By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR EXCURSIONS.

Holiday Excursion Tickets will be issued to and from all Stations (Suburban lines excepted), from 18th December 1882 to 3rd January 1883, both dates inclusive (Sundays excepted), available for return for 30 days, days of issue and return and Sundays included. When the 30th day falls on a Sunday the return journey must be completed on the previous Saturday. The journey can be broken on these tickets. From the 22nd December to the 8th January (both dates inclusive) the Department cannot engage to forward horses and vehicles by any particular train. On the 25th and 26th December and 1st January the Goods Sheds at the various stations will be closed and goods trains will not run. Arrangements will, however, be made for the delivery of perishable goods on application.

North Melbourne Station.—From the 22nd December to the 2nd January (both dates inclusive) tickets will not be issued at North Melbourne for country stations, and down country trains will not stop there.

Special Arrangement of Trains for Passengers leaving Melbourne for the country.

Christmas and Boxing Days, and intermediate days to 1st January 1883, inclusive.

Main line and branches.—Every day (Christmas Day excepted) and until the 8th January inclusive, a through special train will start at 3.25 p.m. for Sunbury, Woodend, Kyneton, Castlemaine, and Sandhurst, available for passengers for the Daylesford, Maryborough, Inglewood, and Echuca lines; and when necessary on other days through special trains will also start ten minutes before the ordinary train. The births of 827 children, viz., 392 boys and 435 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of November. In the month of October, 759 births were registered, or 68 less than in the month under review. The births were 155 above the average of the month in the previous eight years, but only 86 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in November numbered 578, viz., 325 of males and 253 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 249. The deaths outnumbered those in October by 181, and were above the average of November during the previous ten years by 165. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, the excess over the average of the month in those ten years will be found to be reduced to 112.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.90, and of deaths registered 2.03.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 96.6° on the 9th, and the lowest was 42.6° on the 1st and 4th. The mean temperature of the month (61.3°) was more than two degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (45.8°) took place on the 8th, viz., from a maximum of 92.0° to a minimum of 46.2°. The least range (3.2°) was on the 28th, viz., from a maximum of 57.2° to a minimum of 54.0°. The mean daily range was 20.5°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.987 inches) was above the average.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent. to the mortality of the month under review. Children under 5 years of age contributed 49 per cent. to that mortality as against 38 per cent. in November 1881; 41 per cent. in November 1880; 39 per cent. in November 1879; 35 per cent. in November 1878; 42 per cent. in November 1877 and 1876; 46 per cent. in November 1875; 47 per cent. in November 1874; 42 per cent. in November 1873; and 48 per cent. in November 1872.

Twenty-two deaths of persons aged 75 years or upwards were registered during the month, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 75, of cancer; a solicitor, aged 75, of hepatitis; a furniture dealer, aged 77, of aneurism of the aorta; a clothier, aged 77, of Bright's disease; two females, aged 75 and 78 respectively, and an agent, aged 77, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 77, and a miner, aged 78, of disease of the brain; a female, aged 78, of cancer; two females, each aged 80, of diarrhoea and congestion of the lungs respectively; a dealer, aged 81, of tumor in the abdomen; a female, aged 82, of paralysis; a squatter aged 84, of cystitis; a female, aged 84, of apoplexy; and a laborer, aged 75, a wool-sorter, aged 81, a female and a tinsmith, each aged 82, a farmer, aged 83, and a coachbuilder, aged 86, of old age.

Of the deaths registered during the month, 25 resulted from external causes, of which 20 were ascribed to accident, 1 to homicide, and 4 to suicide:—A cabman, aged 33, a shipwright, aged 43, and a female, aged 52, were killed by railway trains; a gentleman, aged 18, died of the effects of a fall from a horse, and a milkman, aged 30, of a fall from a cart; a laborer, aged 33, and a carter, aged 40, were passed over by vehicles; an engineer, aged 61, died of accidental fracture of the skull; an auctioneer, aged 64,

of injuries resulting from a fall down stairs; 2 female children—one, aged 8 months, the other, aged 3 years, died of sunstroke; a boy, aged 6, and a basketmaker, aged 40, were accidentally drowned by falling into tanks; a printer, aged 14, was drowned whilst bathing in the Swimming Baths; five persons were found drowned—a female, aged 48, and a tanner, aged 72, in baths, a cook, aged 27, and a laborer, aged 46, in the River Yarra; and a laborer, aged 42, in Port Phillip Bay; a newly-born male infant was found dead, having probably suffered from violence. The homicidal death was that of a newly-born male infant, who died of neglect at birth, the mother being committed for manslaughter. Of those who committed suicide, a cooper, aged 55, and a needlewoman, aged 21, cut their throats—the latter whilst suffering from puerperal mania; a male of occupation unknown, aged 50, and a watchman, aged 54, drowned themselves.

Seventy-four deaths, or 13 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—42 in the Melbourne Hospital, 5 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 3 in the Lying-in Hospital, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Austin Hospital for Incurables; and 3 in the Infant Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 285, of which 155, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 130, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 244 were under one year of age, 29 were between one and two, 5 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 293. Of these 170, or 58 per cent., were males, and 123, or 42 per cent., were females; 9 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 19 were between twenty and twenty-five, 22 were between twenty-five and thirty, 23 were between thirty and thirty-five, 13 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 25 were between forty-five and fifty, 28 were between fifty and fifty-five, 35 were between fifty-five and sixty, 21 were between sixty and sixty-five, 17 were between sixty-five and seventy, 14 were between seventy and seventy-five, 11 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 11 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month, a large increase took place in deaths from all classes of disease. Those under the head of zymotic diseases rose from 43 to 119; constitutional diseases, from 77 to 102; local diseases, from 196 to 227; and developmental diseases from 55 to 104. In the zymotic class the chief increase was in deaths from diarrhœa, which rose from 7 to 71; whilst in the constitutional class deaths from scrofula and tabes mesenterica increased from 2 to 16, and those from phthisis from 49 to 55. In the local class deaths from brain diseases increased from 51 to 77, those from diseases of the digestive organs from 30 to 51, but on the other hand deaths from bronchitis decreased from 25 to 16. The increase under the head of developmental diseases was in deaths from premature birth and atrophy, the former having increased from 12 to 17 and the latter from 22 to 69.

SHIRES OF BUNINYONG AND BALLAN.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, sec. 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz. :-

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of Buninyong Shire which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from that shire and annexed to the West Riding of the Shire of Ballan.

Area described in the petition :-

Commencing at a point on the main Melbourne to Ballarat (north) road, at the north-eastern corner of the eastern boundary of the Shire of Buninyong; thence westerly by that road to its intersection with three other roads at the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section XI, parish of Kerrit-Barcet; thence southerly by a centre line of road crossing the main Ballarat road west of Gordon, and continuing south therefrom to a point in the centre of the road at its intersection with another road at the south-west corner of Barclay's allotment 27, section XIII, parish aforesaid; thence east by the centre line of road to the eastern boundary of the Shire of Buninyong; thence north by the eastern boundary of the Shire of Buninyong to the commencing point.

Petitioners state that the above territory at one time formed part of the Ballan Shire; that petitioners had every reason then to be satisfied with their treatment by that council, but are greatly dissatisfied with the manner in which their interests are dealt with by the Buninyong Council, the amount expended being much less than what they are entitled to; that the present boundary is a very unsatisfactory one, namely, an imaginary line which divides the township of Gordon, one portion being in the Shire of Buninyong and the other in Ballan; that such severance is detrimental to their interests, and prevents mutual and united action in matters affecting the welfare of that particular portion of the district.

Your petitioners therefore pray that Your Excellency the Governor in Council will be pleased to exercise the powers conferred by *The Local Government Act 1874*, by severing the territory above described and annexing same to the West Riding of the Shire of Ballan.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small, will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied, the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender, it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Telegrams will not be entertained.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own accounts in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

7. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

8. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.

9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

11. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1883; and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
