INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION, AMSTERDAM, 1883.

Sir,—I have the honor to transmit to you a copy of the Foreign Office correspondence noted in the margin, relative to an International Exhibition of Colonial objects, and of General Exportation, Works of Art, &c., which it is proposed to hold at Amsterdam in 1883.

It will be observed from Mr. Stuart's despatch, of the 28th of November, that the representation of the British Colonies is much desired by the Netherlands Government, and I shall be glad if your Government should find itself able to contribute towards the objects of the proposed Exhibition.

Sir,—I am directed by Earl Granville to transmit to you, to be laid before the Secretary of State, copy of a note from the Netherlands Minister in London, enclosing a prospectus of an International Exhibition which it is proposed to hold at Amsterdam, in 1883, of colonial products, articles of general exportation, works of art, &c., and inviting Her Majesty's Government to take part in the Exhibition; and I am to request that you will move the Earl of Kimberley to inform Lord Granville what answer should be returned to Count Bylandt's note.

Londres, 16 Septembre 1881.

M. le Comte,—Dans l'état de l'année 1883 aura lieu à Amsterdam une Exposition Internationale Coloniale et d'Exportation Générale, dont la nature et le but sont plus amplement, détaillés dans le programme que j'ai l'honneur de transmettre ci-joint à votre Excellence.

Le Comité d'Exécution s'étant adressé au Gouvernement du Roi pour fixer l'attention du Gouvernement de Sa Majesté Britannique sur cette Exposition, je me trouve en conséquence chargé d'inviter le Gouvernement de Sa Majesté Britannique à prendre part à cette Exposition.

Malgré qu'elle n'aura lieu qu'en 1883, il est néanmoins désirable que le Comité d'Exécution sache le plus tôt possible avec quelles personnes assignées par le Gouvernement de Sa Majesté Britannique il pourra se mettre en rapport, et je me trouve donc également chargé d'appuyer le désir qu'une nomination éventuelle de délégués puisse se faire dans le plus bref délai possible.

28th November 1881.

My Lord,—With reference to your Lordship's despatch, No. 45 Commercial, of the 14th instant, inquiring of me what Govern-

ments had accepted the invitation to take part in the Exhibition which it is proposed to hold at Amsterdam in 1883, I have the honor to state that Mr. Rochussen informed me this afternoon that he believed that the French, Italian, and United States Governments had accepted, and that the Spanish Government had accepted for the Spanish colonies.

No answer appears to have been received as yet from the Portuguese Government.

Mr. Rochussen reminded me that the German Government had declined to take part in the Paris and other Exhibitions, and that therefore their unwillingness to take part in the one to be held at Amsterdam was not to be wondered at.

His Excellency took the opportunity to tell me that the Netherlands Government would be very grateful for any assistance which Her Majesty's Government might be disposed to render, with a view to contribute to the success of the above Exhibition, and expressed his earnest hope that both Great Britain and her colonies would be well represented at it.

In the course of our conversation Mr. Rochussen observed that it was perhaps unfortunate that so prominent a position had been given to the term *Colonial* in the description given in the programme of the Exhibition, as foreign nations had thereby been led erroneously to suppose that the Exhibition was to be rather of a colonial than of a general character.

KINGDOM OF THE NETHERLANDS.—CITY OF AMSTERDAM.
INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION OF COLONIAL OBJECTS, AND OF
GENERAL EXPORTATION. May—1883—October.

General Programme.

THE brilliant success, achieved by the City of Amsterdam in obtaining a direct road of communication to the North Sea, and by which she has maintained her ancient reputation of being the first commercial city in the kingdom, has given her a fresh stimulus to show renewed signs of life and energy in every department of human knowledge. A Committee, selected from the most influential men of the town, propose to organize an International Exhibition of Colonial Objects and of General Exportation, for the year 1883.

One of the principal objects of this Exhibition will be to promote the interests of the Dutch Colonies as well as those of the Colonies of other nations, who, it is confidently expected, will gladly support and patronize this work.

London, Paris, Vienna, and other important places, in the latter part of the present century, have successively collected at their Exhibitions the products of Trade and Industry, of Agriculture and Horticulture, of Science and Art, in a manner calculated to raise the admiration of the whole world.

Of late years the great cities of the New World—Philadelphia, Sydney, and Melbourne, have successfully followed their example.

As one of the eldest Colonial Powers, Holland would claim the privilege and the honor of taking the initiative in organizing a concourse between the various colonizing people such as has never yet taken place.

The Committee, selected for the execution of this project, is convinced that an Exhibition of this kind, whilst spreading a new light on the colonies in general, cannot fail to be of immense interest.

Much as has been done for stimulating the spirit of enterprise, and securing the success of fresh commercial designs, there still remains a great deal to achieve in propagating a vaster knowledge of those countries, whose inexhaustible wealth of the soil only wants knowledge and capital, those powerful levers of our age, in order to contribute most thoroughly to the universal prosperity.

There is perhaps no fitter medium for the spreading of more knowledge concerning colonies than a Colonial Exhibition, where, with the aid of History and Science, is shown what those colonies were and what they actually are.

The projected Exhibition will be subdivided into five great Departments:

- 1st. Colonial Exhibition.
- 2nd. General Export-Exhibition.
- 3rd. Retrospective Exhibition of Fine Arts and Arts applied to Industry.
- 4th. Special Exhibitions.
- 5th. Scientific Lectures and Meetings.

ART. 1. The Colonial Department forms the main basis of the Exhibition.

A comparative inquiry into the various systems of Colonization, of tropical Agriculture, of the Exploitation of the treasure of the soil, promises to be a useful and original labor, worthy of the general interest.

This Exhibition should not be limited to a mere show of materials and products, but must also offer an opportunity of comparing the manners and customs of the natives of the Transatlantic regions.

Public Works and Means of Conveyance, as being the foundations of prosperity and civilization, should form part of the Exhibition.

It is likewise thought desirable to represent specimens from the fauna and flora of the colonies, as images of the luxuriant nature of the tropical countries.

Finally the Army and Navy, those bulwarks of liberty, should not be wanting.

ART. 2. The Second Department will contain all that belongs or relates to the General Export Trade. A vast space will be set apart for Industry, as applied to the transformation of matter, whilst Industry and Commerce will find ample opportunity for honest competition.

ART. 3. In the third Department will be exhibited specimens of Art from the remotest times, as an instructive picture of the

ideas that have existed, with regard to them, among the original peoples, and how these ideas have been developed under the influence of civilization.

A comparative inquiry into the fine arts of different periods and nations seems highly interesting.

ART. 4. The object of the fourth Department is that of Temporary Exhibitions. These will be, for the greater part, of a national character, so as to show the native products of Agriculture and Industry and as tending to promote the general interest.

ART. 5. The fifth Department is the intellectual part of the Exhibition. Scientific lectures and meetings will offer an opportunity to the men of science, those pioneers of civilization, to communicate their ideas on and discuss the interests of Trade and Industry, of Science and Art, International Law, Education, Hygiene, &c.—Colonial Economy, especially the relations between the mother country and colony, will occupy a first place in the list of interesting subjects of discussion.

The interests of mankind are universal, as the human genius is. We venture to hope that the invitation which the Dutch Government will forward to the other European Powers, for a hearty support of the Colonial Exhibition of Amsterdam, will meet with a favorable reception, so that by a general co-operation a complete success may be secured.

Even the mightiest nations will profit by occasionally entering into intellectual contests with their rivals, be it only for the purpose of showing that power and wealth, supported by moral and intellectual energy, will ever continue to deserve the esteem of the whole civilised world.

Extending the commercial operations, encouraging industry, raising the moral force of nations, strengthening the bond of union among the peoples, those will be the salutary fruits of so many united efforts, both for the colonies and the mother country.

Appendix I.

COLONIAL AND EXPORT TRADE EXHIBITION.—MAY.—
AMSTERDAM.—OCTOBER.—1883.

PROGRAMME OF THE COLONIAL SECTION.

THE Exhibition will embrace the Colonies and extra-European possessions of the different powers. Nations without colonies or possessions abroad may contribute towards the Exhibition, provided they trade or are connected with colonies, or in case they have advanced the knowledge of such parts through charts, books, collections of the products thereof, &c.

The Colonial Exhibition is divided into three general groups:—

- I. Physical conformation of the colonies and possessions.
- II. Their native populations.
- III. The Europeans in such countries and their relation towards the natives.

1st Group.—7 Classes.—Physical conformation of the Colonies and Possessions.

- 1st Class.—Geography. Descriptions, atlases, charts, plans, reliefs, profiles, &c.
- 2nd Class.—Meteorology and Terrestrial Magnetism. Charts, tables and graphical diagrams.
- 3rd Class.—Scenes, by means of paintings, drawings, engravings, lithographs, photographs, &c.
- 4th Class.—Geology and Mineralogy. Zoological and mineralogical descriptions, pictures and collections.
- 5th Class.—Plants. Live and dried plants, pictures of plants and descriptions of the flora.
- 6th Class.—Animals. Stuffed and otherwise preserved animals. Pictures of animals and descriptions of the fauna.
- 7th Class.—Anthropology. Descriptions and pictures, casts, skulls, preserved heads.

2nd Group.—6 Classes.—Native Populations.

(By which is understood all inhabitants not of European race.)

8th Class.—Statistics of population in tables and graphical diagrams.

9th Class.—Domestic and social life.

a. Pictures and models of cities and villages, dwelling-houses, shops, workshops, &c.

b. Furniture.

c. Clothing and finery. Toilet requisites, designs of tattoo processes and instruments.

d. Dietary. Utensils for preparation, use, and preservation.

e. Stimulants. Utensils for preparation, use, and preservation of tobacco, beetle, opium, drinks, &c.

f. Morals and customs. Pictures, paintings, drawings, sketches, costumes, arms, or other objects illustrative of ceremonies and customs, such as betrothals and marriages, pregnancy and births, death and burial, contracts and oaths. Sports and popular games, and objects and pictures thereto appertaining.

g. Pauperism. Communications regarding the means of counteracting it. Poor laws.

10th Class.—Means of subsistence.

a. Sport and fisheries. Apparatuses and instruments for capture and treatment of animals, as traps, drumnets, fences, nets, lines, hooks, harpoons, darts, nooses, cages, &c. Fishing craft and models thereof. Products of the chase and fishing, as ivory, horns, musk, skins, and hides, pearls, mother-o'-pearl, coral, tortoise-shell, amber, dried fish, &c.

b. Cattle breeding. Statistics of cattle markets in tables and graphical diagrams. Pictures of cattle, buffaloes, horses, sheep, &c., indigenous or cross breeds; with quotations of prices.

Products derived from cattle, as horns, hides, wool, dairy produce, &c.

Instruments for feeding, dairy manufacture, wool shearing, &c.

Cattle marks, pictures, and stamps.

Cattle bells, shepherds' tools, stables and fences.

c. Breeding of useful insects, such as silkworms, bees, and cochonille insects. Utensils and samples.

d. Agri- and Horti-culture. Products of agri- and horti-culture, obtained by native means, such as sugar cane and tobacco for home use, pepper, beetle, gambier, rice, Indian corn, and other cereals; arrowroot, sago, kapok, cotton, cocoa, &c.

Models and drawings of waterworks and means of irrigation.

Implements for agri- and horti-culture, such as ploughs, harrows, shovels, spades, hatchets, grasscutters, choppers, scythes, &c.

Lofts and sheds.

e. Forest produce, as samples of wood for house- and ship-building; for piers, embankments, and bridges; for the manufacture of furniture, agricultural implements, instruments, weapons, &c.; for charcoal, &c.

Resins, gums, rattans of different descriptions, bamboos, wax, aconyte, oils and fat, fibrous stuffs, coloring matters, wild nutmegs, massooy.

f. Mining. Mining explorations, gold- and diamond-washing, salt boilings, &c. Implements and samples. Eatable clay.

g. Industry. Spinning, weaving, thrashing, dyeing, cotton printing tools, models, and samples.

NOTE.—The apparent increase of population in 1881 (22,126) was exceeded in 1880—the Exhibition year—by 4,031, but was equalled in no other year since 1871; the increase by excess of recorded arrivals by sea over recorded departures by sea (7,322) was exceeded in 1880 by 4,339, but was reached in no other year since 1871: the increase by excess of registered births over registered deaths (14,804) was equalled in no other year since 1873. It should be stated that, whilst it is probable nearly all the deaths and arrivals by sea are noted, there is reason to believe that some births and departures by sea are not recorded: it should also be borne in mind that no account is or can be taken of persons who come and go overland.

The figures of births and deaths during 1881, and consequently those of population, will probably be slightly altered when the returns of the deputy registrars are finally examined.

The births registered in 1881 numbered 9,236, as against 8,645 in 1880, and 8,829 in 1879. The last named was the highest number recorded in any year of the decenniad preceding the year under review.

As compared with every 1,000 of the population, the births numbered 32.64 in 1881, against 31.19 in 1880. In every other year of the previous decenniad, however, the births in proportion to the population were more numerous than in 1881.

The deaths in 1881 numbered 5,505, which exceeded the number in 1880 by 321, and also exceeded the number in all the other years of the previous decenniad, except 1873, in which an epidemic of measles prevailed, and as many as 6,317 deaths were recorded.

In 1881, the proportion of deaths to every 1,000 of the population was 19.45. This proportion was exceeded in six, but was not reached in the other four of the years of the previous decenniad.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the year was 99.9° on the 26th January, and the lowest was 31.9° on the 10th June. The mean temperature of the year (57.1°) was a tenth of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (47.1°) took place on the 21st February, viz., from a maximum of 99.2° to a minimum of 52.1°. The least range (5.6°) was on the 27th April, viz., from a maximum of 56.1° to a minimum of 50.5°. The mean daily range was 17.33°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.964 inches) was above the average.

Of the births registered in 1881, 50.9 per cent. were of males, and 49.1 per cent. were of females. Of the deaths during the year, 53.5 per cent. were of males, and 46.5 per cent. were of females. Children under the age of 5 years contributed 38 per cent. to the total mortality, as against 40 per cent. in 1880 and 1879; 37 per cent. in 1878; 42 per cent. in 1877; 40 per cent. in 1876; 48 per cent. in 1875; 43 per cent. in 1874; 42 per cent. in 1873; and 47 per cent. in 1872 and 1871.

The deaths of 239 persons, viz., 119 males and 120 females, of the age of 75 years or upwards, occurred during 1881. Of these 104 were between 75 and 80; 88 between 80 and 85; 32 between 85 and 90; 12 between 90 and 95; and 3 upwards of 95, who were aged respectively 96, 99, and 103. The following were the occupations of these old people:—Customs officer, 1; pensioners, 3; clergy, 1; lawyers, 2; female teachers, 2; surveyor, 1; dealers, 2; grocer, 1; hawkers, 4 (two being females); agents, 2; hotelkeeper, 1; bootmaker, 1; tailor, 1; hatter, 1; seamstresses, 2; man-cook, 1; laundresses, 3; female domestic servant, 1; bricklayers, 4; mason, 1; plasterers, 2; brickmaker, 1; blacksmiths, 6; builder, 1; carpenters, 2; coachmaker, 1; bookbinder, 1; tanner, 1; shipwrights, 2; gunsmith, 1; plumber, 1; painter, 1; venetian-blind maker, 1; miners, 5; overseer, 1; shepherds, 2; woolsorter, 1; gardeners, 6; farmers, 5; railway gatekeeper, 1; letter-carrier, 1; sailors, 2; watermen, 2; produce dealer, 1; seedsman, 1; laborers, 14; watchmen, 2; hall-keeper, 1; gentlemen, &c., 21; no occupation, unspecified—males, 7; females, 110.

Of the deaths recorded during the year, 281—of which 225 were of males and 56 of females—were from external causes, 229 being ascribed to accident, 13 to homicide, and 39 to suicide. The accidental deaths occurred as follow:—(1) Railway accidents.—Run over on line, 12; fall from carriage, 3; crushed by carriage, 2; carriage running off rail, 4. (3) Chemical injuries (not in mines or railways)—Burns, 14; scalds—hot water

of the deaths from this complaint, as the latter are generally returned as being caused by the primary disease or injury from which the erysipelas resulted. Deaths from dysentery and diarrhoea were fewer by 55 than the average of the previous decade. Cancer caused fewer deaths than in 1880 or 1879, but more than in any of the eight previous years. Deaths from phthisis, although fewer than in 1880, were much above the average. Deaths resulting from diseases of the brain and nerves were also above the average, the number being 696 as against 640. Deaths from heart disease were much above the average, and exceeded the number in any year of the previous decenniad. Deaths from bronchitis and from pneumonia were each exceeded in only one year of the same period. Childbearing proved unusually fatal in 1881, the number of deaths of parturient women being 103, or 1 to every 90 children born alive, the usual average being 57, or 1 to every 145 such children. The following is a summary of the deaths from these diseases during the last eleven years:—

SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON.
PROPOSED SUBDIVISION.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to be one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being on the municipal roll of the Shire of Shepparton, and state that they are desirous that the said municipal district be subdivided into four Ridings, to be named as follows :—

- The Eastern Riding,
- The Western Riding,
- The Central Riding,
- The Southern Riding.

The Eastern Riding to consist of the parishes of Strathmerton, Katunga, Baulkamaugh, and Uluipa.

The Western Riding to consist of the Parishes of Yalca, Waia, Barwo, and Yielima.

The Central Riding to consist of the Parishes of Drumanure, Congupna, Tallygaroopna, Kaarimba, and Mundoono.

The Southern Riding to consist of the remainder of the shire.

REGULATIONS for the Distribution of the sum of Five hundred pounds (£500) granted by Parliament to the Horticultural Societies, 1881-2 (Division No. 89, No. 5).

1. That each Society claiming to participate in the Grant shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 11th March 1882, a statement in the Form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the Form marked E.

2. The distribution of the Vote will be made one month after the above-mentioned date, when a sum equal to the amount of the prize-money awarded and paid away will be allotted to each Society having a claim, and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, provided that the sums claimed do not exceed in the whole Five hundred pounds, and if they do exceed this amount then they will be reduced *pro rata*, and the allotment made accordingly.

3. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st January 1881 and the 31st December 1881 amounts in the total to less than Fifty pounds shall be entitled to participate in the Vote.

SHIRE OF LEXTON.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE LEXTON COMMON, THE EVANSFORD AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON, AND THE SPRINGS, LEXTON, ERILDOUN, ADDINGTON, AND BEECHWORTH FARMERS' COMMON.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the first day of April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Lexton, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the above-named commons, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such commons.

Regulations.

- Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers, may respectively depasture on any of the above-named commons, within 5 miles from their places of residence, four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on any such common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.
- In the construction and for the purposes of these Regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean, cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules, and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.
- The following shall be the scale of fees, payable half-yearly in advance, for depasturing stock on any of the above-named commons:—

For every horse 6s. per annum.
For head of other large cattle 4s. "
For head of small cattle 1s. "
Young cattle under six (6) months old, progeny of stock legally depasturing on the commons, Free.

- No bull or entire horse shall be allowed to depasture on any of the above-named commons without the permission, in writing, of the managers.
- Persons desiring to depasture stock on any of the above-named commons shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman, at the appointed branding yards, on the days set apart for reception of stock, and shall, at the same time, hand to the herdsman a duplicate of the written statements of the number and brands of the stock so delivered, and the managers shall, on receiving the fees payable on such stock, give a receipt in the prescribed form. The herdsman shall then proceed to brand the stock with the common brand in pitch and tar, and the owners or persons in charge of such stock shall render every assistance to the herdsman during the branding.
- The managers or herdsman will not be responsible for the loss of any stock depasturing on the above-named commons.
- The managers of the above-named commons may, if they think fit, set apart for the depasturing of sheep only portions of the above-named commons.
- No person shall, without the permission in writing of the herdsman, wilfully disturb or remove from any of the above-named commons stock legally depasturing thereon.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

SHIRE OF MERRIANG.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON OF WALLAN WALLAN.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the first day of April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Merriang, having drafted the following regulations for management of the United Town and Farmers' Common of Wallan Wallan, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common.

Regulations.

- Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The following shall be the scale of fees, payable quarterly in advance, for depasturing stock on the common :—
 For every horse 10s. per annum
 " head of other large cattle ... 5s. "
 " of small cattle... .. 1s. 6d. "

3. Persons desiring to depasture stock on the common shall, after payment to the managers of the prescribed fees, deliver the same to the herdsman, to whom the receipt for such fees shall be produced if required.

4. The days for receiving and delivering stock shall be each day in the week (Sundays excepted).

5. All stock remaining on the common fourteen (14) days after the period for which payment has been made will be liable to be impounded, without notice to the owners of such stock.

6. All persons desiring to remove their stock from the common shall give the herdsman two days' notice thereof, in writing; during which period he will muster or collect such stock in the paddock or yards as the case may be, and give notice thereof to the owners. In no case shall the herdsman be allowed to take stock to the owner's residence.

7. No person shall be allowed to remove stock from the common without first applying to the herdsman, to whom a receipt shall be given for all stock removed.

8. The herdsman shall, when required by the managers, muster the stock legally depasturing on the common, but not oftener than twice in any one year.

9. If any stock legally depasturing on the common shall stray therefrom and be impounded from private lands or from any other common, the herdsman shall release the same at his own expense.

10. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common; and any stock so affected found depasturing thereon must, within twenty-four (24) hours after notice thereof, in writing, from the herdsman, be either removed or destroyed by the owners of such stock.

11. No bull or entire horse shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the permission, in writing, of the managers.

12. All carcasses and offensive matter on the common shall be thoroughly burned by the herdsman, as soon as found by him; and, if he neglect or fail to do so, the work may be carried out by the officers of the Public Works Department to the satisfaction of the resident inspector at Yan Yean, at the cost of the Shire Council of Merriang.

13. The register and other books in connection with the common may be inspected at the Shire Office by any person, on payment of a fee of sixpence for each inspection.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds for each offence.

WE, William Henry Breen, Cornelius Comyn, Kenneth McLeod, Lowry Anderson, and Thomas Augustus Garlick, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land in the parish of Ashens temporarily reserved by Order of 9th August 1881 as a site for Public Recreation, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

Regulations.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling on the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. No person shall remove any earth from or deposit any manure or rubbish on the reserve.

10. A fee not exceeding two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve on such days as may be set apart for the holding therein of athletic sports, cricket matches, football matches, or shows.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.



