INCORPORATION OF THE ECHUCA DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twelfth day of April 1882.

Hospitals and Charitable Institutions, it was amongst other things enacted, that any institution established for the cure of disease, or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom should have paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in one donation, might be incorporated as thereafter mentioned, and all persons who should have paid as aforesaid should be deemed contributors within the meaning of the said Act; and it was also enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of the said persons praying that such institution might be incorporated, to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of such persons, should have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in Council might declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be, and they should thereupon become and continue, a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and should have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Governor has received a petition, signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the institution known as the Echuca District Hospital, praying that the said institution may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth by this present Order declare the contributors for the time being to the institution called and known as the Echuca District Hospital, situated at Echuca, to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Echuca District Hospital."

And the Honorable James Macpherson Grant, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act for* No. 41.—APRIL 14, 1882.—1.

DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in pursuance of the provisions of *The Scab Act 1870*, sec. 5, revoked the Order in Council of the 1st October One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, dividing the colony of Victoria into seven districts under the said Act, and has divided the colony anew into six districts hereinafter named and defined, that is to say:—

1. **BEECHWORTH DISTRICT.**—Commencing at the junction of the Murray and Goulburn rivers; thence by the last-named river upwards to the Howqua River; thence by that river upwards to its source at Mount Howitt; thence northerly and north-easterly by the Main Dividing Range to Mount Hotham; thence north-easterly by the watershed between the head waters of the Kiewa River and the head waters of the Cobungra Creek and Bundarra River to Mount Cope; thence northerly by the watershed between the head waters of the Kiewa River and the head waters of the Big River to Mount Bogong; thence south-easterly by the watershed between the Big River and the head waters of the Snowy Creek to Mount Wills; thence easterly by Wombat Creek to the Mitta Mitta River; thence by that river downwards to Gibbo Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the east corner of Gibbo run; thence by the north-eastern boundary of that run to the north-west corner of Buemba run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the trigonometrical station on Mount Gibbo; thence easterly by a direct line to the north-west corner of Tom Groggin run, as described in the *Government Gazette* of 15th February 1872; thence by the north boundary of that run to the Murray River aforesaid; and thence by that river downwards to the commencing point.

2. **CENTRAL DISTRICT.**—Commencing at the junction of the Murray and Goulburn rivers; thence by the last-named river upwards to the Howqua River; thence by that river upwards to its source at Mount Howitt; thence southerly and south-westerly by the Main Dividing Range to the range forming the boundary between the counties of Evelyn and Tanjil; thence south-easterly by that range to Mount Baw Baw; thence westerly by the southern watershed of the Yarra Yarra River to the source of the Buneep River; thence southerly by the latter river to the Melbourne and Gippsland Railway; thence south by a line to the Lang Lang River; thence westerly by that river to Western Port Bay; thence southerly by the shore of that bay to Griffiths' Point; thence westerly and north-westerly by Bass's Strait to Point Lonsdale; thence by the western and north-western shores of Port Phillip Bay to the east boundary of section 8, parish of Truganina; thence by that boundary bearing north to the north-east angle of the said section; thence by a road bearing westerly to the north-east angle of allotment B of section 13, parish of Tarnnet; thence by a road bearing south to the south-east angle of section 2; thence by the south boundary of sections 2 and 1, bearing west to the Werribee River; thence by that river upwards to the north boundary of section 10, parish of Pywhaitjork; thence by that boundary bearing east to the south-east angle of section 11; thence by a road bearing north to the south-east angle of section 12, parish of Kororoit; thence by the south boundary of sections 12 and 11 bearing west to the Toolern Toolern Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the north boundary of section 4, parish of Djerriwarrah; thence by a road bearing west to the north-east angle of section 3; thence by a road bearing north to the north-east angle of allotment A of section 5; thence by the south boundary of sections 7 and 6 bearing west to the south-west angle of allotment E of the latter section; thence by a road and the east boundary of allotment B of section 1 bearing south to the Werribee River aforesaid; thence again by that river upwards to the east boundary of the town of Ballan; thence by the east, north, and west boundaries of that town to the Werribee River aforesaid; thence again by that river upwards to its source in the Main Dividing Range; thence south-easterly and easterly by that range to the source of the Loddon River; thence by that river to the eastern boundary of Murrabit run; thence by that boundary to the Murray River aforesaid; and thence by that river upwards to the commencing point, excepting the cities of Melbourne, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Prahran, and Richmond, the towns of Emerald Hill and Hotham, the boroughs of Brunswick, Essendon, and Flemington, Footscray, Hawthorn, Kew, Sandridge, St. Kilda, and Williamstown, and the portion of country, not included in any municipal district, situated between the eastern boundary of the borough of Footscray, the western boundary of the city of Melbourne and the Yarra Yarra River.

3. **GEELONG DISTRICT.**—Commencing at the mouth of the Hopkins River; thence by that river to the southern boundary of the Burrumbeep run; thence by the southern and western boundaries of that run, the southern boundary of Barton and Mount Burchett runs, and the western boundary of Mount Burchett and La Ross and Lexington runs to the southern boundary of Woortook run; thence by the southern and western boundaries of that run, the southern boundary of Rosebrook run, and the south-eastern boundary of Brim Springs run to the Glenelg River; thence north-westerly by that river to a point south of the most eastern source of Norton's Creek; thence north by a line and northerly and westerly by the said creek to the Wimmera River; thence northerly by that river, the eastern margin of Lakes Hindmarsh and Albacutya and Outlet Creek to the most western track to Kulkyn, near Mount Jenkins; thence north-easterly by that track to Chalka Creek; thence northerly by that creek to the Murray River; thence south-easterly by that river to the east boundary of the Murrabit run; thence southerly by that boundary to the Loddon River; thence by that river upwards to its source in the Main Dividing Range; thence westerly by that range to the source of the Werribee River; thence by that river to the west boundary of the town of Ballan; thence by the west, north, and east boundaries of that town to the Werribee River aforesaid; thence again by that river down-

wards to the east boundary of allotment B of section 1, parish of Djerriwarrah; thence by that boundary and a road bearing north to the south-west angle of allotment E of section 6; thence by the south boundary of sections 6 and 7 bearing east to the south-east angle of allotment D of the latter section; thence by a road bearing south to the north-east angle of allotment B of section 3; thence by a road bearing east to the Toolern Toolern Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the south boundary of allotment D of section 11, parish of Kororoit; thence by the south boundary of sections 11 and 12 bearing east to the south-east angle of the latter section; thence by a road bearing south to the north-east angle of section 10, parish of Pywhaitjork; thence by the north boundary of that section bearing west to the Werribee River aforesaid; thence again by that river downwards to the south boundary of section 1, parish of Tarnnet; thence by the south boundary of sections 1 and 2, bearing east to the south-east angle of the latter section; thence by a road bearing north to the north-east angle of allotment B of section 13; thence by a road bearing easterly to the north-east angle of section 8, parish of Truganina; thence by the east boundary of that section bearing south to the shore of Port Phillip Bay; and thence by the north-western and western shores of that bay and by Bass' Strait and the Southern Ocean to the commencing point. Including the islands off the coast.

4. **GIPPSLAND DISTRICT.**—Commencing at Griffith's Point; thence northerly by the shore of Western Port Bay to the Lang Lang River; thence easterly by that river to a point south of the intersection of the Buneep River and the Melbourne and Gippsland Railway; thence north by a line to the said intersection; thence northerly by the last-named river to its source; thence easterly by the southern watershed of the Yarra Yarra River to Mount Baw Baw; thence north-westerly by the range forming the boundary between the counties of Evelyn and Tanjil to the Main Dividing Range; thence north-easterly and northerly by that range to Mount Hotham; thence north-easterly by the watershed between the head waters of the Kiewa River and the head waters of the Cobungra Creek and Bundarra River to Mount Cope; thence northerly by the watershed between the head waters of the Kiewa River and the head waters of the Big River to Mount Bogong; thence south-easterly by the watershed between the Big River and the head waters of the Snowy Creek to Mount Wills; thence easterly by Wombat Creek to the Mitta Mitta River; thence by that river downwards to Gibbo Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the east corner of Gibbo run; thence by the north-eastern boundary of that run to the north-west corner of Buemba run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the trigonometrical station on Mount Gibbo; thence easterly by a direct line to the north-west corner of Tom Groggin run, as described in the *Government Gazette* of the 15th February 1872; thence by the north boundary of that run to the Indi or Murray River; thence by that river upwards to its source at Forest Hill; thence south-easterly by the boundary between the colonies of New South Wales and Victoria to Cape Howe; and thence south-westerly and north-westerly by the sea-coast to the commencing point. Including the islands off the coast.

5. **MELBOURNE DISTRICT.**—The cities of Melbourne, Fitzroy, Prahran, Collingwood, and Richmond, the towns of Emerald Hill and Hotham, the boroughs of Brunswick, Essendon, and Flemington, Footscray, Hawthorn, Kew, Sandridge, St. Kilda, and Williamstown, and the portion of country not included in any municipal district, situated between the eastern boundary of the borough of Footscray, the western boundary of the city of Melbourne, and the Yarra Yarra River.

6. **WARRNAMBOOL DISTRICT.**—Commencing at a point on the sea-coast where the west boundary of the colony abuts thereon; thence north by that boundary to the Murray River; thence easterly and south-easterly by that river to Chalka Creek; thence southerly by that creek to the most western track from Kulkyn to Dimboola; thence south-westerly by that track to Outlet Creek, near Mount Jenkins; thence southerly by that creek, the eastern margin of Lakes Albacutya and Hindmarsh, and the Wimmera River to Norton's Creek; thence easterly and southerly by that creek to its most eastern source; thence south by a line to the Glenelg River; thence south-easterly by that river to the south-eastern boundary of Brim Springs run; thence by that boundary, the southern boundary of Rosebrook run, and the south-western boundary of Woortook run to the western boundary of that run, the western, south-western, and south-eastern boundaries of Mount Burchett run and the southern and south-eastern boundaries of Barton run to the western boundary of Burrumbeep run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run to the Hopkins River; thence by that river downwards to its mouth; and thence westerly by the sea-coast to the commencing point. Including the islands off the coast.

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

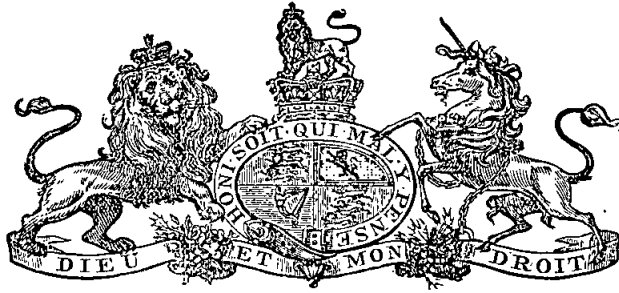
