W HEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the Government Gazette, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Narracan has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order subdivide the Shire of Narracan into three several subdivisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say: that is to say :-

NABRACAN SHIRE.

North Riding.—Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the shire where the Gippsland Railway line crosses the Moe River; thence north, easterly, south-easterly, and south-westerly by the said shire boundary to a point where the said Gippsland Railway crosses the Morwell River; thence westerly by the said railway line to the commencing point.

Gippsland Railway crosses the Morwell River; thence westerly by the said railway line to the commencing point.

East Riding.—Commencing at a point on the Gippsland Railway line immediately north of the north-west angle of allotment 2, parish of Moe; thence south to and by the western boundary of that allotment and allotment 3 to the south-west angle of the allotment last-named; thence east to the north-west angle of allotment 174 same parish; thence south by the road forming the western boundaries of allotments 74, 95, 96, 97, 98, 100, and 130; thence east by the south boundary of last-named allotment to the west boundary of allotment 131; thence south by that boundary of said allotment and west by the north boundary and south again by the west boundary of allotment 136; thence west again to the north-west angle of allotment 1 parish of Narracan South; thence south by the road forming the western boundary of allotments 1, 27, 28, 30, and 31, and a line in continuation thereof being the eastern boundary of the parish of Allambee East; thence west to a road forming the west boundary of allotments 40, 41, 42, and 43, parish of Mirboo to the south-west angle of allotment 44; thence south by the west boundary of allotments 40, 41, 42, and 43, parish of Mirboo to the south-west angle of allotment 44; thence south by the west boundary of said allotment and allotment 45 to the south-west angle thereof; thence east to the north-west angle of allotment 74, 75, 76, 109, 114, and 115 and of the selections of Elizabeth and John Davis to the shire boundary of allotments 74, 75, 76, 108, 109, 114, and 115 and of the selections of Elizabeth and John Davis to the shire boundary at the Tarwin River; thence north-easterly by the said shire boundary to its intersection with the Gippsland Railway line, and westerly by that line to the commencing point.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506), § 19, 38, and 49, it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to

time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the Government Gazette, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the sections of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Town of Emerald Hill, therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition heroinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Town of Emerald Hill the portion of the town described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such town shall be annexed to the West Ward of the Borough of St. Kilda; and, with the advice aforessid, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Town of Emerald Hill, the Borough of St. Kilda, and the West Ward of the said Borough respectively, in manner following, that is to say:

Town Of Emerald Hill REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.
