IN pursuance of the provisions of section 22 of *The Compulsory Vaccination Act*, it is hereby declared that the disease of Small-pox is present in Victoria.

SMALL-POX IN VICTORIA.

NOTICE.—The Central Board of Health desire to draw public attention to the issue of the above notice by the Honorable the Chief Secretary, bearing this date, and setting forth that the disease of Small-pox is present in Victoria.

The Board think it necessary to give the utmost publicity to section XXII. of the *Compulsory Vaccination Act* No. 501, which renders it imperative that any case of small-pox, or of any disease resembling small-pox, should be immediately reported to the Health or to the Police Authorities, under a penalty not exceeding £50, nor less than £20.

The following particulars are therefore published for general information, with the earnest hope that the public will second the efforts of the Government in the endeavour to stamp out the disease:—

Cases of Small-pox to be reported to Board of Health.
Section XXII. of Act No. 501.

"If at any time the disease of Small-pox shall by a notice in the *Government Gazette* be declared to be present in Victoria, any

person who shall neglect to report to the Central Board of Health, or to the Local Board of Health, or to the Officer of Police for the district in which such person resides, any case of Small-pox or disease resembling Small-pox immediately on the existence of any case of such disease coming to such person's knowledge, such person shall, on conviction of such neglect, forfeit a sum not exceeding Fifty nor less than Twenty pounds."

Extract from Instructions issued by the Central Board of Health to each of the Local Boards throughout Victoria.

"Should any case of small-pox make its appearance, an immediate report thereof is to be sent to this Board, by electric telegraph where practicable, and instant measures are to be taken by the Local Board or their Officer of Health for the isolation of the patient, so as to prevent, as far as possible, communication with the uninfected. The house and premises, and the bedding and clothing, where any case occurs, should be instantly and thoroughly disinfected, the latter by being either passed through boiling water or subjected to a temperature of not less than 212 degrees; and the house by being fumigated with sulphurous acid by burning common brimstone therein, the doors, windows, and chimneys being closed, so as to thoroughly fumigate the whole. The drains, closets, and other premises in the infected localities should be disinfected by a liberal use of carbolic acid or other efficient disinfectant."

Light exhibited on Fort Point, George Town, Penang.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, Javasche Courant, Nos. 94, 95 and 96, notice is given that the red light on Fort Point, Prince of Wales Island, is situated in—

lat. 5° 24' 45" N., and
long. 100° 20' 10" E.

The lighthouse is situated on the N.E. bastion of Fort Cornwallis. It is an iron structure, painted white, and has an overhanging gallery round the light-room.

The light is visible from a distance of 10 miles throughout an arc of 202° 30', and the bearings at which it is cut off, are, from a vessel entering the North Channel, S.S.E., and entering the South Channel, North.

H.N.M. *Batavia* discovered a coral reef of little extension with 9 feet on it, on the East Coast of Halmahera. From the reef bears:—

West point of the same, N. ¾ E.
The southernmost of the islets, near Weda, N. ¼ W.
Kampong Weda, N.W. by N.

On the western side, close to the reef, was found 20 to 25 fathoms; no bottom.

Great caution is necessary when approaching Weda Road, as more shoal water is found along the coast.

Kampong Weda, indicated on the chart "Moluksche Archipel," sheet I, is situated on the place indicated as Kampong Wata, the last-named Kampong does not exist.

MIDDLE CHANNEL, MORETON BAY.

By attending to the following directions, a depth of not less than 17 feet at low-water springs can now be carried through the Middle Channel.

From seaward cross the East Banks, with the leading lights in line, and when about half-way through the channel haul up gradually and open them to the northward, rounding the spit of the Venus Bank, with them open a distance of about three-quarters of the difference between their heights.

SOUTH PASSAGE, MORETON BAY.

THE North Break having extended further to the S.E., vessels, when the state of the bar will admit of their hauling with the sea beam, can carry through this entrance a depth of 14½ feet at low-water, as follows:—

After crossing the outer edge of the bar, with the leading beacons open to the northward from three to four times their own width, haul up S. ½ W. and steer for the hill shown on the coast chart as 490 feet high. This, in line with the lowest part of ridge at the back of the beach, will lead clear of the spit off the North Break. When the spit is rounded, the beacons being open to the southward some ten times their own width, a course can be steered between the North and South Breaks.

A knoll, having only 7½ feet upon it at low-water, has now formed on the outer edge of the bar, with the leading beacons in line.

With the beacons open to the southward, from five to eight times their own width, and with Amity Point touching, and just open of the south-east end of Mount Petrie, a depth of from 11½ to 12 feet will be found at low-water.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Roman Catholic Church, under the provisions of *The Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion*, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the eighteenth day of April 1882, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

Description of land.—One acre, county of Bourke, town of Hotham, being allotments 1, 2, 23, and 24 of section 88: Commencing at the intersection of the east side of Melrose street and the south side of Curran street; bounded thence by the latter street bearing east two chains; thence by allotments 3 and 22 bearing south five chains; thence by Brougham street bearing west two chains; and thence by Melrose street aforesaid bearing north five chains to the point of commencement.

COLAC DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

BYE-LAWS.

THAT the object of the institution is to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, and for accidents; but no person able to pay for the same shall meet with further than temporary assistance, provided also that if there be room, patients capable of paying may be admitted on payment of thirty shillings per week in advance.

2. The institution shall consist of a president, one vice-president, two auditors, governors and subscribers.

3. The following shall be the qualifications and privileges of governors and subscribers:—£20, collected by any person, life governor; £20 in one sum, life governor; £15 in one sum, life subscriber; £20, corporate body, life governor; £25, first executor under a will, governor for one year; £10, minister or layman collecting in one year, governor for one year; £1 yearly subscription, subscriber; with power to recommend patients, as follows: Life governor, one in-patient, and two out-patients; life subscriber, one in-patient and one out-patient; governor for one year, one in-patient and one out-patient annually; subscriber, one in-patient annually.

4. Recommendations for admission shall be subject to the approval of the committee or sub-committee, and shall be made by tickets only to be issued by the secretary or collector. These tickets shall only be used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for medical attendance, and be available for the financial year.

5. The members of committee, honorary and medical officers, shall have a discretionary power of recommending both in-patients and out-patients, subject to the approval of the committee or sub-committee.

6. Accidents and cases deemed of decided emergency by the honorary or paid medical staff, may be admitted at any time, but the admission of patients recommended shall be restricted to Thursday, between the hours of three p.m. and four p.m. No pregnant female, for the purpose of confinement, no child under five years of age, no insane person, no person afflicted with syphilis or any infectious disease, or any person who, in the opinion of the medical staff, is unsuitable, to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient within the walls of the Hospital under any circumstances.

7. That the hours of admission for visitors to patients be from two p.m. to five p.m. on Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday, it being always competent for the medical officer to admit or exclude visitors whenever he so deems proper.

8. That the medical officer be required to enter in a book kept for that purpose, the date of each occasion on which, in accordance with Bye-law No. 7, he admits or excludes visitors on appointed days, as also his reasons for thus admitting or excluding visitors.

9. Any patient guilty of gross misconduct may be summarily dismissed by any three of the committee, upon its being substantiated.

10. The committee or sub-committee shall have power to discharge any patient who is not, in their opinion, a proper person to receive the benefits of the institution.

11. Annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, to be computed from the day on which such subscription is paid, and no governor or subscriber will be entitled to any privileges until the subscription is paid.

12. The subscribers to the Colac District Hospital shall be entitled to vote in proportion to their subscriptions according to the following scale, namely:—£1 and less than £3, one vote; £3 and less than £5, two votes; £5 and upwards, three votes.

13. The Committee of Management shall consist of twelve members (including the President, one Vice-President and Treasurer), a member of which shall retire each year (in accordance with the provisions of the Hospital and Charitable Institutions Statute, 27, Vic., No. 220. Clauses 11 and 12, and are eligible for re-election.

14. The committee of management shall elect the office-bearers out of their own body each year at their first meeting of contributors, providing that the honorary treasurer shall continue in office notwithstanding the operation of any rules for retiring by rotation, and remain an ex-officio member of committee until he die, resign, or be removed, by a majority of the committee of management, at a special meeting called for that purpose, and the vacant office shall be filled up by the general committee until the next annual election of officers.

15. The general committee shall direct the affairs of the institution, frame bye-laws for its internal regulation (the same not to be contrary to the general rules), and appoint and discharge all paid officers of the institution.
