At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of February 1882.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Narracan has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order subdivide the Shire of Narracan into three several subdivisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

NARRACAN SHIRE.

North Riding.—Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the shire where the Gippsland Railway line crosses the Moe River; thence north, easterly, south-easterly, and south-westerly by the said shire boundary to a point where the said Gippsland Railway crosses the Morwell River; thence westerly by the said railway line to the commencing point.

East Riding.—Commencing at a point on the Gippsland Railway line immediately north of the north-west angle of allotment 2, parish of Moe; thence south to and by the western boundary of that allotment and allotment 3 to the south-west angle of the allotment last-named; thence east to the north-west angle of allotment 74 same parish; thence south by the road forming the western boundaries of allotments 74, 95, 96, 97, 98, 100, and 130; thence east by the south boundary of last-named allotment to the west boundary of allotment 131; thence south by that boundary of said allotment and west by the north boundary and south again by the west boundary of allotment 136; thence west again to the north-west angle of allotment 1 parish of Narracan South; thence south by the road forming the western boundary of allotments 1, 27, 28, 30, and 31, and a line in continuation thereof being the eastern boundary of the parish of Allambee East; thence west to a road forming the west boundary of allotments 40, 41, 42, and 43, parish of Mirboo to the south-west angle of last-named allotment; thence east to the north-west angle of allotment 44; thence south by the west boundary of said allotment and allotment 45 to the south-west angle thereof; thence east to the north-west angle of allotment 74 and south by the west boundary of allotments 74, 75, 76, 108, 109, 114, and 115 and of the selections of Elizabeth and John Davis to the shire boundary at the Tarwin River; thence north-easterly by the said shire boundary to its intersection with the Gippsland Railway line, and westerly by that line to the commencing point.

West Riding.—Commencing at a point on the Gippsland Railway line immediately north of the north-west angle of allotment 2, parish of Moe; thence southerly by the western boundary of the East Riding (before described) to the shire boundary at the Tarwin River; thence south-westerly, westerly, and northerly by the said shire boundary to its intersection with the Gippsland Railway line, and easterly by that line to the commencing point.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

The shire boundary referred to is that described in *Gazette* of 29th April 1881.

And the Honorable Charles Young, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PART OF THE TOWN OF EMERALD HILL ADDED TO THE BOROUGH OF ST. KILDA.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of February 1882.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), § 19, 38, and 49, it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to

time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the sections of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Town of Emerald Hill, therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Town of Emerald Hill the portion of the town described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such town shall be annexed to the West Ward of the Borough of St. Kilda; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Town of Emerald Hill, the Borough of St. Kilda, and the West Ward of the said Borough respectively, in manner following, that is to say:—

TOWN OF EMERALD HILL REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the shore of Port Phillip Bay opposite the centre of Fraser street; thence north-westerly by the shore of that bay to a point opposite the centre of Pickles street; thence north-easterly by the centre of that street until it intersects the Sandridge road; thence to the centre of Boundary street, and north-westerly by that street and a direct line to the River Yarra at the western boundary of the City of Melbourne; thence north-easterly by the said river to the main Brighton road at Princes bridge; thence south-easterly by the Brighton road aforesaid to a point opposite the centre of High street and the centre of a street between blocks U and V at the boundary of the Borough of St. Kilda; thence south-westerly by the street between the said blocks U and V to the centre of Queen's terrace; thence south-westerly by a direct line to Canterbury road opposite the centre of Fraser street aforesaid; and thence south-westerly by that street to the commencing point.

The centre of the roads and streets along which the line so described is situated shall be taken to be the boundary line.

THE BOROUGH OF ST. KILDA ADDED TO AND RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the shore of Port Phillip Bay opposite the centre of Fraser street; thence north-easterly by that street to its intersection with Canterbury road; thence north-easterly again by a direct line to Queen's terrace opposite the centre of a street between blocks U and V; thence by that street to the main Brighton road; thence east to and by High street to the main Brighton road; thence south by that road to Wellington street; thence east by that street and the main Dandenong road to Moolham street; thence south by that street and the main Brighton road to the Glen Huntley road; thence west by that road to St. Kilda street, south by that street to Park street, west by Park street to shore of Port Phillip Bay, and north-westerly by the shore of that Bay to the starting point.

The centre of the roads and streets along which the line so described is situated shall be taken to be the boundary line.

THE WEST WARD ADDED TO AND RE-DEFINED.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:—

They therefore pray that the petition may be granted; and the area shown on the plan severed from the Shire of Woolamai and annexed as a separate riding to the shire of Buln Buln.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- All charges must be paid to the person in charge when the orders are given, or before the ground is opened.
- Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge before five o'clock on the day previous to the interment.
- The name; age, late place of residence, and cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
- The usual hours of interment will be from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees through the person in charge. A certificate of permission to be given by the secretary on payment of the proper fees.
- All monuments, graves, grave-stones, and fences to be kept in repair at the expense of the owner; and wooden fences, if not kept in repair, will be removed by the trustees, with notice to the owner.
- A drawing of every tomb-stone, monument, or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission to erect any of these things which may seem to them unbecoming or inappropriate, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected, appropriate to the ornamenting of the cemetery.
- No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees to be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
- No graves to be of a less depth than 6 feet.
- No vehicles (except that conveying the body) allowed in the grounds, unless in the case of invalids.
- Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tomb-stone, building, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanor, and, being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by *The Cemeteries Statute* in that case made and provided.
- The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person, on evidence being produced to the trustees, that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.
- The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.
