HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed that, from and after the 1st day of March 1882, the rate of Drawback payable on apparel, slops, and all articles made up in Victoria, not mainly made of material manufactured in Victoria, or of material free of duty, provided that the principal material thereof paid duty on importation at the rate of 20 or 15 per cent. *ad valorem*, to be increased from $6\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. to $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.

ACT 1881.

CHAPTER 47.

AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAW AS REGARDS THE PRESUMPTION OF LIFE IN PERSONS LONG ABSENT FROM SCOTLAND.—[22nd August 1881.]

WHEREAS great hardships have arisen from the want of any limitation to the presumption of life as regards persons who have been absent from Scotland or have disappeared for long periods of years, and it is desirable that a limitation should be provided: Be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Presumption of life limited to seven years, as regards income.

1. In the case of any person who has been absent from Scotland, or who has disappeared for a period of seven years or upwards, and who has not been heard of for seven years, and who at the time of his leaving or disappearance was possessed of or entitled to heritable or movable estate in Scotland, or who has become entitled to such estate in Scotland, it shall be competent to any person entitled to succeed to an absent person in such estate to present a petition to the court setting forth the said facts, and after proof of the said facts, and of the petitioner's being entitled as aforesaid, and after such procedure and inquiry, by advertisement or otherwise, as the court may direct, the court may grant authority to the petitioner to uplift and enjoy the yearly income of the heritable or movable estate of such absent person, as the case may be, and to grant all requisite discharges for the same, as if the said absent person were dead; or the court may sequestrate the estate, and appoint a judicial factor thereon with the usual powers, and with authority to pay over the free yearly income of the estate to the petitioner, whose discharge shall be as valid and effectual as if granted by the absent person.

Provision for disposal of capital of movable estate seven years after date of deliverance.

2. It shall be competent to the petitioner upon whose petition a deliverance has been granted in terms of the preceding section, authorizing him to uplift and enjoy the yearly income of movable estate, or to the heir or representative of such petitioner, to present another petition to the court after the lapse of seven years from the date of said deliverance, setting forth that during that further period the said absent person has not been heard of, and after proof of the facts stated in the petition, and such procedure and inquiry, by advertisement or otherwise, as the court may direct, the court may grant authority to the petitioner to make up a title to, and thereupon to receive and discharge, possess and enjoy, the fee or capital of the said movable estate of the said absent person in the same manner as if the said absent person were dead.

Provision for disposal of heritable estate thirteen years after date of deliverance.

3. It shall be competent to the petitioner or petitioners upon whose petition a deliverance has been granted in terms of section one, authorizing him to uplift and enjoy the yearly income of heritable estate, or to the heir or representative of such petitioner, to present another petition to the court after a lapse of thirteen years from the date of said deliverance, setting forth that during that further period the said absent person has not been heard of, and after proof of the facts stated in the petition, and such procedure and inquiry, by advertisement or otherwise, as the court may direct, the court may grant authority to the petitioner to make up a title to and enter into possession and enjoyment of the fee of the said heritable estate of the said absent person in the same manner as if the said absent person were dead.

Provision for disposal of movable estate after fourteen years' absence where no previous deliverance relative to income under sec. 1.

4. In the case of any person who has been absent from Scotland, or who has disappeared for a period of fourteen years or upwards, and who has not been heard of for fourteen years, and who, at the time of his leaving or disappearance, was possessed of or entitled to movable estate in Scotland, or who has since become entitled to movable estate there, it shall be competent to any person entitled to succeed to the said absent person in such movable estate to present a petition to the court setting forth the said facts; and, after proof of the said facts, and of the petitioner's being entitled as aforesaid, and after such procedure and inquiry, by advertisement or otherwise, as the court may direct, the court may grant authority to the petitioner to make up a title to receive and discharge, possess and enjoy, sell or dispose of the said movable estate in the same manner as if the said absent person were dead.

Provision for disposal of heritable estate after twenty years' absence, where no previous deliverance relative to income under section 1.

5. In the case of any person who has been absent from Scotland, or who has disappeared for a period of twenty years or upwards, and who has not been heard of for twenty years, and who at the time of his leaving or disappearance was possessed of or entitled

to heritable estate in Scotland, or who has since become entitled to heritable estate there, it shall be competent to any person entitled to succeed to said absent person in such heritable estate to present a petition to the court setting forth the said facts; and after proof of the said facts, and of the petitioner's being entitled as aforesaid, and after such procedure and inquiry, by advertisement or otherwise, as the court may direct, the court may grant authority to the petitioner to make up a title to, enter into possession of and enjoy, and sell or dispose of the said heritable estate in the same manner as if the said absent person were dead.

Power to dispense with consent of absent person to sale of property held pro indiviso.

6. Where the absent person shall have been one of two or more pro indiviso proprietors of heritable estate in Scotland, and he shall not have been heard of for seven years or upwards after his leaving Scotland or disappearance, and where the other pro indiviso proprietor or proprietors shall desire to sell the said estate, it shall be competent to such other pro indiviso proprietor or proprietors to present a petition to the court setting forth the said facts, and after such procedure and inquiry by advertisement or otherwise, as the court may direct, the court may grant authority to the petitioners to sell the said estate by public roup or private bargain, as the court may think fit, and the title granted by the said pro indiviso proprietor or proprietors under such authority shall be as good and valid to the purchaser as if the absent person had been a party to the sale and conveyance, and in the case of such a sale the share of the price belonging to the absent person shall be paid into bank for behoof of such absent person, and shall be deemed to be heritable estate of the said absent person, and, as such shall be subject to the provisions of sections one, three, and five hereof.

Claim of absent person barred after thirteen years from date of deliverance.

7. In the event of the absent person having right to heritable or movable estate in Scotland as aforesaid, or of any person entitled to succeed to or take by title derived from him preferably to the person who has obtained possession of the heritable or movable estate under any of the preceding sections of this Act, appearing and establishing his right thereto, he shall be entitled to demand and receive the fee or capital of the said estate, heritable or movable, where extant in the hands of the person or persons who has or have obtained possession thereof as aforesaid, or of any one taking from him by gratuitous title (subject to a claim for the value of any meliorations made thereupon by such person), or to demand and receive the price obtained for the said property, where the same has been sold, unless a period of thirteen years has elapsed since possession of the fee of such estate was obtained under the other provisions of this Act, and after the expiry of such period of thirteen years all claim by the absent person, or those entitled to succeed or deriving right from him as aforesaid, shall be barred. In no case shall any person who has uplifted the income of property under any of the provisions of this Act, or the income of the price obtained therefor, prior to the absent person or those in his right as aforesaid appearing and intimating their claim, be liable to account for or pay to the absent person or those in his right the income received as aforesaid prior to the intimation of such claim.

Presumption of time of death.

8. For the purposes of this Act, in all cases where a person has left Scotland, or has disappeared, and where no presumption arises from the facts that he died at any definite date, he shall be presumed to have died on the day which will complete a period of seven years from the time of his last being heard of, at or after such leaving or disappearance.

Several persons may be conjoined in one petition.

9. Any number of persons entitled to succeed as aforesaid may be conjoined in one petition relating to the estate of the same absent person; and any person having a limited right of succession may appear as petitioner to the effect of having such right made effectual, subject to the provisions of this Act.

Saving the rights of third parties.

10. It is hereby expressly provided and declared that nothing in this Act contained shall be held to prejudice or affect the right of third parties, having right to the estate or any part of it, preferable to the right of the absent person, or to the right of his representatives derived from him.

Policies of assurance exempted.

11. This Act shall not apply to any claim under a policy of assurance upon the life of any person who has been absent from Scotland, or who has disappeared, but the person or persons claiming under such policy shall be required to prove the death of the person whose life is assured in the same manner as if this Act had not been passed.

Jurisdiction.

12. For the purposes of this Act "the court" shall mean and include:—

- (1.) In all cases one of the divisions of the court of session;
- (2.) In all cases where the estate of the absent person in Scotland does not exceed in amount or value the sum of One hundred and fifty pounds sterling, the sheriff court of the county in which said estate or the greater part thereof is situate: Provided always, that the value of heritable estate shall be ascertained in terms of the provisions of the 40 and 41 Vict., c. 50.

Short title.

13. This Act may be cited as the Presumption of Life Limitation (Scotland) Act 1881.

The births of 826 children, viz., 428 boys and 398 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of January. In the month of December 1881, 761 births were registered, or 65 less than in the month under review. The births were 135 above the average of the previous seven years; but only 53 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in January numbered 572, viz., 315 of males and 257 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 254. The deaths were fewer than those in December by 20, but exceeded the average of January during the previous ten years by 33. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been below the average in those ten years by 54.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.92, and of deaths registered 2.02.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 110.5° on the 19th, and the lowest was 46.9° on the 31st. The mean temperature of the month (65.3°) was seven-tenths of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (48.4°) took place on the 18th, viz., from a maximum of 104.0° to a minimum of 55.6°. The least range (4.0°) was on the 30th, viz., from a maximum of 61.0° to a minimum of 57.0°. The mean daily range was 23.8°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.777 inches) was slightly below the average.

Of the deaths registered during the month 55 per cent. were of males, and 45 per cent. were of females. Forty-nine per cent. were of children under 5 years of age, as against 45 per cent. in January 1881; 43 per cent. in January 1880; 44 per cent. in January 1879; 47 per cent. in January 1878; 49 per cent. in January 1877; 52 per cent. in January 1876; 66 per cent. in January 1875; 57 per cent. in January 1874; 49 per cent. in January 1873; and 56 per cent. in January 1872.

Twenty-three deaths of persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of an engineer, aged 75, and a collector, aged 80, of paralysis; a female, aged 75, of gastritis; a dealer, aged 76, of cardiac dropsy; a female, aged 75, a dairyman, aged 77, and a seamstress, aged 80, of bronchitis; a compositor, aged 80, of softening of the brain; a stonebreaker, aged 80, of congestion of the lungs; a widow, aged 80, of asthma; a merchant, aged 81, of sanguineous apoplexy; a female, aged 81, of paralysis; a farmer, aged 81, of pneumonia; a brewer, aged 82, of diarrhoea; a widow, aged 83, of gastric irritation; a male patient in the Kew Lunatic Asylum, aged 84, of disease of the brain; a female, aged 85, of pneumonia; a female, aged 77, another female, aged 80, a stonemason, aged 80, a gentleman, aged 81, a female, aged 83, and a laborer, aged 85, of old age.

The deaths from external causes which took place during the month numbered 27, of which 24 were ascribed to accident, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A female child, aged 2, was killed by a horse striking her; a girl, aged 14, died of injuries to the head, caused by a branch of a tree falling on her; a compositor, aged 22, of fracture of the skull, and a cabdriver, aged 39, of rupture of the intestines, both resulting from falls from cabs; a male, of occupation unstated, aged 41, of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall downstairs. The following persons were killed by being passed over or struck by

vehicles:—A hawker, aged 55, by a train; a male child, aged 1 year by a dray; a slaughterman, aged 38, by a lorry; and a laborer, aged 38, by a dray; a carter, aged 38, died of injuries consequent on being thrown from a break; a female child, aged 2, of scalds; and another female child of the same age, of burns; a girl, aged 13, of sunstroke; a mason, aged 20, of wounds in the stomach, cause not stated; a groom, aged 47, of traumatic erysipelas of the head, the result of a wound inflicted by his daughter, who threw a knife at him; 3 schoolboys, aged 9, 11, and 12 respectively, were drowned while bathing; a female, aged 28, a seaman, aged 33, a shoemaker, aged 35, and a laborer, aged 60, were found drowned; a female infant, aged 2 months, was suffocated in bed; and a laborer, aged 50, was smothered through falling on his face in the dust. Of those who committed self-destruction:—A constable, aged 28, shot himself; a Church of England clergyman, aged 27, and a female, aged 50, poisoned themselves, the former with chloral, and the latter, whilst of unsound mind, with strychnine.

One hundred and fourteen deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—60 in the Melbourne Hospital, 11 in the Alfred Hospital, 9 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 8 in the Lying-in Hospital, 9 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 4 in the Homœopathic Hospital, and 1 in the Blind Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 278, of which 144, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 134, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 210 were under one year of age, 44 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 294. Of these, 171, or 58 per cent., were males, and 123, or 42 per cent., were females; 5 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 23 were between twenty-five and thirty, 23 were between thirty and thirty-five, 28 were between thirty-five and forty, 27 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 30 were between fifty and fifty-five, 25 were between fifty-five and sixty, 16 were between sixty and sixty-five, 17 were between sixty-five and seventy, 12 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 17 were upwards of eighty.

Under the head of zymotic diseases, measles, which had not proved fatal since May last, caused 1 death in the month under notice. In January, as compared with the previous month, deaths from scarlatina rose from 2 to 4; those from diphtheria from 1 to 3; those from typhoid fever from 4 to 11; and those from want of breast-milk from 11 to 17. On the other hand, deaths from croup fell from 6 to 3; those from whooping-cough from 18 to 12; and those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 83 to 70. Under the head of local diseases, deaths from affections of the nerves and brain rose from 75 to 83; but those from heart affections fell from 27 to 20; and those from bowel and stomach complaints from 43 to 35. Eight deaths occurred in childbed, or 1 death of a mother to every 103 births.

WHEREAS by *The Mining Statute 1865* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make regulations, not being contrary to the provisions of the said Act, for the purposes mentioned in the forty-third section thereof, and such regulations from time to time to alter, add to, or rescind: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present order rescind clauses 4 and 5 of the Regulations bearing date twenty-third day of January 1871, and in lieu thereof doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

Requirements relative to the application.

(4.) Every applicant shall apply for a lease in manner prescribed by these regulations, but within seven days previous to leaving the application with the warden he must do the following things:—

(a.) Erect posts not less than two feet six inches above the ground painted white, as far as circumstances and occupiers will permit, to define the boundaries and angles of the land, with a metal plate thereon having the words "Applied for a lease" and the name of the applicant or (if more than two) the first two applicants legibly painted thereon; such posts to be kept so erected and painted until the termination of the proceedings under these regulations.

(b.) Insert in a newspaper published in the district where the land is situated, or if no such newspaper, then in one published nearest the district, an advertisement or notice in the form marked "A" in the schedule hereto.

(c.) Post similar notices on the day of the publication of such advertisement at the office of the warden and at the post-office or police court, whichever shall be the nearest to the land.

(d.) Give to every person occupying or having any rights on or under the land, or any part thereof, a similar notice.

(e.) Deposit with the clerk of the warden, or if no such clerk, with the clerk of the petty sessions holden nearest the land, for any area under ten acres, the sum of £2; above ten acres and under thirty acres, the sum of £5; and for any area above thirty acres, a sum equal to five shillings sterling for every acre; to be dealt with as hereinafter provided. The clerk shall give the receipt set out in Schedule C for such deposit.

(5.) In addition to the deposit named in the preceding paragraph (e), the applicant shall subsequently, if required so to do by the warden, deposit such further sum or sums as may be considered necessary to cover the costs of survey in accordance with the scale of fees marked "B" in the schedule hereto, and such deposit shall also be dealt with as hereinafter provided.

(5a.) The applicant shall, previously to lodging his application with the warden, use all reasonable endeavours to obtain from every person occupying or having rights on or under the land, or any part thereof, and willing to give the same, a consent in writing duly witnessed, to such application being granted. But if any such person should not be willing to give such consent, he shall be at liberty to object to the lease being granted in manner hereinafter provided for.

And I further recommend the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers aforesaid, to make the following addition to clause 8 of the said regulations:—

He shall also require the applicant to make such further deposit as may be necessary to cover any reasonable costs of survey in accordance with an estimate of the mining surveyor; such estimate may, however, be subject to the revision of the Chief Mining Surveyor.

And the Honorable Robert Burrowes, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Power of disposition.—To sell, lease, mortgage, exchange, transfer, or deal with the whole or any part or parts of the land, when and as the trustees, or the major part of them, shall, with the approval of the Annual Conference regulating the affairs of

the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Victoria, think most advantageous. The authorized representative, for the time being, of the said Church shall have power to fill up all vacancies occurring in the trusteeship, to appoint new or additional trustees, and to register these trusts under the provisions of *The Successory Trusts Act 1878*. The printed minutes of the meetings of the said Annual Conference shall, for the purposes hereof, be received and taken as sufficient evidence of its acts and proceedings, subject to such power as aforesaid, the land, or such part thereof as shall be undisposed of as aforesaid, shall be held upon the trusts of the Wesleyan Model Deed enrolled in the Supreme Court of New South Wales under the Act of Council of that colony, 2 Victoria, No. 7, so far as such trusts can be applied and are not inconsistent herewith.

Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.—To such Wesleyan Methodist building purposes as shall be approved by a majority of the trustees.

SHIRE OF BRIGHT.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE BARWIDGEE COMMON.

In pursuance of the regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on the first day of April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Bright, having drafted the following regulations for management of the Barwidgee Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council.

Regulations.

- Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers, residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.
- In the construction and for the purpose of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers,

mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules. The words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats; words importing the singular number shall mean and include the plural number, and words importing the plural number shall mean and include the singular number.

3. The scale of fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follows:—

For every horse	5s. per annum
" " head of other large cattle	3s. "
" " head of small cattle	1s. 6d. "

Progeny (under nine months old) of stock legally depasturing on the common } Free

The fee for depasturing goats on the common shall be payable yearly in advance on the first day of February in every year, and the fees for depasturing thereon other descriptions of stock shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of February and the first day of August in every year.

4. No person shall depasture stock on the common unless such stock be his or her own property.

5. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common.

6. No entire horse, bull, or he-goat, shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the permission in writing of the managers.

7. The herdsman shall register the permanent brands of, or brand with the common brand, all stock depasturing on the common, when the fees for such stock are paid. All stock not registered or branded with the common brand shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall be liable to be impounded.

8. The managers shall not be responsible for any loss of, or injury to, any stock depasturing on the common.

9. Sheep shall be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for that purpose.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

SHIRE OF LEXTON.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE LEXTON COMMON, THE EVANSFORD AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON, AND THE SPRINGS, LEXTON, BRIGLDOWN, ADDINGTON AND BECKWORTH FARMERS' COMMON.

In pursuance of the regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on the first day of April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Lexton, having drafted the following regulations for management of the above-named commons, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such commons.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers may respectively depasture on any of the above-named commons, within five (5) miles from their places of residence, four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on any such common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses and mules, and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

3. The following shall be the scale of fees, payable half-yearly in advance, for depasturing stock on any of the above-named commons:—

For every horse	...	6s. per annum
" " head of other large cattle	...	4s. " "
" " " small cattle	...	1s. " "
Young cattle under six (6) months old, the progeny of stock legally depasturing on the commons	...	Free

4. No bull or entire horse shall be allowed to depasture on any of the above-named commons, without the permission, in writing, of the managers.

5. Persons desiring to depasture stock on any of the above-named commons shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman, at the appointed branding yards, on the days set apart for reception of stock, and shall at the same time hand to the herdsman a duplicate of the written statements of the number and brands of the stock so delivered, and the managers shall on receiving the fees payable on such stock give a receipt in the prescribed form. The herdsman shall then proceed to brand the stock with the common brand in pitch and tar, and the owners or persons in charge of such stock shall render every assistance to the herdsman during the branding.

6. The managers or herdsman will not be responsible for the loss of any stock depasturing on the above-named commons.

7. The managers of the above-named commons may, if they think fit, set apart, for the depasturing of sheep only, portions of the above-named commons.

8. No person shall, without the permission in writing of the herdsman, wilfully disturb or remove from any of the above-named commons stock legally depasturing thereon.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.
