WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 500), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Order, amongst other things, altering, for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the date of such publication: And whereas it has been deemed expedient that a portion of the boundary-line between the Shires of Buninyong and Meredith should be altered and adjusted: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and adjust the boundaries of the said Shires of Buninyong and Meredith, and doth re-define the boundaries of the contiguous shires respectively in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF BUNINYONG.—Commencing at a point due south of the west boundary of section 8, in the parish of Cardigan, and due west of the south boundary of John Winter's pre-emptive right in the parish of Yarroewe, county of Grenville; thence east to the south-west angle of the said John Winter's pre-emptive right; thence north and east by the west and north boundaries of said pre-emptive right to the River Yarroewe; thence northerly by the west side of the Yarroewe to the south boundary of the town of Ballarat East; thence east and north by the south and east boundaries of Ballarat-East to the centre of the main Melbourne to Ballarat (north) road; thence easterly along the centre of the said main road eleven miles forty chains to a point due north of the north-west angle of the Borhoneyghurk pre-emptive section; thence south to the said angle and by the west boundary of said pre-emptive section to its south-west angle; thence west by the north boundary of allotment 133, parish of Meredith, to the north-west angle of said allotment; thence south by a line and centre of a road forming the east boundary of allotments 134, 131, 130, 127, 126, 125, 124, 123, 122, 121, 120, and 119, and a line in continuation thereof to the centre of the Geelong and Ballarat Railway; thence north-westerly by that railway to a point opposite the centre of a road forming the boundary between allotments 166 and 167, parish aforesaid; thence westerly by that road to the west boundary of the parish; thence south-westerly by the road dividing allotments 15 A and 63 B, parish of Cargerie, to the south-east angle of the last-named allotment; thence west by the south boundary thereof and of the Cargerie pre-emptive section to its south-west angle; thence south-westerly by the centre of a road to the south-east angle of allotment 33 B, said parish; and thence by a line and road forming the south boundary of 33 B, 34 B, and 35 B, parish of Cargerie to the River Leigh; thence northerly by the centre of that river to a point due east of the north boundary of the Mount Mercer pre-emptive right; thence by a line bearing west, forming for a portion of the distance the north boundary of the said Mount Mercer pre-emptive right, nineteen miles twenty-one chains, more or less, to a point due south of the commencing-point; thence by a line bearing north to the commencing-point. Excluding the Borough of Buninyong.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specially described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the colony of Victoria and its dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, sec. 14) it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time upon the application in writing of the council of any municipality to proclaim any part of the municipal district of such municipality, to be defined by such council, not being a borough having a population of Five hundred persons liable to be rated, as shown by the rate-book, a special area; and it was further enacted that the fee which should be paid for a publican's license in respect of premises situated within a special area should be Ten pounds only; and the Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any proclamation made under the authority of the above recited section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation bearing date the nineteenth day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty proclaiming Flinders and Barrington (being portions of the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong) special areas under the provisions of the fourteenth section of the Act above recited, within which the fee to be paid for a publican's license shall be Ten pounds only.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* it was amongst other things enacted that where any street or road in any municipal district exceeds one chain in width such street or road might, for any length thereof, be reduced in width to any width not less than one chain, and that the council of the municipality and the Board of Land and Works, and every owner of any land having a frontage to such street or road in any place where the same is so reduced in width, or in any place not more than three chains from any such place, might agree in writing, under the common seals of the municipality

and the Board of Land and Works, and under the hand and seal of every such owner, upon a scheme for the reduction in width of such street or road for the length mentioned in such scheme and for the disposal of the surplus land taken from such street or road, and as to the purchase-money to be paid by any such owners who might be allowed to purchase any of the surplus land, and as to the compensation, if any, not exceeding in the whole the amount of the purchase-money to be paid in respect of any land injuriously affected by such scheme, and the Governor in Council might by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such scheme, and thereupon any land mentioned in such scheme in that behalf should cease to be a street or road, and all rights of way over the same should cease and determine: And whereas a scheme has this day been submitted to the Governor in Council for reducing the width of Macdougall street, in the City of Sandhurst, in the colony of Victoria, as hereinafter set forth: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the 367th section of the said in part recited Act, doth by this present Order confirm the said scheme for reducing the width of Macdougall street, in the City of Sandhurst aforesaid, from its intersection with High street to its intersection with Pantom street in the said city, from its present width of one chain and a half to the width of one chain, as shown on the plan attached to the said scheme, and deposited at the Office of Crown Lands and Survey, Melbourne, and in accordance with such scheme, under the seals of the City of Sandhurst, the Board of Land and Works, and under the hands and seals of the several and respective persons named therein, dated the tenth day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

ROADS PROCLAIMED UNDER "THE LAND ACT 1869."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might from time to time by a notice in the *Government Gazette* proclaim as a street or road or as a town or village any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such town or village should be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road should have been proclaimed should be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim as roads the portions of Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE WANGARATTA BOROUGH COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st day of April 1879, the Council of the Borough of Wangaratta having drafted the following Regulations for management of the Wangaratta Borough Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle shall be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable, in advance, on the first day of October in every year:—

3. Persons desirous to depasture stock upon the common must furnish to the managers a statement in writing of the brands and description of such stock, and pay the fees chargeable for same, as set forth in clause 2.

4. No bulls, swine, or entire horses shall be depastured on the common without permission, in writing, of the managers.

5. All unregistered stock found upon the common after the twenty-first day of December 1882 shall be liable to be impounded by the herdsman.

6. All stock registered must be the *bona fide* property of the person registering the same.

7. No person shall remove from the common, or drive thereon any cattle or horses not his or her own property, and duly registered as such in the common books.

8. Travellers intending to drive cattle or sheep across or through the common shall, before entering upon such common, deliver to the managers notice of their intention so to drive such cattle or sheep, and shall by such notice state whence they have brought the same and whither they are driving them. And all cattle shall be driven every day a distance of not less than ten miles, and all sheep shall be driven every day a distance of not less than six miles in the direction of the place mentioned in the notice as the place to which it is intended to drive such cattle or sheep respectively. Travellers depasturing any stock on the common shall be allowed to run the same free of charge for twenty-four hours while travelling as aforesaid, but shall be liable to pay Twopenny per day for every horse and head of horned cattle, and One half-penny for each sheep depastured beyond that time; but the managers shall have power at any time to prevent travelling cattle or sheep remaining on the common beyond twenty-four hours.

9. When any animal is infected with disease the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the common within twelve hours after receiving notice from the herdsman, and such animal shall not again be put upon the common without the special permission, in writing, of the managers.

10. After due notice has been given, the managers shall, at the owner's expense, have power to remove all diseased animals from the common, and also, at the owner's expense, to remove, bury, or destroy all dead carcasses found thereon.

11. Holders of licenses may substitute cattle for others removed from the common during the currency of their licenses by giving notice in writing to the managers, and furnishing the description, brands and number of cattle so substituted, and paying a fee of One shilling per head for large cattle, and Sixpence per head for small cattle.

12. During the months of October and April in each year all owners of stock shall be required to muster the same at the yards appointed by the managers, and shall assist in re-branding such stock with the common brand.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

By the 19th section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to maintain and keep up a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their heirs or representatives for ever.

3. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying on payment of the proper charges.

4. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person, on evidence being produced satisfactory to the trustees, that the relatives or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery on the day previous to the interment.

6. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but persons wanting brick vaults or other graves will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees.

7. That between every grave-site there shall be a space of not less than one foot, and between every family vault-site or between every grave-site and family vault-site a space of not less than two feet.

8. When giving orders for interment, a form of application for burial, containing the name, age, and late place of residence of the deceased, will be provided, and must be filled up where practicable, and entered in the interment book.

9. The time fixed for the funeral to be at the cemetery must be strictly adhered to.
10. The hours for interments will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months.
11. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition, at the expense of the owners.
12. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in and cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, iron, or good blue or red gum planking.
13. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument, stone, tomb, pedestal, epitaph, or inscription which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of such stone, tomb, monument, or pedestal, which may be proposed to be erected, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
14. Any fence, if not kept in proper repair, may be removed by order of the trustees, without notice to the owner.
15. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
16. The ground will be open for the public daily, from sunrise to sunset.
17. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected by any person during business hours.

A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

11. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair, may be removed, by order of the trustees, without notice to owner.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small, will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered, at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied, the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description; chaff to be made from oatn hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own accounts in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

7. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

8. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.

9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

11. 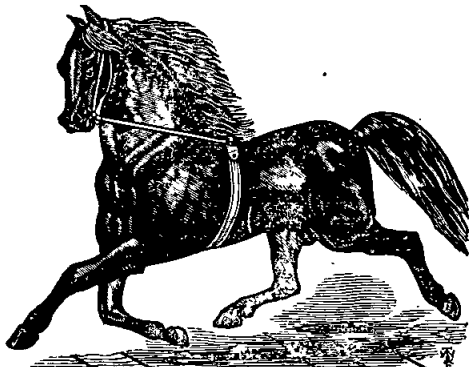

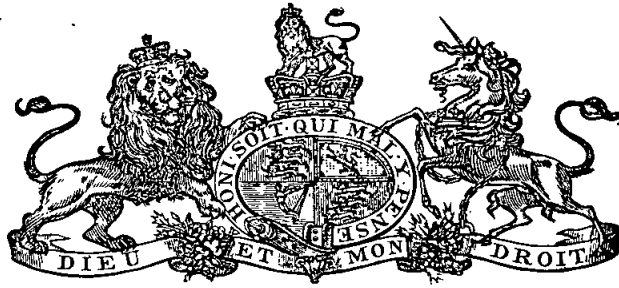
