial certificate of competency shall have the name of the British possession in which the same is granted inserted prominently on its face and back.

Certificates to be Numbered Consecutively.

4. The colonial certificates of competency granted in each British possession shall be numbered in consecutive order.

Lists of Certificates Granted, Cancelled, &c., to be sent to Registrar-General of Seamen.

5. The Authority in each British possession shall furnish the Registrar-General of Seamen in London, from time to time, with accurate lists of all such colonial certificates of competency as may be granted therein, or as may for any cause whatsoever be cancelled, suspended, renewed, or re-issued; and shall also furnish him with duplicates of the applications for examination made by the persons to whom such certificates are granted.

Certificates to be Granted only upon Proof of Service at Sea.

5. A colonial certificate of competency shall be granted only upon proof that the previous service at sea of the person applying for the same has been such as is required by the regulations for the time being in force in the United Kingdom with respect to certificates of the like grade.

Certificates of competency granted contrary to this regulation, or upon any false, incorrect, or insufficient proof, certificate, or report of service, qualification, conduct, or character, shall be regarded as improperly granted.

Certificates Not to be Granted when Former are Cancelled.

6. A colonial certificate of competency shall not be granted to any person who may have had a certificate, whether granted by the Board of Trade or by the Government of a British possession, cancelled or suspended under the provisions of the said Acts or of any Act for the time being in force in any part of Her Majesty's dominions, unless the period of suspension has expired, or unless intimation has been received from the Board of Trade, or the authority by whom the cancelled or suspended certificate was originally granted, to the effect that no objection to the grant of such colonial certificate is known to exist, or unless a new certificate has been granted to him by such board or authority; and in the last-named event no such colonial certificate of competency shall be for a higher grade than the certificate so last granted as aforesaid.

Colonial certificates of competency granted contrary to this regulation shall be regarded as improperly granted.

Certificates Improperly Granted may be Cancelled without Formal Investigation.

7. A colonial certificate of competency which appears from information subsequently acquired, or otherwise, to have been improperly granted, whether in the above or in any other respect, may be cancelled by the authority by which the same was granted, or by the Board of Trade in the United Kingdom, without any formal investigation under *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, and the holder of such certificate shall thereupon deliver it to the Board of Trade or such authority, or as they or either of them may direct, and in default thereof shall incur a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, which shall be recoverable in the same manner as penalties imposed by the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping are thereby made recoverable.

Cancellation, &c., of a Certificate shall involve Cancellation of all other Certificates possessed by its Owner.

8. Every decision with respect to the cancellation or suspension of a certificate pronounced by any board, court, or tribunal under the provisions of the said Acts, shall extend equally to all the colonial certificates at the time possessed by the person in respect of whom the decision is made, as well as to all certificates granted to him under any of the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping, and whether such certificates be specified in such decisions or not.

Certificates believed to be fraudulent may be demanded.

9. Any officer of the Board of Trade or the Registrar-General of Seamen, or any of his officers, or a superintendent of a mercantile marine office, or a consular officer, or duly appointed shipping officer in a British possession, may demand the delivery to him of any Colonial Certificate of Competency which he has reason to believe has been improperly issued, or is forged, altered, cancelled, or suspended, or to which the person using it is not justly entitled, and may detain such certificate for a reasonable period for the purpose of making inquiries respecting such issue, forgery, alteration, cancellation, suspension or possession, and any person who, without reasonable cause, neglects or refuses to comply with such demand shall incur a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds or its equivalent in local currency, which shall be recoverable in the same manner as penalties imposed by the Acts relating to Merchants Shipping are thereby made recoverable.

Suspended Certificates to be re-issued only by Colony by which originally granted.

10. A Colonial Certificate of Competency which has from any cause been cancelled or suspended, shall be renewed or re-issued only by the authority by which the same was originally granted.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

The Public Works Statute 1865, section 128.—"It shall be lawful for any officer or agent of the board or company, and all persons called by him to his assistance, to seize and detain any person who shall have committed any offence against the provisions of this part of this Act or of the bye-laws made under the authority of this Act, and whose name and residence shall be unknown to such officer or agent, and give him in charge to a police constable who shall convey him with all convenient despatch before some justice without any warrant or other authority than this Act; and such justice shall proceed with all convenient despatch to the hearing and determining of the complaint against such offender."

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby authorize and appoint the person named in the schedule hereto annexed as its agent and officer for the purpose of carrying into effect (so far as applicable to each respective case) the 128th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and also at any time hereafter to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the provisions of Part III. of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, or of any bye-law made or to be made under the authority of such Act; and to summon such person before any justice or justices for such offence, or to charge him or her with such offence.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Board of Land and Works.

CITY OF PRAHRAN.

BYE-LAW No. 87.

A Bye-law of the City of Prahran, made under section 213 of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 87, for regulating the traffic through and over the roads and streets of the city, and for preserving order therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by The Local Government Act 1874, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Prahran order as follows:—

1. Any street musician or vocalist shall, when requested by any householder or his servant, or by any member of the police force, depart from the neighborhood of the premises of such householder.

2. No procession of persons or of vehicles, or both, for other than funeral purposes, shall parade or pass through any of the streets, unless with the previous consent, in writing, of the Mayor, or in his absence, the Town Clerk of the city, and only by the route specified in such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given at least twenty-four hours' notice, with particulars of such consent and route, to the officer in charge of the city police.

3. Whenever, for the prevention of accident or the maintenance of order, and for such time as by notice in writing under the hand or by the direction of the Mayor, or in his absence, or the case of sudden emergency, under the hand of the Town Clerk or the officer in charge of police station at Prahran, any carriage-way, footway, street, or other public place shall be declared to be closed against traffic of vehicles or persons, or both, the drivers of vehicles and all persons contemplated by such notice shall, when so required by any member of the police force, obey and conform to such notice by abstaining from going or by withdrawing and removing from where mentioned therein. And the drivers of all vehicles, whether private or public, which may be there, whether plying for hire on any duly appointed stand or otherwise, shall, when so required by any member of the police force, remove their vehicles thence, and if desiring to remain in the vicinity, shall proceed to any other carriage-way, street, or public place which may be indicated by the police for that purpose, and there arrange and order their vehicles in manner directed by any member of the police force.

4. Upon any occasion when any number exceeding ten vehicles shall be assembled and waiting at any one and the same place, the driver of every such vehicle shall, as to the placing and ordering thereof, comply with the directions given by any member of the police force placed on duty there for the preservation of safety and order.

CITY OF PRAHRAN.

REGULATION No. 15.

A Regulation of the City of Prahran made under the provisions of the Act No. 630, to amend the Police Offences Statute 1865, numbered 15, for the purpose of keeping order in the carriage-ways and public places in the City of Prahran, and preventing obstructions in the same respectively.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Act of Parliament of Victoria, No. 630, to amend the Police Offences Statute 1865, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Prahran make the regulations following:—

1. All persons standing or loitering upon any of the carriage-ways, footways, or other public places of the city shall discontinue to do so on requirement by any member of the police force.

2. All persons walking along the footways shall in passing each other keep on their respective right-hand side of the footway.

3. The driver of any vehicle shall give way, if he conveniently can, to any other vehicle, during the taking up or setting down of any person into or from such other vehicle.

4. The driver of any hackney carriage or omnibus shall not stop the same for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passenger at any part of the street except as near as may be to the left or near side thereof.

5. No driver of any omnibus or hackney carriage shall drive the same so as to immediately and closely precede or follow, and intentionally conform to the progress of any other omnibus or hackney carriage in competition against or to the annoyance of any other person.

6. The driver of any vehicle of whatsoever kind it may be, and whether private or public, before stopping the same in any carriage-way for any purpose shall give notice of his intention so to do if riding upon such vehicle by holding up his whip or his hand, so that the same may be seen by the driver of any other vehicle in rear of his, and upon stopping he shall so place his vehicle as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic, and if the stoppage prevent the passing of any other vehicle, or interrupt or delay traffic, he shall upon being so required by the driver of such other vehicle, or by any member of the police force, remove his vehicle so as to permit such other vehicle to pass or so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

7. Between the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening of any day, no person shall cause interruption or annoyance to passengers along the public roadways or footways by raising or discharging dust upon or across any such roadway or footway, whether from buildings in process of construction or demolition, or in any other manner.

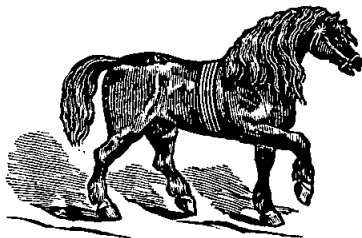
